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## MULTIPLE PLAYER STATIONS AS “GAMING DEVICE” (REVISED)

**In furtherance of the Government-to-Government relationship existing between the State and the Indian Tribes of California that are authorized by the Tribal State Gaming Compacts now in force to conduct Class III gaming, the Division of Gambling Control, as a component of the State Gaming Agency identified in those Compacts, will from time to time provide information in the form of advisories concerning its practices on matters within the scope of its responsibility under those Compacts. The purpose of an advisory is informational. An advisory does not constitute legal advice.**

Several vendors nationwide are offering central server systems which have the capacity to service multiple player stations terminals, or ‘Gaming Devices’. The Division of Gambling Control considers each separate player station terminal to be a Gaming Device for purposes of determining the Tribe’s Gaming Device Allotment. In effect, each terminal of these gaming systems is considered to be one Gaming Device and licensed individually. This includes, but is not limited to, systems such as Cyberview Technology (as outlined in Tribal Casino Advisory Number 1), ‘Blackjack Hand Action’, ‘Hot Shot Dice’, ‘Roulette Club’, and any other electronic multiple player Roulette or Craps games.
