SUBJECT: CLETS Legislative Session Update

AB 354: Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training

Author(s): Rodriguez

Summary:

- Would require POST employees whose job duties require access to criminal offender record information, state summary criminal history information, or information obtained from CLETS to undergo a fingerprint-based state and national criminal history background check,
- Would authorize the commission, Peace Officer Standards Accountability Division, and all persons for whom background checks have been completed and their duties require access to inspect or duplicate any information derived from CLETS, any criminal history information, criminal offender record information, or criminal justice information, or any other sensitive, confidential or privileged information if the commission determines that the information is needed in the course of the commission's duties.

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1 **Chief O'Keefe:** Okay. Good afternoon, everyone. As
2 Vice Chair, I would like to call the meeting to order. I
3 appreciate everyone making the trip today and attending.
4 Next on the agenda will be the roll call. Chris.

5 **Mr. Blair:** Thank you. Chief Mark Bonini.

6 **Chief Bonini:** Present.

7 **Mr. Blair:** Chief Andrew White.

8 **Chief White:** Present.

9 **Mr. Blair:** Chief Jim Munro.

10 **Chief Munro:** Present.

11 **Mr. Blair:** Chief Don Chief O'Keefe.

12 **Chief O'Keefe:** Present.

13 **Mr. Blair:** Chief Veronica Gilliard.

14 **Chief Gilliard:** Present.

15 **Mr. Blair:** Chief Christina Michel.

16 **Chief Michel:** Present.

17 **Mr. Blair:** Chief Rick Hillman. Okay. Thank you. We
18 have a quorum.

19 **Chief O'Keefe:** Thank you, Chris. Next on the item
20 is housekeeping. Restrooms are located in the lobby. When
21 coming into the lobby from the main entrance, go straight
22 through the back to the -- the men's room is on the left.
23 The women's room is on the right.

24 I would like to ask for all members to identify
25 themselves before speaking or making a motion or

1 seconding a motion for the transcript. Also, for the
2 audience members that would like to make a comment,
3 please use the microphone. Public comments will be
4 limited to three minutes per person. Members of the
5 public will not be permitted to yield their allotted time
6 to other members of the public to make comments.

7 Let's see. Next on our agenda is approval of minutes
8 from the October 15th, 2024 meeting. The meeting summary
9 from the October 15th meeting was posted prior to this
10 meeting. Does the committee have any comments on the
11 summary of minutes? Seeing, hearing none, is there any
12 public comment? Seeing, hearing none, I would like to
13 take a vote. Do I have a motion to accept?

14 **Chief White:** Chief White. Motion to approve.

15 **Chief O'Keefe:** Second.

16 **Chief Gilliard:** Chief Gilliard seconds that
17 approval.

18 **Chief O'Keefe:** Okay. Chris, will you do a roll
19 call?

20 **Mr. Blair:** Chief White.

21 **Chief White:** Approve.

22 **Mr. Blair:** Chief Bonini.

23 **Chief Bonini:** Approve.

24 **Mr. Blair:** Chief Munro.

25 **Chief Munro:** Approve.

1 **Mr. Blair:** Chief O'Keefe.

2 **Chief O'Keefe:** Approve.

3 **Mr. Blair:** Chief Gilliard.

4 **Chief Gilliard:** Approve.

5 **Mr. Blair:** Chief Michel.

6 **Chief Michel:** Approve.

7 **Mr. Blair:** And that is all. Thank you. That has

8 passed.

9 **Chief O'Keefe:** Thank you, Chris. Next on our agenda

10 will be the Chairman's Report. The Chair position is

11 still vacant on the committee. Therefore, as Vice Chair,

12 I will be chairing today's meeting. Nominating and voting

13 for a new Chair will happen sometime in the future.

