Bureau Requirements

Advertising

Bay 101 Casino may advertise various names for this gaming activity. Should the Casino advertise a different name, the BGC ID (GEGA-000421) shall be referenced on all advertisements relating to the gaming activity.

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for the Poker Tournament and associated gaming activities, including but not limited to the following, shall be prominently displayed in Bay 101 Casino at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play:

- How a player may enter the tournament.
- The game(s) offered during the play of the tournament.
- The fees charged for entering the tournament, including a description for each fee charged and whether it shall be retained by Bay 101 Casino, added directly into the tournament prize pool, or any other method of retention or distribution.
- The amount of tournament chips that will be awarded to each player upon entry into the tournament.
- The tournament prize structure offered and the number of players that will be paid.
- When the patron(s) will be paid and the manner in which they will be paid.
- Any other restrictions that apply to the Poker Tournament.

Gaming Activities Played with Tournaments

- Advertising for bounties will be prominently posted with the prize amount and how the bounties will be funded.
- The bounties will be paid during the tournament or as soon as their tournament play ends.
- In the event of a tie, the bounty will be split among the players with the highest hands.
- The bounty money may be deducted from the tournament prize pool or may be guaranteed and paid for by Bay 101 Casino.
- If the designated bounty target does not get eliminated from the tournament, they will keep the bounty.
- Patrons shall be given notice of how the activity prior to the tournament being offered.
- Tournament staff collects, verifies and copies current ID's of winning players and enters them into the tournament system.
- Winning players will exchange their chips at the cage for cash or a check.

Tournament Log

Bay 101 Casino will maintain a completed tournament log for at least seven years. These logs shall be maintained in a paper or electronic format. The cardroom shall also retain and make available the most recent three months of tournament logs for inspection by a representative of the Bureau during all hours of operation. Upon request of the Bureau, a licensee shall provide the Bureau with copies of such tournament logs. Tournament logs shall contain the following information:

- The name of the gambling establishment.
- The day, date, time and name advertised for the tournament.
- The total number of tables used.
- The names of the controlled games offered.
- The method of entry.

Poker Tournaments

- The number and amount of rebuys and/or add-ons offered.
- The number of participants.
- The name of each fee charged, amount of each fee charged, total number of each fee collected and cumulative amount of collected.
- The source of all funds for the tournament prize pool.
- The amount of the prize pool.
- The amount and reason for any deduction from the total collected prize pool.
- The name of gaming activities offered (when applicable):
 - Funding source.
 - Prize amount.
 - Total number of prizes awarded.
 - Total amount deducted from the prize pool (when applicable).
- The results of the tournament, including the amount paid out and amount paid for each place in the tournament.
- The signature of casino staff responsible for administering the tournament.

Eligible Controlled Games

The controlled games that may be played during Poker Games Tournaments at the Bay 101 Casino shall only be those as listed below. All controlled game rules shall be played as previously approved by the Bureau.

Gaming Activities Offered During Tournament Play

Bounties

Bounties pay a full buy-in to the tournament. Bounties are given a promotional/appearance fee so their likeness can be used for the promotion. Bounty targets are tournament players who are selected prior to the start of the tournament. Bounty targets are selected based on popular personalities in the world of poker. During the play of a Shooting Star Tournament only, either player or multiple players in a tournament may be designated as bounty targets. If a bounty target loses all of their tournament chips during a hand of play and is eliminated from the tournament, the winner of that hand shall win a pre-determined and designated amount of money ranging in value between \$5 and \$5,000.

Tournament Entry

- Tournament entry is open to all customers.
- The specific structure shall be in any and all advertisements and must be made available to patrons prior to the start of the tournament. The structure of a tournament shall not change once sign-ups begin.

