1 Pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure sections 580 and 585, California Rules of
2 Court, rule 3.1800, and Los Angeles Superior Court Local Rules, rules 3.200 and 3.201, the Court
3 hereby enters final judgment in favor of Plaintiffs, the People of the State of California, by and
4 through Xavier Becerra, Attorney General ("Attorney General"), and by and through Barbara A.
5 Lee, Director, Department of Toxic Substances Control (collectively, "the People"), against
6 Defendants Luxy Accessory, Inc. and Hyun Sook Kim ("Defendants") as follows:

7 1. Defendants are ordered to pay civil penalties in the total amount of \$1,626,000, as
8 follows:

9 a. Defendants shall pay \$117,500 in civil penalties for violations of Health and
10 Safety Code section 25214.2, subdivisions (a), (b), and (d) of California's Metal-
11 Containing Jewelry Law ("Jewelry Law"), pursuant to Health and Safety Code section
12 25214.3(b)(1);

13 b. Defendants shall pay \$117,500 in civil penalties for violations of section
14 25214.3.1, subdivision (a) of the Jewelry Law, pursuant to Health and Safety Code section
15 25214.3(b)(1);

16 c. Defendants shall pay \$117,500 in civil penalties for violations of section
17 25214.3.1, subdivisions (b) and (c) of the Jewelry Law, pursuant to Health and Safety
18 Code section 25214.3(b)(1);

19 d. Defendants shall pay \$37,500 in civil penalties for violations of Business and
20 Professions Code section 17500, pursuant to Business and Professions Code sections
21 17500, 17536(a);

22 e. Defendants shall pay \$390,000 in civil penalties for violations of the Unfair
23 Competition Law, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 17206, subd. (a);
24 and

25 f. Defendants shall pay \$846,000 in civil penalties for violations of an injunction
26 issued under the Unfair Competition Law, pursuant to Business and Professions Code
27 section 17207, subd. (a).

28 2. Payment of costs and disbursements have been waived.
