Plaintiff Peter Englander and defendant Flexible Foam Products, Inc. have agreed to the terms of the settlement memorialized in the [Proposed] Consent Judgment ("Consent Judgment") attached as Exhibit A to the Declaration of Brian C. Johnson in Support of Motion to Approve Proposition 65 Settlement and Consent Judgment lodged herewith, and plaintiff has moved this Court for an Order approving the settlement.

After consideration of the papers submitted and the arguments presented, the Court finds that the settlement agreement set forth in the Consent Judgment meets the criteria established by California Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(f)(4), in that:

- 1. The injunctive relief required by the Consent Judgment complies with Proposition 65;
- 2. The reimbursement of fees and costs provided by the Consent Judgment is reasonable under California law; and
- 3. The civil penalty amount to be paid pursuant to the Consent Judgment is reasonable.

Accordingly, the Motion for Approval of the Proposition 65 Settlement is GRANTED.
