**COMPLAINT FOR CIVIL PENALTIES
AND INJUNCTIVE RELIEF**

(Health & Safety Code § 25249.6, *et seq.*)

17 **NATURE OF THE ACTION**

18 1. This Complaint is a representative action brought by plaintiff Laurence Vinocur
19 ("Plaintiff") in the public interest of the citizens of the State of California to enforce the
20 citizens' right to be informed of the presence of Di(2-ethylhexyl)phthalate ("DEHP"), Di-
21 isodecyl phthalate ("DIDP"), and Diisononyl phthalate ("DINP"); toxic chemicals found in
22 hearing protection with vinyl/PVC ear cushions sold in California. DEHP, DIDP, and DINP
23 are toxic chemicals used as plasticizers and are used in a variety of products.

24 2. By this Complaint, Plaintiff seeks to remedy Defendants' continuing failures to
25 warn California citizens about the risk of exposure to DEHP, DIDP, and DINP present in and
26 on hearing protection manufactured, distributed, and offered for sale or use to consumers
27 throughout the State of California.

BY FAX

1 3. Detectable levels of DEHP, DIDP, and DINP are commonly found in and on
2 hearing protection that Defendants manufacture, distribute, and offer for sale to consumers
3 throughout the State of California. Individuals in California, including infants and children, are
4 exposed to DEHP, DIDP, and DINP in such products through through dermal exposure to,
5 and/or ingestion of, DEHP, DIDP, and DINP present in and on Defendants' hearing protection
6 products.

7 4. Under the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, codified at
8 Health and Safety Code section 25249.5 *et seq.* ("Proposition 65"), "[n]o person in the course
9 of doing business shall knowingly and intentionally expose any individual to a chemical known
10 to the state to cause cancer or reproductive toxicity without first giving clear and reasonable
11 warning to such individual" Health & Safety Code § 25249.5.

12 5. Pursuant to Proposition 65, on October 24, 2003, California identified and listed
13 DEHP as a chemical known to cause to cause birth defects and other reproductive harm.
14 DEHP became subject to the "clear and reasonable warning" requirements of the Act one year
15 later on October 24, 2004. Cal. Code Regs., Tit. 27, § 27001(c); Health & Safety Code §§
16 25249.8 & 25249.10(b).

17 6. Pursuant to Proposition 65, on April 20, 2007, California identified and listed
18 DIDP as a chemical known to cause birth defects and other reproductive harm. DIDP became
19 subject to the "clear and reasonable warning" requirements of the Act one year later on April
20 20, 2008. Cal. Code Regs., Tit. 27, § 27001(c); Health & Safety Code §§ 25249.8 &
21 25249.10(b).

22 7. Pursuant to Proposition 65, on December 20, 2013, California identified and
23 listed DINP as a chemical known to cause cancer. DINP became subject to the "clear and
24 reasonable warning" requirements of the Act one year later on December 20, 2014. Cal. Code
25 Regs., Tit. 27, § 27001(c); Health & Safety Code §§ 25249.8 & 25249.10(b)

26 8. DEHP, DIDP, and DINP are hereinafter referred to as the "Listed Chemicals."

27 9. Defendant STIHL Incorporated ("STIHL") and Defendant Tasco Corporation
28 ("Tasco") manufacture, distribute, import, sell and/or offer for sale in California hearing

1 protection containing the Listed Chemicals without a warning including, but not limited to,
2 Professional Hearing Protector, STIHL SKU #000-866-0402, Tasco SKU #230-02555, and
3 UPC #7 95711 13304 7.

4 10. All products containing the Listed Chemicals as listed in paragraph 9 above shall
5 hereinafter be referred to as the "Products."

6 11. Although Defendants expose infants, children, and other people to the Listed
7 Chemicals in the Products, Defendants provide no warnings about the reproductive and
8 carcinogenic hazards associated with exposures to the Listed Chemicals. Defendants' failures
9 to warn consumers and other individuals in the State of California about their exposures to the
10 Listed Chemicals in conjunction with Defendants' sales of the Products, is a violation of
11 Proposition 65, and subjects Defendants to enjoinder of such conduct as well as civil
12 penalties for each violation. Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(a) & (b)(1).

13 12. As a result of Defendants' violations of Proposition 65, Plaintiff seeks
14 preliminary and permanent injunctive relief to compel Defendants to provide purchasers or
15 users of the Products with the required warning regarding the health hazards of the Listed
16 Chemicals in the Products. Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(a).

