22 **NATURE OF THE ACTION**

23 1. This Complaint is a representative action brought by plaintiff Maureen Parker, in  
24 the public interest of the citizens of the State of California, to enforce the people's right to be  
25 informed of the presence of lead, a toxic chemical found in Half-Time Drill Driver (UPC #  
26 740275007761) sold in California.

27 2. By this Complaint, plaintiff seeks to remedy defendants' continuing failures to  
28 warn California citizens about their exposure to lead present in or on certain drills/tools that  
defendants manufacture, distribute and/or offer for sale to consumers throughout the State of  
California.

1           3. High levels of lead are commonly found in Half-Time Drill Driver (UPC  
2 #740275007761) that defendants manufacture, distribute and/or offer for sale to consumers  
3 throughout the State of California.

4           4. Under California's Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986,  
5 California Health & Safety Code § 25249.6 et seq. (Proposition 65), "No person in the course of  
6 doing business shall knowingly and intentionally expose any individual to a chemical known to  
7 the state to cause cancer or reproductive toxicity without first giving clear and reasonable  
8 warning to such individual..." (*Cal. Health & Safety Code § 25249.6.*)

9           5. California identified and listed Lead as a chemical known to cause birth defects  
10 and other reproductive harm. Lead became subject to the warning requirements of Proposition 65  
11 for developmental toxicity beginning on February 27, 1987 and for cancer toxicity on October 1,  
12 1992. (*27 CCR § 27002; Cal. Health & Safety Code § 25249.6.*)

13           6. Lead shall hereinafter be referred to as the "LISTED CHEMICAL."

14           7. Defendants manufacture, distribute and/or sells drill drivers containing excessive  
15 levels of the LISTED CHEMICAL including, but not limited to Half-Time Drill Driver (UPC  
16 #740275007761). All such drivers containing the LISTED CHEMICAL shall hereinafter be  
17 referred to as the "PRODUCTS."

18           8. Defendants' failures to warn consumers and/or other individuals in the State of  
19 California about their exposure to the LISTED CHEMICAL in conjunction with defendant's  
20 sale of the PRODUCTS is a violation of Proposition 65 and subjects defendants to enjoinder of  
21 such conduct as well as civil penalties for each such violation.

22           9. For defendants' violations of Proposition 65, plaintiff seeks preliminary  
23 injunctive and permanent injunctive relief to compel defendants to provide purchasers or users of  
24 the PRODUCTS with the required warning regarding the health hazards of the LISTED  
25 CHEMICAL. (*Cal. Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(a).*)

26           10. Plaintiff also seeks civil penalties against defendants for their violations of  
27 Proposition 65, as provides for by California Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(b).  
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**PARTIES**

11. Plaintiff Maureen Parker is a citizen of the City of Oceanside, County of San Diego, in the State of California, who is dedicated to protecting the health of California citizens through the elimination o reduction of toxic exposures from consumer products, and brings this action in the public interest pursuant to California Health & Safety Code § 25249.7.

12. Defendant ALLSTAR PRODUCTS GROUP, LLC. ("ALLSTAR PRODUCTS" or "DEFENDANT 1") is a person doing business within the meaning of California Health & Safety Code § 25249.11.

13. Defendant manufactures, ALLSTAR PRODUCTS distributes, and/or offers the PRODUCTS for sales or use in the State of California or implies by its conduct that it manufactures, distributes and/or offers the PRODUCTS for sale or use in the State of California.

14. Defendant ALLSTAR MARKETING GROUP, LLC. ("ALLSTAR MARKETING" or "DEFENDANT 2") is a person doing business within the meaning of California Health & Safety Code § 25249.11.

15. Defendant ALLSTAR MARKETING manufactures, distributes, and/or offers the PRODUCTS for sales or use in the State of California or implies by its conduct that it manufactures, distributes and/or offers the PRODUCTS for sale or use in the State of California.

16. Defendant SEARS, ROEBUCK AND CO ("SEARS" or "DEFENDANT 3") is a person doing business within the meaning of California Health & Safety Code § 25249.11.

17. Defendant SEARS manufactures, distributes, and/or offers the PRODUCTS for sales or use in the State of California or implies by its conduct that it manufactures, distributes and/or offers the PRODUCTS for sale or use in the State of California.

18. Defendant K-MART CORPORATION . ("K-MART" or "DEFENDANT 4") is a person doing business within the meaning of California Health & Safety Code § 25249.11.

19. Defendant K-MART manufactures, distributes, and/or offers the PRODUCTS for sales or use in the State of California or implies by its conduct that it manufactures, distributes and/or offers the PRODUCTS for sale or use in the State of California.



1 DEFENDANTS' purposeful availment renders the exercise of personal jurisdiction by California  
2 courts consistent with traditional notions of fair play and substantial justice.

3 **FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION**

4 **(Violation of Proposition 65 – Against Defendant and Other Defendants)**

5 28. Plaintiff realleges and incorporates by reference, as if full reference, as if full set  
6 forth herein, Paragraphs 1 through 24, inclusive.

