Pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure sections 580 and 585, California Rules of Court, rule 3.1800, and Los Angeles Superior Court Local Rules, rules 3.200 and 3.201, the Court hereby enters final judgment in favor of Plaintiffs, the People of the State of California, by and through Xavier Becerra, Attorney General ("Attorney General"), and by and through Barbara A. Lee, Director, Department of Toxic Substances Control (collectively, "the People"), against Defendants Luxy Accessory, Inc. and Hyun Sook Kim ("Defendants") as follows:

- 1. Defendants are ordered to pay civil penalties in the total amount of \$1,626,000, as follows:
 - a. Defendants shall pay \$117,500 in civil penalties for violations of Health and Safety Code section 25214.2, subdivisions (a), (b), and (d) of California's Metal-Containing Jewelry Law ("Jewelry Law"), pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 25214.3(b)(1);
 - b. Defendants shall pay \$117,500 in civil penalties for violations of section 25214.3.1, subdivision (a) of the Jewelry Law, pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 25214.3(b)(1);
 - c. Defendants shall pay \$117,500 in civil penalties for violations of section 25214.3.1, subdivisions (b) and (c) of the Jewelry Law, pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 25214.3(b)(1);
 - d. Defendants shall pay \$37,500 in civil penalties for violations of Business and Professions Code section 17500, pursuant to Business and Professions Code sections 17500, 17536(a);
 - e. Defendants shall pay \$390,000 in civil penalties for violations of the Unfair Competition Law, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 17206, subd. (a); and
 - f. Defendants shall pay \$846,000 in civil penalties for violations of an injunction issued under the Unfair Competition Law, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 17207, subd. (a).
 - 2. Payment of costs and disbursements have been waived.

3. Defendants and all of their agents must comply with all statutes and regulations
applicable to the manufacture, distribution, or sale of jewelry in California.
