Legislative Findings

- More than four million Africans enslaved
- U.S. government sanctioned slavery
- Slavery was an immoral and inhumane deprivation of life

Legislative Findings

- Ongoing legacy of slavery: systemic discrimination against Black people
- American government continued to benefit from the destruction of Black life

Purpose of the Task Force



Study and Develop Reparations Proposals

- The institution of slavery
- De jure and de facto discrimination
- Lingering effects of slavery on Black people and society in California

Duties of the Task Force



Summarize evidence of: Capture, transport, and sale of African people

- Treatment of enslaved people
- Denial of humanity and sexual abuse

- Anti-Black
 Discrimination in law
- Anti-Black discrimination in public and private sector
- Lingering harm of slavery

- International standards of reparations
- State of California's apology
- Elimination of laws and policies that perpetuate effects of slavery



Recommend:

- Policies, programs, projects for reversing injuries
- Calculating compensation, instrumentalities, eligibility
- Other forms of rehabilitation

- Educate the California public of the task force's findings
- Submit report by June 1, 2022



Membership of the Task Force

Membership

- Nine members
 - 5 by Governor
 - 2 by President of Senate
 - 2 by Speaker of Assembly
- From: academia, reparatory justice organizations
- Diverse backgrounds, experience implementing racial justice reform

Membership

- Term: entirety of the Task Force
- 5 members = quorum
- Election of Chair and Vice Chair
- Reimbursement of expenses for 10 meetings



Powers of the Task Force



Powers of the Task Force

- Hold hearings
- Request witness testimony
- Request production of documents
- Compel testimony
- Acquire information from state agencies

Administrative Provisions of the Task Force



Administrative Provisions of the Task Force

- May compensate personnel
- Administrative, technical, and legal assistance of the Department of Justice
- Enter into contracts



State Level Reparations

"Any state level reparation actions that are undertaken as a result of this chapter are not a replacement for any reparations enacted at the federal level, and shall not be interpreted as such."