Poker Tournaments

- **Promotional materials shall not advertise gender-based discounts nor imply gender-based entrance policy.**
- Patrons may enter a tournament by paying the buy-in and entry fee. All fees, prices charged, and the amount of tournament chips provided shall be equal and posted for all players.
- Entry may be earned by winning a previous tournament, playing in a daily tournament, and winning entry into a satellite event. All gaming activities and /or promotions shall be approved by the Bureau prior to being offered for tournament play.
- More than one method of entry for a specific tournament may be utilized.

Tournament Structure

Buy-In	\$0 - \$500,000
Re-Buy	\$1 - \$500,000

Add-On	\$1 - \$500,000
Number of Add-Ons	0 – 99 Times
Entry Fee*	\$0 - \$1,000

*The entry fee shall be retained by the Bay 101 Casino for hosting the tournament. This fee shall not be included in the tournament prize pool

Tournament Prize Amounts & Source of Funds

The prizes will be cumulative amount of buy-ins, re-buys, and add-ons. The prizes may also be guaranteed. The cardroom may provide prizes or add funds to the prize pool for special events.

- When the prize amount is guaranteed, the payouts will be a cash value ranging from \$5-\$5,000. The cash will be paid to players from the buy-ins, re-buys, and add-ons. If there is not enough cash to cover the guaranteed prize amount, Bay 101 Casino will fund the difference.
- When the prize pool is not based solely on buy-ins, re-buys and add-ons (free roll), Bay 101 Casino will determine and set the payout structure.

Regular Prize Pool

- The prize pot may consist of the sum of all buy-ins, re-buys, and add-ons for each event, and the payouts shall be a percentage.
- Fixed payouts with Equally Distributed Remainders
 - This structure will allow the distribution of a specific prize, or group of prizes, of fixed values. The maximum number of items is distributed with any remaining prize monies equally to those players who won the items.
 - To determine the number of winners, divide the total prize money by the value of the prize being given out (quotient). The quotient is the number of winners that will be eligible for that specific tournament. The remainder, which is the prize money less the guaranteed prize being given out, is then divided by the quotient to determine the amount of additional prize monies each winner will receive.
 - The value of the fixed prize(s) will be distributed to the top finishers of the tournament if adequate money to pay the pre-determined and designated fixed prize(s), the money in the prize pool will be distributed using a previously approved and designated prize distribution structure (PADPDS), as shown above.
 - If the monies in the prize pool are in excess of the value of the pre-determined and designated fixed prize(s), then the following will occur:

Poker Tournaments

- If the first place prize money is equal to or in excess of the pre-determined and designated fixed prize(s) value if distributed by previously approved prize distribution structures, then all prize money will be distributed by that PADPDS. First place winnings would then include the pre-determined fixed prize as well as whatever amount of prize money when combined with the value of the fixed prize would be equal, as determined by the PADPDS.
 - If the first place prize money would be less than the value of the pre-determined fixed designated prize if distributed by the PADPDS, then first place will receive the designated prize. The remaining monies (total prize pool minus the value of the first place prize) will be distributed based on the PADPDS beginning with the second place finisher receiving the first place share of the remaining prize pool.
 - Exception to A & B- If any prizes calculated by the PADPDS are less than the original buy-ins plus entry fee and service fee, if applicable, then those prizes will be eliminated and the money from these prizes will be equally distributed among each of the remaining winners.
- Patrons will be given ample notice of what prize is being offered and it will be displayed prominently via printed flyers, digital display, and any other forms of advertisements.

Tournament Prize Structure

When the prize is not guaranteed, the prize structure will be broken down by the number of paid entries and percentage paid. The percentage paid out will always equal 100%. In the event the players decide to forgo the payout structure and “split” the total prize pool amongst themselves, it shall be permitted and shall be noted in detail on the casino’s tournament log.

- The prize pool will be awarded via a flat amount or percentage. Whether a flat amount or percentage, the casino will clearly and prominently display such method prior to offering the tournament.
- The prize may be a fixed cash amount, merchandise, jewelry, trips, tournament entries, extra tournament chips, and vehicles.

