Interns can expect broad exposure to the practice of law in the public sector and may draft motions and pleadings, conduct research on complex and challenging questions of law, draft discovery requests and responses, and review and assess evidence. Interns can also expect frequent opportunities to attend client meetings, depositions, court hearings, and trials.

Applicants should possess excellent writing, research, and analytical skills and can submit applications at any point during the year. Hiring decisions are made on a rolling basis for summer and school-year internships. Applications for summer internships received before January 12th will receive priority consideration.
