**[PROPOSED] CONSENT JUDGMENT**  
(Health & Safety Code § 25249.6 *et seq.*)

1     **1.     INTRODUCTION**

2             **1.1     Parties**

3             This Consent Judgment is entered into by and between Anthony E. Held, Ph.D., P.E. (“Held”) and Harrow Sports, Inc. (“Harrow Sports”), with Held and Harrow Sports each individually referred to as a “Party” and collectively as the “Parties.”

6             **1.2     Plaintiff**

7             Held is an individual residing in California who seeks to promote awareness of exposures to toxic chemicals and improve human health by reducing or eliminating hazardous substances contained in consumer products.

10            **1.3     Defendant**

11            Harrow Sports employs ten or more persons and is a “person in the course of doing business” for purposes of the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, Health and Safety Code section 25249.6 *et seq.* (“Proposition 65”).

14            **1.4     General Allegations**

15            Held alleges that Harrow Sports manufactures, imports, sells, or distributes for sale in California, ball bags with vinyl/PVC components containing di(2-ethylhexyl) phthalate (“DEHP”), without first providing the exposure warning required by Proposition 65. DEHP is listed pursuant to Proposition 65 as a chemical known to the State of California to cause birth defects, and other reproductive harms.

20            **1.5     Product Description**

21            Harrow Sports’ products that are covered by this Consent Judgment are (i) ball bags with vinyl/PVC components containing DEHP including, without limitation, the *Elite Ball Bag, UPC #8 40749 00186 5* (“Ball Bags”), and (ii) field hockey gloves with vinyl/PVC components, including, but not limited to the *Harrow Field Hockey Glove, #2500030213, UPC #8 49776 00351 4* (“Hockey Gloves”), which are manufactured by or for Harrow Sports and sold in the State of California (the “Covered Products”).

1           **1.6 Notices of Violation**

2           On April 29, 2015, Held served Harrow Sports, others, and certain requisite public  
3 enforcement agencies with a “60-Day Notice of Violation” (“Notice”) alleging that Harrow Sports  
4 violated Proposition 65 when it failed to warn its customers and consumers in California that ball  
5 bags with vinyl/PVC components expose users to DEHP. On September 24, 2015, Held served  
6 Harrow Sports, and certain requisite public enforcement agencies with a “Supplemental 60-Day  
7 Notice of Violation” (“Supplemental Notice”) alleging that Harrow Sports violated Proposition 65  
8 when it failed to warn its customers and consumers in California that field hockey gloves with  
9 vinyl/PVC components expose users to DEHP. The Notice and the Supplemental Notice shall  
10 hereinafter be referred to as the “Notices.”

11           **1.7 Complaint**

12           On or about July 15, 2015, Held filed the instant action (“Complaint”), naming Harrow Sports  
13 as defendant for its alleged violations of Health and Safety Code section 25249.6 that are the subject  
14 of the Notice. Upon entry of this Consent Judgment, the Complaint shall be deemed amended *nunc*  
15 *pro tunc* to include the violations of Proposition 65 alleged by Held in the Supplemental Notice.

16           **1.8 No Admission**

17           Harrow Sports denies the material, factual, and legal allegations contained in the Notices and  
18 Complaint, and maintain that all of the products that they have sold and distributed for sale in  
19 California, including the Products, have been, and are, in compliance with all laws. Nothing in this  
20 Consent Judgment shall be construed as an admission of any fact, finding, conclusion of law, issue of  
21 law, or violation of law, nor shall compliance with this Consent Judgment constitute or be construed  
22 as an admission of any fact, finding, conclusion of law, issue of law, or violation of law. This  
23 Section shall not, however, diminish or otherwise affect Harrow Sports’ obligations, responsibilities,  
24 and duties under this Consent Judgment.

25           **1.9 Jurisdiction**

26           For purposes of this Consent Judgment only, the Parties stipulate that this Court has  
27 jurisdiction over Harrow Sports as to the allegations in the Complaint, that venue is proper in the  
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1 County of Alameda, and that this Court has jurisdiction to enter and enforce the provisions of this  
2 Consent Judgment.

