17 Plaintiff ENVIRONMENTAL RESEARCH CENTER, INC. ("Plaintiff" or "ERC")  
 18 brings this action in the interests of the general public and, on information and belief, hereby  
 19 alleges:

20 **INTRODUCTION**

21 1. This action seeks to remedy the continuing failure of Defendant HERBS OF  
 22 LIGHT, INC., a Florida Corporation ("Herbs of Light" or "Defendant") to warn consumers in  
 23 California that they are being exposed to lead, a substance known to the State of California to  
 24 cause cancer, birth defects, and other reproductive harm.

25 2. Defendant manufactures, packages, distributes, markets, and/or sells in California  
 26 certain products containing lead, including each of the following products ("PRODUCTS"):

3. Lead and lead compounds (hereinafter, the "LISTED CHEMICAL") is a substance

1 known to the State<sup>1</sup> of California to cause cancer, birth defects, and other reproductive harm.

2 4. The use and/or handling of the PRODUCTS causes exposures to the LISTED  
3 CHEMICAL at levels requiring a “clear and reasonable warning” under California's Safe  
4 Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, Health & Safety Code (“H&S Code”)  
5 §25249.5, *et seq.* (also known as “Proposition 65”). Defendant has failed to provide the health  
6 hazard warnings required by Proposition 65.

7 5. Defendant’s continued manufacturing, packaging, distributing, marketing and/or  
8 sales of the PRODUCTS without the required health hazard warnings, causes individuals to be  
9 involuntarily and unwittingly exposed to levels of the LISTED CHEMICAL that violate  
10 Proposition 65.

11 6. Plaintiff seeks injunctive relief enjoining Defendant from the continued  
12 manufacturing, packaging, distributing, marketing and/or sales of the PRODUCTS in  
13 California without provision of clear and reasonable warnings regarding the risks of cancer,  
14 birth defects, and other reproductive harm posed by exposure to the LISTED CHEMICAL  
15 through the use and/or handling of the PRODUCTS. Plaintiff seeks an injunctive order  
16 compelling Defendant to bring its business practices into compliance with Proposition 65 by  
17 providing a clear and reasonable warning to each individual who has been and who in the  
18 future may be exposed to the LISTED CHEMICAL from the use of the PRODUCTS. Plaintiff  
19 also seeks an order compelling Defendant to identify and locate each individual person who in  
20 the past has purchased the PRODUCTS, and to provide to each such purchaser a clear and  
21 reasonable warning that the use of the PRODUCTS will cause exposures to the LISTED  
22 CHEMICAL.

1 reproductive toxicity. 27 CCR § 25805(b).

2 19. On October 1, 1992, the State of California officially listed the chemicals lead and  
3 lead compounds as chemicals known to cause cancer. Lead and lead compounds became  
4 subject to the warning requirement one year later and were therefore subject to the “clear and  
5 reasonable” warning requirements of Proposition 65 beginning on October 1, 1993. 27 CCR  
6 § 25102, *et seq.*; H&S Code §25249.6, *et seq.* Due to the carcinogenicity of lead, the no  
7 significant risk level for lead is 15 ug/day (micrograms a day). 27 CCR § 25705(b)(1).

8 20. To test Defendant’s PRODUCTS for lead, Plaintiff hired a well-respected and  
9 accredited testing laboratory that designed the testing protocol used and approved by the  
10 California Attorney General years ago for testing heavy metals. The results of testing  
11 undertaken by Plaintiff of Defendant’s PRODUCTS show that the PRODUCTS tested were in  
12 violation of the 0.5 ug/day “safe harbor” daily dose limit set forth in Proposition 65’s  
13 regulations. The results of testing undertaken by PLAINTIFF of DEFENDANT’S Goldenseal  
14 Wildcrafted product show that product was in violation of the 15 ug/day “safe harbor” no  
15 significant risk level set forth in Proposition 65’s regulations for chemicals listed as  
16 carcinogens. Very significant is the fact that people are being exposed to lead through  
17 ingestion as opposed to other not as harmful methods of exposure such as dermal exposure.  
18 Ingestion of lead produces much higher exposure levels and health risks than does dermal  
19 exposure to this chemical.

20 21. At all times relevant to this action, Defendant, therefore, has knowingly and  
21 intentionally exposed the users and/or handlers of the PRODUCTS to the LISTED  
22 CHEMICAL without first giving a clear and reasonable warning to such individuals.

23 22. The PRODUCTS have allegedly been sold by Defendant for use in California  
24 since at least December 22, 2011. The PRODUCTS continue to be distributed and sold  
25 in California without the requisite warning information.

