**NOTICE OF A PUBLIC HEARING FOR COMMENT ON  
PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO REGULATIONS CONCERNING  
PROPOSITION 65 ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS BROUGHT BY PRIVATE PARTIES**

The Department of Justice (DOJ), also known as the Office of the Attorney General, has proposed to amend Title 11, Division 4, of the California Code of Regulations (CCR) concerning Proposition 65 enforcement actions brought by private parties. The amendments would affect settlement terms, penalty amounts, and attorney's fees in civil actions filed by private persons in the public interest pursuant to the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 (Proposition 65), codified at Health and Safety Code §§ 25249.5-25249.13; § 25180.7; and § 25192.

DOJ has received a written request to hold a public hearing regarding the proposed amendments. The request is made pursuant to Government Code section 11346.8, subdivision (a). Accordingly, a public hearing will be convened on **Monday, November 9, 2015**, in Room 10 of the Elihu M. Harris Building, 1515 Clay Street, Oakland, California, as an opportunity for comment on this proposal. The hearing will begin at 2:00 p.m. and will end when all business is conducted or at 5:00 p.m., whichever is sooner.