14 For the Chairman's Report, we have a new member

15 introduction on the agenda: Chief Jim Munro representing

16 the League of California Cities. Chris, please read Chief

17 Munro's bio.

18 **Mr. Blair:** Thank you. Serving his community since

19 1998, Jim is the Chief of Police for the Grover Beach

20 Police Department, a progressive police department on the

21 Central Coast of California. Prior to joining the Grover

22 Beach Police Department, Jim spent 23 years with the

23 Clovis Police Department located in the Central Valley of

24 California.

25 As a former dispatcher, detective, SWAT member, and

1 experienced public information officer, Jim enjoys using
2 his experience to help lead a 21st century police
3 organization into the future. Jim has a passion for
4 technology and law enforcement and is recognized as a
5 subject matter expert in the field. He serves on the
6 California Police Chief's Association Technology
7 Committee and has previously served on the Communications
8 Committee.

9 Jim is a graduate of the FBI National Academy, and
10 he has a master's degree in Law Enforcement and Public
11 Safety Leadership from the University of San Diego.
12 Additionally, he is a graduate of Class 403 of the
13 Sherman Block Supervisory Leadership Institute.

14 In his free time, Jim enjoys spending time with his
15 family, traveling, skiing, and playing beach volleyball.

16 **Chief O'Keefe:** Thank you, Chris. Please, everyone,
17 join me in welcoming Chief Munro to the committee. Chief,
18 not to put you on the spot, but any comment you'd like to
19 make?

20 **Chief Munro:** Happy to join this great group. It's
21 great to meet everybody and see some familiar faces in
22 the audience as well. So, I'm looking forward to serving
23 with you, and we'll be seeing each other for quite a
24 while. Thank you.

25 **Chief O'Keefe:** Thank you, Chief. Before moving onto

1 the next item, is there any public comment? Hearing none,
2 seeing none, let's go to our next agenda item. That's the
3 Executive Secretary's Report. I'll turn it over to our
4 Executive Secretary.

5 **Mr. Blair:** Thank you. For the report, we'll be
6 discussing CLETS traffic, misuse statistics, and action
7 items from previous meetings.

8 In the fourth quarter of 2024 between October and
9 December, there were approximately 243 million total
10 messages for inbound and outbound. The monthly average is
11 approximately 81 million, daily average is approximately
12 2.6 million, and the peak day is approximately 3.2
13 million messages.

14 During this quarter, of the total 155 direct
15 connections, this is a list of agencies falling below 95
16 percent uptime for the fourth quarter. Only a single
17 agency fell below the average uptime, averaging 80.14
18 percent. This is Santa Barbara County Sheriff. This is
19 one of their connections. No other agencies use this
20 connection, and the agency is currently working to
21 replace this connection.

22 For CLETS misuse statistics, as of 2/28/25 for the
23 2024 calendar year, we have 1,086 agencies or ORIs
24 submitting the report, 611 not reporting at this time --
25 or as of 2/28/25, 1,058 reporting no misuse, and 28

1 reporting misuse. As of April 4th, 2025, DOJ has received
2 reports for around 300 additional ORIs that are not
3 reflected in these statistics, so those statistics will
4 be included in the Fall 2025 report. DOJ's efforts to
5 obtain misuse reports from the remaining agencies are
6 ongoing.

7 For 2024, there were 107 investigations performed
8 related to CLETS misuse. 32 of those investigations are
9 ending, 39 found no CLETS misuse, 42 violations were
10 found from the 107 investigations performed, 9 resulted
11 in counseling, 3 resulted in reprimand, 12 resulted in
12 training, 8 resulted in suspension, 8 resulted in
13 resignation, 9 resulted in termination, 1 "other" and 4
14 resulted in no action taken. And for the "no action
15 taken" and "other," the agency reporting "other" took
16 several different administrative actions, including
17 counseling and training, and reported them accordingly.
18 For "no action," -- all four instances where no action
19 taken was reported -- CLETS misuse was unfounded.