3 **1.10 Effective Date**

4 For purposes of this Consent Judgment, the term "Effective Date" means the date which the  
5 Court approves this Consent Judgment, including any unopposed tentative rulings.

6 **2. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF: REFORMULATION AND WARNINGS**

7 **2.1 Reformulation of Products**

8 Within forty five (45) days of the Effective Date, and continuing thereafter, Harrow Sports  
9 shall only purchase for sale, manufacture for sale, import, sell, or distribute for sale in California  
10 Covered Products that are either: (i) "Reformulated Products" (as defined below in this section), or  
11 (ii) contain a clear and reasonable warning required under Section § 25603.2 of the California Health  
12 & Safety Code, as set forth in Section 2.2 below ("Product Warning"). For purposes of this Consent  
13 Judgment, "Reformulated Products" are products that contain DEHP in concentrations of less than  
14 0.1 percent (1,000 parts per million) when analyzed pursuant to U.S. Environmental Protection  
15 Agency testing methodologies 3580A and 8270C, or any other methodology utilized by federal or  
16 state agencies for the purpose of determining the DEHP content in a solid substance.

17 **2.2 Product Warnings**

18 Each Product Warning shall be prominently placed with such conspicuousness as compared  
19 with other words, statements, designs, or devices as to render it likely to be read and understood by  
20 an ordinary individual under customary conditions before purchase or use. Each warning shall be  
21 provided in a manner such that the consumer or user understands to which *specific* Product the  
22 warning applies, so as to minimize the risk of consumer confusion.

23 **(a) Retail Store Sales and Product Labeling.**

24 Harrow Sports shall cause a warning to be affixed to the packaging, or labeling on each  
25 Product provided for sale in retail outlets in California that states:

26 **WARNING:** This product contains a chemical known to the State of California to  
27 cause birth defects or other reproductive harms.





1 any Covered Product; or (d) on one or more web pages displayed to a purchaser during the checkout  
2 process. The following warning statement shall be used and shall appear in any of the above  
3 instances adjacent to or immediately following the display, description, or price of the Covered  
4 Product for which it is given in the same type size or larger than the Product description text:

5 **WARNING:** This product contains a chemical known to the State of California to  
6 cause birth defects or other reproductive harms.

7 Alternatively, the designated symbol may appear adjacent to or immediately following the  
8 display, description, or price of the Covered Product for which a warning is being given, provided  
9 that the following warning statement also appears elsewhere on the same web page, as follows:

10 **WARNING:** This product contains a chemical known to the State of California to  
11 cause birth defects or other reproductive harms.

12 **3. MONETARY SETTLEMENT TERMS**

13 **3.1 Civil Penalty Payments**

14 Pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 25249.7(b), in settlement of all the claims referred  
15 to in this Consent Judgment, Harrow Sports shall pay \$7,500 in civil penalties. Each civil penalty  
16 payment shall be allocated according to Health and Safety Code section 25249.12(c)(1) and (d) with  
17 seventy-five percent (75%) of the penalty paid to the California Office of Environmental Health  
18 Hazard Assessment (“OEHHA”) and twenty-five percent (25%) of the penalty allocated to Held.

19 **3.1.1 Initial Civil Penalty**

20 Within five (5) days following the Effective Date, Harrow Sports shall make the initial  
21 civil penalty payment in the amount of \$2,500 to by check made out to “Anthony E. Held, Ph.D.,  
22 P.E., Client Trust Account.” Held subsequently will direct 75% of the initial civil penalty to  
23 OEHHA.

24 **3.1.2 Final Civil Penalty**

25 On or before June 30, 2016, Harrow Sports shall make a final civil penalty payment of  
26 \$5,000. Pursuant to title 11 California Code of Regulations, section 3203(c), Held agrees that the  
27 final civil penalty payment shall be waived in its entirety if, no later than June 15, 2016, an officer of  
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1 Harrow Sports provides Held with written certification that it is no longer offering or distributing for  
2 sale in California the Covered Products, or that it is only offering for sale in California Covered  
3 Products that qualify as Reformulated Products, as defined in section 2 of this Consent Judgment.  
4 The option to provide the above-described certification in lieu of making the final civil penalty  
5 payment required by this Section is a material term and time is of the essence.

