

PARTNER AGENCY TO DHCS

UNIQUE FUNDING STRUCTURE

Medicaid Fraud Control Units are defined in United States' Code and originate from 1970s Congressional hearings on fraud/abuse. Partner agency to the Department of Health Care Services that functions as the Single State Agency administering California's Medicaid program.






California Medi-Cal Statistics

Long-Term Health Care Facilities that accept Medi-Cal Patients

Two or more unrelated elders/dependent adults receiving substantial ADL assistance

Medi-Cal Recipients in a non-institutional or other setting provided the allegation occurred in connection with the provision of Medi-Cal services

Multi-disciplinary team approach

Conducted During Normal Business Hours

Executed in Least Intrusive Manner Possible Operation Guardian (Pre-COVID 19 Pandemic)

> Operation SAFE (Post-COVID 19 Pandemic)

California Government Code section 12528.1

Fraud Case: New Hope Hospice

- In-depth investigation showed two companies transferred "patients" back and forth using a network of bribes, kickbacks, and financial incentives to "recruit" people for hospice. \$4.2 million billed to Medi-Cal.
- Result: 6 felony convictions, awaiting sentencing





Financial Abuse Case: People v. Engelbrecht

- Defendant stole over \$500,000 from elderly mother while acting as Power of Attorney. Victim suffered from Huntington's Disease and lived in a Board and Care home.
- Result: Suspect convicted and sentenced to 3 years state prison pending appeal.





Facility Neglect Case: People v. Anderson

- Allegation involves a licensed vocational nurse (LVN) who oversaw an assisted living facility. Victim suffered from a stroke and was found on the floor. Suspect refused to call 911 and did not notify doctor. Victim passed away as a result.
- Result: Case filed, litigation is pending.





Dental Provider Fraud: People v. Wisner

- Dr. Wisner was the #1 X-ray biller in the state. Investigation revealed millions in billing fraud and hundreds of unnecessary X-rays on elderly and minor patients
- Result: Convicted of felony fraud and sentenced to seven years prison






Drug Diversion: United States v. Kemprud

- Suspect ran a clinic out of a nail salon after business hours. Undercover investigation showed suspect prescribed controlled substances with no medical necessity. Joint investigation with federal government.
- Result: Guilty of 14 felony counts of illegally prescribing opioids and other controlled substances. Sentenced to probation in federal court.
