


- ³ Physical Theft or Loss: Unencrypted data stored on laptop, thumb drive or other device removed from owner's control. Malware and Hacking: Intentional unauthorized intrusions into computer systems containing data. Misuse: Intentional abuse of access privileges by insider. Errors: Anything unintentionally done or left undone that exposes data to unauthorized individuals.
