COMPLAINT FOR INJUNCTIVE RELIEF  
AND CIVIL PENALTIES

TOXIC TORT/ENVIRONMENTAL

20 MATEEL ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE FOUNDATION alleges as follows:

21 INTRODUCTION

22 1. This Complaint seeks civil penalties and an injunction to remedy the continuing  
23 failure of defendants THE TJX COMPANIES, INC. and TARGET CORPORATION (hereinafter  
24 "Defendants"), to give clear and reasonable warnings to those residents of California, who handle  
25 and use, and drink beverages stored or contained in drink dispensers, such as lemonade jars and  
26 water tanks, that utilize leaded brass valves, spigots and stopcocks (hereinafter referred to as  
27 "drink dispensers"), that handling and use of and drinking from these drink dispensers causes

1 those residents to be exposed to lead and lead compounds, lead acetate, lead phosphate, and lead  
2 subacetate (hereinafter, collectively, "lead"). The types of products to which this Complaint  
3 pertains are those types listed in the Product List appended to the Proposition 65 60-Day Notice  
4 Letter that is attached to and incorporated by reference into this Complaint. Lead is known to  
5 the State of California to cause cancer, birth defects and male and female reproductive toxicity.  
6 Defendants distribute, and/or market drink dispensers. These products cause exposures to lead  
7 and lead compounds, which are chemicals known to the State of California to cause cancer, birth  
8 defects and other reproductive harm.

9         2. Defendants market, and/or distribute drink dispensers. Defendants intend that  
10 residents of California handle, use and drink beverages stored or contained in the drink  
11 dispensers that Defendants market, and/or distribute. When these products are handled and used  
12 in their normally intended manner and when people drink beverages that has been stored in or  
13 contained in these drink dispensers the drink dispensers expose people to lead. In spite of  
14 knowing that residents of California were and are being exposed to this toxic heavy metal when  
15 they handle, use and drink beverages contained or stored in drink dispensers, Defendants did not  
16 and do not provide clear and reasonable warnings that these products cause exposure to  
17 chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects and other reproductive harm.

18         3. Plaintiff seeks injunctive relief pursuant to Health & Safety Code Section 25249.7  
19 to compel Defendants to bring their business practices into compliance with section 25249.5 et  
20 seq. by providing a clear and reasonable warning to each individual who has been and who in the  
21 future may be exposed to the above mentioned toxic chemicals from the use of Defendants'  
22 products. Plaintiff seeks an order that defendant identify and locate each individual person who  
23 in the past has purchased drink dispensers and to provide to each such purchaser a clear and  
24 reasonable warning that the drink dispensers will cause exposures to chemicals known to cause  
25 birth defects.

26         4. In addition to injunctive relief, plaintiff seeks civil penalties to remedy the failure  
27 of Defendants to provide clear and reasonable warnings regarding exposure to chemicals known  
28 to cause cancer, birth defects and other reproductive harm.

1 PARTIES

2 5. Plaintiff MATEEL ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE FOUNDATION ("Mateel")  
3 is a non-profit organization dedicated to, among other causes, the protection of the environment,  
4 promotion of human health, environmental education, and consumer rights. Mateel is based in  
5 Eureka, California, and is incorporated under the laws of the State of California. Mateel is a  
6 "person" pursuant to Health & Safety Code Section 25118. Mateel brings this enforcement  
7 action in the public interest pursuant to Health & Safety Code §25249.7(d). Residents of  
8 California are regularly exposed to lead and lead compounds from drink dispensers  
9 manufactured, distributed or marketed by Defendants and are so exposed without a clear and  
10 reasonable Proposition 65 warning.

11 6. Defendants are persons doing business within the meaning of Health & Safety  
12 Code Section 25249.11. Defendants are businesses that distribute, and/or market drink dispensers  
13 in California, including the City and County of San Francisco. Distribution and/or marketing of  
14 these products in the City and County of San Francisco and/or to people who live in San  
15 Francisco, causes people to be exposed to lead and lead compounds while they are physically  
16 present in the City and County of San Francisco.

17 7. Plaintiff brings this enforcement action against Defendants pursuant to Health &  
18 Safety Code Section 25249.7(d). Attached hereto and incorporated by reference is a copy of a  
19 60-day Notice letter, dated June 25, 2008, which Mateel sent to California's Attorney General.  
20 Substantively identical letters were sent to every District Attorney in the state, and to the City  
21 Attorneys of every California city with a population greater than 750,000, and to each defendant.  
22 Attached to the 60-Day Notice Letter sent to each defendant was a summary of Proposition 65  
23 that was prepared by California's Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment. In  
24 addition, each 60-Day Notice Letter plaintiff sent was accompanied by a Certificate of Service  
25 attesting to the service of the 60-Day Notice Letter on each entity which received it. Pursuant to  
26 California Health & Safety Code Section 25249.7(d), a Certificate of Merit attesting to the  
27 reasonable and meritorious basis for the action was also sent with each 60-Day Notice Letter.  
28 Factual information sufficient to establish the basis of the Certificate of Merit was enclosed with

1 the 60-Day Notice letter Mateel sent to the Attorney General.

