22	MATEEL ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE FOUNDATION alleges as follows:		
23	INTRODUCTION		
24	1. This Complaint seeks civil penalties and an injunction to remedy the continuing		
25	failure of defendants BIG O TIRES, LLC.; BRIDGESTONE AMERICAS, INC.; and		
26	BRIDGESTONE RETAIL OPERATIONS, LLC (hereinafter "Defendants"), to give clear and		
27	reasonable warnings to those residents of California, who handle and use, automotive batteries		
28	that utilize leaded terminals that handling and contacting the terminals on these batteries causes

1 those residents to be exposed to lead and lead compounds (hereinafter, collectively, "lead"). The 2 types of products to which this Complaint pertains are those types listed in the Product List 3 appended to the Proposition 65 Notice of Violation Letter that is attached to and incorporated by 4 reference into this Complaint. Lead is known to the State of California to cause cancer, birth 5 defects and male and female reproductive toxicity. Defendants distribute, and/or market 6 automotive batteries. These products cause exposures to lead and lead compounds, which are 7 chemicals known to the State of California to cause cancer, birth defects and other reproductive 8 harm.

9 2. Defendants market, and/or distribute automotive batteries. Defendants intend that 10 residents of California handle and contact the terminals of these batteries that Defendants 11 market, and/or distribute. When these products are handled and used in their normally intended 12 manner the automotive batteries expose people to lead. In spite of knowing that residents of 13 California were and are being exposed to this toxic heavy metal when they handle and contact 14 the terminals of these batteries, Defendants did not and do not provide clear and reasonable 15 warnings that these products cause exposure to chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects and other reproductive harm. 16

17 3. Plaintiff seeks injunctive relief pursuant to Health & Safety Code Section 25249.7 18 to compel Defendants to bring their business practices into compliance with section 25249.5 et 19 seq. by providing a clear and reasonable warning to each individual who has been and who in the 20 future may be exposed to the above mentioned toxic chemicals from the use of Defendants' 21 products. Plaintiff seeks an order that defendant identify and locate each individual person who 22 in the past has purchased automotive batteries and to provide to each such purchaser a clear and 23 reasonable warning that the batteries will cause exposures to chemicals known to cause birth 24 defects.

4. In addition to injunctive relief, plaintiff seeks civil penalties to remedy the failure
of Defendants to provide clear and reasonable warnings regarding exposure to chemicals known
to cause cancer, birth defects and other reproductive harm.

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COMPLAINT FOR INJUNCTION AND CIVIL PENALTIES

PARTIES

2 5. Plaintiff MATEEL ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE FOUNDATION ("Mateel") 3 is a non-profit organization dedicated to, among other causes, the protection of the environment, 4 promotion of human health, environmental education, and consumer rights. Mateel is based in 5 Eureka, California, and is incorporated under the laws of the State of California. Mateel is a 6 "person" pursuant to Health & Safety Code Section 25118. Mateel brings this enforcement 7 action in the public interest pursuant to Health & Safety Code §25249.7(d). Residents of 8 California are regularly exposed to lead and lead compounds from automotive batteries that are 9 distributed or marketed by Defendants and are so exposed without a clear and reasonable 10 Proposition 65 warning.

Defendants are persons doing business within the meaning of Health & Safety
 Code Section 25249.11. Defendants are businesses that distribute, and/or market automotive
 batteries in California, including in the City and County of San Francisco. Distribution and/or
 marketing of these products in the City and County of San Francisco and/or to people who live
 in San Francisco, causes people to be exposed to lead and lead compounds while they are
 physically present in the City and County of San Francisco.

17 7. Plaintiff brings this enforcement action against Defendants pursuant to Health & 18 Safety Code Section 25249.7(d). Attached hereto and incorporated by reference is a copy of a 19 60-day Notice of Violation ("Notice"), dated August 14, 2014, which Mateel sent to California's Attorney General. Substantively identical letters were sent to every District Attorney in the state, 2021 and to the City Attorneys of every California city with a population greater than 750,000, and to 22 each defendant. Attached to the Notice sent to each defendant was a summary of Proposition 65 that was prepared by California's Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment. In 23 24 addition, each 60-Day Notice Letter plaintiff sent was accompanied by a Certificate of Service attesting to the service of the 60-Day Notice Letter on each entity which received it. Pursuant to 25 California Health & Safety Code Section 25249.7(d), a Certificate of Merit attesting to the 26 reasonable and meritorious basis for the action was also sent with each 60-Day Notice Letter. 27 Factual information sufficient to establish the basis of the Certificate of Merit was enclosed with 28

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the 60-Day Notice letter Mateel sent to the Attorney General.

8. Each defendant employs more than ten people.

JURISDICTION

9. The Court has jurisdiction over this action pursuant to California Health & Safety
 Code Section 25249.7. California Constitution Article VI, Section 10 grants the Superior Court
 "original jurisdiction in all causes except those given by statute to other trial courts." Chapter
 6.6 of the Health & Safety Code, which contains the statutes under which this action is brought,
 does not grant jurisdiction to any other trial court.

9 10. This Court also has jurisdiction over Defendants because they are businesses that
10 have sufficient minimum contacts in California and within the City and County of San Francisco.
11 Defendants intentionally availed themselves of the California and San Francisco County markets
12 for automotive batteries. It is thus consistent with traditional notions of fair play and substantial
13 justice for the San Francisco Superior Court to exercise jurisdiction over Defendants.

