1. Name of Proposed Gaming Activity:

Cracked Hand.

2. Name each controlled game that is associated with this gaming activity:

All approved poker games.

3. Describe any jackpot or any other type of prize awarded:

A pre- designated fixed prize that ranges from \$0-\$3000 in cash or casino chips. The pre-designated prize will be displayed visibly at a conspicuous location or locations.

4. If a cash prize is involved, is the amount of the prize progressive or a fixed amount?

Fixed.

5. Explain if the gaming activity is house funded or player funded:

House Funded.

6. Describe any special fee collection involved in this gaming activity, for example, a jackpot fee collection:

No additional fees.

7. Describe how the jackpot will be seeded and how any prizes will be awarded:

The prize will be seeded with house funds. 100% of the prize is to be paid to the player that loses with one of the below qualifying hands. The promotion will be offered only during a pre-designated time. The pre-designated time will be displayed visibly at a conspicuous location or locations.

Players that make a hand that contains the specific pair of hole cards, as specified below, and loses to a better hand will be eligible to win the Cracked Hand promotion prize amount, as shown below. In order to qualify for the jackpot, the player dealt the qualifying hand must use both hole cards. Only losing hands that have been Bureau approved and pre-determined and designated by The Casino are eligible. Only one of these qualifying hand options shall be offered at any one time that the Cracked Hand promotion is being offered for play. No combination of the qualifying hand options shall be offered together at any time that this gaming activity is being offered. Patrons shall be provided with ample advance notice of which qualifying hand option is being offered for play. Furthermore, the designated qualifying hand shall be displayed prominently via printed flyers, digital display, or any other form of advertisements.

Option A

Losing Hand	Prize Amount
Ace – Ace (any suit)	\$1 - \$3,000

Option B

Losing Hand	Prize Amount
King – King (any suit)	\$1 - \$3,000

Option C

Losing Hand	Prize Amount
Queen - Queen (any suit)	\$1 - \$3,000

8. **Explain any prize distribution including prizes given to the winner, loser, or any other player or patron:**

100% of the prize will be awarded to the player that loses with pre-designated hole cards.

Example: A common promotion currently in the industry is Aces Cracked. The Casino might choose to offer Aces Cracked wins \$100 (or any other pre-designated hand and pre-designated prize amount) during the slow hours from 6am-8am. After posting the time frame and the amount offered, any customer during those hours who is dealt two (2) Aces as their hole cards, and loses with those same cards, will receive the pre-designated prize amount; in this case \$100.

9. **Explain if the house is re-seeding of the fund once the prize is won:**

The house will immediately re-seed the prize with a pre-designated fixed amount that will be displayed visibly at a conspicuous location or locations.

10. **Explain any minimum or maximum number of players required to be dealt into the game for the table to be eligible for the gaming activity and prize:**

No minimum or maximum for limit and/or no-limit games.

11. **Explain if the house is retaining any administrative or any other type of fee for operation the gaming activity:**

No additional fees.

12. **Describe any opportunity(s) for a person to play for the prize without placing any live wagers or paying any table fees:**

A No Purchase Necessary (NPN) table will be provided upon request. All hands will be dealt out face up to 9 players. There will be no betting or wagering of any kind. If a player who is seated at the NPN table qualifies for this or any other NPN promotion, the player will win the posted amount.

13. **Provide copies of any published/proposed promotion or advertisement literature:**

None at present, but fliers, and promotional advertisements will be created upon approval.

14. **Identify any entity or person other than those licensed as the house involved in the gaming activity:**

15. **Describe the type of table and equipment utilized for the gaming activity:**

A standard poker table that is common in the industry. Playing cards, poker chips, dealer button, and cut card. All equipment used is identical to what we currently offer in our poker games.

Eligibility

This gaming activity will be open to all players who are seated and playing at an above listed game during the pre-determined and specified hours designated for the gaming activity.

- When a qualifying hand is announced, a floor person will verify that both hands qualify. Any deviation from a standard deck will nullify the promotion.
- In order to qualify for the promotion, the player must complete the applicable bets on each round. If the player goes all-in, this is considered to have completed all bets.
- In order to qualify for the promotion, the player must lose the hand at the showdown, after the final round of betting.
- In the event that during a round of play, two or more players have qualifying hands, each qualifying hand will receive the full amount of the jackpot.
- The promotion will not be valid during tournament play and is only valid during live game play.
- Casino employees are eligible to participate off duty, in or out of uniform.
- All procedures, times, qualifying hands, and prize amounts must be displayed prominently via any form of advertising that The Casino wishes to use, including but not limited to printed flyers, digital display, the Casino's website, etc.