20 Onto action items. Actions items are requests that
21 staff received from the committee at previous meetings.

22 Action item number one from Chief White from
23 December 14th, '23 and May 14th of '24: DOJ to revisit
24 previous action item that PPPs require that retraining
25 occur if operator misuse was founded. Actions: based on

1 Chief White's suggestion and the requirements in the FBI
2 CJIS Security Policy section AT-2, Literacy Training and
3 Awareness, subsection a(2), DOJ agrees and will add the
4 retraining requirement in section 1.8.2 of the PPPs and
5 present those changes in the fall of 2025.

6 Action item number two from Sheriff Honea from
7 October 15, 2024: DOJ to research what efforts are being
8 made to update 2020 CLETS Less-Than-Full and Full Access
9 Reference Guide so that content matches corresponding
10 CLETS test questions related to when new hires must be
11 tested. Actions: DOJ's Client Services Program has
12 identified the inconsistencies noted and is working to
13 address and update related documentation and testing.
14 Thank you.

15 **Chief O'Keefe:** Thank you, Chris. Before moving on,
16 are there any comments from the committee? Seeing,
17 hearing none, any public comment? Not seeing or hearing
18 any, let's move onto the next agenda item. This will be
19 the CLETS legislative update. John Ponce will be
20 providing the legislative report. Thank you, John.

21 **Mr. Ponce:** Hi. Good afternoon, Vice Chair and
22 committee members. My name is John Ponce. I'm the
23 Legislative Manager for the Department of Justice,
24 California Justice Information Services Division, and I'm
25 here to provide a legislative update for one bill and

1 that is Assembly Bill 354 by Assembly Member Rodriguez.
2 It's the Commission on Peace Officer Standards and
3 Training. Assembly Bill 354 would require employees of
4 the Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training,
5 or POST, whose job duties require access to criminal
6 offender record information, state summary criminal
7 history information, or information obtained from CLETS,
8 to undergo a fingerprint-based state and national
9 criminal history background check. This bill would
10 authorize the commission and the Peace Officer Standards
11 Accountability Division and all persons for whom
12 background checks have been completed and required by
13 their duties, to inspect and duplicate any information
14 derived from CLETS, any criminal history information,
15 criminal offender record information, or criminal justice
16 information, or any other sensitive, confidential, or
17 privileged information, if the commission determines that
18 the information is needed in the course of the
19 commission's duties. The bill has been referred to the
20 Assembly Committee on Public Safety and is awaiting a
21 hearing.

22 **Chief O'Keefe:** Thank you, John. Appreciate that.
23 Does the committee have any questions? Not seeing any or
24 hearing any, is there any public comment on this issue of
25 this report? Not seeing any. Thank you very much, John.

1 Appreciate it.

2 **Mr. Ponce:** Thank you.

3 **Chief O'Keefe:** Okay. Next on the agenda is a vote,
4 a new service request. Chris, please present the request
5 for the new CLETS service.

6 **Mr. Blair:** Thank you. The new request is from Rio
7 Hondo College Campus Police and Safety Department located
8 in Whittier, California in Los Angeles County. The agency
9 is a Class 3 law enforcement subunit of a non-law
10 enforcement agency. The statute of entitlement is
11 California Penal Code 830.32. The primary function of the
12 agency is to enforce criminal traffic and parking laws on
13 and around the campus of Rio Hondo College. Officers are
14 POST certified. They have peace officer powers, and they
15 have 10 to 15 projected sworn personnel. They are seeking
16 access to CLETS through the Los Angeles County Sheriff.
17 Their system has a local area network, wide area network,
18 computer-aided dispatch, and records management system.
19 Their type of connection will be a dedicated landline and
20 wireless with Wi-Fi and cellular. They plan to have three
21 fixed terminals and three mobile terminals. Their network
22 does have internet access, and it meets CLETS Firewall
23 Policy. The level of access they are seeking is "full."
24 Additionally, this agency qualifies for CLETS service and
25 has been assigned an ORI by the FBI. However, the

1 application is still under DOJ review to ensure the
2 agency meets technical, security, and administrative
3 requirements. DOJ's recommendation is approval pending
4 successful DOJ technical, security, and administrative
5 review.

