Dear Sample A. Sample:

Rex Signature Services (“RSS”) is writing to inform you of an event that may have impacted some of your information. Although there is currently no indication of identity theft or fraud in relation to this event, we are providing you with information about the event, our response to it, and resources available to you to help protect your information, should you feel it appropriate to do so.

**What Happened?** On April 18, 2024, RSS became aware that certain computer systems in its environment were inaccessible. We promptly took steps to secure our systems and launched an investigation to determine the full nature and scope of the event. Our investigation determined that an unknown actor gained access to certain RSS systems between April 9, 2024 and April 18, 2024 and likely accessed and/or acquired information on our systems.

We then undertook a review of the involved files to determine what information was contained therein and to whom it related. On or about September 25, 2024, our review determined that information relating to you was present within the involved files.

**What Information Was Involved?** Our investigation determined that your name and Social Security number were contained in the impacted files. Other information potentially impacted includes driver’s license number, state identification card number, tax identification number, passport number, military identification number, other unique governmental identification number, and limited medical information. At this time, we are not aware of anyone experiencing fraud as a result of the event.

**What We Are Doing.** The privacy and security of information in our possession is one of our highest priorities. Upon learning of this event, we immediately took steps to ensure the security of our systems, investigate the event, and report the event to federal law enforcement. Additionally, we are notifying state regulators as required. As part of our commitment to the privacy of information in our care, since the event we have implemented and continue to implement technical security measures to strengthen the security of our systems. As an additional precaution, we are offering you access to twenty-four (24) months of complimentary credit monitoring and identity restoration services through Experian.

**What You Can Do.** We encourage you to remain vigilant against incidents of identity theft and fraud by reviewing your account statements and monitoring your free credit reports for suspicious activity and to detect errors. You may also review the information contained in the enclosed *Steps You Can Take to Help Protect Personal Information*. There you will also find more information on the credit monitoring and identity restoration services we are making available to you. RSS will cover the cost of these services; however, you will need to complete the enrollment process. Enrollment instructions are enclosed with this letter.

Consumers have the right to place an initial or extended “fraud alert” on a credit file at no cost. An initial fraud alert is a 1-year alert that is placed on a consumer’s credit file. Upon seeing a fraud alert display on a consumer’s credit file, a business is required to take steps to verify the consumer’s identity before extending new credit. If consumers are the victim of identity theft, they are entitled to an extended fraud alert, which is a fraud alert lasting seven years. Should consumers wish to place a fraud alert, please contact any of the three major credit reporting bureaus listed below.

As an alternative to a fraud alert, consumers have the right to place a “credit freeze” on a credit report, which will prohibit a credit bureau from releasing information in the credit report without the consumer’s express authorization. The credit freeze is designed to prevent credit, loans, and services from being approved in a consumer’s name without consent. However, consumers should be aware that using a credit freeze to take control over who gets access to the personal and financial information in their credit report may delay, interfere with, or prohibit the timely approval of any subsequent request or application they make regarding a new loan, credit, mortgage, or any other account involving the extension of credit. Pursuant to federal law, consumers cannot be charged to place or lift a credit freeze on their credit report. To request a credit freeze, individuals may need to provide some or all of the following information:

1. Full name (including middle initial as well as Jr., Sr., II, III, etc.);
2. Social Security number;
3. Date of birth;
4. Addresses for the prior two to five years;
5. Proof of current address, such as a current utility bill or telephone bill;
6. A legible photocopy of a government-issued identification card (state driver’s license or ID card, etc.); and
7. A copy of either the police report, investigative report, or complaint to a law enforcement agency concerning identity theft if they are a victim of identity theft.