Easy Way Bad Beat Jackpot

Bureau Requirements

Advertising

Paso Robles Central Coast Casino may advertise various names for this gaming activity. Should Paso Robles Central Coast Casino advertise a different name, the BGC ID (GEGA-003332) shall be referenced on all advertisements relating to the Easy Way Bad Beat Jackpot.

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for the Easy Way Bad Beat jackpot, including but not limited to the following, shall be conspicuously and prominently displayed in Paso Robles Central Coast Casino at all times the jackpot is being offered:

- Eligible games and time periods.
- Qualifying winning and losing hands and any restrictions that apply to the hands.
- Prize payout structure.
- Jackpot prize amount.
- Initial seed amount and re-seed amount for the main and reserve prize pools.
- Availability of No Purchase Necessary.
- Any other restrictions that apply to this jackpot.

Eligible Controlled Game

The Easy Way Jackpot shall be attached to the following approved controlled games offered at Paso Robles Central Coast Casino, as shown below, at all times that this jackpot is being offered for play. All controlled game rules shall be played as previously approved by the Bureau.

- Texas Hold'em (GEGA-003326)
- Omaha (GEGA-003327)

Object and Summary

The Easy Way Jackpot features a progressive jackpot prize. A prize is awarded to players participating in any of the above games when a designated Qualifying Hand is beaten by a better hand at the showdown. When the winning and losing hands are confirmed, those players with the qualifying jackpot hands shall receive the posted percentage of the posted jackpot prize amount. Paso Robles Central Coast Casino will utilize a jackpot prize pool monitor for the prize amounts, days and times of the promotion.

Qualifying Hands

Players that make the any of following Qualifying Hands shall be eligible to win their share of the Easy Way Jackpot prize amount, as shown below.

Easy Way Bad Beat Jackpot

Eligibility Requirements

This gaming activity shall be open to all players who are seated and playing at an above listed controlled game during the pre-determined and specified hours designated and posted for the gaming activity.

- In order to qualify for the jackpot, players with qualifying winning and losing hands must play through the final betting round in order to qualify for the jackpot. If a player with one of the qualifying hands folds prior to the final betting round, the table will be in-eligible for the jackpot.
- When a qualifying hand is announced, a floor person shall verify that both hands qualify. Any deviation from a standard deck will nullify the jackpot.
- There must be a minimum of 5 players in order to be eligible for the jackpot.
- In the event that two or more players make a qualifying winning and/or losing hand(s), the player with the highest qualifying hand shall win the posted percentage of the prize for that hand.
- Players must use two hole cards when making their hand.
- If the jackpot amount is in the process of being changed on the jackpot prize pool display monitor at the time a qualifying hand is made, the prize awarded will be in the newly posted amount.
- In all games participating in this promotion all hands involved in a showdown including "all in" hands must be shown or any potential of qualifying for the jackpot will be voided. A Paso Robles Central Coast Casino Supervisor must verify every qualifying jackpot hand before any jackpot prize money will be paid. In the event a qualifying hand is not verified before a new hand is dealt, then that hand shall be declared null and void.
- Any communication among players, whether verbal or otherwise, to lead other players to believe that this is the time to attempt to play for the jackpot will render any hands at the table null and void for the promotion.
- Casino employees are eligible to participate in the jackpot when off duty and in or out of uniform.
- If two or more employees are playing, and two of the employees hold the winning and losing hands, the jackpot will be split equally among all active players.
- Third Party Providers of Proposition Player Services are eligible for the promotion when off duty.
- Tournament games are not eligible for the jackpot.

Prize

The players that make the pre-determined and posted qualifying losing and winning hands shall be eligible to win a progressive prize ranging in value from \$1 – \$25,000. The posted prize shall be paid in the form of cash or casino chips. The prize amount will continue to progress until the jackpot is won. Furthermore, the amount of the progressive prize amount shall be displayed prominently within Paso Robles Central Coast Casino at all times the Easy Way Jackpot is being offered for play.

Prize Payout Structure

Players that make the approved qualifying hands shall be eligible to win their share of the Easy Way Jackpot prize amount, according to the payout option, as shown below. Each qualifying hand for each game will have their portion of the posted prize amount. The player who loses the pot with the second best hand receives 40% of the Easy Way Jackpot prize pool awarded for

the particular game. The individual who wins the pot, defeating the individual with a qualifying hand shall win 20% of the prize amount. The remaining 40% will be distributed to all players in the casino participating in the winning game.