6 **Chief O'Keefe:** Thank you, Chris. The approval for
7 this agency requires a vote. Is there any discussion from
8 the members surrounding this agency? Okay. Before we ask
9 for a motion, is there any public comment on this? Not
10 seeing or hearing any, do I have a motion?

11 **Chief Bonini:** So moved. Chief Bonini.

12 **Chief O'Keefe:** Chief Bonini.

13 **Chief Munro:** Chief Munro. Second.

14 **Chief O'Keefe:** Chief Munro. Second. Chris, can we
15 initiate a roll call vote?

16 **Mr. Blair:** Chief White.

17 **Chief White:** Approve.

18 **Mr. Blair:** Chief Bonini.

19 **Chief Bonini:** Approve.

20 **Mr. Blair:** Chief Munro.

21 **Chief Munro:** Approve.

22 **Mr. Blair:** Chief O'Keefe.

23 **Chief O'Keefe:** Approve.

24 **Mr. Blair:** Chief Gilliard.

25 **Chief Gilliard:** Approve.

1 **Mr. Blair:** Chief Michel.

2 **Chief Michel:** Approve.

3 **Mr. Blair:** Thank you. Passes.

4 **Chief O'Keefe:** Thank you, Chris. Next on our agenda
5 are upgrade applications approved by DOJ. For CLETS
6 upgrade applications approved by DOJ, there are a total
7 of 15 approved since our last meeting. These are
8 presented as information only and do not require a vote
9 by the committee. I will ask members and the public to
10 refer to the agenda where they are listed. Are there any
11 comments from the committee? Seeing none, any comments
12 from the public? Okay. Thank you very much.

13 Let's move onto the next agenda item. Next agenda
14 item is going to be closed session. Before we go into
15 closed session, Chris, please present the information
16 about what we're about to do here.

17 **Mr. Blair:** Pursuant to Government Code section
18 11126 subsection (c)(18), a closed session is being
19 conducted in order to review detailed client reports
20 regarding specific matters that pose a threat or
21 potential threat of criminal activity against CLETS
22 and/or CLETS data transmitted between the DOJ and
23 specific client law enforcement agencies.

24 **Chief O'Keefe:** Thank you, Chris. Could you please
25 initiate a roll call vote --

1 **Mr. Blair:** Yes.

2 **Chief O'Keefe:** -- to move into closed session?

3 **Mr. Blair:** Chief White.

4 **Chief White:** Approve.

5 **Mr. Blair:** Chief Bonini.

6 **Chief Bonini:** Approve.

7 **Mr. Blair:** Chief Munro.

8 **Chief Munro:** Approve.

9 **Mr. Blair:** Chief O'Keefe.

10 **Chief O'Keefe:** Approve.

11 **Mr. Blair:** Chief Gilliard.

12 **Chief Gilliard:** Approve.

13 **Mr. Blair:** Chief Michel.

14 **Chief Michel:** Approve.

15 **Mr. Blair:** That passes.

16 **Chief O'Keefe:** Okay. Thank you. Before we go into

17 closed session, is there any public comment? Okay. Not

18 seeing, hearing anything, we will be in closed session.

19 **(Closed Session)**

20 **Mr. Blair:** -- threat or potential threat of

21 criminal activity against CLETS and/or CLETS data

22 transmitted between the DOJ and specific client law

23 enforcement agencies where the disclosure of these

24 considerations could compromise the security of CLETS or

25 the transmitted CLETS data. The committee evaluated the

1 status of compliance efforts and directed dates by which
2 items need to be resolved.

