DEFENDANTS HOMELESS AND
DISABLED VETERANS
CORPORATION, ALLEN WILSON, AND
GEORGE DUMAS

This Court, having considered plaintiff's request for Default Judgment by Court as to defendants Homeless and Disabled Veterans Corporation, Allen Wilson, and George Dumas, including all evidence submitted with the request, the Court files, and the documents presented at the default judgment hearing, and good cause appearing:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that judgment be entered against defendants Homeless and Disabled Veterans Corporation, Allen Wilson, and George Dumas as set forth below:

DEFENDANT HOMELESS AND DISABLED VETERANS CORPORATION

1. Defendant Homeless and Disabled Veterans Corporation ("HDV" hereafter) is ordered to pay to plaintiff, the People of the State of California, represented by California

1 Attorney General's Office, \$300,000 in civil penalties as follows: \$150,000 in civil penalties
2 under section 17200 et seq. of the Business and Professions Code, one-half of which shall be
3 made payable to the San Mateo County Treasurer and the remaining one-half made payable to
4 California Department of Justice, Office of the Attorney General; and \$150,000 in civil penalties
5 under section 17500 et seq. of the Business and Professions Code, one-half of which shall be
6 made payable to the San Mateo County Treasurer and the remaining one-half made payable to
7 California Department of Justice, Office of the Attorney General. The civil penalties collected
8 under section 17200 et seq. of the Business and Professions Code shall be used as set forth in
9 section 17206 of the Business and Professions Code. The civil penalties collected under section
10 17500 et seq. of the Business and Professions Code shall be used as set forth in section 17536 of
11 the Business and Professions Code.

12 2. Defendant HDV is ordered to pay to plaintiff, the People of the State of California,
13 represented by California Attorney General's Office, civil penalties in the amount of \$10,000
14 under section 12591.1 of the Government Code, made payable to "California Department of
15 Justice, Office of the Attorney General" and the funds shall be used exclusively by the Charitable
16 Trusts Section for the administration of the Attorney General's charitable trust enforcement
17 responsibilities.

18 3. Defendant HDV is permanently enjoined from soliciting charitable donations in
19 California on its own behalf or on behalf of any corporation, company, or any other entity it
20 owns/controls, and/or on behalf of any California charitable organization, entity, foundation,
21 groups or charitable trust.

22 4. Defendants HDV, Allen Wilson, and George Dumas are jointly and severally liable
23 for plaintiff's costs and are ordered to pay costs to plaintiff, the People of the State of California,
24 represented by California Attorney General's Office, in the amount of \$1057 under section 12598
25 of Government Code and section 1021.8 of the Code of Civil Procedure, the payment of which
26 shall be made to the "California Department of Justice," and the funds shall be used exclusively
27 by the Charitable Trusts Section for administration of the Attorney General's charitable trust
28 enforcement responsibilities.

1 5. Defendants HDV, Allen Wilson, and George Dumas are jointly and severally liable
2 for plaintiff's reasonable attorneys' fees in the amount of \$117,084.00, as provided in section
3 12598 of the Government Code, and section 1021.8 of the Code of Civil Procedure. Defendants
4 HDV, Allen Wilson, and George Dumas are ordered to pay \$117,084.00 in attorney's fees, the
5 payment of which shall be to the "California Department of Justice," and the funds shall be used
6 exclusively by the Charitable Trusts Section for administration of the Attorney General's
7 charitable trust enforcement responsibilities.

8 6. Defendant HDV is ordered involuntarily dissolved pursuant to this Court's separate
9 order involuntarily dissolving HDV. The Court's said Order involuntarily dissolving HDV is
10 incorporated into this Judgment as if fully set forth herein. HDV's corporate existence shall cease
11 as of the date of the entry of this Judgment and Order of Involuntary Dissolution HDV, except to
12 wind up its affairs and to satisfy its obligations under this Judgment and Order. The duties of the
13 directors/de facto directors of HDV are discharged, except to wind up the affairs of HDV, and to
14 satisfy their individual obligations under this Judgment and Order. The individual liabilities of
15 director and/or de facto directors of HDV are not discharged.

16 **DEFENDANT ALLEN WILSON**

17 1. Defendant Allen Wilson is ordered to pay to plaintiff, the People of the State of
18 California, represented by California Attorney General's Office, \$300,000 in civil penalties as
19 follows: \$150,000 in civil penalties under section 17200 et seq. of the Business and Professions
20 Code, one-half of which shall be made payable to the San Mateo County Treasurer and the
21 remaining one-half to the State of California; and \$150,000 in civil penalties under section 17500
22 et seq. of the Business and Professions Code, one-half of which shall be made payable to the San
23 Mateo County Treasurer and the remaining one-half to the State Treasurer. The civil penalties
24 collected under section 17200 et seq. of the Business and Professions Code shall be used as set
25 forth in section 17206 of the Business and Professions Code. The civil penalties collected under
26 section 17500 et seq. of the Business and Professions Code shall be used as set forth in section
27 17536 of the Business and Professions Code.

1 2. Defendant Allen Wilson is ordered to pay to plaintiff, the People of the State of
2 California, represented by California Attorney General's Office, civil penalties in the amount of
3 \$10,000 under section 12591.1 of the Government Code, made payable to "California Department
4 of Justice" to be used exclusively by the Charitable Trusts Section for the administration of the
5 Attorney General's charitable trust enforcement responsibilities.