17 13. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 25249.7(b), Plaintiff also seeks civil
18 penalties against Defendants for their violations of Proposition 65.

19 **PARTIES**

20 14. Plaintiff Laurence Vinocur is a citizen of the State of California who is dedicated
21 to protecting the health of California citizens through the elimination or reduction of toxic
22 exposures from consumer products, and he brings this action in the public interest pursuant to
23 Health and Safety Code section 25249.7(d).

24 15. Defendant STIHL is a person in the course of doing business within the meaning
25 of Health and Safety Code sections 25249.6 and 25249.11.

26 16. STIHL manufactures, imports, distributes, sells, and/or offers the Products for
27 sale or use in the State of California, or implies by its conduct that it manufactures, imports,
28 distributes, sells, and/or offers the Products for sale or use in the State of California.

1 corporation, or association that is a citizen of the State of California, has sufficient minimum
2 contacts in the State of California, and/or otherwise purposefully avails itself of the California
3 market. Defendants' purposeful availment of California as a marketplace for the Products
4 renders the exercise of personal jurisdiction by California courts over Defendants consistent
5 with traditional notions of fair play and substantial justice.

6 **FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION**

7 **(Violation of Proposition 65 - Against All Defendants)**

8 24. Plaintiff re-alleges and incorporates by reference, as if fully set forth herein,
9 Paragraphs 1 through 23, inclusive.

10 25. In enacting Proposition 65, in the preamble to the Safe Drinking Water and
11 Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, the People of California expressly declared their right "[t]o be
12 informed about exposures to chemicals that cause birth defects, or other reproductive harm."

13 26. Proposition 65 states, "[n]o person in the course of doing business shall
14 knowingly and intentionally expose any individual to a chemical known to the state to cause
15 cancer or reproductive toxicity without first giving clear and reasonable warning to such
16 individual" Health & Safety Code § 25249.6.

17 27. On October 24, 2014, Plaintiff served a sixty-day notice of violation ("Notice"),
18 together with the requisite certificate of merit, on STIHL and certain public enforcement
19 agencies stating that, as a result of STIHL's sales of the Products containing DEHP, purchasers
20 and users in the State of California were being exposed to DEHP, without the individual
21 purchasers and users first having been provided with a "clear and reasonable warning"
22 regarding such toxic exposures, as required by Proposition 65. The Notice is attached hereto as
23 Exhibit A.

24 28. On March 13, 2015, Plaintiff served STIHL and Tasco, and certain requisite
25 public enforcement agencies, with a Supplemental 60-Day Notice of Violation ("Supplemental
26 Notice"), alleging that STIHL and Tasco violated Proposition 65 when they failed to warn
27 customers and consumers in California that the Products expose users to DEHP. The
28 Supplemental Notice is attached hereto as Exhibit B.

1 29. On April 29, 2015, Plaintiff served STIHL and Tasco, and certain requisite public
2 enforcement agencies, with a Second Supplemental 60-Day Notice of Violation (“Second
3 Supplemental Notice”), alleging that Defendants violated Proposition 65 when they allegedly
4 failed to warn customers and consumers in California that the Products expose users to the
5 Listed Chemicals. The Second Supplemental Notice is attached hereto as Exhibit C. (The
6 Notice, the Supplemental Notice and the Second Supplemental Notice are hereinafter the
7 "Notices.")

8 30. Defendants have engaged in the manufacture, importation, distribution, sale, and
9 offering of the Products for sale or use in violation of Health and Safety Code section 25249.6,
10 and Defendants’ violations have continued to occur beyond their receipt of the Notices. As
11 such, Defendants’ violations are ongoing and continuous in nature, and will continue to occur
12 in the future.

13 31. After receiving Plaintiff’s Notices, the appropriate public enforcement agencies
14 have failed to commence and diligently prosecute a cause of action against Defendants under
15 Proposition 65.

16 32. The Products manufactured, imported, distributed, sold, and offered for sale or
17 use in California by Defendants contain the Listed Chemicals such that they require a “clear
18 and reasonable” warning under Proposition 65.

19 33. Defendants knew or should have known that the Products they manufacture,
20 import, distribute, sell, and offer for sale or use in California contain the Listed Chemicals.

21 34. The Listed Chemicals are present in or on the Products in such a way as to
22 expose individuals to the Listed Chemicals through dermal contact and/or ingestion during
23 reasonably foreseeable use of the Products.