14 11. Venue is proper in this Court because Defendants market theirs products in and
15 around San Francisco and thus cause people to be exposed to lead and lead compounds while
16 those people are physically present in San Francisco. Liability for Plaintiff's causes of action, or
17 some parts thereof, has accordingly arisen in San Francisco during the times relevant to this
18 Complaint and Plaintiff seeks civil penalties imposed by statute.

FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION (Claim for Injunctive Relief)

The People of the State of California have declared by referendum under

Proposition 65 (California Health & Safety Code § 25249.5 et seq.) their right "[t]o be informed

that businesses that knowingly and intentionally expose any individual to a chemical known to

the State of California to cause cancer or birth defects must first provide a clear and reasonable

about exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects, and reproductive harm."

Plaintiff realleges and incorporates by reference into this First Cause of Action, as

To effectuate this goal, Section 25249.6 of the Health and Safety Code mandates

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1 warning to such individual prior to the exposure.

2 15. Since at least August 14, 2011, Defendants have engaged in conduct that violates 3 Health and Safety Code Section 25249.6 et seq. This conduct includes knowingly and 4 intentionally exposing to the above mentioned toxic chemicals, those California residents who 5 handle or contact the terminals on automotive batteries. This happens when people install the 6 battery or when they remove it from their vehicle to charge it or maintain the terminals by 7 brushing corrosion from the terminals. These normally intended uses of automotive batteries 8 causes exposure to lead and lead compounds, which are chemicals known to the State of 9 California to cause cancer, birth defects and other reproductive harm. Defendants have not 10 provided clear and reasonable warnings, within the meaning of Health & Safety Code Sections 25249.6 and 25249.11. 11

12 16. At all times relevant to this action, Defendants knew that the automotive batteries
13 they distributed or marketed were causing exposures to lead and lead compounds. Defendants
14 intended that residents of California handle and contact the terminals of the batteries in such
15 ways as would lead to significant exposures to these chemicals.

16 17. By the above described acts, Defendants have violated Cal. Health & Safety Code
17 § 25249.6 and are therefore subject to an injunction ordering them to stop violating Proposition
18 65, to provide warnings to all present and future customers and to provide warnings to their past
19 customers who purchased Defendants' products without receiving a clear and reasonable
20 warning.

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SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION (Claim for Civil Penalties)

18. Plaintiff realleges and incorporates by reference into this Second Cause of Action, as if specifically set forth herein, paragraphs 1 through 17, inclusive.

19. By the above described acts, Defendants are liable and should be liable pursuant to Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(b), for a civil penalty of \$2,500.00 per day for each individual exposed without proper warning, since August 14, 2013, to lead and lead compounds

from the handling of, contact with, and maintenance of the automotive batteries that Defendants market.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF

Wherefore, plaintiff prays for judgment against DEFENDANTS, as follows:

1. Pursuant to the First Cause of Action, that Defendants be enjoined, restrained, and ordered to comply with the provisions of Section 25249.6 of the California Health & Safety 7 Code;

8 2. Pursuant to the Second Cause of Action, that Defendants be assessed a civil 9 penalty in an amount equal to \$2,500.00 per day per individual exposed, in violation of Section 10 25249.6 of the California Health & Safety Code, to lead and lead compounds as the result of 11 Defendant's distributing or marketing of automotive batteries;

12 3. That Defendant be ordered to identify and locate each individual who purchased 13 automotive batteries and provide a warning to each such person that the automotive batteries the 14 person purchased will expose that person to chemicals known to cause birth defects.

15 4. That, pursuant to Civil Procedure Code § 1021.5, Defendant be ordered to pay to Plaintiff the attorneys fees and costs it incurred in bringing this enforcement action. 16

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For such other relief as this court deems just and proper.

Greetings:

This office and the Mateel Environmental Justice Foundation ("Mateel") give you notice that the private businesses on the attached service list have been, are, will be and threaten to be in violation of Cal. Health & Safety Code § 25249.6. Both this office and Mateel are private enforcers of Proposition 65, both may be contacted at the below listed address and telephone number, and I am a responsible individual at both Mateel and this office. The above referenced violations occur when California residents come into contact with battery terminals. A list of specific examples of the specific products at issue is attached. These battery terminals are made from lead and lead compounds ("lead"), chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects and other reproductive harm. California residents are exposed to lead when they handle these battery terminals while removing and installing batteries in their cars, motorcycles, boats, RVs, lawnmowers and other vehicles. Lead is transferred from the battery terminals to their hands and to other parts of their skin. This lead is then absorbed through the skin, taken into cuts and abrasions, absorbed through mucous membranes, and transferred from the skin to the mouth via oral contact either from oral contact with the lead-contaminated skin, or when lead is transferred from contaminated skin to cigarettes and food and the contaminated cigarettes and food are smoked and/or eaten. These lead exposures thus occur via the dermal absorption, subcutaneous, mucus membrane, ingestion and inhalation routes. The listed businesses did not and do not provide people with clear and reasonable warnings before they expose them to lead. These violations have occurred every day since at least August 14, 2011, and will continue every day until the lead is removed from the battery terminals, or until clear and reasonable warnings are given. The above-referenced violations are alleged for occupational exposures as well as for consumer and environmental exposures. We do not, however, allege occupational exposure violations as to any battery terminals made outside of California, except as to workplaces these companies themselves maintain in California. Exposures constituting Proposition 65 environmental exposure violations occur both on and off each company's property and in each of California's 58 counties.