### 6 **3.2 Reimbursement of Fees and Costs**

7 The Parties acknowledge that Held and his counsel offered to resolve this dispute without  
8 reaching terms on the amount of fees and costs to be reimbursed to them, thereby leaving the issue to  
9 be resolved after the material terms of this Consent Judgment had been settled. Shortly after the  
10 other settlement terms had been finalized, Harrow Sports expressed a desire to resolve Held's fees  
11 and costs. The Parties then attempted to (and did) reach an accord on the compensation due to Held  
12 and his counsel under general contract principles and the private attorney general doctrine codified at  
13 California Code of Civil Procedure section 1021.5 for all work performed through the mutual  
14 execution of this Consent Judgment. Harrow Sports shall, within five (5) days of the Effective Date,  
15 issue a check for \$24,000 to the address found in Section 3.3.1 below. This payment shall be made  
16 by a check payable to "The Chanler Group."

### 17 **3.3 Payment Procedures**

18 Except for the final civil penalty payment required by Section 3.1.2, all payments due under  
19 this Consent Judgment are to be delivered within fifteen (15) days following the full execution of  
20 this Consent Judgment to Valle Makoff, LLP, to be held in its client trust account, and released to  
21 The Chanler Group and Held within five (5) days of the Effective Date, as provided in subsections  
22 3.1 and 3.2, and mailed to the addresses set forth in subsection 3.3.1.

1                                   **3.3.2 Issuance of Tax Documentation**

2                                   Within 15 days of the execution of this Consent Judgment, The Chanler Group shall  
3 advise Harrow Sports, through its counsel, regarding the issuance of 1099 forms, including the  
4 persons and entities to whom 1099 forms should be issued, and the tax identification numbers for  
5 each such person and entity.

6                                   **3.3.3 Court Approval; Reimbursement.**

7                                   If the Court does not approve the Consent Judgment within one year from the date of  
8 execution by Harrow Sports, all funds tendered into any trust account, or otherwise received by The  
9 Chanler Group from Harrow Sports in settlement of this action, shall be refunded in full.

10 **4. CLAIMS COVERED AND RELEASED**

11                                   **4.1 Held's Public Release of Proposition 65 Claims**

12                                   Held, acting on his own behalf and in the public interest, hereby releases Harrow Sports and  
13 its parents, subsidiaries, affiliated entities under common ownership (including Caleel + Hayden  
14 LLC), directors, officers, employees, and attorneys (collectively "Releasees") and each entity to  
15 whom it directly or indirectly distributes or sells the Products, including but not limited to its  
16 downstream distributors, wholesalers, customers, retailers, franchisers, cooperative members,  
17 licensors, and licensees ("Downstream Releasees") from all claims for violations arising under  
18 Proposition 65 for unwarned exposures to DEHP from the Covered Products sold by Harrow Sports  
19 prior to the Effective Date, as set forth in the Notices. Upon entry of this Consent Judgment by the  
20 Court, going forward, Harrow Sports' compliance with the terms of Section 2 of this Consent  
21 Judgment shall be deemed to constitute compliance with Proposition 65 with respect to DEHP in  
22 the Covered Products, pending full implementation of Harrow Sports' obligations set forth in  
23 Section 2 of this Consent Judgment.

24                                   **4.2 Held's Individual Release of Claims**

25                                   Held, in his individual capacity only and *not* in his representative capacity, on behalf of  
26 himself and his past and current agents, representatives, attorneys, successors, and/or assignees, also  
27 provides a release to Releasees, and Downstream Releasees, which shall be effective as a full and  
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1 final accord and satisfaction, as a bar to all actions, causes of action, obligations, costs, expenses,  
2 attorneys' fees, damages, losses, claims, liabilities and demands of Held of any nature, character or  
3 kind, arising out of alleged or actual exposures to DEHP from the Covered Products sold or  
4 distributed for sale by Harrow Sports before the Effective Date. Upon entry of this Consent  
5 Judgment by the Court, going forward, Harrow Sports' compliance with the terms of Section 2 of  
6 this Consent Judgment shall be deemed to constitute compliance with Proposition 65 with respect to  
7 the Listed Chemicals in the Products, pending full implementation of Harrow Sports' obligations set  
8 forth in Section 2 of this Consent Judgment.

