

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#### 1. INTRODUCTION

#### 1.1 Parties

This Consent Judgment is entered into by and between plaintiff, Anthony E. Held, Ph.D., P.E. ("Held"), and defendant, Finesse Novelty Corp. ("Finesse"), with Held and Finesse collectively referred to as the "Parties."

#### 1.2 Plaintiff

Held is an individual residing in California who seeks to promote awareness of exposures to toxic chemicals and improve human health by reducing or eliminating hazardous substances contained in consumer products.

#### 1.3 Defendant

Finesse employs ten or more persons and is a person in the course of doing business for purposes of the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, California Health & Safety Code § 25249.6 et seq. ("Proposition 65").

#### 1.4 General Allegations

Held alleges that Finesse sold bracelets containing di(2-ethylhexyl)phthalate ("DEHP") without first providing the clear and reasonable warning required by Proposition 65. DEHP is listed pursuant to Proposition 65 as a chemical known to the state of California to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.

#### 1.5 Product Description

The products covered by this Consent Judgment are bracelets manufactured, distributed, sold, or offered for sale in California by Finesse, including, but not limited to, the *Bracelet*, #10000B-001 (#7 82663 49018 2) (hereinafter, the "Products").

#### 1.6 Notice of Violation

On or about September 19, 2011, Held served Finesse and various public enforcement agencies with a "60-Day Notice of Violation" ("Notice"), a document that informed the recipients of Held's allegation that Finesse was in violation of Proposition 65 for failing to warn its customers and consumers in California that the Products expose users to DEHP.

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#### 1.7 Complaint

On or about April 6, 2012, Held filed the instant action against Finesse ("Complaint") for the violations of Health & Safety Code § 25249.6 alleged in the Notice.

#### 1.8 No Admission

Finesse denies the material, factual, and legal allegations contained in the Notice and Complaint, and maintains that all of the products that it has sold in California, including the Products, have been, and are, in compliance with all laws. Nothing in this Consent Judgment shall be construed as an admission of any fact, finding, conclusion of law, issue of law, or violation of law; nor shall compliance with this Consent Judgment constitute or be construed as an admission of any fact, finding, conclusion of law, issue of law, or violation of law, the same being specifically denied by Finesse. This section shall not, however, diminish or otherwise affect Finesse's obligations, responsibilities, and duties under this Consent Judgment.

#### 1.9 Consent to Jurisdiction

For purposes of this Consent Judgment only, the Parties stipulate that this Court has jurisdiction over Finesse as to the allegations in the Complaint, that venue is proper in Alameda County, and that this Court has jurisdiction to enter and enforce the provisions of this Consent Judgment.

#### 1.10 Effective Date

For purposes of this Consent Judgment, the term "Effective Date" shall mean April 16, 2012.

#### 2. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF: REFORMULATION

#### 2.1 Reformulated Products

Commencing on the Effective Date and continuing thereafter, Finesse shall only import, manufacture, sell or distribute for sale in California, Products that contain a maximum of 1,000 parts per million (0.1%) DEHP content by weight in any accessible component (i.e., any component that can be handled or touched during reasonably foreseeable use) when analyzed pursuant to EPA testing methodologies 3580A and 8270C, or equivalent methodologies utilized by state or federal agencies for the purpose of determining DEHP content in a solid substance.

#### 3. MONETARY PAYMENTS

#### 3.1 Civil Penalty Payment Pursuant to Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(b)

Pursuant to Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(b), Finesse shall pay a civil penalty of \$2,000 after application of a credit of \$4,000, agreed to by Held in response to Finesse's commitment to Proposition 65 compliance, including reformulating the Products to comply with the DEHP content standard established by section 2 above.

The penalty payment will be allocated according to Health & Safety Code § 25249.12 (c)(1) & (d), with seventy-five percent (75%) of the penalty amount earmarked for the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment ("OEHHA") and the remaining twenty-five (25%) of the penalty amount earmarked for Held.

#### 3.2 Reimbursement of Held's Fees and Costs

The Parties acknowledge that Held and his counsel offered to resolve this dispute without reaching terms on the amount of fees and costs to be reimbursed to them, thereby leaving the issue to be resolved after the material terms of the agreement had been settled. Shortly after all other settlement terms had been finalized, Finesse expressed a desire to resolve the fee and costs issue. The Parties then attempted to (and did) reach an accord on the compensation due Held and his counsel under general contract principles and the private attorney general doctrine codified at California Code of Civil Procedure § 1021.5 for all work performed in this matter exclusive of fees and costs that may be incurred on appeal, if any. Under these legal principles, Finesse shall pay \$29,500 for fees and costs incurred investigating, litigating, and enforcing this matter, including the fees and costs incurred (and yet to be incurred) drafting, negotiating, and obtaining the Court's approval of this Consent Judgment in the public interest.

