22 **NATURE OF THE ACTION**

23 1. This Complaint is a representative action brought by plaintiff King Pun Cheng, in  
24 the public interest of the citizens of the State of California, to enforce the people's right to be  
25 informed of the presence of Diisononyl phthalate (hereinafter referred to as "DINP") found in  
26 Yum Dinger Bama Bug Gummy Worms.

27 2. By this Complaint, plaintiff seeks to remedy Defendant's failure to warn California  
28 citizens about the risks of exposure to DINP present in Yum Dinger Bama Bug Gummy Worms

1 manufactured, distributed and/or offered for sale to consumers throughout the State of  
2 California.

3 3. Detectable levels of DINP are found in Yum Dinger Bama Bug Gummy Worms  
4 and components that Defendant manufactures, distributes and/or offers for sale to consumers  
5 throughout the State of California.

6 4. Under California's Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986,  
7 California Health & Safety Code § 25249.5 et seq. (Proposition 65), "No person in the course of  
8 doing business shall knowingly and intentionally expose any individual to a chemical known to  
9 the state to cause cancer or reproductive toxicity without first giving clear and reasonable  
10 warning to such individual..." (*Cal. Health & Safety Code § 25249.6.*)

11 5. Under Proposition 65, California identified and listed DINP as chemicals known to  
12 cause cancer.

13 6. DINP shall hereinafter be referred to as the "LISTED CHEMICALS."

14 7. Defendant manufactures, distributes and/or sells without a health hazard warning  
15 in California, Gummy Worm Lures, including Yum Dinger Bama Bug Gummy Worms,  
16 UPC719339092746, containing the LISTED CHEMICALS shall hereinafter be referred to as the  
17 "PRODUCTS."

18 8. Defendant's failure to warn consumers and/or other individuals in the State of  
19 California about their exposure to the LISTED CHEMICALS in conjunction with Defendant's  
20 distribution or sale of the PRODUCTS is a violation of Proposition 65 and subjects Defendant to  
21 enjoinder of such conduct as well as civil penalties for each such violation.

22 9. For Defendant's violations of Proposition 65, plaintiff seeks preliminary  
23 injunctive and permanent injunctive relief to compel Defendant to provide purchasers or users of  
24 the PRODUCTS with the required warning regarding the health hazards of the LISTED  
25 CHEMICAL. (*Cal. Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(a).*)

26 10. Plaintiff also seeks civil penalties against Defendant for its violations of  
27 Proposition 65, as provided for by California Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(b).

28 **PARTIES**

1 11. Plaintiff King Pun Cheng is a citizen of the City of Carlsbad, County of San Diego,  
2 in the State of California, who is dedicated to protecting the health of California citizens through  
3 the elimination or reduction of toxic exposures from consumer products, represented by and  
4 through its counsel of record, Parker A. Smith. Plaintiff brings this action in the public interest  
5 pursuant to California Health & Safety Code § 25249.7.

6 12. Plastic Research and Development Company is a person doing business within  
7 the meaning of California Health & Safety Code § 25249.11.

8 13. The parties in paragraphs 12 of this Complaint shall be collectively referred  
9 to as "Defendant".

10 14. Plastic Research and Development Company manufactures, distributes, and/or  
11 offers the PRODUCTS for sale or use in the State of California or implies by its conduct that it  
12 manufactures, distributes and/or offers the PRODUCTS for sale or use in the State of California.

13 15. The identities of DOES 1-25 are unknown to Plaintiff at this time. Plaintiff  
14 suspects that they are business entities with at least ten or more employees that have sold,  
15 authorized the distribution, or sale of the said PRODUCTS under the name "Yum Dinger Bama  
16 Bug Gummy Worms" and other brand names, that contain and/or produce DINP, for sale within  
17 the State of California, without giving clear and reasonable warning.

#### 18 VENUE AND JURISDICTION

19 16. Venue is proper in the San Diego County Superior Court, pursuant to Code of  
20 Civil Procedure § § 394, 495, 395.5, because this Court is a court of competent jurisdiction,  
21 because one or more instances of wrongful conduct occurred, and continues to occur, in the  
22 County of San Diego and/or because Defendant conducted, and continues to conduct, business in  
23 this County with respect to the PRODUCTS.

