COMPLAINT FOR INJUNCTIVE
RELIEF AND CIVIL PENALTIES

22 Plaintiff Center for Food Safety ("Plaintiff") brings this action in the interests of the
23 general public and, on information and belief, hereby alleges:

24 **INTRODUCTION**

25 1. This action seeks to remedy the continuing failure of Defendant The Hain
26 Celestial Group, Inc. ("Defendant") to warn individuals in California that they are being
27 exposed to the chemical acrylamide, a substance known to the State of California to cause
28 cancer. These exposures have occurred, and continue to occur through the manufacture,

1 distribution, sale, and consumption of the following almond butter products, which contain the
2 chemical acrylamide (the “Almond Butter Products”):

- 3 1. MaraNatha Creamy Almond Butter
- 4 2. MaraNatha Crunchy Almond Butter

5
6 2. California’s Proposition 65 (Health & Safety Code § 25249.5, *et seq.*), is a right
7 to know statute. Under Proposition 65, it is unlawful for businesses to knowingly and
8 intentionally expose individuals in California to chemicals known to the State to cause cancer,
9 birth defects, or other reproductive harm without providing clear and reasonable warnings to
10 individuals prior to exposure.

11 3. When consumers eat the Almond Butter Products, they are exposed to
12 acrylamide at levels requiring a “clear and reasonable warning” under Proposition 65. Yet
13 Defendant has failed to provide any warning to consumers that they are being exposed to the
14 carcinogenic chemical acrylamide.

15 4. Defendant’s past and continued manufacturing, distribution, and sale of the
16 Almond Butter Products in California without a clear and reasonable warning causes
17 individuals to be involuntarily and unwittingly exposed to acrylamide at levels that violate
18 Proposition 65.

19 5. Plaintiff seeks injunctive relief enjoining Defendant from the continued
20 manufacturing, distribution, and/or sales of the Almond Butter Products in California without
21 provision of clear and reasonable warnings regarding the risks of cancer posed by exposure to
22 acrylamide through consumption of the Almond Butter Products. Plaintiff seeks an injunctive
23 order compelling Defendant to bring its business practices into compliance with Proposition 65
24 by providing a clear and reasonable warning to each individual who has been and who in the
25 future may be exposed to acrylamide from consumption of the Almond Butter Products.
26 Plaintiff also seeks an order compelling Defendant to identify and locate each individual
27 person who in the past has purchased the Almond Butter Products, and to provide to each such
28

1 purchaser a clear and reasonable warning that use of the Almond Butter Products will cause
2 exposures to acrylamide.

3
4 **JURISDICTION AND VENUE**

5 6. This Court has jurisdiction over this action pursuant to Health and Safety Code
6 § 25249.8, allowing enforcement of Proposition 65 in any court of competent jurisdiction, and
7 pursuant to California Constitution Article VI, Section 10, which grants the Superior Court
8 “original jurisdiction in all causes except those given by statute to other trial courts.” The
9 causes of actions alleged herein are not given by statute to other trial courts.

10 8. This Court has jurisdiction over Defendant because Defendant is a business
11 having sufficient minimum contacts with California, or otherwise intentionally availing itself
12 of the California market through the distribution and sale of the Almond Butter Products in the
13 State of California to render the exercise of jurisdiction over Defendant by the California
14 courts consistent with traditional notions of fair play and substantial justice.

15 9. Venue in this action is proper in the Alameda Superior Court because Defendant
16 has violated or threatens to violate California law in the County of Alameda.

17 **PARTIES**

18 10. Plaintiff Center for Food Safety is a non-profit corporation working to protect
19 human health and the environment by curbing the use of harmful food production technologies
20 and by promoting organic and other forms of sustainable agriculture. Plaintiff is Center for
21 Food Safety is a person within the meaning of Health & Safety Code §25118 and brings this
22 enforcement action in the public interest pursuant to Health & Safety Code §25249.7(d).

24 11. Defendant The Hain Celestial Group is a corporation organized under the State
25 of Delaware’s corporation law and is a person doing business within the meaning of Health &
26 Safety Code § 25249.11.

27 12. Defendant has manufactured, packaged, distributed, marketed and/or offered the
28 Almond Butter Products for sale or use in California and the County of Alameda. Plaintiff is

1 informed and believes, and thereupon alleges, that Defendant continues to manufacture,
2 package, distribute, market and/or sell the Almond Butter Products in California and in
3 Alameda County.

4
5 **STATUTORY BACKGROUND**

6 13. The People of the State of California have declared in Proposition 65 their right
7 “[t]o be informed about exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects, or other
8 reproductive harm.” Section 1(b) of Initiative Measure, Proposition 65.

9 14. To effect this goal, Proposition 65 requires that individuals be provided with a
10 “clear and reasonable warning” before being exposed to substances listed by the State of
11 California as causing cancer or reproductive toxicity. Health & Safety Code § 25249.6 states,
12 in pertinent part:

13 No person in the course of doing business shall knowingly and intentionally
14 expose any individual to a chemical known to the state to cause cancer or
15 reproductive toxicity without first giving clear and reasonable warning to such
16 individual....

