Department of Justice Regulations for DROS Fees

§ 4001. DROS Fees.

(a) As authorized pursuant to subdivisions (f) and (i) of section 12076 of the Penal Code, the ~~Firearms Division~~ fees for ~~submitting Dealers' Records~~ a Dealer's Record of Sale (DROS) to the Department of Justice are as follows, until and unless administratively adjusted pursuant to the process set forth in subdivision (b):

~~(a)~~(1) DROS fee for a single handgun: ~~\$19-\$14~~

(2) DROS fee for each additional handgun submitted at the same time as first DROS: ~~\$15-\$10~~

~~(b)~~ (3) DROS fee for one or more rifles or shotguns: ~~\$19-\$14~~

(b) After the end of Fiscal Year 2009/10 (ending on June 30, 2010) and at the end of each fiscal year thereafter, the department shall review its DROS revenues and DROS-related expenses during the prior fiscal year. Based upon the review, the department shall determine whether it is necessary to administratively adjust the DROS fee during the current fiscal year in order to cover all estimated costs of administering the programs funded by the DROS fee. The fee may be increased at a rate not to exceed any increase in the California Consumer Price Index as compiled and reported by the Department of Industrial Relations.

(c) By November 1, 2010 and by November 1st each year thereafter, the department shall publish its determination whether to administratively adjust the DROS fee on its public website and make its determination available to the public upon request.

(d) If the department determines it is necessary to administratively adjust the DROS fee, the department shall provide notice of the administrative adjustment, including the amount of the adjusted fee and the date when the adjustment takes effect, by doing both of the following at least 30 days before the adjustment takes effect:

(1) Notify each person who has filed a request for notice of administrative adjustment of the DROS fee in the manner requested by that person as provided in subdivision (e).

(2) Notify each dealer listed on the Centralized List of firearms dealers pursuant to Penal Code section 12071, subdivision (e)(1) of the DROS fee adjustment.

(e) Any person may file a request with DOJ for notice by either United States Mail Service or electronic mail of any administrative adjustment of the DROS fee.