26 23. On December 22, 2014, Plaintiff sent a 60-Day Notice of Proposition 65 (“Notice”)

1 violations to the requisite public enforcement agencies, and to the Defendant. A true and  
2 correct copy of the Notice is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference. The  
3 Notice was issued pursuant to, and in compliance with, the requirements of H&S Code  
4 §25249.7(d) and the statute's implementing regulations regarding the notice of the violations to  
5 be given to certain public enforcement agencies and to the violator. The Notice included, *inter*  
6 *alia*, the following information: the name, address, and telephone number of the noticing  
7 individual; the name of the alleged violator; the statute violated; the approximate time period  
8 during which violations occurred; and descriptions of the violations, including the chemicals  
9 involved, the routes of toxic exposure, and the specific product or type of product causing the  
10 violations, and was issued as follows:

- 11 a. Defendant was provided a copy of the Notice by Certified Mail.
- 12 b. Defendant was provided a copy of a document entitled "The Safe  
13 Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 (Proposition 65): A  
14 Summary," which is also known as Appendix A to Title 27 of CCR  
15 §25903.
- 16 c. The California Attorney General was provided a copy of the Notice via  
17 online submission.
- 18 d. The California Attorney General was provided with a Certificate of Merit  
19 by the attorney for the noticing party, stating that there is a reasonable  
20 and meritorious case for this action, and attaching factual information  
21 sufficient to establish a basis for the certificate, including the identity of  
22 the persons consulted with and relied on by the certifier, and the facts,  
23 studies, or other data reviewed by those persons, pursuant to H&S Code  
24 §25249.7(h) (2).

25 24. At least 60-days have elapsed since Plaintiff sent the Notice to the Defendant.

26 The appropriate public enforcement agencies have failed to commence and diligently

1 prosecute a cause of action under H&S Code §25249.5, *et seq.* against Defendant based  
2 on the allegations herein.

3 25. As a proximate result of acts by Defendant, as persons in the course of doing  
4 business within the meaning of Health & Safety Code §25249.11, individuals throughout the  
5 State of California, including in the County of Alameda, have been exposed to the LISTED  
6 CHEMICAL without a clear and reasonable warning. The individuals subject to the illegal  
7 exposures include normal and foreseeable users of the PRODUCTS, as well as all other  
8 persons exposed to the PRODUCTS.

9 **FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION**

10 **(Injunctive Relief for Violations of Health and Safety Code § 25249.5, *et seq.* concerning  
11 the PRODUCTS described in the December 22, 2014 Prop. 65 Notice)**

12 26. Plaintiff realleges and incorporates by reference all preceding paragraphs as if  
13 specifically set forth herein.

14 27. By committing the acts alleged in this Complaint, Defendant at all times relevant to  
15 this action, and continuing through the present, has violated H&S Code §25249.6 by, in the  
16 course of doing business, knowingly and intentionally exposing individuals who use or handle  
17 the PRODUCTS set forth in the Notice to the LISTED CHEMICAL, without first providing a  
18 clear and reasonable warning to such individuals pursuant to H&S Code §§ 25249.6 and  
19 25249.11(f).

20 28. By the above-described acts, Defendant has violated H&S Code § 25249.6 and is  
21 therefore subject to an injunction ordering Defendant to stop violating Proposition 65, to  
22 provide warnings to all present and future customers, and to provide warnings to Defendant's  
23 past customers who purchased or used the PRODUCTS without receiving a clear and  
24 reasonable warning.

25 29. An action for injunctive relief under Proposition 65 is specifically authorized by  
26 Health & Safety Code §25249.7(a).

30. Continuing commission by Defendant of the acts alleged above will irreparably

1 harm the citizens of the State of California, for which harm they have no plain, speedy, or  
2 adequate remedy at law.

3 Wherefore, Plaintiff prays judgment against Defendant, as set forth hereafter.

4 **SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION**

5 **(Civil Penalties for Violations of Health and Safety Code § 25249.5, *et seq.* concerning the**  
6 **PRODUCTS described in the December 22, 2014 Prop. 65 Notice)**

7 31. Plaintiff realleges and incorporates by reference all preceding paragraphs as if  
8 specifically set forth herein.

9 32. By committing the acts alleged in this Complaint, Defendant at all times relevant to  
10 this action, and continuing through the present, has violated H&S Code §25249.6 by, in the  
11 course of doing business, knowingly and intentionally exposing individuals who use or handle  
12 the PRODUCTS set forth in the Notice to the LISTED CHEMICAL, without first providing a  
13 clear and reasonable warning to such individuals pursuant to H&S Code §§ 25249.6 and  
14 25249.11(f).

15 33. By the above-described acts, Defendant is liable, pursuant to H&S Code  
16 §25249.7(b), for a civil penalty of \$2,500 per day per violation for each unlawful exposure to the  
17 LISTED CHEMICAL from the PRODUCTS, in an amount in excess of \$15 million.

