

1 PLAINTIFF, THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA, based on 2 information and belief, alleges as follows: 3 PLAINTIFF 1. Plaintiff, THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA ("Plaintiff"), brings this 4 5 action by and through Kamala D. Harris, the Attorney General of the State of California 6 ("Attorney General"), and by the District Attorneys of Alameda, El Dorado, Merced, Nevada, 7 Placer, San Bernardino, and Stanislaus Counties ("District Attorneys"). 8 Pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 25145.4, 25181, and 25182 the Attorney 2. 9 General and the District Attorneys may bring a civil action in the name of the People of the State 10 of California to enjoin any violation of Chapter 6.5 of Division 20 of the California Health and 11 Safety Code (hereinafter "Chapter 6.5") and seek civil penalties for violations of the provisions of 12 Chapter 6.5. 3. Pursuant to California Health and Safety Code section 25299.02, the Attorney 13 General and the District Attorneys may bring a civil action in the name of the People of the State 14 15 of California for violations of state law dealing with the underground storage of hazardous 16 substances, underground storage tanks ("USTs"), and UST systems, as set forth in Chapter 6.7 of 17 Division 20 of the California Health and Safety Code (hereinafter "Chapter 6.7"). 18 4. Pursuant to California Health and Safety Code section 25299.01, the Attorney 19 General and the District Attorneys may apply to a superior court for an injunction or an order 20 directing compliance against any person who has engaged in, is engaged in, or is about to engage 21 in any acts or practices which violate Chapter 6.7. 22 Pursuant to California Health and Safety Code sections 25516 and 25516.1, the 5. Attorney General and the District Attorneys may bring an action for civil penalties for violations 23 24 of Health and Safety Code sections 25503.5 to 25505, inclusive, or sections 25508 to 25520, 25 inclusive, and to enjoin a violation of Chapter 6.95 of Division 20 of the Health and Safety Code 26 (hereinafter "Chapter 6.95"). 27 6. Pursuant to California Business and Professions Code sections 17203, 17204, and 28 17206, the Attorney General and the District Attorneys may bring actions in the name of the 3

People of the State of California in a superior court for an injunction against any person who
 engages, had engaged, or proposes to engage in unfair competition and for civil penalties for each
 act of unfair competition.

7. Plaintiff brings this action without prejudice to, and independent of, and without
prejudice to any other existing action or claims which Plaintiff may have based on separate,
independent and unrelated violations of Chapters 6.5, 6.7, or 6.95 of Division 20 of the Health
and Safety Code by the Defendants and on facts which are not alleged in this Complaint.

8. Plaintiff alleges that certain claims alleged in this case are related to certain specific
 9 claims that were at issue and resolved in a final judgment in the action of *People v. Atlantic* 10 *Richfield Company, et al.*, Sacramento County Superior Court, Case No. 03AS05452.

DEFENDANTS

9. Defendant Phillips 66 Company is a Delaware corporation, duly registered with the
 California Secretary of State.

15 10. Defendant ConocoPhillips Company is a Delaware corporation, duly registered with
16 the California Secretary of State.

17 11. On or about May 1, 2012, Defendant ConocoPhillips Company reorganized its
18 corporate structure, and the successor entity for liability for ownership or operation of
19 underground storage tanks in California became Phillips 66 Company. These entities are referred
20 to herein as "Defendants."

21 12. At all times herein relevant, Defendants owned and operated underground storage
22 tanks and underground storage tanks systems to store motor vehicle fuel for retail sale at no less
23 than 560 sites or facilities located throughout California.

24 13. Plaintiff is informed and believes that Defendants have sold, transferred, or otherwise
25 divested themselves of all interest in all but six underground storage tank and underground
26 storage tank systems sites or facilities in California.

14. In this Complaint when reference is made to any act or omission of Defendants, such
allegations shall include the acts and omissions of owners, officers, directors, agents, employees,

contractors, vendors, affiliates, and representatives of Defendants while acting within the course
 and scope of their employment or agency on behalf of Defendants.

3 15. The identities of DOES 1-10 are unknown to Plaintiff at this time. At such time as
4 the identities of DOE defendants become known, Plaintiff will amend this Complaint
5 accordingly.

6 16. At all times relevant to the facts alleged herein, the Defendants were legally
7 responsible for compliance with the provisions of the Health and Safety Code including Chapter
8 6.5, 6.7, and 6.95 of Division 20, and the corresponding implementing regulations, at Defendants'
9 sites located in California in connection with the ownership and operation of the facilities.

VENUE AND JURISDICTION

The Defendants at all times mentioned herein have transacted business within, *inter alia*, Alameda County and the Counties of El Dorado, Merced, Nevada, Placer, San Bernardino,
 and Stanislaus, State of California. The violations of law hereinafter described have been
 committed within, *inter alia*, Alameda County and the Counties of El Dorado, Merced, Nevada,
 Placer, San Bernardino, and Stanislaus, State of California.

16 18. Venue is proper in Alameda County pursuant to Health and Safety Code section
17 25280 *et seq.* in that certain of the violations alleged in the Complaint occurred in this County,
18 and that the other violations alleged in the Complaint, which occurred at locations outside this
19 County, are related to such violations and the penalties and injunctive relief sought by Plaintiff in
20 this action. This Court has jurisdiction pursuant to Article 6, section 10 of the California
21 Constitution.

GENERAL ALLEGATIONS

19. Plaintiff is informed and believes and thereupon alleges that on and after November
18, 2006, and continuing through the present, Defendants have engaged in actions and omissions
involving: (a) the operation and maintenance of underground storage tanks ("USTs") and UST
systems, and, (b) the handling of hazardous wastes and hazardous substances generated by
operation of USTs, UST systems, and motor vehicle maintenance, at Defendants' facilities in
California in violation of Health and Safety Code, Division 20, Chapters 6.5, 6.7, and 6.95.