World Series of Poker Tournament

The Bay 101 Casino may guarantee entry into any tournament event, such as the World Series of Poker Tournament (W.S.O.P.). Rather than the first place tournament winner receiving a percentage of the prize pool, they will receive entry into the W.S.O.P. In addition to entry fees and buy-ins, a travel allowance may be included for out of area tournaments.

Entities Involved Other than the House

At any time, Bay 101 Casino may offer a charity tournament that would include other organizations. These organizations shall be reputable and federally recognized as non-profit or charity organizations. These organizations will not be involved in running the tournament; however, their name may be used in conjunction with the advertising and promoting of the event. Bay 101 may donate prizes such as entries into Bay 101 Casino’s tournament is no cost to the charity. Charity tournaments may be structured where all or part of the buy-in, re-buy and add-on monies may be designated to go to a specified charity, in lieu of being paid out to winners. This shall be pre-determined and clearly posted on any and all advertisements.

Poker Tournaments

No Purchase Necessary

The gaming activities attached to the Poker Tournaments shall be offered for free, on a general and indiscriminant basis, with no restrictions, to patrons who wish to participate in a No Purchase Necessary (NPN) game. The Casino shall provide No Purchase Necessary tables for patrons who request to participate in the gaming activities attached to the Poker Tournaments without paying any entry into the tournament. The NPN player must adhere to all rules as the tournament player. All advertisements shall state "No Purchase Necessary" when referencing the gaming activities offered during the Poker Tournaments.

Poker Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot

Bureau Requirements

Advertising

Bay 101 may advertise various names for this gaming activity. Should Bay 101 advertise a different name, the BGC ID (GEAR-001277) shall be referenced on all advertisements relating to this gaming activity.

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for the gaming activity, including but not limited to the following, shall be prominently displayed in Bay 101 at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play:

- Eligible games and time periods
- Requirements for qualifying hands
- Qualifying hands and corresponding jackpot prize amounts
- Availability of No Purchase Necessary
- Any other restrictions that apply to this jackpot

Eligible Controlled Games

The Poker Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot shall be attached to all Bureau approved poker games offered at Bay 101 at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play. All controlled game rules shall be played as approved by the Bureau.

Object and Summary

The Poker Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot features three progressive jackpot prizes. The Poker Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot considers the best hand dealt to any player playing in any participating game during the predetermined and posted promotional period.

1. To determine qualifying hands, the following procedures will be followed for each attached poker game type:
 - a. Draw Poker style games:
 - i. For the base game, the players are each dealt five cards.
 - ii. Each player will use the five-card hand dealt for the base game as their five-card hand for the purpose of this gaming activity.
 - b. 7-Card Stud, 7-Card Stud High-Low style games:
 - i. For the base game, the players are each dealt three hole cards face-down and four cards face-up.
 - ii. Each player will use two hole cards and three up cards to complete their five-card hand for the purpose of this gaming activity.
 - iii. In the case of Four of a Kind (Quads), the hole cards used must be a pocket pair.
 - c. Flop games, e.g., Texas Hold'em, Omaha, Pineapple:
 - i. For the base game, the players are each dealt two, three, four or five hole cards. Five community cards are dealt on the board.
 - ii. Each player will use two hole cards and three community cards to complete their five-card hand for the purpose of this gaming activity.
 - iii. In the case of Four of a Kind (Quads), the hole cards used must be a pocket pair.
2. In the event that the qualifying hand was dealt to more than one player during the predetermined and posted period, the posted progressive jackpot amount will be evenly divided and distributed amongst the players with the qualifying hands.

Poker Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot

- All prize amounts will be paid by a casino representative. Once the proper records have been completed, the casino representative will pay the winner(s) in live casino chips. All prize amounts will be reset and reseeded from the jackpot reserve fund.

