California Department of Justice Proposition 69 DNA Data Bank Program Report for Fourth Quarter 2022

Since the California DNA (CAL-DNA) Data Bank Program's inception on November 3, 2004, the California Department of Justice (DOJ), Division of Law Enforcement (DLE), Bureau of Forensic Services (BFS) has provided DNA typing services to support California's law enforcement agencies with the State's DNA data bank. All of the BFS DNA programs, including the CAL-DNA Data Bank, are accredited by the ANSI (American National Standards Institute) National Accreditation Board (ANAB). Seventeen local crime laboratories and seven BFS laboratories/sections participate in the CAL-DNA Data Bank and the National DNA Index System (NDIS) as part of the Combined DNA Index System (CODIS).

In accordance with the requirements of Penal Code (PC) section 295(h)(4), the following statistics have been prepared based on the last quarter for which complete information exists, the fourth quarter of 2022.