18 Wherefore, Plaintiff prays judgment against Defendant, as set forth hereafter.

19 **THE NEED FOR INJUNCTIVE RELIEF**

20 34. Plaintiff realleges and incorporates by this reference all preceding paragraphs as  
21 if set forth below.

22 35. By committing the acts alleged in this Complaint, Defendant has caused  
23 irreparable harm for which there is no plain, speedy or adequate remedy at law. In the absence  
24 of equitable relief, Defendant will continue to create a substantial risk of irreparable injury by  
25 continuing to cause consumers to be involuntarily and unwittingly exposed to the LISTED  
26 CHEMICAL through the use and/or handling of the PRODUCTS.

1 **PRAYER FOR RELIEF**

2 Wherefore, Plaintiff accordingly prays for the following relief:

3 A. A preliminary and permanent injunction, pursuant to H&S Code §25249.7(b),  
4 enjoining Defendant, its agents, employees, assigns and all persons acting in concert or  
5 participating with Defendant, from distributing or selling the PRODUCTS in California  
6 without first providing a clear and reasonable warning, within the meaning of Proposition 65,  
7 that the users and/or handlers of the PRODUCTS are exposed to the LISTED CHEMICAL;

8 B. An injunctive order, pursuant to H&S Code §25249.7(b), compelling Defendant  
9 to identify and locate each individual who has purchased the PRODUCTS since December 22,  
10 2011, and to provide a warning to such person that the use of the PRODUCTS will expose the  
11 user to chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects, and other reproductive harm;

12 C. An assessment of civil penalties pursuant to Health & Safety Code §25249.7(b),  
13 against Defendant in the amount of \$2,500 per day for each violation of Proposition 65, in an  
14 amount in excess of \$15 million;

15 D. An award to Plaintiff of its reasonable attorney's fees and costs of suit pursuant  
16 to California Code of Civil Procedure §1021.5, as Plaintiff shall specify in further application  
17 to the Court; and

18 E. Such other and further relief as may be just and proper.

Dear Addressees:

I represent the Environmental Research Center, Inc. ("ERC") in connection with this Notice of Violations of California's Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, which is codified at California Health & Safety Code Section 25249.5 *et seq.* and also referred to as Proposition 65.

ERC is a California non-profit corporation dedicated to, among other causes, helping safeguard the public from health hazards by bringing about a reduction in the use and misuse of hazardous and toxic chemicals, facilitating a safe environment for consumers and employees, and encouraging corporate responsibility.

The name of the Company covered by this notice that violated Proposition 65 (hereinafter the "Violator") is:

On February 27, 1987, the State of California officially listed lead as a chemical known to cause developmental toxicity, and male and female reproductive toxicity. On October 1, 1992, the State of California officially listed lead and lead compounds as chemicals known to cause cancer.

This letter is a notice to the Violator and the appropriate governmental authorities of the Proposition 65 violations concerning the listed products. This notice covers all violations of Proposition 65 involving the Violator currently known to ERC from the information now available. ERC may continue to investigate other products that may reveal further violations. A summary of Proposition 65, prepared by the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment, is enclosed with the copy of this letter to the Violator.

The Violator has manufactured, marketed, distributed, and/or sold the listed products, which have exposed and continue to expose numerous individuals within California to the



identified chemical, lead. The consumer exposures that are the subject of this notice result from the purchase, acquisition, handling and/or recommended use of these products by consumers. The primary route of exposure to lead has been through ingestion, but may have also occurred through inhalation and/or dermal contact. Proposition 65 requires that a clear and reasonable warning be provided prior to exposure to lead. The method of warning should be a warning that appears on the product's label. The Violator violated Proposition 65 because it failed to provide an appropriate warning to persons using and/or handling these products that they are being exposed to lead. Each of these ongoing violations has occurred on every day since December 22, 2011, as well as every day since the products were introduced in the California marketplace, and will continue every day until clear and reasonable warnings are provided to product purchasers and users.

Pursuant to Section 25249.7(d) of the statute, ERC intends to file a citizen enforcement action sixty days after effective service of this notice unless the Violator agrees in an enforceable written instrument to: (1) reformulate the listed products so as to eliminate further exposures to the identified chemicals; (2) pay an appropriate civil penalty; and (3) provide clear and reasonable warnings compliant with Proposition 65 to all persons located in California who purchased the above products in the last three years. Consistent with the public interest goals of Proposition 65 and my client's objectives in pursuing this notice, ERC is interested in seeking a constructive resolution to this matter. Such resolution will avoid both further unwarned consumer exposures to the identified chemicals and expensive and time consuming litigation.