Qualifying Hands

Players who make one of the following advertised qualifying hands, with all requirements satisfied, are eligible to win the posted prize amount. The qualifying hand(s) and corresponding prize amounts will be displayed prominently within Bay 101 Casino at all times while this gaming activity is being offered for play. All qualifying hands within a chart must be offered together at all times.

Eligibility Requirements

This gaming activity shall be open to all players who are seated and playing at any of the above listed controlled games during the predetermined specified hours posted for the gaming activity.

- Players must be seated and playing at a designated table in order to qualify for this gaming activity.
- Players must be present to win a prize.
- Players have up to fifteen (15) minutes to present a valid ID and claim the prize. If the player cannot present their ID within the fifteen (15) minutes, the player has thirty (30) days to return and claim the prize. If the player does not claim the prize within the thirty (30) days, the prize will be returned to the prize fund.
- In order to qualify for this gaming activity, the player must use two hole cards in flop or stud game, or five cards in draw style games.
- There is a minimum of five players required to be seated and actively playing in an above mentioned game for the table to qualify for the jackpot.
- A minimum of \$20 must be in the pot of the attached controlled game in order for the table to qualify for this jackpot.
- In the event two or more players make a qualifying hand, each player with a qualifying hand will be eligible for the prize.
- When a qualifying hand is announced, a casino representative will verify both hands qualify. Any deviation from a standard deck will nullify the jackpot.
- The player(s) with the qualifying hands must complete the applicable bets on each round and play through the final betting round (the showdown) in order to qualify for the jackpot.
- A misdeal will disqualify any hand with regards to this gaming activity.
- Any discussion of this gaming activity during the play of the hand may be considered collusion which will disqualify the hand and void payment of the jackpot.
- There is no restriction on the number of times a player may qualify for or win a prize.
- Casino employees are eligible for this gaming activity when off duty and out of uniform.
- Tournament games do not qualify for the gaming activity.

Poker Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot

Prize

Players who make the predetermined and posted qualifying hands shall be eligible to win the corresponding progressive prize amount. The prize will be paid out in live casino chips from the cage.

The Casino will initially seed the Royal Flush prize pool with an amount between \$10 and \$300. The Royal Flush prize pool will then increase daily by a range of \$1 to \$50. The Royal Flush prize pool will continue to increase until it reaches its cap of \$599.

The Casino will initially seed the Straight Flush prize pool with an amount between \$10 and \$250. The Straight Flush prize pool will then increase daily by a range of \$1 to \$50. The Straight Flush prize pool will continue to increase until it reaches its cap of \$599.

The Casino will initially seed the Four of a Kind prize pool with an amount between \$10 and \$200. The Four of a Kind prize pool will then increase daily by a range of \$1 to \$50. The Royal Flush prize pool will continue to increase until it reaches its cap of \$599.

The actual progressive jackpot prize pool amount will depend on the amount that the jackpot was originally seeded at, as well as how many days have transpired in order for the posted jackpot prize to increase progressively each day. Any additional jackpot fees collected each day shall be added to the jackpot reserve fund after the jackpot prize pools have been increased. In addition, once the cap is reached, any jackpot fees collected shall be added to the jackpot reserve fund. The jackpot reserve fund shall reseed the jackpot at an amount ranging from \$10 to \$598 after the jackpot is hit.

Funding

The Poker Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot utilizes three progressive jackpot prize pools which will be player funded by a \$1 jackpot collection fee. During play of the attached controlled games, a \$1 jackpot collection fee will be collected from the poker pot during the play of attached controlled games, which is in addition to the regular house collection fee.

Each jackpot prize pool will be increased by \$1 to \$50 based on how many jackpot fees are collected that day with any additional collected jackpot fees going into the jackpot reserve fund in an amount between \$100 and \$5,000. The jackpot reserve fund shall be used to reseed the jackpot prize pools and pay administrative fees. If the Casino is required to reseed the jackpot or cover any shortfall due to inadequate funds, the Casino shall be reimbursed from the reserve fund once there are sufficient funds available.