24 17. The California Superior Court has jurisdiction over this action pursuant to  
25 California Constitution Article VI, § 10, which grants the Superior Court "original jurisdiction in  
26 all causes except those given by statute to other trial courts." The statute under which this action  
27 is brought does not specify any other basis of subject matter jurisdiction.  
28

1 18. The California Superior Court has jurisdiction over Defendant based on plaintiff's  
2 information and good faith belief that Defendant is a person, firm, corporation or association that  
3 either are citizens of the State of California, has sufficient minimum contacts in the State of  
4 California, or otherwise purposefully avail itself of the California market. Defendant's  
5 purposeful availment renders the exercise of personal jurisdiction by California courts consistent  
6 with traditional notions of fair play and substantial justice.

7 **FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION**

8 **(Violation of Proposition 65 – Against Defendant)**

9 19. Plaintiff alleges and incorporates by reference, as if full reference, as if full set  
10 forth herein, Paragraphs 1 through 19, inclusive.

11 20. The citizens of the State of California have expressly stated in the Safe Drinking  
12 Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, California Health & Safety Code § 25249.5, et seq.  
13 (Proposition 65) that they must be informed “about exposures to chemicals that cause cancer,  
14 birth defects and order reproductive harm.” (*Cal. Health & Safety Code § 25249.6.*)

15 21. Proposition 65 states, “No person in the course of doing business shall knowingly  
16 and intentionally expose any individual to a chemical known to the state to cause cancer or  
17 productive toxicity without first giving clear and reasonable warning to such individual (*Id.*)”

18 22. On, June 11, 2015, a sixty-day notice of violation, together with the requisite  
19 certificates of merit, was provided to Defendant, other potential violators and various public  
20 enforcement agencies, including the California Attorney General's Office, stating that as a result  
21 of the Defendant's sale of the PRODUCTS, purchasers and users in the State of California were  
22 being exposed to the LISTED CHEMICALS resulting from the reasonably foreseeable users of  
23 the PRODUCTS, without the individual purchasers and users first having been provided with a  
24 “clear and reasonable warning” regarding such toxic exposures.

25 23. Defendant manufactures, distributes and/or offers the PRODUCTS for sale or use  
26 in violation of California Health & Safety Code § 25249.6 and Defendant's manufacture,  
27 distribution and/or offering of the PRODUCTS for sale or use in violation of California Health &  
28 Safety Code § 25249.6 has continued to occur beyond Defendant's receipt of plaintiff's sixty-day

1 notices of violation. Plaintiff further alleges and believes that such violations will continue to  
2 occur into the future.

3 24. After receipt of the claims asserted in the sixty-day notices of violation, the  
4 appropriate public enforcement agencies have failed to commence and diligently prosecute a  
5 cause of action against Defendant under Proposition 65.

6 25. The PRODUCTS manufactured, distributed, and/or offered for sale or use in  
7 California by Defendant contained the LISTED CHEMICALS above the allowable state limits.

8 26. Defendant knew or should have known that the PRODUCTS manufactured,  
9 distributed, and/or for sale or use by Defendant in California contained the LISTED  
10 CHEMICALS.

11 27. The LISTED CHEMICALS were present in or on the PRODUCTS in such a way  
12 as to expose individuals to the LISTED CHEMICALS through dermal contact and/or ingestion  
13 during the reasonably foreseeable use of the PRODUCTS.

14 28. The normal and reasonably foreseeable use of the PRODUCTS have caused and  
15 continue to cause consumer exposure to the LISTED CHEMICALS, as such exposure is defined  
16 by 27 CCR§ 25602(b).

17 29. Defendant had knowledge that the normal and reasonably foreseeable use of the  
18 PRODUCTS would expose individuals to the LISTED CHEMICALS through dermal contact  
19 and/or ingestion.

20 30. Defendant intended that such exposures to the LISTED CHEMICAL from the  
21 reasonably foreseeable use of the PRODUCTS would occur by its deliberate, non-accidental  
22 participation in the manufacture, distribution and/or offer for sale or use of PRODUCTS to  
23 individuals in the State of California.

24 31. Defendant failed to provide a "clear and reasonable warning" to those consumers  
25 and/or other individuals in the State of California who were or who could become exposed to the  
26 LISTED CHEMICALS through dermal contact and/or ingestion during the reasonably  
27 foreseeable use of the PRODUCTS.  
28

1 32. Contrary to the express policy and statutory prohibition of Proposition 65, enacted  
2 directly by California voters, individuals exposed to the LISTED CHEMICALS through dermal  
3 contact and/or ingestion resulting from the reasonably foreseeable use of the PRODUCTS, sold  
4 by Defendant without a "clear and reasonable warning," have suffered, and continue to suffer,  
5 irreparable harm, for which harm they have no plain, speedy or adequate remedy at law.