17 15. “‘Knowingly’ refers only to knowledge of the fact that a discharge of, release of,
18 or exposure to a chemical listed pursuant to Section 25249.8(a) of the Act is occurring. No
19 knowledge that the discharge, release or exposure is unlawful is required.” 27 Cal. Code of
20 Regs. (“CCR”) § 25102(n).

21 16. Proposition 65 provides that any “person who violates or threatens to violate” the
22 statute may be enjoined in a court of competent jurisdiction. Health & Safety Code § 25249.7.
23 The phrase “threaten to violate” is defined to mean creating “a condition in which there is a
24 substantial probability that a violation will occur.” Health & Safety Code § 25249.11(e).
25 Violators are liable for civil penalties of up to \$2,500 per day for each violation of the Act.
26 Health & Safety Code § 25249.7.

27 17. On January 1, 1990, the State of California officially listed the chemical
28 acrylamide as a chemical known to cause cancer. Acrylamide became subject to the warning
requirement one year later and was therefore subject to the “clear and reasonable” warning

1 requirements of Proposition 65 beginning on January 1, 1991. Health & Safety Code §
2 25249.6 *et seq.*; 27 Cal. Code Regs. §§ 25000, *et seq.* Due to the carcinogenicity of
3 acrylamide, the no significant risk level for acrylamide is 0.2 µg/day (micrograms per day). 27
4 Cal. Code Regs. § 25705(b)(1).

5 FACTUAL BACKGROUND

6
7 18. To test Defendant’s Almond Butter Products for acrylamide, Plaintiff hired a
8 well-respected and accredited testing laboratory. The results of testing undertaken by Plaintiff
9 of the Almond Butter Products show that they were in violation of the 0.2 microgram per day
10 (“µg/day”) for acrylamide “safe harbor” daily dose limits set forth in Proposition 65’s
11 regulations.

12 19. Based on the testing results, on June 21, 2018, Plaintiff sent a 60-Day Notice of
13 Proposition 65 Violations (“Notice”) to the requisite public enforcement agencies, and to
14 Defendant (a true and correct copy of the 60-Day Notice letter is attached hereto as **Exhibit A**
15 and is incorporated by reference). The Notice was issued pursuant to, and in compliance with,
16 the requirements of Health & Safety Code §25249.7(d) and the statute’s implementing
17 regulations regarding the notice of the violations to be given to certain public enforcement
18 agencies and to the violators. The Notice included, *inter alia*, the following information: the
19 name, address, and telephone number of the noticing individuals; the name of the alleged
20 violator; the statute violated; the approximate time period during which violations occurred;
21 and descriptions of the violations, including the chemical involved, the routes of toxic
22 exposure, and the specific product or type of product causing the violations, and was issued as
23 follows:
24

- 25 a. Defendant was provided a copy of the Notice by Certified Mail.
- 26 b. Defendant was provided a copy of a document entitled “The Safe Drinking
27 Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 (Proposition 65): A Summary,”
28 which is also known as Appendix A to Title 27 of Cal. Code Regs. § 25903.

- 1 c. The California Attorney General was provided a copy of the Notice via online
2 submission.
- 3 d. The California Attorney General was provided with a Certificate of Merit by the
4 attorney for the noticing party, stating that there is a reasonable and meritorious
5 case for this action, and attaching factual information sufficient to establish a
6 basis for the certificate, including the identity of the persons consulted with and
7 relied on by the certifier, and the facts, studies, or other data reviewed by those
8 persons, pursuant to Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(h)(2).
- 9 e. The district attorneys, city attorneys or prosecutors of each jurisdiction within
10 which the Almond Butter Products are offered for sale within California were
11 provided with a copy of the Notice pursuant to Health & Safety Code §
12 25249.7(d)(1).
13

14 20. At least 60-days have elapsed since Plaintiff sent the Notice to Defendant. The
15 appropriate public enforcement agencies have failed to commence and diligently prosecute a
16 cause of action under Health & Safety Code § 25249.5, *et seq.* against Defendant based on the
17 allegations herein.

18 21. On information and belief, the Almond Butter Products have been
19 manufactured, distributed, and/or sold by Defendant for consumption in California since at
20 least August 28, 2015. On information and belief, the Almond Butter Products continue to be
21 distributed and sold in California without the requisite warning information.
22

23 22. At all times relevant to this action, Defendant has knowingly and intentionally
24 exposed the users of the Almond Butter Products to acrylamide without first giving a clear and
25 reasonable warning to such individuals.

26 23. As a proximate result of acts of Defendant, as a person in the course of doing
27 business within the meaning of Health & Safety Code § 25249.11, individuals throughout the
28 State of California, including in the County of Alameda, have been exposed to acrylamide

1 without a clear and reasonable warning. The individuals subject to the illegal exposures
2 include normal and foreseeable users of the Almond Butter Products, as well as all other
3 persons exposed to the Almond Butter Products.
4

5 **FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION**
6 **(Violations of Health and Safety Code § 25249.5, *et seq.* concerning the Almond Butter**
7 **Products described in the June 21, 2018 Prop. 65 Notice)**

8 24. Plaintiff re-alleges and incorporates by reference Paragraphs 1 through 23,
9 inclusive, as if specifically set forth herein.

