We are contacting you in connection with your previous employment at an Informa company or a business that has since become part of the company.

Like a number of businesses around the world, Informa was recently affected by a security incident at Oracle, a third-party software supplier. We took prompt action and a number of additional steps in response. This letter includes details of actions you may want to consider taking to help further protect your information.

**What happened**

One of our third-party technology providers, Oracle, was recently involved in a security incident that affected its E-Business Suite software, as was reported in the press. This went on to impact many companies globally that use the software.

As a result of the incident, in November 2025, we identified that an unauthorised party had temporarily accessed and copied some records held on an Informa Oracle system, including historical employment-related information. This unauthorised access took place between August 11, 2025 and August 18, 2025, before the software vulnerability had been publicly disclosed by Oracle.

As soon as we became aware of the unauthorised access, third-party forensics experts were engaged to secure the system and conduct a full investigation. We undertook a robust review to confirm the data involved and notified relevant authorities, including law enforcement.

There is no evidence that your personal information has been misused for purposes of fraud or identity theft, and we have taken steps to minimise the chance of this happening.

**What information was involved**

Our review determined that some of the data involved included personal information you provided in the past and as part of your employment, including your name, [Extra1]

We are contacting you in connection with your relationship to Informa, which may be because you have applied for a job at one of our businesses in the past, for example.

Like a number of companies around the world, Informa was recently affected by a security incident at Oracle, a third-party software supplier. We took prompt action and a number of additional steps in response. This letter includes details of actions you may want to consider taking to help further protect your information.

**What happened**

One of our third-party technology providers, Oracle, was recently involved in a security incident that affected its E-Business Suite software, as was reported in the press. This went on to impact many companies around the world that use the software.

As a result of the incident, in November 2025, we identified that an unauthorised party had temporarily accessed and copied some records held on an Informa Oracle system. This unauthorised access took place between August 11, 2025 and August 18, 2025, before the software vulnerability had been publicly disclosed by Oracle.

As soon as we became aware of the unauthorised access, third-party forensics experts were engaged to secure the system and conduct a full investigation. We undertook a robust review to confirm the data involved and notified relevant authorities, including law enforcement.

There is no evidence that your personal information has been misused for purposes of fraud or identity theft, and we have taken steps to minimise the chance of this happening.

**What information was involved**

Our review determined that some of the data involved included personal information shared with us, including your name, [Extra1]

**What we are doing**

We took prompt action to secure the system involved. We also continue to monitor for evolving cybersecurity threats and enhance our protections in response.

While there is no evidence that your personal information has been misused for purposes of fraud or identity theft, and we have taken steps to minimise the chance of this happening, we wanted to provide additional information on measures you may wish to consider taking.