24 35. The normal and reasonably foreseeable uses of the Products have caused, and
25 continue to cause, consumer exposures to the Listed Chemicals, as such exposures are defined
26 by the California Code of Regulations Title 27, section 25602(b).

1 2. That the Court, pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 25249.7(a),
2 preliminarily and permanently enjoin Defendants from manufacturing, distributing, or offering
3 the Products for sale or use in California without first providing a “clear and reasonable
4 warning” as defined by the California Code of Regulations title 27, section 25601 *et seq.*, as to
5 the harms associated with exposures the Listed Chemicals;

6 3. That the Court, pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 25249.7(a), issue
7 preliminary and permanent injunctions mandating that Defendants recall all Products currently
8 in the chain of commerce in California without a “clear and reasonable warning” as defined by
9 California Code of Regulations title 27, section 25601 *et seq.*

10 4. That the Court grant Plaintiff his reasonable attorneys’ fees and costs of suit; and

11 5. That the Court grant such other and further relief as may be just and proper.

I. INTRODUCTION

My name is Laurence Vinocur. I am a citizen of the State of California acting in the interest of the general public. I seek to promote awareness of exposures to toxic chemicals in products sold in California and, if possible, to improve human health by reducing hazardous substances contained in such items. This Notice is provided to the public agencies listed above pursuant to California Health & Safety Code § 25249.6 *et seq.* (“Proposition 65”). As noted above, notice is also being provided to the alleged violator, Stihl Incorporated (the “Violator”). The violations covered by this Notice consist of the product exposures, routes of exposure, and type of harm potentially resulting from exposure to the toxic chemical (“listed chemical”) identified below, as follows:

Product Exposure: See Section VII. Exhibit A
Listed Chemical: Di(2-ethylhexyl)phthalate (“DEHP”)
Routes of Exposure: Ingestion, Dermal
Types of Harm: Birth Defects and Other Reproductive Harm

II. NATURE OF ALLEGED VIOLATION (PRODUCT EXPOSURE)

The specific type of product that is causing consumer and occupational exposures in violation of Proposition 65, and that is covered by this Notice, is listed under “Product Category/Type” in Exhibit A in Section VII below. All products within the category covered by this Notice shall be referred to hereinafter as the “products.” Exposures to the listed chemical from the use of the products have been occurring without the clear and reasonable warning required by Proposition 65, dating as far back as October 24, 2011. Without proper warnings regarding the toxic effects of exposures to the listed chemical resulting from contact with the products, California citizens lack the information necessary to make informed decisions on whether and how to eliminate (or reduce) the risk of exposure to the listed chemical from the reasonably foreseeable use of the products.

California citizens, through the act of buying, acquiring or utilizing the products, are exposed to the listed chemical. Women of childbearing age ingest the listed chemical when they, among other activities, touch the products and transfer the listed chemical from the products to their mouths through hand-to-mouth activities that may continue to occur for a significant period after contact with the products stops. Women of childbearing age are exposed to the listed chemical through direct dermal contact when they, among other activities, handle, touch or otherwise use the products.

For the Violator's reference, I have attached a copy of "Proposition 65: A Summary" which has been prepared by OEHHA.

V. RESOLUTION OF NOTICED CLAIMS

Based on the allegations set forth in this Notice, I intend to file a citizen enforcement lawsuit against the alleged Violator unless such Violator enters into a binding written agreement to: (1) recall products already sold or undertake best efforts to ensure that the requisite health hazard warnings are provided to those who have received such products; (2) provide clear and reasonable warnings for products sold in the future or reformulate such products to eliminate the DEHP exposures; and (3) pay an appropriate civil penalty based on the factors enumerated in California Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(b). If the alleged Violator is interested in resolving this dispute without resorting to time-consuming and expensive litigation, please feel free to contact my counsel identified in Section III above. It should be noted that neither my counsel nor I can: (1) finalize any settlement until after the 60-day notice period has expired; nor (2) speak for the Attorney General or any district or city attorney who received this Notice. Therefore, while reaching an agreement with me will resolve my claims, such agreement may not satisfy the public prosecutors.

VI. ADDITIONAL NOTICE INFORMATION

Identified below is a specific example of a product recently purchased and witnessed as being available for purchase or use in California that is within the category or type of offending product covered by this Notice.