6 33. As a consequence of the above-described acts, each Defendant is liable for a  
7 maximum civil penal of \$2,500 per day for each violation pursuant to California Health & Safety  
8 Code § 25249.7(b).

9 34. As a consequence of the above-described acts, California Health & Safety Code §  
10 25249.7(a) also specifically authorizes the Court to grant injunctive relief against Defendant.

11 35. Wherefore, plaintiff prays for judgment against Defendant as set forth hereinafter.

12 **PRAYER FOR RELIEF**

13 Wherefore, plaintiff prays for judgment against Defendant as follows:

14 1. That the Court, pursuant to California Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(b), assess  
15 civil penalties against Defendant, in the amount of \$2,500 per day for each violation alleged  
16 herein;


17 2. That the Court, pursuant to California Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(a),  
18 preliminarily and permanently enjoin Defendant from manufacturing, distributing or offering the  
19 PRODUCTS for sale or use in California, without providing "clear and reasonable warnings" as  
20 detailed by 27 CCR § 25601, as to the harms associated with exposures to the LISTED  
21 CHEMICALS;

22 3. That the Court grant plaintiff his reasonable attorneys' fees and cost of suit; and

23 4. That the Court grant such other and further relief as may be just and proper.

If the case has multiple causes of action, check the box that best indicates the **primary** cause of action. To assist you in completing the sheet, examples of the cases that belong under each case type in item 1 are provided below. A cover sheet must be filed only with your initial paper. Failure to file a cover sheet with the first paper filed in a civil case may subject a party, its counsel, or both to sanctions under rules 2.30 and 3.220 of the California Rules of Court.

**To Parties in Rule 3.740 Collections Cases.** A "collections case" under rule 3.740 is defined as an action for recovery of money owed in a sum stated to be certain that is not more than \$25,000, exclusive of interest and attorney's fees, arising from a transaction in which property, services, or money was acquired on credit. A collections case does not include an action seeking the following: (1) tort damages, (2) punitive damages, (3) recovery of real property, (4) recovery of personal property, or (5) a prejudgment writ of attachment. The identification of a case as a rule 3.740 collections case on this form means that it will be exempt from the general time-for-service requirements and case management rules, unless a defendant files a responsive pleading. A rule 3.740 collections case will be subject to the requirements for service and obtaining a judgment in rule 3.740.

A letter or phone call will not protect you. Your written response must be in proper legal form if you want the court to hear your case. There may be a court form that you can use for your response. You can find these court forms and more information at the California Courts Online Self-Help Center ([www.courtinfo.ca.gov/selfhelp](http://www.courtinfo.ca.gov/selfhelp)), your county law library, or the courthouse nearest you. If you cannot pay the filing fee, ask the court clerk for a fee waiver form. If you do not file your response on time, you may lose the case by default, and your wages, money, and property may be taken without further warning from the court.

There are other legal requirements. You may want to call an attorney right away. If you do not know an attorney, you may want to call an attorney referral service. If you cannot afford an attorney, you may be eligible for free legal services from a nonprofit legal services program. You can locate these nonprofit groups at the California Legal Services Web site ([www.lawhelpcalifornia.org](http://www.lawhelpcalifornia.org)), the California Courts Online Self-Help Center ([www.courtinfo.ca.gov/selfhelp](http://www.courtinfo.ca.gov/selfhelp)), or by contacting your local court or county bar association. **NOTE:** The court has a statutory lien for waived fees and costs on any settlement or arbitration award of \$10,000 or more in a civil case. Hay otros requisitos legales. Es recomendable que llame a un abogado inmediatamente. Si no conoce a un abogado, puede llamar a un servicio de remisión a abogados. Si no puede pagar a un abogado, es posible que cumpla con los requisitos para obtener servicios legales gratuitos de un programa de servicios legales sin fines de lucro. 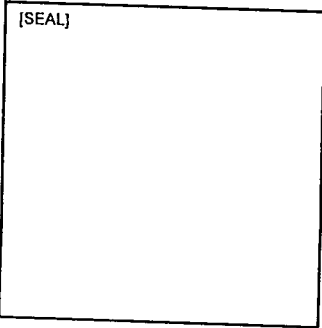