Administrative Fees

The Casino will take an administrative fee of \$5 to \$20 per table per hour from the reserve fund. The administrative fee shall be utilized to cover expenses incurred by the gambling establishment for administering the Poker Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot.

No Purchase Necessary

The Poker Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot shall be offered to customers who wish to participate for free, on a general and indiscriminate basis, with **no restrictions**. The Casino shall provide No Purchase Necessary tables for all patrons who request to participate in the gaming activity without paying a table fee or placing a live wager. All advertisement material shall state "No Purchase Necessary" when referencing the Poker Bonus Hand Progressive Jackpot. This requirement extends to all forms of advertising including electronic message boards, computer monitors, posters, and flyers.

Poker Bad Beat Progressive Jackpot

Bureau Requirements

Advertising

Bay 101 may advertise various names for this gaming activity. Should Bay 101 advertise a different name, the BGC ID (GEAR-001279) shall be referenced on all advertisements relating to this gaming activity.

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for the gaming activity, including but not limited to the following, shall be prominently displayed in Bay 101 at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play:

- Eligible games and time periods
- Requirements for qualifying hands
- Qualifying hands and corresponding jackpot prize amounts
 - “Prize Multiplier” eligibility (including times, dates, and funding source)
- Availability of No Purchase Necessary
- Any other restrictions that apply to this jackpot

Eligible Controlled Games

The Poker Bad Beat Progressive Jackpot shall be attached to the following Bureau approved controlled games offered at Bay 101, as shown below, at all times this gaming activity is being offered for play. All controlled game rules shall be played as previously approved by the Bureau.

- Omaha (GEGA-001987)
- Texas Hold'em (GEGA-001983)

Object and Summary

The Poker Bad Beat Progressive Jackpot features a total of four progressive jackpot prizes. The game of Texas Hold'em will have two progressive prize pools named the Mega Jackpot and Mini Jackpot. The game of Omaha will have the other two progressive prize pools named the Major Jackpot and Minor Jackpot. A prize is awarded to players participating in an attached controlled game when a designated second hand is beaten by a better qualifying hand at the showdown.

1. When the winning and losing hands are confirmed, those players with the qualifying jackpot hands will receive the posted percentage of the progressive jackpot prize. Additionally, a posted percentage of the jackpot prize, known as Table(s) Share, will be evenly distributed amongst all other players at the qualifying table(s) who have participated in the hand.
2. In the event the more than one player has a qualifying losing hand, only the highest qualifying losing hand will receive the “Losing Hand” payout. The other players with qualifying losing hands will participate only in the Table(s) Share.
3. In the event that more than one player has the same qualifying losing hand, the “Losing Hand” payout will be evenly distributed amongst the players with that qualifying losing hand.

Poker Bad Beat Progressive Jackpot

4. During the designated promotional period, the jackpot prize pool amount may be multiplied by 2x or more. The amount in excess of the 1x jackpot prize pool amount will be funded from the jackpot reserve fund. If there are inadequate funds in the reserve fund, the Casino will cover the shortfall and will be reimbursed from the reserve fund once funds are available. Patrons will be given ample notice if and when a “Prize Multiplier” will be used, prior to it being offered.

Qualifying Hands

Players who make one of the following advertised qualifying hands, with all requirements satisfied, are eligible to win the posted prize amount. The qualifying hand(s) and corresponding prize amounts will be displayed prominently within Bay 101 Casino at all times while this gaming activity is being offered for play. The following qualifying hand chart options will not be offered together at any time, nor may any combination of the different qualifying hand chart options be offered together at any time that this gaming activity is being offered. All qualifying hands within a chart must be offered together at all times.

Eligibility Requirements

This gaming activity shall be open to all players who are seated and playing at any of the above listed controlled games during the predetermined specified hours posted for the gaming activity.

