RE: Notice of Potential Privacy Breach

Dear Kearny Mesa Infiniti Customer:

The security and privacy of your personal information is highly important to us. This letter is to inform you of a potential unauthorized access and disclosure of your personal information. One Kearny Mesa Infiniti Customer alleges that a former employee of Kearny Mesa Infiniti improperly accessed and used the customer's personal information to obtain prescription medications. This individual is no longer employed by Kearny Mesa Infiniti. Criminal charges have been filed against this individual and the San Diego County Sheriff's office is investigating the matter further.

Based on our internal review and the private nature of the information that may have been improperly accessed, we are notifying any individual who provided us with their personal information during the accused individual's employment. The personal information may have included the following: full name, address, driver's license information, social security number, telephone number, and date of birth.

We do not have any information that leads us to believe that your personal information has been improperly accessed or disclosed by the accused individual. We are providing you with this notice to advise you of a potential unauthorized disclosure of your personal information and to advise you of what you can do to protect yourself from the risk of identity theft.

You may want to consider placing a free fraud alert on your credit file. To do this, make a toll-free call to any one of the three credit bureaus listed below (Experian, Trans Union, or Equifax). You will get instructions on how to get a free copy of your credit reports and how to have a free fraud alert placed on your credit file. This fraud alert remains in effect for 90 days, but can be renewed by contacting the credit bureaus. A fraud alert can help prevent an identity thief from using your personal information to open new accounts. All three credit bureaus allow you to file a fraud alert online.

After you contact one of the credit bureaus, you will soon receive a letter from each bureau confirming placement of the fraud alert and telling you how to order a free copy of your credit report. You may also obtain a free copy of your credit report annually by visiting www.annualcreditreport.com or calling 1-877-322-8228. When you get the report, look for personal information, such as home address and social security number that are not accurate. If you see anything that is incorrect or that you do not understand, call the credit-reporting agency at the telephone number on the report.

If you find suspicious activity on your credit report, you will need to contact the creditors involved. You should also report the crime to your local police or sheriff's department and file a police report of identity theft. Get a copy of the police report. You may need to give copies of the police report to creditors to clear up the inaccuracies.