#### 3.3 Payment Procedures

#### 3.3.1 Payments Held in Trust

All payments made under this Consent Judgment shall be delivered to either The Chanler Group or the attorney of record for the Finesse, and shall be held in trust pending the Court's approval of this Consent Judgment.

Settlement funds delivered to The Chanler Group shall be in the form of checks for the following amounts, made payable as follows:

- (a) to "The Chanler Group in Trust for OEHHA" in the amount of \$1,500, due on or before May 1, 2012;
- (b) to "The Chanler Group in Trust for Anthony Held" in the amount of \$500, due on or before May 1, 2012; and
- (c) to "The Chanler Group in Trust" as follows: due as follows: \$10,000 on or before May 1, 2012; \$10,000 on or before June 1, 2012; and \$9,500 on or before either July 1, 2012 or the date the Court approves the settlement, whichever is sooner.

Settlement funds delivered to Allen Matkins Leck Gamble Mallory & Natsis LLP shall be in the form of checks for the following amounts, made payable as follows:

- (a) to "Allen Matkins Leck Gamble Mallory & Natsis LLP in Trust for OEHHA" in the amount of \$1,500, due on or before May 1, 2012;
- (b) to "Allen Matkins Leck Gamble Mallory & Natsis LLP in Trust for Anthony Held" in the amount of \$500, due on or before May 1, 2012; and
- (c) to "Allen Matkins Leck Gamble Mallory & Natsis LLP in Trust" as follows: due as follows: \$10,000 on or before May 1, 2012; \$10,000 on or before June 1, 2012; and \$9,500 on or before either July 1, 2012 or the date the Court approves the settlement, whichever is sooner.

If Finesse elects to deliver payments to its attorney of record, such attorney of record shall: (a) confirm in writing within five days of receipt of each payment that the funds have been deposited in a trust account; and (b) within two days of the date of the hearing on which the Court approves the Consent Judgment, deliver the payments to The Chanler Group in three separate checks, as follows:

- (a) to "The Chanler Group in Trust for OEHHA" in the amount of \$1,500;
- (b) to "The Chanler Group in Trust for Anthony Held" in the amount of \$500; and

1	(c) to "The Chanler Group in Trust" in the amount of \$29,500.	
2	3.3.2 Issuance of 1099 Forms	
3	After the Consent Judgment has been approved, Finesse shall issue three 1099 forms	
4	for the payments made pursuant sections 3.1 and 3.2, as follows:

20	4. <u>CLAIMS COVERED AND RELEASED</u>	
21	4.1 Held's Public Release of Proposition 65 Claims	
22	Held, acting on his own behalf and in the public interest, releases Finesse from all claims for	
23	violations of Proposition 65 up through the Effective Date based on exposures to DEHP from the	
24	Products as set forth in the Notice. Compliance with the terms of this Consent Judgment constitutes	
25	compliance with Proposition 65 with respect to exposures to DEHP from the Products as set forth in	
26	the Notice.	

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#### 4.2 Held's Individual Release of Claims

Held, in his individual capacity only and *not* in his representative capacity, also provides a release herein which shall be effective as a full and final accord and satisfaction, as a bar to all actions, causes of action, obligations, costs, expenses, attorneys' fees, damages, losses, claims, liabilities and demands of Held of any nature, character or kind, whether known or unknown, suspected or unsuspected, arising out of alleged or actual exposures to DEHP in the Products imported, manufactured, sold or distributed for sale by Finesse.

#### 4.3 Finesse's Release of Held

Finesse on behalf of itself, its past and current agents, representatives, attorneys, successors, and/or assignces, hereby waives any and all claims against Held, his attorneys and other representatives, for any and all actions taken or statements made (or those that could have been taken or made) by Held and his attorneys and other representatives, whether in the course of investigating claims, otherwise seeking to enforce Proposition 65 against it in this matter, or with respect to the Products.

#### 5. <u>COURT APPROVAL</u>

This Consent Judgment is not effective until it is approved and entered by the Court and shall be null and void if, for any reason, it is not approved and entered by the Court within one year after it has been fully executed by all Parties.

#### 6. SEVERABILITY

If, subsequent to the execution of this Consent Judgment, any provision is held by a court to be unenforceable, the validity of the remaining provisions shall not be adversely affected.

#### 7. **GOVERNING LAW**

The terms of this Consent Judgment shall be governed by the laws of the state of California and apply within the state of California. In the event that Proposition 65 is repealed, preempted, or is otherwise rendered inapplicable by reason of law generally, or as to the Products, then Finesse may provide written notice to Held of any asserted change in the law, and shall have no further obligations pursuant to this Consent Judgment with respect to, and to the extent that, the Products are so affected.

#### 12. **AUTHORIZATION**

The undersigned are authorized to execute this Consent Judgment and have read, understood, and agree to all of the terms and conditions contained herein.