3 **Chief O'Keefe:** Thank you, Chris. Is there any
4 public comment on this item? Okay. Not seeing or hearing
5 any, let's go to Members' Reports. For Members' Reports,
6 as I call on each of the members, please provide a report
7 for the agency or association which you are representing
8 on the committee. I'm going to start over there.

9 **Chief Michel [for California DMV]:** Nothing to
10 report.

11 **Chief Gilliard [for California DOJ]:** Nothing to
12 report.

13 **Chief O'Keefe:** Just from the Governor's Office of
14 Emergency Services, I think just everything for us has
15 been the Los Angeles fires and continuing through the
16 recovery. I don't know if anybody has seen it, but I was
17 down there several times. It's devastating what happened.
18 So, it just comes down to preparation and we never know
19 when these events are going to happen. It's just tragic
20 what happened down in the Los Angeles area, but we still
21 continue to work with the government, FEMA. The governor
22 is very, very much involved in this and we are trying to
23 bring as much as we can to those communities. Thank you.

24 **Chief Munro:** Chief Munro representing the League of
25 California Cities. No report at this time, but we'll see

1 for the next time. Thank you.

2 **Chief O'Keefe:** Thank you.

3 **Chief Bonini:** Mark Bonini for California State
4 Association of Counties. I don't have anything to report.

5 **Chief White:** Chief White for California Peace
6 Officers Association. Nothing to report.

7 **Chief O'Keefe:** Thank you. Is there any public
8 comment on this item? Okay.

9 Community discussion, open forum, public comment.
10 For this next agenda item, I would like to first open it
11 up to the committee to request any new items members
12 would like to recommend for future committee meetings.
13 Although any committee member may identify a topic of
14 interest, committee members may not substantially discuss
15 or take action on any matter raised during the meeting
16 that is not included on this agenda, except if you decide
17 to place a matter on the agenda for a future meeting. Now
18 I'd like to open it up to any public comment of this item
19 that is not agendized. Okay. Not hearing or seeing
20 anything, the next meeting will be scheduled on or about
21 September -- oh. I'm sorry. I would like to - would the
22 committee like to make any comments? Yes.

23 **Chief White:** Chief White. This will be my last
24 meeting. I have notified the California Peace Officers'
25 Association of my intent to step down from here and allow

1 somebody else to do it. It's been I think almost five
2 years -- four or five years. So, I just wanted to thank
3 everybody up here for serving on this. I also wanted to
4 thank the DOJ staff -- I know up here we kind of work
5 through all this stuff, but on the back end I know
6 there's a tremendous amount of work. There's a super
7 reliable system that I think we should all be proud of
8 and it keeps officers safe, it keeps the community safe.
9 I know through working on this committee and working with
10 the Department of Justice, I've come to find out the
11 incredible skill set that your staff have, the
12 developers, everybody else that makes it all work. On the
13 front end we just put in information, we get the right
14 information at the right time. So, it's been a pleasure
15 and all the best to you as you move forward.

16 **Chief O'Keefe:** Thank you, Chief. I want to thank
17 you for your career in law enforcement. Hopefully you're
18 not leaving. You're retiring?

19 **Chief White:** No.

20 **Chief O'Keefe:** Okay. Just leaving. I can tell you
21 Chief White and I have worked on other committees and he
22 is one of the most learned, if you will, of police chiefs
23 like us. He's very knowledgeable in the areas of
24 technology and whether it's communications, or whether
25 it's what we're doing with CLETS. I just want to thank

1 you very much for everything you've done, you're always a
2 resource, and I know you'll take the call when people
3 have questions. Thank you.

4 Our next meeting will be in September or October of
5 2025. Staff will be looking for a date, so you will be
6 informed on that. I move to adjourn the meeting. Do we
7 need a second, Chris? Okay. We don't need it. Thank you
8 all for coming. Take care. (Recording Ends)

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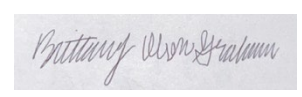
