THE PARTIES

1. Plaintiff CONSUMER ADVOCACY GROUP, INC. ("Plaintiff" or "CAG") is an organization qualified to do business in the State of California. CAG is a person within the meaning of Health and Safety Code section 25249.11, subdivision (a). CAG, acting as a private attorney general, brings this action in the public interest as defined under Health and Safety Code section 25249.7, subdivision (d).
2. Defendant SHUN FAT SUPERMARKET INC. ("SHUN FAT") is a California corporation, doing business in the State of California at all relevant times herein.
3. Defendant EL MONTE SUPERSTORE INC. ("EL MONTE") is a California corporation, doing business in the State of California at all relevant times herein.
4. Defendant SF SUPERMARKET, INC. ("SF") is a California corporation, doing business in the State of California at all relevant times herein.
5. Defendant TRAN'S FAMILY, INC. ("TRAN'S FAMILY") is a California corporation, doing business in the State of California at all relevant times herein.
6. Defendant JIANLIBAO AMERICA, LTD. ("JIANLIBAO") is a business entity form unknown, doing business in the State of California at all relevant times herein.
7. Defendant NORTHERN FOOD I/E, INC. ("NORTHERN") is a New York corporation, doing business in the State of California at all relevant times herein.
8. Plaintiff is presently unaware of the true names and capacities of defendants DOES 1-20, and therefore sues these defendants by such fictitious names. Plaintiff will amend this complaint to allege their true names and capacities when ascertained. Plaintiff is informed, believes, and thereon alleges that each fictitiously named defendant is responsible in some manner for the occurrences herein alleged and the damages caused thereby.
9. At all times mentioned herein, the term "Defendants" includes SHUN FAT, EL MONTE, SF, TRAN'S FAMILY, JIANLIBAO, NORTHERN, and DOES 1-20.
10. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and thereon alleges that each of the Defendants at all times mentioned herein have conducted business within the State of California.

1 11. Upon information and belief, at all times relevant to this action, each of the Defendants,
2 including DOES 1-20, was an agent, servant, or employee of each of the other
3 Defendants. In conducting the activities alleged in this Complaint, each of the
4 Defendants was acting within the course and scope of this agency, service, or
5 employment, and was acting with the consent, permission, and authorization of each of
6 the other Defendants. All actions of each of the Defendants alleged in this Complaint
7 were ratified and approved by every other Defendant or their officers or managing
8 agents. Alternatively, each of the Defendants aided, conspired with and/or facilitated
9 the alleged wrongful conduct of each of the other Defendants.

10 12. Plaintiff is informed, believes, and thereon alleges that at all relevant times, each of the
11 Defendants was a person doing business within the meaning of Health and Safety Code
12 section 25249.11, subdivision (b), and that each of the Defendants had ten (10) or more
13 employees at all relevant times.

14 **JURISDICTION**

15 13. The Court has jurisdiction over this lawsuit pursuant to California Constitution Article
16 VI, Section 10, which grants the Superior Court original jurisdiction in all causes except
17 those given by statute to other trial courts. This Court has jurisdiction over this action
18 pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 25249.7, which allows enforcement of
19 violations of Proposition 65 in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

20 14. This Court has jurisdiction over Defendants named herein because Defendants either
21 reside or are located in this State or are foreign corporations authorized to do business in
22 California, are registered with the California Secretary of State, or who do sufficient
23 business in California, have sufficient minimum contacts with California, or otherwise
24 intentionally avail themselves of the markets within California through their
25 manufacture, distribution, promotion, marketing, or sale of their products within
26 California to render the exercise of jurisdiction by the California courts permissible
27 under traditional notions of fair play and substantial justice.

1 15. Venue is proper in the County of Los Angeles because one or more of the instances of
2 wrongful conduct occurred, and continues to occur, in the County of Los Angeles and/or
3 because Defendants conducted, and continue to conduct, business in the County of Los
4 Angeles with respect to the consumer product that is the subject of this action.