*The House Share is a percentage split between all active players playing the winning game at the time the jackpot is hit. For example if a qualifying hand is made at a Texas Hold'em game, every active player participating at a Texas Hold'em game in the casino would be eligible for a portion of the House Share.

Funding

The Easy Bad Beat Jackpot utilizes a progressive prize pool which will be player funded via a \$0.50 jackpot collection fee. \$0.50 shall be taken for every pot over \$20 on every Texas Hold'em and Omaha game. If the pot does not reach \$20 no funds will be taken and the hand will not be eligible for the jackpot. The casino will initially seed the prize pool in an amount ranging from \$1,000 to \$3,000. The casino shall be reimbursed the seed money from the reserve once the funds have been collected. The jackpot collection fees shall then be used to fund the jackpot. Additionally, when the casino is required to seed the jackpot or cover the shortfall due to in-adequate funds in the reserve account, the casino shall be repaid from the jackpot reserve account once the reserve is sufficient and the funds become available. When a qualifying jackpot hand is made, it shall be re-seeded by Paso Robles Casino or by the reserve fund, in an amount ranging between \$1 and \$1,000. The jackpot shall increase daily by an amount between \$1 and \$100. This jackpot has a cap amount of \$25,000. Under no circumstances shall the jackpot cap amount be decreased once determined and posted. Once the jackpot has reached the cap, the future collected funds shall go into a reserve account. The jackpot collection fees shall be kept in a separate account for tracking and accounting purposes.

Administrative Fees

Paso Robles Central Coast Casino shall retain an administrative fee ranging from \$8 - \$12 for the Easy Way Bad Beat Jackpot per table hour. The administrative fee shall be used for marketing and operation costs.

No Purchase Necessary Table Requirement

Paso Robles Central Coast Casino shall provide to patrons who wish to participate for free, on a general and indiscriminate basis, with no restrictions a No Purchase Necessary game option. No purchase necessary for this promotion will be administered as follows: A player shall approach a Paso Robles Central Coast Casino employee to enter a promotion by means of No Purchase Necessary. Paso Robles Central Coast Casino employee would then call the shift manager. The Shift Manager would then notify the dealer coordinator for Paso Robles Central Coast Casino to provide a table, a dealer and cards. The player is then provided with the rules of how the promotion is played and awarded. The player would then play the game in the same manner as the paying patron. Paso Robles Central Coast Casino dealer would deal hands for a full table including the NPN patron. All hands dealt at the table will be shown. If the NPN patron hits the jackpot, only his/her corresponding percentage portion of the jackpot would be paid out.

High Hand Promotion

Bureau Requirements

Advertising

Paso Robles Central Coast Casino may advertise various names for this gaming activity. Should Paso Robles Central Coast Casino advertise a different name, the BGC ID (GEGA-003331) shall be referenced on all advertisements relating to the High Hand Promotion gaming activity.

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for this gaming activity, including but not limited to the following, shall be prominently displayed in Paso Robles Central Coast Casino at all times the gaming activity is being offered:

- Eligible games, dates and time periods.
- Qualifying hands and any restrictions.
- Specific prize amounts.
- No purchase necessary information.
- Any other applicable restrictions.

Eligible Controlled Games

The High Hand Promotion may be attached to all Bureau approved California Games offered at Paso Robles Central Coast Casino as shown below. All base game rules will be played as previously approved by the Bureau of Gambling Control.

- Texas Hold'em (GEGA-003326)
- Omaha (GEGA-003327)

Object and Summary

A prize is awarded when a player makes a pre-determined and designated hand, as listed below, during a qualifying game. The High Hand Promotion prize can be awarded hourly or on a daily basis. A customer must be present to win the prize in the event that the casino chooses to award the prize on an hourly basis. During hourly giveaways the customer has up to 10 minutes to claim their prize. If the customer does not claim their prize or there isn't a qualifying hand during the hour of play the amount will be rolled over to the next hour. If the promotion is based on a daily basis the customer does not need to be present to win and will have up to 24 hours to claim their prize. If the prize isn't claimed for that day it will be rolled over to the next day's prize amount. Both hourly and daily prize winners will receive notification via telephone call that they have won the prize. The winning player shall receive the pre-determined posted prize amount for the corresponding qualifying hand. The current qualifying high hands will be prominently displayed in an area of the casino that will be easy to view.

Qualifying Hands

Players that make the designated qualifying hand shall be eligible to win the announced cash prize. The qualifying hands options chart shall be offered together at all times that this promotion is being offered. Only the hands that have been Bureau approved and pre-determined and designated by Paso Robles Central Coast Casino are eligible.

