RE: NOTICE OF DATA BREACH

Dear <<First and Last Name>>:

We are writing with an important message involving a security incident relating to the LACBA.org website. We learned on June 11, 2020, that beginning on or around May 10, 2020, unauthorized cybercriminals placed malicious code on our website. The malicious code copied member payment card information and other information as it was typed on our website, and then transferred it to a server operated by the cybercriminals. These cybercriminals did not just target LACBA – we understand that they attacked many bar associations and other professional organizations. Upon learning of this issue, we immediately took steps to eliminate any further theft of our members' personal information, and we began an internal investigation. We have also retained an independent forensic firm. The following details are based on our current understanding of this incident, but may be subject to change.

What happened?

On June 11, 2020, a financial institution alerted LACBA that there was malicious code present on specific portions of its website, LACBA.org. Further investigation of the incident established that the malicious code was present at least as early as May 10, 2020.

What information was involved?

Our internal investigation indicates that the information compromised as a result of this incident includes your first and last name, 16-digit payment card number(s), username, password, attorney bar number (if used as a username), and any other information you typed into the website at that time.

What we are doing.

We have eliminated the code that enabled unauthorized access to the personal information, and have engaged an independent forensic firm to review our systems and recommend any additional necessary changes.

What You Can do.

If you have not already done so, you should change your LACBA.org password and your password for all other online accounts for which you use the same user name or email address and password.

We recommend that you contact the financial institution that issued the payment card you used on LACBA.org and alert them to the compromise of your payment card information. We also recommend that you review your account statements for any suspicious or unauthorized charges between at least as early as May 10, 2020 and the present, and to contact your financial institution if you identify any such charges.

In addition, we recommend that you regularly review statements from your accounts and periodically obtain your credit report from one or more of the national credit reporting companies. 