5 **BACKGROUND AND PRELIMINARY FACTS**

6 16. In 1986, California voters approved an initiative to address growing concerns about
7 exposure to toxic chemicals and declared their right "[t]o be informed about exposures
8 to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects, or other reproductive harm." Ballot Pamp.,
9 Proposed Law, Gen. Elec. (Nov. 4, 1986) at p. 3. The initiative, The Safe Drinking
10 Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, codified at Health and Safety Code sections
11 25249.5, *et seq.* ("Proposition 65"), helps to protect California's drinking water sources
12 from contamination, to allow consumers to make informed choices about the products
13 they buy, and to enable persons to protect themselves from toxic chemicals as they see
14 fit.

15 17. Proposition 65 requires the Governor of California to publish a list of chemicals known
16 to the state to cause cancer, birth defects, or other reproductive harm. *Health & Safety*
17 *Code* § 25249.8. The list, which the Governor updates at least once a year, contains
18 over 700 chemicals and chemical families. Proposition 65 imposes warning
19 requirements and other controls that apply to Proposition 65-listed chemicals.

20 18. All businesses with ten (10) or more employees that operate or sell products in
21 California must comply with Proposition 65. Under Proposition 65, businesses are: (1)
22 prohibited from knowingly discharging Proposition 65-listed chemicals into sources of
23 drinking water (*Health & Safety Code* § 25249.5), and (2) required to provide "clear and
24 reasonable" warnings before exposing a person, knowingly and intentionally, to a
25 Proposition 65-listed chemical (*Health & Safety Code* § 25249.6).

26 19. Proposition 65 provides that any person "violating or threatening to violate" the statute
27 may be enjoined in any court of competent jurisdiction. *Health & Safety Code* §
28 25249.7. "Threaten to violate" means "to create a condition in which there is a

1 substantial probability that a violation will occur." *Health & Safety Code* § 25249.11(e).
2 Defendants are also liable for civil penalties of up to \$2,500.00 per day per violation,
3 recoverable in a civil action. *Health & Safety Code* § 25249.7(b).

4 20. Plaintiff identified certain practices of manufacturers and distributors of products
5 bearing Lead and Lead Compounds ("LEAD") and Cadmium and Cadmium Compounds
6 ("CADMIUM") of exposing, knowingly and intentionally, persons in California to the
7 Proposition 65-listed chemicals of such products without first providing clear and
8 reasonable warnings of such to the exposed persons prior to the time of exposure.
9 Plaintiff later discerned that Defendants engaged in such practice.

10 21. On February 27, 1987, the Governor of California added Lead to the list of chemicals
11 known to the State to cause developmental toxicity, male reproductive toxicity, and
12 female reproductive toxicity. On October 1, 1992, the Governor of California added
13 Lead and lead compounds to the list of chemicals known to the State to cause cancer.
14 LEAD is known to the State to cause reproductive toxicity and cancer. Pursuant to
15 Health and Safety Code sections 25249.9 and 25249.10, twenty (20) months after
16 addition of LEAD to the list of chemicals known to the State to cause reproductive
17 toxicity and cancer, LEAD became fully subject to Proposition 65 warning requirements
18 and discharge prohibitions.

19 22. On October 1, 1987, the Governor of California added Cadmium and cadmium
20 compounds to the list of chemicals known to the State to cause cancer. On May 1, 1997,
21 the Governor of California added Cadmium to the list of chemicals known to the State to
22 cause developmental toxicity and male reproductive toxicity. CADMIUM is known to
23 the State to cause reproductive toxicity and cancer. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code
24 sections 25249.9 and 25249.10, twenty (20) months after addition of CADMIUM to the
25 list of chemicals known to the State to cause reproductive toxicity and cancer,
26 CADMIUM became fully subject to Proposition 65 warning requirements and discharge
27 prohibitions.

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SATISFACTION OF PRIOR NOTICE

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2 23. On or about May 4, 2016, Plaintiff served notice of alleged violations of Health and
3 Safety Code section 25249.6, concerning consumer products exposures, subject to a
4 private action to JIANLIBAO, NORTHERN, EL MONTE, SHUN FAT, SF, and to the
5 California Attorney General, County District Attorneys, and City Attorneys for each city
6 containing a population of at least 750,000 people in whose jurisdictions the violations
7 allegedly occurred, concerning the product Dried Seaweed containing LEAD and
8 CADMIUM.

