COMPLAINT FOR INJUNCTIVE
RELIEF AND CIVIL PENALTIES

22 Plaintiff Community Science Institute ("Plaintiff") brings this action in the interests of
23 the general public and, on information and belief, hereby alleges:

24 INTRODUCTION

25 I. This action seeks to remedy the continuing failure of Defendants Plum, Inc. dba
26 Plum Organics and Plum, PBC (collectively "Plum" or "Defendants") to warn individuals in
27 California that they are being exposed to the chemical acrylamide, a substance known to the
28 State of California to cause cancer. These exposures have occurred, and continue to occur
through the manufacture, distribution, sale, and consumption of the following food products,
marketed towards children, which contain the chemical acrylamide (the "Products"):

- 1 2 Grow Well Tummy Prune, Pear, Peach & Pumpkin with Chia
- 2 Mighty Dinos - Cheddar Organic Baked Crackers
- 3 Mighty Sticks Berry beet whole grain snacks
- 4 Mighty Sticks Apple Carrot whole grain snacks
- 5 Mighty snack bars strawberry
- 6 Mighty Snack Bars – Blueberry
- 7 Little Yums - Pumpkin & Banana Organic Teething Wafers

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9 2. California’s Proposition 65 (Health & Safety Code § 25249.5, *et seq.*), is a right
10 to know statute. Under Proposition 65, it is unlawful for businesses to knowingly and
11 intentionally expose individuals in California to chemicals known to the State to cause cancer,
12 birth defects, or other reproductive harm without providing clear and reasonable warnings to
13 individuals prior to exposure.

14 3. When children and other consumers eat the Products, they are exposed to
15 acrylamide at levels requiring a “clear and reasonable warning” under Proposition 65. Yet
16 Defendants have failed to provide any warning to consumers that they are being exposed to the
17 carcinogenic chemical acrylamide.

18 4. Defendants’ past and continued manufacturing, distribution, and sale of the
19 Products in California without a clear and reasonable warning causes individuals, particularly
20 children, to be involuntarily and unwittingly exposed to acrylamide at levels that violate
21 Proposition 65.

22 5. Plaintiff seeks injunctive relief enjoining Defendants from the continued
23 manufacturing, distribution, and/or sales of the Products in California without provision of
24 clear and reasonable warnings regarding the risks of cancer posed by exposure to acrylamide
25 through consumption of the Products. Plaintiff seeks an injunctive order compelling
26 Defendants to bring their business practices into compliance with Proposition 65 by providing
27 a clear and reasonable warning to each individual who has been and who in the future may be
28

1 exposed to acrylamide from consumption of the Products. Plaintiff also seeks an order
2 compelling Defendants to identify and locate each individual person who in the past has
3 purchased the Products, and to provide to each such purchaser a clear and reasonable warning
4 that use of the Products will cause exposures to acrylamide.
5

6 **JURISDICTION AND VENUE**

7 6. This Court has jurisdiction over this action pursuant to Health and Safety Code
8 § 25249.8, allowing enforcement of Proposition 65 in any court of competent jurisdiction, and
9 pursuant to California Constitution Article VI, Section 10, which grants the Superior Court
10 “original jurisdiction in all causes except those given by statute to other trial courts.” The
11 causes of actions alleged herein are not given by statute to other trial courts.

12 7. This Court has jurisdiction over Defendants because Defendants are businesses
13 having sufficient minimum contacts with California, or otherwise intentionally availing
14 themselves of the California market through the distribution and sale of the Products in the
15 State of California to render the exercise of jurisdiction over Defendants by the California
16 courts consistent with traditional notions of fair play and substantial justice.

17 8. Venue in this action is proper in the Alameda Superior Court because the
18 Defendants have violated or threaten to violate California law in the County of Alameda.

19 **PARTIES**

20 9. Plaintiff is a non-profit association. Plaintiff operates as a fiscally sponsored
21 project of the non-profit organization Social and Environmental Entrepreneurs. CSI’s mission
22 is to unite consumers and industrial neighbors to reform government and industry practices for
23 a toxic free future. CSI is a person within the meaning of H&S Code §25118 and brings this
24 enforcement action in the public interest pursuant to H&S Code §25249.7(d).
25

26 10. Defendant Plum, Inc. dba Plum Organics. is a corporation organized under the
27 State of Delaware’s corporation law and is a person doing business within the meaning of
28 Health & Safety Code § 25249.11.

1 of the Act. Health & Safety Code § 25249.7.

