Statute of Limitations – Tolling for Documents Seized from Lawyer Taken to Court for Hearing

(P.C. 1524(c)(1)(C)

From March 4, 2010, until September 28, 2012, the period of limitations to commence this action was tolled pursuant to Penal Code section 1524(c)(1)(C). On March 15, 2010, defendant Nick Ayyoub and attorney Safaie filed in this court an "Ex Parte Application For An Order Recalling Or Modifying The Search Warrant Served March 4, 2010, Ordering Immediate Access To Business And Legal Records, And Ordering Return Of Property Seized But Not Designated In The Warrant And Patently Privileged Material To Wit Bankruptcy Records." The motion invoked claims of privilege pursuant to Penal Code section 1524(c) and tolled the period of limitations from the date of the search warrant on March 4, 2010 until the issue was resolved on September 28, 2012, when the Honorable Mary E. Fuller issued a final ruling and released all seized documents for review by investigators.
