unknown to commit the crime of making campaign contributions in a false name and to avoid campaign contribution limits, in violation of Government Code sections 84301, 84302, and, 85301, misdemeanors, that pursuant to and for the purpose of carrying out the objects and purposes of the aforesaid conspiracy, the said defendants thereafter committed the following overt act and acts at and in the County of San Bernardino:

OVERT ACT NO. 1

On or about January 15, 2002, Nicola Cacucciolo makes a contribution to the Bob Dutton for Assembly Committee.

OVERT ACT NO. 2

On or about June 17, 2002, James Lloyd Deremiah makes a contribution to the Bob Dutton for Assembly Committee.

OVERT ACT NO. 3

On or about October 21, 2002, Nicola Cacucciolo makes a contribution to the Bill Leonard for Board of Equalization Committee.

OVERT ACT NO. 4

On or about January 23, 2003, Mark Anthony Leggio files a California Fair Political Practices Committee Form 461.

OVERT ACT NO. 5

On or about June 30, 2003, Nick Vito Cacucciolo signs a Mark Christopher check which is deposited into the account of Nicola and Annette Cacucciolo.

OVERT ACT NO. 6

On July 25, 2003, Mark Anthony Leggio signs a Mark Christopher Auto Center check for a contribution to the Pirozzi for Assembly Committee.

OVERT ACT NO. 7

On July 5, 2006, Mark Anthony Leggio issues a \$10,000 check to Nick Vito Cacucciolo

OVERT ACT NO. 8

On July 5, 2006, Nick Vito Cacucciolo issues a \$3,300 check to Miyuki LeMay and a \$3,300 check to Lee Jones in reimbursement for contributions to the Committee to Elect Brenda Salas.

COUNT 2

For a further and separate cause of action, being a different offense from but connected

in its commission with the charge set forth in count 1 hereof, the Criminal Grand Jury of the County of San Bernardino by this Indictment hereby accuses MARK ANTHONY LEGGIO of a violation of Penal Code section 115, a felony, in that on or about January 25, 2003, he did wilfully, unlawfully, and knowingly procure and offer a false and forged instrument, to wit: a Major Donor and Independent Committee Campaign Statement, California Form 461, which instrument, if genuine, might be filed, registered, and recorded, under any law of this state and the United States.

COUNT 3

For a further and separate cause of action, being a different offense from but connected in its commission with the charges set forth in counts 1 and 2 hereof, the Criminal Grand Jury of the County of San Bernardino by this Indictment hereby accuses MARK ANTHONY LEGGIO of a violation of Penal Code section 118, a felony, in that on or about January 25, 2003, in the County of San Bernardino, State of California, he being person who testified, declared, deposed, and certified under penalty of perjury in a case in which such testimony, declaration, deposition, and certification is permitted by law under penalty of perjury, to wit, Major Donor and Independent Committee Campaign Statement, California Form 461, did wilfully state as true a material matter which he knew to be false, to wit: that information within the Major Donor and Independent Committee Campaign Statement, California Form 461, for Mark Christopher Auto Center, Mountain View Chevrolet and SCM&C Expansion was true and complete.

COUNT 4

For a further and separate cause of action, being a different offense from but connected in its commission with the charges set forth in counts 1 through 3 hereof, the Criminal Grand Jury of the County of San Bernardino by this Indictment hereby accuses MARK ANTHONY LEGGIO of a violation of Penal Code section 115, a felony, in that on or about July 25, 2003, he did wilfully, unlawfully, and knowingly procure and offer a false and forged instrument, to wit: a Major Donor and Independent Committee Campaign Statement, California Form 461, which instrument, if genuine, might be filed, registered, and recorded, under any law of this state and the United States.

COUNT 5

For a further and separate cause of action, being a different offense from but connected in its commission with the charges set forth in counts 1 through 4 hereof, the Criminal Grand Jury of the County of San Bernardino by this Indictment hereby accuses

MARK ANTHONY LEGGIO of a violation of Penal Code section 118, a felony, in that on or about January 25, 2003, in the County of San Bernardino, State of California, he being person who testified, declared, deposed, and certified under penalty of perjury in a case in which such testimony, declaration, deposition, and certification is permitted by law under penalty of perjury, to wit, Major Donor and Independent Committee Campaign Statement, California Form 461, did wilfully state as true a material matter which he knew to be false, to wit: that the information within the Major Donor and Independent Committee Campaign Statement, California Form 461, for Mark Christopher Auto Center was true and complete.