- Players must be seated and playing at a designated table in order to qualify for this gaming activity.
- Players must be dealt in during the round of play in order to qualify for this gaming activity. Any player with a “Hold” or “Missed Blind” button are considered to be inactive during the round of play and are ineligible for this gaming activity.
- Players must be present to win a prize.

Poker Bad Beat Progressive Jackpot

- Players have up to fifteen (15) minutes to present a valid ID and claim the prize. If the player cannot present their ID within the fifteen (15) minutes, the player has thirty (30) days to return and claim the prize. If the player does not claim the prize within the thirty (30) days, the prize will be returned to the prize fund.
- In order to qualify for this gaming activity, the player must use two hole cards.
- There is a minimum of five players required to be seated and actively playing in an above mentioned game for the table to qualify for the jackpot.
- A minimum of \$20 must be in the pot of the attached controlled game in order for the table to qualify for this jackpot.
- In the event two or more players make a qualifying losing hand, only the highest ranking qualifying losing hand will be considered for the losing share of the progressive prize. If two or more players have the same qualifying losing hand, the eligible players will split the losing share of the progressive prize evenly.
- When a qualifying hand is announced, a casino representative will verify both hands qualify. Any deviation from a standard deck will nullify the jackpot.
- The player(s) with the qualifying hands must complete the applicable bets on each round and play through the final betting round (the showdown) in order to qualify for the jackpot. In order to qualify for this gaming activity, qualifying hands must be tabled and considered live at the time all action is considered complete.
- A misdeal will disqualify any hand with regards to this gaming activity.
- Any discussion of this gaming activity during the play of the hand may be considered collusion which will disqualify the hand and void payment of the jackpot.
- There is no restriction on the number of times a player may qualify for or win a prize.
- Casino employees are eligible for this gaming activity when off duty and out of uniform.
- Tournament games do not qualify for the gaming activity.

Prize

Players who make the predetermined and posted qualifying hands shall be eligible to win the corresponding progressive prize amount. The prize will be paid out in cash, check, or live casino chips from the cage.

The Mega Jackpot prize pool is progressive with a minimum amount of \$1,000 and a maximum amount of \$150,000. The actual progressive jackpot prize pool amount will depend on the amount that the jackpot was originally seeded at, as well as how many days have transpired in order for the posted jackpot prize to increase progressively each day by a range of \$50 to \$5,000 and will cap at \$150,000.

The Mini Jackpot prize pool is progressive with a minimum amount of \$1,000 and a maximum amount of \$150,000. The actual progressive jackpot prize pool amount will depend on the amount that the jackpot was originally seeded at, as well as how many days have transpired in order for the posted jackpot prize to increase progressively each day by a range of \$50 to \$500 and will cap at \$150,000.

The Major Jackpot prize pool is progressive with a minimum amount of \$1,000 and a maximum amount of \$150,000. The actual progressive jackpot prize pool amount will depend on the amount that the jackpot was originally seeded at, as well as how many days have transpired in order for the posted jackpot prize to increase progressively each day by a range of \$50 to \$500 and will cap at \$150,000.

Poker Bad Beat Progressive Jackpot

The Minor Jackpot prize pool is progressive with a minimum amount of \$1,000 and a maximum amount of \$150,000. The actual progressive jackpot prize pool amount will depend on the amount that the jackpot was originally seeded at, as well as how many days have transpired in order for the posted jackpot prize to increase progressively each day by a range of \$5 to \$50 and will cap at \$150,000.

Prize Payout Structure

Players that make one of the advertised qualifying hands, as shown above, will be eligible to win their share of the posted Poker Bad Beat Progressive Jackpot prize pools, according to the payout as shown below. For the prize payout structure, 40% of the posted progressive jackpot prize amount will be awarded to the player that makes the qualifying losing hand, 20% of the posted progressive jackpot prize amount will be awarded to the player that makes the qualifying winning hand, and 40% of the posted progressive jackpot prize amount will be evenly divided and distributed amongst all other players who are seated and participating at qualifying poker tables in the Casino, referred to as the Table(s) Share.