2 17. On January 1, 1990, the State of California officially listed the chemical
3 acrylamide as a chemical known to cause cancer. Acrylamide became subject to the warning
4 requirement one year later and was therefore subject to the “clear and reasonable” warning
5 requirements of Proposition 65 beginning on January 1, 1991. Health & Safety Code §
6 25249.6 *et seq.*; 27 Cal. Code Regs. §§ 25000, *et seq.* Due to the carcinogenicity of
7 acrylamide, the no significant risk level for acrylamide is 0.2 µg/day (micrograms per day). 27
8 Cal. Code Regs. § 25705(b)(1).

9
10 **FACTUAL BACKGROUND**

11 18. To test Defendants’ Products for acrylamide, Plaintiff hired a well-respected
12 and accredited testing laboratory. The results of testing undertaken by Plaintiff of the Products
13 show that they were in violation of the 0.2 microgram per day (“µg/day”) for acrylamide “safe
14 harbor” daily dose limits set forth in Proposition 65’s regulations. Very significant is the fact
15 that these products are marketed towards children, who are being exposed to acrylamide
16 through ingestion.

17 19. Based on the testing results, on May 16, 2018, Plaintiff sent a 60-Day Notice of
18 Proposition 65 Violations (“Notice”) to the requisite public enforcement agencies, and to
19 Defendants (a true and correct copy of the 60-Day Notice letter is attached hereto as **Exhibit A**
20 and is incorporated by reference). The Notice was issued pursuant to, and in compliance with,
21 the requirements of Health & Safety Code §25249.7(d) and the statute’s implementing
22 regulations regarding the notice of the violations to be given to certain public enforcement
23 agencies and to the violators. The Notice included, *inter alia*, the following information: the
24 name, address, and telephone number of the noticing individuals; the name of the alleged
25 violator; the statute violated; the approximate time period during which violations occurred;
26 and descriptions of the violations, including the chemical involved, the routes of toxic
27 exposure, and the specific product or type of product causing the violations, and was issued as
28

1 follows:

- 2 a. Defendants were provided a copy of the Notice by Certified Mail.
- 3 b. Defendants were provided a copy of a document entitled “The Safe Drinking
- 4 Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 (Proposition 65): A Summary,”
- 5 which is also known as Appendix A to Title 27 of Cal. Code Regs. § 25903.
- 6 c. The California Attorney General was provided a copy of the Notice via online
- 7 submission.
- 8 d. The California Attorney General was provided with a Certificate of Merit by the
- 9 attorney for the noticing party, stating that there is a reasonable and meritorious
- 10 case for this action, and attaching factual information sufficient to establish a
- 11 basis for the certificate, including the identity of the persons consulted with and
- 12 relied on by the certifier, and the facts, studies, or other data reviewed by those
- 13 persons, pursuant to Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(h)(2).
- 14 e. The district attorneys, city attorneys or prosecutors of each jurisdiction within
- 15 which the Products are offered for sale within California were provided with a
- 16 copy of the Notice pursuant to Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(d)(1).

17 20. At least 60-days have elapsed since Plaintiff sent the Notice to Defendants. The

18 appropriate public enforcement agencies have failed to commence and diligently prosecute a

19 cause of action under Health & Safety Code § 25249.5, et seq. against Defendants based on the

20 allegations herein.

21 21. On information and belief, the Products have been manufactured, distributed,

22 and/or sold by Defendants for consumption in California since at least May 16, 2015. On

23 information and belief, the Products continue to be distributed and sold in California without

24 the requisite warning information.

25 22. At all times relevant to this action, Defendants have knowingly and

26 intentionally exposed the users of the Products to acrylamide without first giving a clear and

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1 reasonable warning to such individuals.

2 23. As a proximate result of acts of Defendants, as persons in the course of doing
3 business within the meaning of Health & Safety Code § 25249.11, individuals throughout the
4 State of California, including in the County of Alameda, have been exposed to acrylamide
5 without a clear and reasonable warning. The individuals subject to the illegal exposures
6 include normal and foreseeable users of the Products, as well as all other persons exposed to
7 the Products.

8
9 **FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION**
10 **(Violations of Health and Safety Code § 25249.5, *et seq.* concerning the Products**
11 **described in the May 16, 2018 Prop. 65 Notice)**

12 24. Plaintiff re-alleges and incorporates by reference Paragraphs 1 through 23,
13 inclusive, as if specifically set forth herein.

14 25. Defendants are persons doing business within the meaning of Health & Safety
15 Code § 25249.11.

16 26. Acrylamide is listed by the State of California as a chemical known to cause
17 cancer.