Eligibility Requirements

This gaming activity shall be open to all players who are seated and playing at an above listed controlled game during the pre-determined and specified hours designated and posted for the gaming activity.

- When a qualifying hand is announced, a floor person shall verify that the hand qualifies. Any deviation from a standard deck will nullify the promotion.
- There is no minimum or maximum number of players in order to be eligible for the promotion other than what is required in the eligible controlled games rules.
- In the event that two or more players make a qualifying hand, the player with the highest qualifying hand shall win the posted percentage of the prize for that hand.
- If two or more players have the same qualifying hand the posted prize for that hand will be equally split amongst the players who have the qualifying hand.
- If the prize amount is in the process of being changed on the prize pool display monitor at the time a qualifying hand is made, the prize awarded will be in the newly posted amount.
- In all games participating in this promotion, all hands involved in a showdown including "all in" hands must be shown or any potential of qualifying for the promotion will be voided.
- A Paso Robles Central Coast Casino Supervisor must verify every qualifying hand before any prize money will be paid. In the event a qualifying hand is not verified before a new hand is dealt, then that hand shall be declared null and void.
- Any communication among players, whether verbal or otherwise, to lead other players to believe that this is the time to attempt to play for the prize will render any hands at the table null and void for the promotion.
- Casino employees are eligible to participate in the promotion when off duty and in or out of uniform.
- Third Party Providers of Proposition Player Services are eligible for the promotion when off duty.
- Tournament games are not eligible for the promotion.

Prize Amount

The player that makes the pre-determined and posted qualifying hand shall be eligible to win a progressive prize ranging in value from \$1 – \$1,000. The posted prize shall be paid in the form of cash or casino chips. The prize amount will be added to until the prize is won. Furthermore, the amount of the prize shall be displayed prominently within Paso Robles Central Coast Casino at all times the High Hand Promotion is being offered for play.

Funding

The High Hand Promotion utilizes a prize pool which shall be funded from the Easy Way Bad Beat Jackpot (GEGA-003332) reserve prize pool, which is player funded. The jackpot collection fees shall be kept in a separate account for tracking and accounting purposes.

Administrative Fees

Paso Robles Central Coast Casino shall not retain an administrative fee for this promotion.

High Hand Promotion

No Purchase Necessary Table Requirement

The High Hand Promotion shall be offered to customers who wish to participate for free, on a general and indiscriminate basis, with no restrictions, to patrons who wish to participate in a No Purchase Necessary (NPN) game. Paso Robles Central Coast Casino shall provide NPN tables for all patrons who request to participate in the promotion without paying a table fee or placing a live wager. All advertisement material shall state "No Purchase Necessary" when referencing the High Hand Promotion. This requirement extends to all forms of advertising including electronic message boards, computer monitors, posters, and flyers.

Texas Hold'em Tournament Rules

Whenever possible, all rules are the same as those that apply to live games. Tournament structure (Including Buy-ins, Re-buys, Add-ons, etc.). Method of Entry – Patrons may enter a tournament by paying a buy-in plus entry fee, winning a previous tournament, or winning their entry from a promotion at the Casino.

Buy-In: 0 - \$1,000

Re-Buy: \$1 - \$1,000 /1 time – unlimited times

Add-on: \$1 - \$1,000/1 time – 3 times

Entry Fee: \$0 - \$40

*The entry fee shall be retained by the Central Coast-Paso Robles for hosting the tournament. This fee shall not be included in the tournament prize pool.

Prize amount; source of funds: The prizes will be the cumulative amount of buy-ins, re-buys, and add-ons. The prizes may also be guaranteed, with any shortfall being covered by the Casino.

When the prize amount is guaranteed the payouts will be a cash value ranging from \$100 - \$50,000. The cash will be paid to players from the buy-ins, re-buys, and add-ons. If there is not enough cash to cover the guaranteed prize amount, the Casino will fund the difference.

The prizes may also consist of merchandise, travel packages, tickets to sporting or other entertainment events, or other appropriate awards and this guaranteed prize will range in value from \$100 to \$50,000.

Bounties: “Bounty” targets are tournament players who are selected prior to the start of the tournament. During the play of a tournament, either a single player or multiple players in a tournament may be designated as “bounty” targets. If a “bounty” target player loses all of their tournament chips during a hand of play and is eliminated from the tournament, the winner of that hand will win a pre-determined and designated amount of money ranging in value between \$5 and \$5,000. The “bounty” money may be deducted from the tournament prize pool or may be guaranteed and paid for by the Casino. Patrons shall be given notice of how the activity will be funded prior to the tournament being offered.