9 24. On or about December 13, 2016, Plaintiff served notice of alleged violations of Health
10 and Safety Code section 25249.6, concerning consumer products exposures, subject to a
11 private action to SHUN FAT, EL MONTE, SF, TRAN'S FAMILY, and to the California
12 Attorney General, County District Attorneys, and City Attorneys for each city containing
13 a population of at least 750,000 people in whose jurisdictions the violations allegedly
14 occurred, concerning the product Dried Seaweeds containing LEAD and CADMIUM.

15 25. Before sending the notice of alleged violations, Plaintiff investigated the consumer
16 products involved, the likelihood that such products would cause users to suffer
17 significant exposures to LEAD and CADMIUM, and the corporate structure of each of
18 the Defendants.

19 26. Plaintiff's notice of alleged violation included a Certificate of Merit executed by the
20 attorney for the noticing party, CAG. The Certificate of Merit stated that the attorney
21 for Plaintiff who executed the certificate had consulted with at least one person with
22 relevant and appropriate expertise who reviewed data regarding the exposures to LEAD
23 and CADMIUM, the subject Proposition 65-listed chemicals of this action. Based on
24 that information, the attorney for Plaintiff who executed the Certificate of Merit believed
25 there was a reasonable and meritorious case for this private action. The attorney for
26 Plaintiff attached to the Certificate of Merit served on the Attorney General the
27 confidential factual information sufficient to establish the basis of the Certificate of
28 Merit.

1 27. Plaintiff's notices of alleged violations also included a Certificate of Service and a
2 document entitled "The Safe Drinking Water & Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986
3 (Proposition 65) A Summary." *Health & Safety Code* § 25249.7(d).

4 28. Plaintiff is commencing this action more than sixty (60) days from the dates that
5 Plaintiff gave notices of the alleged violation to SHUN FAT, EL MONTE, SF, TRAN'S
6 FAMILY, JIANLIBAO, NORTHERN, and the public prosecutors referenced in
7 Paragraphs 23 and 24.

8 29. Plaintiff is informed, believes, and thereon alleges that neither the Attorney General, nor
9 any applicable district attorney or city attorney has commenced and is diligently
10 prosecuting an action against the Defendants.

11 **FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION**

12 (By CONSUMER ADVOCACY GROUP, INC. and against JIANLIBAO, NORTHERN,
13 EL MONTE, SHUN FAT, SF, and DOES 1-10 for Violations of Proposition 65, The Safe
14 Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 (*Health & Safety Code*, §§ 25249.5, et
15 seq.))

16 **Dried Seaweed**

17 30. Plaintiff CONSUMER ADVOCACY GROUP, INC. repeats and incorporates by
18 reference paragraphs 1 through 29 of this complaint as though fully set forth herein.
19 Each of the Defendants is, and at all times mentioned herein was, a manufacturer,
20 distributor, promoter, or retailer of Dried Seaweed, which includes but is not limited to,
21 ""Yefeng ®"; "Seaweed Special Grade Dried Seaweed"; NET WT. 7oz (200 G);
22 "INGREDIENT: SEAWEED"; "PRODUCT OF CHINA" Exported BY Fuzhou Yefeng
23 Import & Export Trading Co., Ltd.; UPC: 7 54351 16002 8" ("YEFENG SEAWEED").

24 31. YEFENG SEAWEED contain LEAD and CADMIUM.

25 32. Defendants knew or should have known that LEAD and CADMIUM has been identified
26 by the State of California as a chemical known to cause cancer and reproductive toxicity
27 and therefore was subject to Proposition 65 warning requirements. Defendants were
28 also informed of the presence of LEAD and CADMIUM in YEFENG SEAWEED
within Plaintiff's notice of alleged violations further discussed above at Paragraph 23.

