Dear Ms. George,

I am writing to **OPPOSE** the proposed regulations that hinder Cal's Marina Club ability to waive collection fees in controlled games. These proposed regulations will cause the city of Marina to suffer a sharp reduction in general fund revenue much of which funds police and fire support in our area.

If the Bureau requires that card rooms such as Cal's Marina Club charge fees on every hand played, we will be at a serious disadvantage to tribal casinos and suffer a drastic loss of revenue. Cal's marina club has provided safe, legal gaming for many years while contributing LIVING WAGE JOBS and VITAL TAX REVENUE to Marina. Many of these jobs and most of the revenue will be lost if these regulations become law.

No other gaming business in California is forced by law to charge its customers a fee per wager, and there is no reasonable basis for the Bureau to institute this practice. History has shown that price control **HURT CONSUMERS** and have no place in a progressive state like California. Please do not cede to the special interests proposing these regulations and let our card room set its pricing based on local market conditions.
