

TO: ALL CALIFORNIA LAW ENFORCEMENT TELECOMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM (CLETS) USERS

The purpose of this information bulletin is to inform all law enforcement agencies (LEAs) that pursuant to National Crime Information Center (NCIC) Policy 6.6, the California Department of Justice has updated the Wanted Persons System (WPS) to allow for the use of the code Detained (DETN) in the Extradition (EXT) field when placing an NCIC Locate on an **out-of-state** warrant in the NCIC Wanted Person File. This update does not impact how users place Locates on California WPS records.

According to NCIC Policy 6.6.3, use of the code "DETN" means that the subject is being detained and will be returned to the wanting LEA upon release. The DETN code must be included in the NCIC locate message under either of the following circumstances:

- The locating LEA intends to hold the subject on local charges, or
- The wanted person has been found in a government holding facility, such as in prison

Programming changes will be required for LEAs utilizing local systems for data entry to accommodate this update; however, the string format may be used as an alternative. If your LEA utilizes LEAWEB, no programming changes will be necessary.