1 33. Plaintiff's allegations regarding YEFENG SEAWEED concerns "[c]onsumer products
2 exposure[s]," which "is an exposure that results from a person's acquisition, purchase,
3 storage, consumption, or other reasonably foreseeable use of a consumer good, or any
4 exposure that results from receiving a consumer service." *Cal. Code Regs.* tit. 27, §
5 25602(b). YEFENG SEAWEED are consumer products, and, as mentioned herein,
6 exposures to LEAD and CADMIUM took place as a result of such normal and
7 foreseeable use.

8 34. Plaintiff is informed, believes, and thereon alleges that between May 4, 2013 and the
9 present, each of the Defendants knowingly and intentionally exposed California
10 consumers and users of YEFENG SEAWEED, which Defendants manufactured,
11 distributed, or sold as mentioned above, to LEAD and CADMIUM, without first
12 providing any type of clear and reasonable warning of such to the exposed persons
13 before the time of exposure. Defendants have distributed and sold YEFENG
14 SEAWEED in California. Defendants know and intend that California consumers will
15 use YEFENG SEAWEED, thereby exposing them to LEAD and CADMIUM.
16 Defendants thereby violated Proposition 65.

17 35. The principal routes of exposure were through ingestion, including hand to mouth
18 pathways, trans-dermal absorption, and inhalation. Persons sustained exposures by
19 eating and consuming YEFENG SEAWEED, handling YEFENG SEAWEED without
20 wearing gloves or by touching bare skin or mucus membranes with gloves after handling
21 YEFENG SEAWEED, or through direct and indirect hand to mouth contact, hand to
22 food to mouth, direct contact to food then to mouth, hand to mucous membrane, or
23 breathing in particulate matter emanating from YEFENG SEAWEED, as well as
24 through environmental mediums that carry the LEAD and CADMIUM once contained
25 within the YEFENG SEAWEED.

26 36. Plaintiff is informed, believes, and thereon alleges that each of Defendants' violations of
27 Proposition 65 as to YEFENG SEAWEED have been ongoing and continuous to the
28 date of the signing of this complaint, as Defendants engaged and continue to engage in

1 conduct which violates Health and Safety Code section 25249.6, including the
2 manufacture, distribution, promotion, and sale of YEFENG SEAWEED, so that a
3 separate and distinct violation of Proposition 65 occurred each and every time a person
4 was exposed to LEAD and CADMIUM by YEFENG SEAWEED as mentioned herein.
5 37. Plaintiff is informed, believes, and thereon alleges that each violation of Proposition 65
6 mentioned herein is ever continuing. Plaintiff further alleges and believes that the
7 violations alleged herein will continue to occur into the future.
8 38. Based on the allegations herein, Defendants are liable for civil penalties of up to
9 \$2,500.00 per day per individual exposure to LEAD and CADMIUM from YEFENG
10 SEAWEED, pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 25249.7(b).
11 39. Plaintiff has engaged in good faith efforts to resolve the claims alleged herein prior to
12 filing this Complaint.

13 SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION

14 **(By CONSUMER ADVOCACY GROUP, INC. and against SHUN FAT, EL MONTE, SF,**
15 **TRAN'S FAMILY, and DOES 11-20 for Violations of Proposition 65, The Safe Drinking**
16 **Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 (*Health & Safety Code, §§ 25249.5, et seq.*))**

17 **Dried Seaweeds**

18 40. Plaintiff CONSUMER ADVOCACY GROUP, INC. repeats and incorporates by
19 reference paragraphs 1 through 39 of this complaint as though fully set forth herein.
20 Each of the Defendants is, and at all times mentioned herein was, a manufacturer,
21 distributor, promoter, or retailer of Dried Seaweeds, which includes but is not limited to,
22 ""B&C"; "DRIED SEAWEEDS"; HIGH PROTEIN VEGETABLE: Seaweed, theseo-
23 called "Vegetable For Longevity", contains high contents of protein, Iodine,
24 Phosphorous, Calcium, Iron and various vitamins. Among all natural foods, seaweed
25 contains the highest amount of protein and without any cholesterol.; Ingredient:
26 Seaweed; Product Name: Dried Seaweeds; Net wt: 50g(1.75oz); Consume Before: 02 12
27 2017; IMPORTED BY: B&C FOOD CO 11264 ½ E. Rush St.South El Monte, CA
28 91733; PRODUCT OF CHINA; 6920423929761" ("DRIED SEAWEED").