9 **4.3 Harrow Sports' Release of Held**

10 Harrow Sports, on its own behalf, and on behalf of its past and current agents,  
11 representatives, attorneys, successors, and assignees, hereby waives any and all claims against Held  
12 and his attorneys and other representatives, for any and all actions taken or statements made by  
13 Held and his attorneys and other representatives, whether in the course of investigating claims,  
14 otherwise seeking to enforce Proposition 65 against it in this matter, or with respect to the Products.

15 **5. COURT APPROVAL**

16 This Consent Judgment is not effective until it is approved and entered by the Court and shall  
17 be null and void if, for any reason, it is not approved and entered by the Court within one year after it  
18 has been fully executed by the Parties, at which time, per section 3.3.3, any funds being held in trust  
19 for purposes of this agreement shall be fully reimbursed to Harrow Sports.

20 **6. SEVERABILITY**

21 If, subsequent to the Court's approval and entry of this Consent Judgment as a judgment, any  
22 provision is held by a court to be unenforceable, the validity of the remaining provisions shall not be  
23 adversely affected.

24 **7. GOVERNING LAW**

25 The terms of this Consent Judgment shall be governed by the laws of the state of California  
26 and apply within the state of California. In the event that Proposition 65 is repealed, preempted, or is  
27 otherwise rendered inapplicable by reason of law generally, or as to the Products, then Harrow Sports  
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1 may provide written notice to Held of any asserted change in the law, and shall have no further  
2 obligations pursuant to this Consent Judgment with respect to, and to the extent that, the Products are  
3 so affected. Nothing in this Consent Judgment shall be interpreted to relieve Harrow Sports from any  
4 obligation to comply with any applicable state or federal toxics control laws.

5 **8. NOTICE**

6 Unless specified herein, all correspondence and notice required by this Consent Judgment  
7 shall be in writing and sent by: (i) personal delivery; (ii) first-class, registered, or certified mail,  
8 return receipt requested; or (iii) a recognized overnight courier to the following addresses:

17 Any Party may, from time to time, specify in writing to the other, a change of address to which all  
18 notices and other communications shall be sent.

19 **9. COUNTERPARTS; FACSIMILE SIGNATURES**

20 This Consent Judgment may be executed in counterparts and by facsimile or portable  
21 document format (PDF) signature, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which, when  
22 taken together, shall constitute one and the same document.

23 **10. POST EXECUTION ACTIVITIES**

24 Held agrees to comply with the reporting form requirements referenced in Health and Safety  
25 Code section 25249.7(f). The Parties further acknowledge that, pursuant to Health and Safety Code  
26 section 25249.7(f), a noticed motion is required to obtain judicial approval of the settlement. In  
27 furtherance of obtaining such approval, Held and Harrow Sports agree to mutually employ their best  
28 efforts, and that of their counsel, to support the entry of this agreement as judgment, and to obtain

1 judicial approval of their settlement in a timely manner. For purposes of this Section, "best efforts"  
2 shall include, at a minimum, cooperating with the drafting and filing of the necessary moving papers,  
3 and supporting the motion for judicial approval.

4 **11. MODIFICATION**

5 This Consent Judgment may be modified only by: (i) a written agreement of the Parties and  
6 entry of a modified consent judgment by the Court; or (ii) a successful motion or application of any  
7 Party, and the entry of a modified consent judgment by the Court.

8 **12. AUTHORIZATION**

9 The undersigned are authorized to execute this Consent Judgment and have read, understood,  
10 and agree to all of the terms and conditions contained herein.

11 **13. ENTIRE AGREEMENT**

12 This Consent Judgment contains the sole and entire agreement and understanding of the parties. No  
13 representations, oral or otherwise, express or implied, other than those contained herein, have been  
14 made by any party hereto. No other agreements shall be deemed to exist or to bind any of the parties.