2 8. Each defendant employs more than ten people.

3 JURISDICTION

4 9. The Court has jurisdiction over this action pursuant to California Health & Safety  
5 Code Section 25249.7. California Constitution Article VI, Section 10 grants the Superior Court  
6 "original jurisdiction in all causes except those given by statute to other trial courts." Chapter 6.6  
7 of the Health & Safety Code, which contains the statutes under which this action is brought, does  
8 not grant jurisdiction to any other trial court.

9 10. This Court also has jurisdiction over Defendants because they are businesses that  
10 have sufficient minimum contacts in California and within the City and County of San Francisco.  
11 Defendants intentionally availed themselves of the California and San Francisco County markets  
12 for drink dispensers. It is thus consistent with traditional notions of fair play and substantial  
13 justice for the San Francisco Superior Court to exercise jurisdiction over Defendants.

14 11. Venue is proper in this Court because Defendants market their products in and  
15 around San Francisco and thus cause people to be exposed to lead and lead compounds while  
16 those people are physically present in San Francisco. Liability for Plaintiff's causes of action, or  
17 some parts thereof, has accordingly arisen in San Francisco during the times relevant to this  
18 Complaint and Plaintiff seeks civil penalties imposed by statute.

19 FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION  
20 (Claim for Injunctive Relief)

21 12. Plaintiff realleges and incorporates by reference into this First Cause of Action, as  
22 if specifically set forth herein, paragraphs 1 through 11, inclusive.

23 13. The People of the State of California have declared by referendum under  
24 Proposition 65 (California Health & Safety Code § 25249.5 et seq.) their right "[t]o be informed  
25 about exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects, and reproductive harm."

26 14. To effectuate this goal, Section 25249.6 of the Health and Safety Code mandates  
27 that businesses that knowingly and intentionally expose any individual to a chemical known to  
28 the State of California to cause cancer or birth defects must first provide a clear and reasonable

1 warning to such individual prior to the exposure.

2 15. Since at least July 18, 2004, Defendants have engaged in conduct that violates  
3 Health and Safety Code Section 25249.6 et seq. This conduct includes knowingly and  
4 intentionally exposing to the above mentioned toxic chemicals, those California residents who  
5 handle, use or drink beverages stored or contained in drink dispensers. The normally intended  
6 use of drink dispensers causes exposure to lead and lead compounds, which are chemicals known  
7 to the State of California to cause cancer, birth defects and other reproductive harm. Defendants  
8 have not provided clear and reasonable warnings, within the meaning of Health & Safety Code  
9 Sections 25249.6 and 25249.11.

10 16. At all times relevant to this action, Defendants knew that the drink dispensers they  
11 distributed or marketed were causing exposures to lead and lead compounds. Defendants  
12 intended that residents of California handle, use and drink beverages stored or contained in drink  
13 dispensers in such ways as would lead to significant exposures to these chemicals.

14 17. By the above described acts, Defendants have violated Cal. Health & Safety Code  
15 § 25249.6 and are therefore subject to an injunction ordering them to stop violating Proposition  
16 65, to provide warnings to all present and future customers and to provide warnings to their past  
17 customers who purchased Defendants' products without receiving a clear and reasonable  
18 warning.

19 SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION  
20 (Claim for Civil Penalties)

21 18. Plaintiff realleges and incorporates by reference into this Second Cause of Action,  
22 as if specifically set forth herein, paragraphs 1 through 17, inclusive.

23 19. By the above described acts, Defendants are liable and should be liable pursuant  
24 to Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(b), for a civil penalty of \$2,500.00 per day for each  
25 individual exposed without proper warning to lead and lead compounds from the handling, use  
26 of, or the drinking of beverages stored or contained in Defendants' drink dispensers.

