



The Offender-Based Transaction Statistics (OBTS) system in California describes the processing of adults arrested for felony offenses from arrest through final disposition. Data on the adjacent flow chart pertain specifically to adult felony arrests that received final dispositions in 1997 and were added to the Automated Criminal History System (ACHS) by the Department of Justice by September 1998.

WHAT IS A FINAL DISPOSITION?

In the OBTS system, the term "final disposition" refers to a specific legal action that takes place following an adult felony arrest. Final dispositions shown occur at the law enforcement, prosecutor, or court level. For example, if an arrestee is released by a law enforcement agency or by a prosecutor who has determined that there is not enough evidence to justify the filing of a complaint, this release is recorded as a final disposition. If an arrestee is referred to court for adjudication, the outcome (i.e., dismissal, diversion dismissal, acquittal, or conviction) is also recorded as a final disposition. "Intermediate" dispositions (e.g., placements into diversionary programs) are not included in the OBTS file.

HOW ARE OBTS DATA REPORTED?

Dispositions of adult felony arrests were reported by approximately 1,200 agencies in 1997. These agencies include law enforcement, prosecutor, lower court, and superior court levels of the California criminal justice system.

OBTS data are taken directly from the Department of Justice's Automated Criminal History System (ACHS). The arrest dispositions received generally describe statewide processing of adult felony arrestees through California's criminal justice system. (See [Appendix](#) for known data limitations.)

OBTS data files for 1993 through 1997 were updated in 1998 and may not match previously published data. Fluctuations from year to year in counts may not necessarily be due to actual occurrences in the criminal justice system but only reflect the degree to which reports of dispositions are reported and processed. 

Comparing 1992 through 1997:

As a percentage of recorded adult felony arrest dispositions:

- Law enforcement releases ranged from 4.3 to 4.9 percent.
- Prosecutor complaints denied ranged from 11.3 to 14.6 percent.
- Dismissals and acquittals ranged from 12.5 to 14.1 percent.
- Convictions ranged from 67.9 to 70.3 percent.


ADULT FELONY ARREST DISPOSITIONS, 1992-1997

In 1997, more than six out of ten adult felony arrest dispositions resulted in a conviction.

In 1997,

As a percentage of recorded adult felony arrest dispositions:

- Law enforcement releases accounted for 4.4 percent (14,289).
- Prosecutor complaints denied accounted for 14.6 percent (47,829).
- Dismissals or acquittals accounted for 13.1 percent (42,842).
- Convictions accounted for 67.9 percent (221,808).

In 1997,

As a percentage of recorded adult felony arrest dispositions for each arrest category:

- The largest percentage of prosecutor complaints denied was for the violent offense category (22.4 percent).
- The largest percentage of dismissals and acquittals was for the drug offense category (17.0 percent).
- The largest percentage of convictions was for the property and "all other" offense categories (73.3 and 76.1 percent, respectively).

Adult Felony Arrestees Convicted

Comparing 1992 through 1997:

The percentage of adult felony arrestees convicted and sentenced to:

- State institutions ranged from 18.8 to 22.6 percent.
- Probation ranged from 9.5 to 10.6 percent.
- Probation with jail ranged from 61.4 to 66.5 percent.
- Jail ranged from 3.8 to 5.6 percent.


In 1997,

The percentage of adult felony arrestees convicted and sentenced to:

- State institutions accounted for 21.5 percent (47,730).
- Probation accounted for 9.6 percent (21,255).
- Probation with jail accounted for 65.1 percent (144,365).
- Jail accounted for 3.8 percent (8,458).


The most frequent sentence given is probation with jail.

Adult Felony Arrestees Convicted of Violent Offenses

Comparing 1992 through 1997:

The percentage of adult felony arrestees convicted of violent offenses and sentenced to:


- State institutions ranged from 17.7 to 24.0 percent.
- Probation ranged from 9.0 to 11.8 percent.
- Probation with jail ranged from 59.9 to 68.5 percent.
- Jail ranged from 3.2 to 4.8 percent.

In 1997,

Of adult felony arrestees convicted of violent offenses:


- More than two-thirds received sentences of probation with jail (68.5 percent).
- Almost one-fifth (19.3 percent) received sentences to state institutions.

Adult Felony Arrestees Convicted of Property Offenses

Comparing 1992 through 1997:

The percentage of adult felony arrestees convicted of property offenses and sentenced to:


- State institutions ranged from 19.1 to 22.7 percent.
- Probation ranged from 8.5 to 9.4 percent.
- Probation with jail ranged from 62.5 to 67.3 percent.
- Jail ranged from 2.8 to 6.1 percent.

In 1997,

Of adult felony arrestees convicted of property offenses:


- Probation with jail sentences were most frequent (65.7 percent).
- "Straight" jail sentences were least frequent (2.8 percent).

Adult Felony Arrestees Convicted of Drug Offenses

Comparing 1992 through 1997:

The percentage of adult felony arrestees convicted of drug offenses and sentenced to:

- State institutions ranged from 20.9 to 26.3 percent.
- Probation ranged from 5.9 to 7.4 percent.
- Probation with jail ranged from 63.9 to 68.8 percent.
- Jail ranged from 3.2 to 4.4 percent.


In 1997,

Of adult felony arrestees convicted of drug offenses:

- Probation with jail sentences were given for the majority of these convictions (63.9 percent).
- "Straight" jail sentences were the least frequent given (3.5 percent).


In 1997, more than one-fourth of convictions for drug offenses resulted in sentences to state institutions.



Conviction Rates

The conviction rates shown are calculated using two different bases. The first is based on *total adult felony arrest dispositions* and the second is based on *total complaints filed*. Each is valid and by presenting both, the reader is provided two perspectives from which to evaluate the effectiveness of the criminal justice system.


Conviction rates based on *total adult felony arrest dispositions* describe the overall processing of offenders by the criminal justice system. This method of calculation focuses on the proportion of convictions out of the total number of arrests.

Conviction Rates (continued)

Conviction rates based on *total complaints filed* describe the processing of defendants in the courts. This method of calculation focuses on those arrests for which a complaint was filed by the district attorney.

Formulas used to calculate conviction rates based on total adult felony arrest dispositions and total complaints filed can be found in the Appendix.