10 25. Defendant is a person doing business within the meaning of Health & Safety
11 Code § 25249.11.

12 26. Acrylamide is listed by the State of California as a chemical known to cause
13 cancer.

14 27. Defendant has and continues to knowingly and intentionally expose individuals
15 who ingest the Almond Butter Products to the chemical acrylamide without first providing a
16 clear and reasonable warning to such individuals pursuant to Health & Safety Code §§ 25249.6
17 and 25249.11(f).

18 28. Continuing commission by Defendant of the acts alleged above will irreparably
19 harm the citizens of the State of California, for which harm they have no plain, speedy, or
20 adequate remedy at law.

21 Wherefore, Plaintiff prays for judgment against Defendant, as set forth hereafter.

22 **PRAYER FOR RELIEF**

23 Wherefore, Plaintiff prays for the following relief:

24 1. A preliminary and permanent injunction, pursuant to Health & Safety Code §
25 25249.7(b), enjoining Defendant, its agents, employees, assigns and all persons acting in
26 concert or participating with Defendant, from distributing or selling the Almond Butter
27 Products in California without first providing a clear and reasonable warning that consumers of
28 the Almond Butter Products are exposed to acrylamide;

1
2 2. An injunctive order, pursuant to Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(b),
3 compelling Defendant to identify and locate each individual who has purchased the Almond
4 Butter Products since August 28, 2015, and to provide a warning to such persons that
5 consumption of the Almond Butter Products will expose the consumers to a chemical known to
6 cause cancer;


7 3. An assessment of civil penalties pursuant to Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(b)
8 against Defendant in the amount of \$2,500 per day for each violation of Proposition 65;

9 4. An award to Plaintiff of its reasonable attorney's fees and costs of suit pursuant
10 to California Code of Civil Procedure § 1021.5, as Plaintiff shall specify in further application
11 to the Court; and,

12 5. Such other and further relief as may be just and proper.

This firm represents Center for Food Safety in connection with this Notice of Violations of California's Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, which is codified at California Health & Safety Code Section 25249.5 *et seq.* ("Proposition 65"). Center for Food Safety is a national non-profit public interest and environmental advocacy organization working to protect human health and the environment by curbing the use of harmful food production technologies and by promoting organic and other forms of sustainable agriculture. This letter serves to provide notification of these violations to you and to the public enforcement agencies of Proposition 65.

This letter constitutes notice that the entity listed below has violated and continues to violate provisions of Proposition 65. Specifically, the entity listed below has violated and continues to violate the warning requirement at § 25249.6 of the California Health & Safety Code, which provides that "[n]o person in the course of doing business shall knowingly and intentionally expose any individual to a chemical known to the state to cause cancer or reproductive toxicity without first giving clear and reasonable warning to such individual..."

Violator: The name of the violator covered by this notice that violated Proposition 65 (hereinafter referred to as the "Violator") is: The Hain Celestial Group, Inc.

Listed Chemical: These violations involve exposure to the listed chemical acrylamide. On January 1, 1990, California officially listed acrylamide as a chemical known to the State of California to cause cancer. On February 25, 2011, California officially listed acrylamide as a chemical known to cause reproductive and developmental toxicity.

Consumer Products: The following specific products that are the subject of this notice because are causing exposures in violation of Proposition 65 are:

1. MaraNatha Creamy Almond Butter
2. MaraNatha Crunchy Almond Butter

Violation: The alleged Violator knowingly and intentionally exposed and continues to expose consumers within the State of California to acrylamide without providing a Proposition 65 warning. The Violator has manufactured, marketed, distributed, and/or sold the listed products, which have exposed and continue to expose numerous individuals within California to the identified chemical, acrylamide.

Route of Exposure: Use of the products identified in this notice results in human exposures to acrylamide. The primary route of exposure is ingestion.

Duration of Violation: The violations have been occurring since at least June 21, 2018, and are ongoing.

A summary of Proposition 65, prepared by the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment, is enclosed with the copy of this letter sent to the Violators.

Pursuant to California Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(d), Center for Food Safety intends to file a citizen enforcement action sixty days after effective service of this notice unless the Violator agree in an enforceable written agreement to: (1) reformulate the listed products so as to eliminate further exposures to the identified chemicals; (2) pay an appropriate civil penalty; and (3) provide clear and reasonable warnings compliant with Proposition 65 to all persons located in California who purchased the above products in the last three years. Consistent with the public interest goals of Proposition 65 and my client's objectives in pursuing this notice, Center for Food Safety is interested in seeking a constructive resolution to this matter. Such resolution will avoid both further unwarned consumer exposures to the identified chemical and expensive and time consuming litigation.