18 27. Defendants have and continue to knowingly and intentionally expose
19 individuals who ingest the Products to the chemical acrylamide without first providing a clear
20 and reasonable warning to such individuals pursuant to Health & Safety Code §§ 25249.6 and
21 25249.11(f).

22 28. Continuing commission by Defendants of the acts alleged above will irreparably
23 harm the citizens of the State of California, for which harm they have no plain, speedy, or
24 adequate remedy at law.

25 Wherefore, Plaintiff prays for judgment against Defendants, as set forth hereafter.

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PRAYER FOR RELIEF

Wherefore, Plaintiff prays for the following relief:

1. A preliminary and permanent injunction, pursuant to Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(b), enjoining Defendants, their agents, employees, assigns and all persons acting in concert or participating with Defendants, from distributing or selling the Products in California without first providing a clear and reasonable warning that consumers of the Products are exposed to acrylamide;
2. An injunctive order, pursuant to Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(b), compelling Defendants to identify and locate each individual who has purchased the Products since May 16, 2015, and to provide a warning to such persons that consumption of the Products will expose the consumers to a chemical known to cause cancer;
3. An assessment of civil penalties pursuant to Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(b) against Defendants in the amount of \$2,500 per day for each violation of Proposition 65;
4. An award to Plaintiff of its reasonable attorney's fees and costs of suit pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure § 1021.5, as Plaintiff shall specify in further application to the Court; and,
5. Such other and further relief as may be just and proper.

Dear Addressees:

This firm represents Community Science Institute ("CSI") in connection with this Notice of Violations of California's Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, which is codified at California Health & Safety Code Section 25249.5 *et seq.* ("Proposition 65"). CSI is a fiscally sponsored project of the non-profit organization Social and Environmental Entrepreneurs. CSI's mission is to unite consumers and industrial neighbors to reform government and industry practices for a toxic free future. This letter serves to provide notification of these violations to you and to the public enforcement agencies of Proposition 65.

This letter constitutes notice that the entities listed below have violated and continue to violate provisions of Proposition 65. Specifically, the entities listed below have violated and continue to violate the warning requirement at § 25249.6 of the California Health & Safety Code, which provides that "[n]o person in the course of doing business shall knowingly and intentionally expose any individual to a chemical known to the state to cause cancer or reproductive toxicity without first giving clear and reasonable warning to such individual..."

Violators: The names of the violators covered by this notice that violated Proposition 65 (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Violators") are: Plum, Inc. dba Plum Organics, and Plum, PBC.

Listed Chemical: This violation involves exposure to the listed chemical acrylamide. On January 1, 1990, California officially listed acrylamide as a chemical known to the State of California to cause cancer. On February 25, 2011, California officially listed acrylamide as a chemical known to cause reproductive and developmental toxicity.

Consumer Products: The following specific products that are the subject of this notice are causing exposures in violation of Proposition 65 are:

1. 2 Grow Well Tummy Prune, Pear, Peach & Pumpkin with Chia
2. Mighty Dinos - Cheddar Organic Baked Crackers
3. Mighty Sticks Berry beet while grain snacks
4. Mighty snack bars strawberry

6. Mighty Snack Bars – Blueberry
7. Little Yums - Pumpkin & Banana Organic Teething Wafers

Violation: The alleged Violators knowingly and intentionally exposed and continue to expose consumers within the State of California to acrylamide without providing a Proposition 65 warning. The Violators have manufactured, marketed, distributed, and/or sold the listed products, which have exposed and continue to expose numerous individuals within California to the identified chemical, acrylamide.

Route of Exposure: Use of the products identified in this notice results in human exposures to acrylamide. The primary route of exposure is ingestion, but may also occur through inhalation and/or dermal contact.

Duration of Violation: The violations have been occurring since at least May 15, 2015, and are ongoing.

A summary of Proposition 65, prepared by the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment, is enclosed with the copy of this letter sent to the Violators.

Pursuant to California Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(d), CSI intends to file a citizen enforcement action sixty days after effective service of this notice unless the Violators agree in an enforceable written agreement to: (1) reformulate the listed products so as to eliminate further exposures to the identified chemicals; (2) pay an appropriate civil penalty; and (3) provide clear and reasonable warnings compliant with Proposition 65 to all persons located in California who purchased the above products in the last three years. Consistent with the public interest goals of Proposition 65 and my client's objectives in pursuing this notice, CSI is interested in seeking a constructive resolution to this matter. Such resolution will avoid both further unwarned consumer exposures to the identified chemical and expensive and time consuming litigation.