COUNT 6

For a further and separate cause of action, being a different offense from but connected in its commission with the charges set forth in counts 1 through 5 hereof, the Criminal Grand Jury of the County of San Bernardino by this Indictment hereby accuses MARK ANTHONY LEGGIO of a violation of Penal Code section 115, a felony, in that on or about January 28, 2004, he did wilfully, unlawfully, and knowingly procure and offer a false and forged instrument, to wit: a Major Donor and Independent Committee Campaign Statement, California Form 461, which instrument, if genuine, might be filed, registered, and recorded, under any law of this state and the United States.

COUNT 7

For a further and separate cause of action, being a different offense from but connected in its commission with the charges set forth in counts 1 through 6 hereof, the Criminal Grand Jury of the County of San Bernardino by this Indictment hereby accuses MARK ANTHONY LEGGIO of a violation of Penal Code section 118, a felony, in that on or about January 28, 2004, in the County of San Bernardino, State of California, he being person who testified, declared, deposed, and certified under penalty of perjury in a case in which such testimony, declaration, deposition, and certification is permitted by law under penalty of perjury, to wit, Major Donor and Independent Committee Campaign Statement, California Form 461, did wilfully state as true a material matter which he knew to be false, to wit: that the information within the Major Donor and Independent Committee Campaign Statement, California Form 461, for Mark Christopher Auto Center was true and complete.

It is further alleged that the allegations set forth in Counts 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 were not discovered and could not have been discovered with the exercise of reasonable diligence on or before December 1, 2006. During the latter part of November 2006 Investigator Stephen Kirby of the Riverside County District Attorney's Office began an investigation into

possible campaign contribution irregularities. During the investigation he came across indications of a pattern of contributions to a few campaign committees by the same individuals who reportedly worked at Mark Christopher Auto Center or Mountain View Chevrolet.

On January 27, 2007, he met with James Deremiah, Nicola Cacucciolo, Annette Cacucciolo, Nick Cacucciolo and Kristy Cacucciolo after which he had sufficient information to obtain a search warrant for bank records which was served on January 31, 2007. Prior to this time there was insufficient evidence to establish that a crime had occurred or that any individual was engaged in criminal conduct.

COUNT 8

For a further and separate cause of action, being a different offense from but connected in its commission with the charges set forth in counts 1 through 7 hereof, the Criminal Grand Jury of the County of San Bernardino by this Indictment hereby accuses MARK ANTHONY LEGGIO AND NICOLA CACUCCIOLO of a violation of Government Code section 84301, a misdemeanor, in that on or about June 29, 2004, in the County of San Bernardino, State of California, they did directly and indirectly contribute to the Wapner for Assembly Committee by a name other than the name by which the said defendant was identified for legal purposes, to wit: by the name of Nicola Cacucciolo.

COUNT 9

For a further and separate cause of action, being a different offense from but connected in its commission with the charges set forth in counts 1 through 8 hereof, the Criminal Grand Jury of the County of San Bernardino by this Indictment hereby accuses MARK ANTHONY LEGGIO AND NICOLA CACUCCIOLO of a violation of Government Code section 84301, a misdemeanor, in that on or about June 29, 2004, in the County of San Bernardino, State of California, they did directly and indirectly contribute to the Wapner for Assembly Committee by a name other than the name by which the said defendant was identified for legal purposes, to wit: by the name of Annette Cacucciolo.

Code section 84301, a misdemeanor, in that on or about June 29, 2004, in the County of San Bernardino, State of California, they did directly and indirectly contribute to the Wapner for Assembly Committee by a name other than the name by which the said defendant was identified for legal purposes, to wit: by the name of James Deremiah.

For a further and separate cause of action, being a different offense from but connected in its commission with the charges set forth in counts 1 through 35 hereof, the Criminal Grand Jury of the County of San Bernardino by this Indictment hereby accuses MARK ANTHONY LEGGIO of a violation of Government Code section 85301, a misdemeanor, in that on and between March 6, 2006, through and including June 29, 2006, in the County of San Bernardino, State of California, he did wilfully and unlawfully make to any candidate for elective state office a contribution totaling more than three thousand three hundred dollars (\$3,300) per election, to wit: Committee to Elect Brenda Salas.

COUNT 37

For a further and separate cause of action, being a different offense from but connected in its commission with the charges set forth in counts 1 through 36 hereof, the Criminal Grand Jury of the County of San Bernardino by this Indictment hereby accuses MARK ANTHONY LEGGIO of a violation of Penal Code section 115, a felony, in that on or about July 27, 2006, he did wilfully, unlawfully, and knowingly procure and offer a false and forged instrument, to wit: a Major Donor and Independent Committee Campaign Statement, California Form 461, which instrument, if genuine, might be filed, registered, and recorded, under any law of this state and the United States.