Funding

The Poker Bad Beat Progressive Jackpot utilizes four progressive jackpot prize pools which will be player funded by a \$1 jackpot collection fee. During play of the attached controlled games, a \$1 jackpot collection fee will be collected from the pot during the play of attached controlled games, which is in addition to the regular house collection fee.

The Casino will initially seed the Mega Jackpot prize pool with a minimum of \$1,000 and a maximum of \$75,000. The Mega Jackpot prize pool will then increase daily by a range of \$50 to \$5,000 based on how many jackpot fees were collected that day. The Mega Jackpot prize pool will continue to increase until it reaches its cap of \$150,000. When the prize pool is hit, the prize pool will be reseeded from the reserve fund at a minimum of \$1,000 and a maximum of \$149,500.

The Casino will initially seed the Mini Jackpot prize pool with a minimum of \$1,000 and a maximum of \$50,000. The Mini Jackpot prize pool will then increase daily by a range of \$50 to \$500 based on how many jackpot fees were collected that day. The Mini Jackpot prize pool will continue to increase until it reaches its cap of \$150,000. When the prize pool is hit, the prize pool will be reseeded from the reserve fund at a minimum of \$1,000 and a maximum of \$149,500.

The Casino will initially seed the Major Jackpot prize pool with a minimum of \$1,000 and a maximum of \$30,000. The Major Jackpot prize pool will then increase daily by a range of \$5 to \$500 based on how many jackpot fees were collected that day. The Major Jackpot prize pool will continue to increase until it reaches its cap of \$150,000. When the prize pool is hit, the prize pool will be reseeded from the reserve fund at a minimum of \$1,000 and a maximum of \$149,500.

Poker Bad Beat Progressive Jackpot

The Casino will initially seed the Minor Jackpot prize pool with a minimum of \$1,000 and a maximum of \$20,000. The Minor Jackpot prize pool will then increase daily by a range of \$5 to \$50 based on how many jackpot fees were collected that day. The Minor Jackpot prize pool will continue to increase until it reaches its cap of \$150,000. When the prize pool is hit, the prize pool will be reseeded from the reserve fund at a minimum of \$1,000 and a maximum of \$149,500.

Each day a portion of the collected jackpot fee between \$110 and \$10,000 will be added to the jackpot reserve fund, not the progressive jackpot prize pool. The jackpot reserve fund shall be used to reseed the jackpot prize pools and pay administrative fees. Once the cap is reached on the jackpot prize pools, any jackpot fees collected shall be added to the jackpot reserve fund. If there is an inadequate amount of jackpot fees collected during a day and the progressive prize pools or reserve fund cannot be increased by their minimum amount as described above, the Casino will cover the shortfall and be reimbursed from the reserve fund. If the Casino is required to reseed the jackpot due to inadequate funds, the Casino shall be reimbursed from the reserve fund once there are sufficient funds available. The jackpot fees will be kept in separate and locked jackpot collection boxes, apart from the regular house collection fees.

Administrative Fees

The Casino will take an administrative fee of \$5 to \$20 per table per hour from the reserve fund. The administrative fee shall be utilized to cover expenses incurred by the gambling establishment for administering the Poker Bad Beat Progressive Jackpot.

No Purchase Necessary

The Poker Bad Beat Progressive Jackpot shall be offered to customers who wish to participate for free, on a general and indiscriminate basis, with **no restrictions**. The Casino shall provide No Purchase Necessary tables for all patrons who request to participate in the gaming activity without paying a table fee or placing a live wager. All advertisement material shall state "No Purchase Necessary" when referencing the Poker Bad Beat Progressive Jackpot. This requirement extends to all forms of advertising including electronic message boards, computer monitors, posters, and flyers.
