

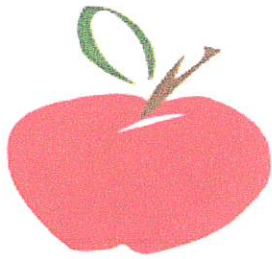

It is my understanding that the gaming industry is facing potential changes that threaten the current games offered at Hollywood Park Casino, and other local card rooms. These games have been offered by Hollywood Park Casino and enjoyed by players for the last 10-25 years. I strongly encourage you to consider the impact of these potential changes on card rooms and the indirect consequences of vendors such as Solo Foods, Inc.

Any limits on or elimination of California games, like Black Jack, could jeopardize the stability and security of my business, not to mention the tax revenues that fund a variety of vital City services, including fire and public safety. Additionally, imposing heavy-handed and unwarranted limits on popular legal games like Black Jack and other California games will jeopardize employment opportunities for people who live in and around communities that house card clubs. In Los Angeles County, it is estimated that approximately 7,000 residents and countless other businesses would potentially be impacted by the contemplated new regulations.

I implore you to work with the industry to find a workable solution and prevent the negative economic and job-loss consequences that will certainly result from limiting or eliminating these games. Thank you.
