TO: ALL CALIFORNIA LAW ENFORCEMENT TELECOMMUNICATIONS (CLETS) USERS

Department of Justice will be updating the California Restraining and Protective Order System (CARPOS) effective **January 1, 2026**. The update will enhance CARPOS by adding a new optional field to allow the entry of restraining order terms prohibiting the restrained person from attempting to dissuade or prevent any victim or witness from attending a hearing, testifying, or making a report to law enforcement.

Below is the verbiage for the Dissuade Victim or Witness Field (DSW) field when "Y" is entered.

DSW

THE RESTRAINED PERSON MUST NOT ATTEMPT TO OR ACTUALLY PREVENT OR DISSUADE ANY VICTIM OR WITNESS FROM ATTENDING A HEARING, TESTIFYING, OR MAKING A REPORT TO ANY LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY OR PERSON.

Programming changes will be required for agencies using local systems for data entry to accommodate the updates; however, the string format may be used as an alternative. For agencies utilizing LEAWEB, no programming changes will be necessary.