6 3. Defendants Allen Wilson and George Dumas are jointly and severally liable for
7 \$29,291.00 in damages to plaintiff, the People of the State of California, represented by
8 California Attorney General's Office, made payable to "California Department of Justice" to be
9 used for the benefit of a charity with a charitable purpose similar to that of HDV, which charity is
10 to be selected by the Attorney General's Office.

11 4. Defendant Allen Wilson is permanently enjoined from soliciting charitable donations
12 in California on his own behalf or on behalf of any corporation or company he owns/controls,
13 and/or on behalf of any California charitable organization, entity, foundation, groups or charitable
14 trust.

15 5. Defendant Allen Wilson is permanently enjoined from serving in any fiduciary role or
16 capacity, as a director, a board member, a trustee, and/or an officer of any California charitable
17 organization, entity, foundation, group or charitable trust.

18 6. Defendants Allen Wilson, George Dumas, and HDV are jointly and severally liable
19 for plaintiff's costs and are hereby ordered to pay costs to plaintiff, the People of the State of
20 California, represented by California Attorney General's Office, the amount of \$1057 under
21 section 12598 of Government Code and section 1021.8 of the Code of Civil Procedure, the
22 payment of which shall be made to the "California Department of Justice," and the funds shall be
23 used exclusively by the Charitable Trusts Section for administration of the Attorney General's
24 charitable trust enforcement responsibilities.

25 7. Defendants Allen Wilson, George Dumas, and HDV are jointly and severally liable
26 for plaintiff's reasonable attorneys' fees, and are ordered to pay attorney's fees in the amount of
27 \$117,084, as provided in section 12598 of Government Code, and section 1021.8 of the Code of
28 Civil Procedure. The payment of the attorney's fees shall be made to the "California Department

1 of Justice," the attorneys for plaintiff, the People of the State of California, and the funds shall be
2 used exclusively by the Charitable Trusts Section for administration of the Attorney General's
3 charitable trust enforcement responsibilities.

4 DEFENDANT GEORGE DUMAS

5 1. Defendant George Dumas is ordered to pay to plaintiff, the People of the State of
6 California, represented by California Attorney General's Office, \$300,000 in civil penalties as
7 follows: \$150,000 in civil penalties under section 17200 et seq. of the Business and Professions
8 Code, one-half of which shall be made payable to the San Mateo County Treasurer and the
9 remaining one-half to the State of California; and \$150,000 in civil penalties under section 17500
10 et seq. of the Business and Professions Code, one-half of which shall be made payable to the San
11 Mateo County Treasurer and the remaining one-half to the State Treasurer. The civil penalties
12 collected under section 17200 et seq. of the Business and Professions Code shall be used as set
13 forth in section 17206 of the Business and Professions Code. The civil penalties collected under
14 section 17500 et seq. of the Business and Professions Code shall be used as set forth in section
15 17536 of the Business and Professions Code.

16 2. Defendant George Dumas is ordered to pay to plaintiff, the People of the State of
17 California, represented by California Attorney General's Office, civil penalties in the amount of
18 \$10,000 under section 12591.1 of the Government Code, made payable to "California Department
19 of Justice" to be used exclusively by the Charitable Trusts Section for the administration of the
20 Attorney General's charitable trust enforcement responsibilities.

21 3. Defendants George Dumas and Allen Wilson are jointly and severally liable for
22 \$29,291.00 in damages to plaintiff, the People of the State of California, represented by
23 California Attorney General's Office, made payable to "California Department of Justice" to be
24 used for the benefit of a charity with a charitable purpose similar to that of HDV, which charity is
25 to be selected by the Attorney General's Office.

26 4. Defendant George Dumas is permanently enjoined from soliciting charitable
27 donations in California on his own behalf or on behalf of any corporation or company he
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1 owns/controls, and/or on behalf of any California charitable organization, entity, foundation,
2 groups or charitable trust.


3 5. Defendant George Dumas is permanently enjoined from serving in any fiduciary role
4 or capacity, as a director, a board member, a trustee, and/or an officer of any California charitable
5 organization, entity, foundation, group or charitable trust.

6 6. Defendants George Dumas, Allen Wilson, and HDV are jointly and severally liable
7 for plaintiff's costs and are hereby ordered to pay costs to plaintiff in the amount of \$1057 under
8 section 12598 of Government Code and section 1021.8 of the Code of Civil Procedure, the
9 payment of which shall be made to the "California Department of Justice," and the funds shall be
10 used exclusively by the Charitable Trusts Section for administration of the Attorney General's
11 charitable trust enforcement responsibilities.

12 7. Defendants George Dumas, Allen Wilson, and HDV are jointly and severally liable
13 for plaintiff's reasonable attorneys' fees, and are ordered to pay attorney's fees in the amount of
14 \$117,084, as provided in section 12598 of Government Code, and section 1021.8 of the Code of
15 Civil Procedure. The payment of the attorney's fees shall be made to the "California Department
16 of Justice," and the funds shall be used exclusively by the Charitable Trusts Section for
17 administration of the Attorney General's charitable trust enforcement responsibilities.