1 PRAYER FOR RELIEF

2 Wherefore, plaintiff prays for judgment against DEFENDANTS, as follows:

3 1. Pursuant to the First Cause of Action, that Defendants be enjoined, restrained,  
4 and ordered to comply with the provisions of Section 25249.6 of the California Health & Safety  
5 Code;

6 2. Pursuant to the Second Cause of Action, that Defendants be assessed a civil  
7 penalty in an amount equal to \$2,500.00 per day per individual exposed, in violation of Section  
8 25249.6 of the California Health & Safety Code, to lead and lead compounds as the result of  
9 Defendant's distributing or marketing of drink dispensers;

10 3. That Defendant be ordered to identify and locate each individual who purchased  
11 drink dispensers and provide a warning to each such person that the drink dispensers the person  
12 purchased will expose that person to chemicals known to cause birth defects.

13 4. That, pursuant to Civil Procedure Code § 1021.5, Defendant be ordered to pay to  
14 Plaintiff the attorneys fees and costs it incurred in bringing this enforcement action.

15 5. For such other relief as this court deems just and proper.

Greetings:

This office and the Mateel Environmental Justice Foundation ("Mateel") give you notice that the private companies listed on the attached service list have been, are, will be and threaten to be in violation of Cal. Health & Safety Code § 25249.6. Both this office and Mateel are private enforcers of Proposition 65, both may be contacted at the below listed address and telephone number, and I am a responsible individual at both Mateel and this office. The above referenced violations occur when California residents come into contact with the brass valves or stopcocks on beverage dispensers (hereinafter "brass valved beverage dispensers"), and when they drink beverages that have flowed through the leaded brass valves/stopcocks that the listed businesses market. Specific examples of the products to which this notice pertains are listed on the attached products list. The valves or stopcocks on these brass valved beverage dispensers are made from leaded brass, which contains lead and lead compounds ("lead"), which are chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects and other reproductive harm. California residents are exposed to lead whenever they handle the brass valves/stopcocks, such as when serving beverages from these products, when washing them, or when drinking beverages that have flowed through the brass valves/stopcocks. Lead is transferred from the brass to peoples' hands and to other parts of their skin. This lead is then absorbed through the skin, taken into cuts and abrasions, absorbed through mucous membranes, and transferred from the skin to the mouth via oral contact either directly with the lead-contaminated skin, and when lead is transferred from contaminated skin to cigarettes and food and the contaminated cigarettes and food are smoked and/or eaten. Lead also leaches from the brass into the beverages that flow through the brass valves/stopcocks and is then drunk. These lead exposures thus occur via the dermal absorption, subcutaneous, mucous membrane, ingestion and inhalation routes. The listed companies did not and do not provide people with clear and reasonable warnings before they expose them to lead. These violations have occurred every day since at least June 25, 2005, and will continue every day until the lead is removed from the brass valves/stopcocks, or until clear and reasonable warnings are given. The above-referenced violations are alleged for occupational exposures as well as for consumer and environmental exposures. We do not, however, allege occupational exposure violations as to any brass valved beverage dispenser made outside of California, except as to workplaces the companies themselves maintain in California. Exposures constituting Proposition 65 environmental exposure violations occur both on and off the companies private business properties and in each of California's 58 counties.



I, William Verick, hereby declare: This Certificate of Merit accompanies the attached sixty-day notice(s) in which it is alleged the parties identified in the notices have violated Health and Safety Code section 25249.6 by failing to provide clear and reasonable warnings. I am the attorney for the noticing party. I have consulted with one or more persons with relevant and appropriate experience or expertise who has reviewed facts, studies, or other data regarding the exposure to the listed chemical that is the subject of the action. Based on the information obtained through those consultations, and on all other information in my possession, I believe there is a reasonable and meritorious case for the private action. I understand that "reasonable and meritorious case for the private action" means that the information provides a credible basis that all elements of the plaintiffs' case can be established and the information did not prove that the alleged violator will be able to establish any of the affirmative defenses set forth in the statute. The copy of this Certificate of Merit served on the Attorney General attaches to it factual information sufficient to establish the basis for this certificate, including the information identified in Health and Safety Code section 25249.7(h)(2), i.e., (1) the identity of the person(s) consulted with and relied on by the certifier, and (2) the facts, studies, or other data reviewed by those persons.

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This notice alleges the violation of Proposition 65 with respect to occupational exposures governed by the California State Plan for Occupational Safety and Health. The State Plan incorporates the provisions of Proposition 65, as approved by Federal OSHA on June 6, 1997. This approval specifically placed certain conditions on Proposition 65, including that it does not apply to the conduct of manufacturers occurring outside the State of California. The approval also provides that an employer may use the means of compliances in the general hazard communication requirements to comply with Proposition 65. It also requires that supplemental enforcement is subject to the supervision of the California Occupational Safety and Health Administration. Accordingly, any settlement, civil complaint, or substantive court orders in this matter must be submitted to the Attorney General.
