TO THE HONORABLE SECRETARY OF STATE OF CALIFORNIA

We, the undersigned, registered, qualified voters of California, residents of Tulare County hereby propose a statute relating to pupil testing, and petition the Secretary of State to submit the same to the voters of California for their adoption or rejection at the next succeeding statewide general election or at any special

statewide election held prior to that general election or otherwise as provided by law. The proposed statute reads as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 60640.5 is added to the Education Code, to read:

- 60640.5. (a) The parent or guardian of each pupil in grades 2 to 11, inclusive, who, within a school year, achieves a score of at least proficient pursuant to subdivision (b) on all portions of the standards-based achievement test provided for in Section 60642.5 shall receive a grant of one thousand dollars (\$1,000).
- (b) The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall determine the scores received by the pupil that qualify for this purpose as proficient on the standards-based achievement test provided for in Section 60642.5.
- (c) That amount sufficient to fund the grants required by subdivision (a) is hereby annually appropriated from the General Fund to the Superintendent of Public Instruction.