1 41. DRIED SEAWEED contain LEAD and CADMIUM.

2 42. Defendants knew or should have known that LEAD and CADMIUM has been identified
3 by the State of California as a chemical known to cause cancer and reproductive toxicity
4 and therefore was subject to Proposition 65 warning requirements. Defendants were
5 also informed of the presence of LEAD and CADMIUM in DRIED SEAWEED within
6 Plaintiff's notice of alleged violations further discussed above at Paragraph 24.

7 43. Plaintiff's allegations regarding DRIED SEAWEED concerns "[c]onsumer products
8 exposure[s]," which "is an exposure that results from a person's acquisition, purchase,
9 storage, consumption, or other reasonably foreseeable use of a consumer good, or any
10 exposure that results from receiving a consumer service." *Cal. Code Regs. tit. 27, §*
11 *25602(b)*. DRIED SEAWEED are consumer products, and, as mentioned herein,
12 exposures to LEAD and CADMIUM took place as a result of such normal and
13 foreseeable use.

14 44. Plaintiff is informed, believes, and thereon alleges that between December 13, 2013 and
15 the present, each of the Defendants knowingly and intentionally exposed California
16 consumers and users of DRIED SEAWEED, which Defendants manufactured,
17 distributed, or sold as mentioned above, to LEAD and CADMIUM, without first
18 providing any type of clear and reasonable warning of such to the exposed persons
19 before the time of exposure. Defendants have distributed and sold DRIED SEAWEED
20 in California. Defendants know and intend that California consumers will use DRIED
21 SEAWEED, thereby exposing them to LEAD and CADMIUM. Defendants thereby
22 violated Proposition 65.

23 45. The principal routes of exposure were through ingestion, including hand to mouth
24 pathways, trans-dermal absorption, and inhalation. Persons sustained exposures by
25 eating and consuming DRIED SEAWEED, handling DRIED SEAWEED without
26 wearing gloves or by touching bare skin or mucus membranes with gloves after handling
27 DRIED SEAWEED, or through direct and indirect hand to mouth contact, hand to food
28 to mouth, direct contact to food then to mouth, hand to mucous membrane, or breathing

1 in particulate matter emanating from DRIED SEAWEED, as well as through
2 environmental mediums that carry the LEAD and CADMIUM once contained within the
3 DRIED SEAWEED.

4 46. Plaintiff is informed, believes, and thereon alleges that each of Defendants' violations of
5 Proposition 65 as to DRIED SEAWEED have been ongoing and continuous to the date
6 of the signing of this complaint, as Defendants engaged and continue to engage in
7 conduct which violates Health and Safety Code section 25249.6, including the
8 manufacture, distribution, promotion, and sale of DRIED SEAWEED, so that a separate
9 and distinct violation of Proposition 65 occurred each and every time a person was
10 exposed to LEAD and CADMIUM by DRIED SEAWEED as mentioned herein.

11 47. Plaintiff is informed, believes, and thereon alleges that each violation of Proposition 65
12 mentioned herein is ever continuing. Plaintiff further alleges and believes that the
13 violations alleged herein will continue to occur into the future.

14 48. Based on the allegations herein, Defendants are liable for civil penalties of up to
15 \$2,500.00 per day per individual exposure to LEAD and CADMIUM from DRIED
16 SEAWEED, pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 25249.7(b).

17 49. Plaintiff has engaged in good faith efforts to resolve the claims alleged herein prior to
18 filing this Complaint.

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25 **PRAYER FOR RELIEF**

26 Plaintiff demands against each of the Defendants as follows:

- 27 1. A permanent injunction mandating Proposition 65-compliant warnings;
28 2. Penalties pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 25249.7, subdivision (b);

- 1 3. Costs of suit;
- 2 4. Reasonable attorney fees and costs; and
- 3 5. Any further relief that the court may deem just and equitable.


