

CRIME IN CALIFORNIA, 1983-2004

By Category Rate per 100,000 Population



- The violent crime rate decreased 5.2 percent.
- The property crime rate increased 0.9 percent.

Crime in California, 2004, Advance Release is published by the Department of Justice to provide annual 2004 criminal justice data as soon as possible. Information about crimes, arrests, and adult felony arrest dispositions is included. This report compares crime and arrest rates from 2003 to 2004, and from 1989 to 2004.

Violent crime rates for 1992 and 2004 are also compared since 1992 marked a high point for the period shown. Property crime rates for 1989 and 2004 are compared since 1989 marked a peak for the period shown. (Note that larceny-theft over \$400 was added to the property crime category in 2003 to give a more representative depiction of crime in California and to correlate more closely to national data presentation. These data are only available since 1983, hence the period presented in this report.)

The more extensive report, Crime in California, 2004, will be published later this year.

The California Crime Index (CCI) has been temporarily suspended until a new national crime index is established by the FBI.

Therefore, property crime data presented in this report will differ from data published previously, and the reader is cautioned against making comparisons with previous publications.

- From 2003 to 2004, felony arrests increased 1.1 percent in rate per 100,000 population at risk. Felony arrests have decreased 29.6 percent in rate since 1989.
- From 2003 to 2004, misdemeanor arrests decreased 0.5 percent in rate. Misdemeanor arrests have decreased 44.6 percent in rate since 1989.

- Total complaints denied decreased from 13.9 percent in 2002 to 13.6 percent in 2003.
- Dismissals and acquittals increased from 14.3 percent in 2002 to 14.5 percent in 2003.
- Convictions increased from 68.0 percent in 2002 to 68.7 percent in 2003.