7 29. The citizens of the State of California have expressly stated in the Safe Drinking  
8 Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, California Health & Safety Code § 25249.5, et seq.  
9 (Proposition 65) that they must be informed “about exposures to chemicals that cause cancer,  
10 birth defects and order reproductive harm.” (*Cal. Health & Safety Code § 25249.6.*)

11 30. Proposition 65 states, “No person in the course of doing business shall knowingly  
12 and intentionally expose any individual to a chemical known to the state to cause cancer or  
13 productive toxicity without first giving clear and reasonable warning to such individual (*Id.*)”

14 31. On December 23, 2011 a sixty-day notice violation, together with the requisite  
15 certificate of merit, was provided to ALLSTAR PRODUCTS and other defendants, and various  
16 public enforcement agencies stating that as a result of the DEFENDANTS' sales of the  
17 PRODUCTS, purchasers and users in the State of California were being exposed to the LISTED  
18 CHEMICAL resulting from the reasonably foreseeable users of the PRODUCTS, without the  
19 individual purchasers and users first having been provided with a “clear and reasonable warning”  
20 regarding such toxic exposures.

21 32. DEFENDANTS have engaged in the manufacture, distribution and/or offering of  
22 the PRODUCTS for sale or use in violation of California Health & Safety Code § 25249.6 and  
23 DEFENDANTS' manufacture, distribution and/or offering of the PRODUCTS for sale or use in  
24 violation of California Health & Safety Code § 25249.6 has continued to occur beyond  
25 DEFENDANTS' receipt of plaintiff's sixty-day notice of violation. Plaintiff further alleges and  
26 believes that such violations will continue to occur into the future.

1 33. After receipt of the claims asserted in the sixty-day notices of violation, the  
2 appropriate public enforcement agencies have failed to commence and diligently prosecute a  
3 cause of action against DEFENDANTS under Proposition 65.

4 34. The PRODUCTS manufactured, distributed, and/or offered for sale or use in  
5 California by DEFENDANTS contained the LISTED CHEMICAL above the allowable state  
6 limits.

7 35. DEFENDANTS knew or should have known that the PRODUCTS manufactured,  
8 distributed, and/or for sale or use by DEFENDANT in California contained the LISTED  
9 CHEMICAL.

10 36. The LISTED CHEMICAL was present in or on the PRODUCTS in such away as  
11 to expose individuals to the LISTED CHEMICAL through dermal contact and/or ingestion  
12 during the reasonably foreseeable use of the PRODUCTS.

13 37. The normal and reasonably foreseeable use of he PRODUCTS has caused and  
14 continues to cause consumer exposures to the LISTED CHEMICAL, as such exposure s defined  
15 by 27 CCR§ 25602(b).

16 38. DEFENDANTS had knowledge that the normal and reasonably foreseeable use of  
17 the PRODUCTS would expose individuals to the LISTED CHEMICAL through dermal contact  
18 and/or ingestion.

19 39. DEFENDANTS intended that such exposures to the LISTED CHEMICAL from  
20 the reasonably foreseeable use of the PRODUCTS would occur by their deliberate, non-  
21 accidental participation in the manufacture, distribution and/or offer for sale or use of  
22 PRODUCTS to individuals in the State of California.

23 40. DEFENDANTS failed to provide a “clear and reasonable warning” to those  
24 consumers and/or other individuals in the State of California who were or who could become  
25 exposed to the LISTED CHEMICAL through dermal contact and/or ingestion during the  
26 reasonably foreseeable use of the PRODUCTS.

27 41. Contrary to the express policy and statutory prohibition of Proposition 65, enacted  
28 directly by California voters, individuals exposed to the LISTED CHEMICAL through dermal

1 contact and/or ingestion resulting from the reasonably foreseeable use of the PRODUCTS, sold  
2 by DEFENDENTS without a "clear and reasonable warning," have suffered, and continue to  
3 suffer, irreparable harm, for which harm they have no plain, speedy or adequate remedy at law.

4 42. As a consequence of the above-described acts, DEFENDANTS are liable for a  
5 maximum civil penal of \$2,500.00 per day for each violation pursuant to California Health&  
6 Safety Code § 25249.7(b).

7 43. As a consequence of the above-described acts, California Health & Safety Code §  
8 25249.7(a) also specifically authorizes the Court to grant injunctive relief against  
9 DEFENDANTS.

10 44. Wherefore, plaintiff prays for judgment against DEFENDANTS as set forth  
11 hereinafter.

12 **PRAYER FOR RELIEF**

13 Wherefore, plaintiff prays for judgment against DEFENDANTS as follows:

14 1. That the Court, pursuant to California Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(b), assess  
15 civil penalties against DEFENDANTS, in the amount of \$2,500.00 per day for each violation  
16 alleged herein;, pursuant to

17 2. That the Court, pursuant to California Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(a),  
18 preliminarily and permanently enjoin DEFENDANTS from manufacturing, distributing or  
19 offering the PRODUCTS for sale or use in California, without providing "clear and reasonable  
20 warnings" as detailed by 27 CCR § 25601, as to the harms associated with exposures to the  
21 LISTED CHEMICAL;

22 3. That the Court grant plaintiff his reasonable attorneys' fees and cost of suit; and

23 4. That the Court grant such other and further relief as may be just and proper.
