1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 On February 28, 2017, Plaintiff Environmental Research Center, Inc. ("ERC"), a non-profit corporation, as a private enforcer and in the public interest, initiated this action by

1 filing a Complaint for Injunctive and Declaratory Relief and Civil Penalties (the "Complaint")
2 pursuant to the provisions of California Health and Safety Code section 25249.5 *et seq.*
3 ("Proposition 65"), against Spartan Brands, Inc., individually and doing business as Beautiful
4 Nutrition ("Beautiful Nutrition"), and Does 1-100. In this action, ERC alleges that one of the
5 products manufactured, distributed, or sold by Beautiful Nutrition contains lead, a chemical
6 listed under Proposition 65 as a carcinogen and reproductive toxin, and exposes consumers to
7 this chemical at a level requiring a Proposition 65 warning. This product (referred to
8 hereinafter as the "Covered Product") is: Beautiful Nutrition LLC Beautritious Skin Firming
9 Collagen Cocktail Line Reducing Drink Mix.

10 **1.2** ERC and Beautiful Nutrition are hereinafter referred to individually as a "Party"
11 or collectively as the "Parties."

12 **1.3** ERC is a 501 (c)(3) California non-profit corporation dedicated to, among other
13 causes, helping safeguard the public from health hazards by reducing the use and misuse of
14 hazardous and toxic chemicals, facilitating a safe environment for consumers and employees,
15 and encouraging corporate responsibility.

16 **1.4** For purposes of this Consent Judgment only, the Parties agree that Beautiful
17 Nutrition is a business entity that has employed ten or more persons at all times relevant to this
18 action, and qualifies as a "person in the course of business" within the meaning of Proposition 65.
19 Beautiful Nutrition manufactures, distributes, and/or sells the Covered Product.

20 **1.5** The Complaint is based on allegations contained in ERC's Notice of Violation
21 dated December 16, 2016 that was served on the California Attorney General, other public
22 enforcers, and Beautiful Nutrition ("Notice"). A true and correct copy of the 60-Day Notice
23 dated December 16, 2016 is attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and is incorporated herein by
24 reference. More than 60 days have passed since the Notice was served on the Attorney
25 General, public enforcers, and Beautiful Nutrition and no designated governmental entity has
26 filed a complaint against Beautiful Nutrition with regard to the Covered Product or the alleged
27 violations.

28 **1.6** ERC's Notice and Complaint allege that use of the Covered Product exposes

1 persons in California to lead without first providing clear and reasonable warnings in violation
2 of California Health and Safety Code section 25249.6. Beautiful Nutrition denies all material
3 allegations contained in the Notice and Complaint.

4 **1.7** The Parties have entered into this Consent Judgment in order to settle,
5 compromise, and resolve disputed claims and thus avoid prolonged and costly litigation.
6 Nothing in this Consent Judgment nor compliance with this Consent Judgment shall constitute or
7 be construed as an admission by any of the Parties or by any of their respective officers,
8 directors, shareholders, employees, agents, parent companies, subsidiaries, divisions, franchisees,
9 licensees, customers, suppliers, distributors, wholesalers, or retailers of any fact, issue of law, or
10 violation of law.

11 **1.8** Except as expressly set forth herein, nothing in this Consent Judgment shall
12 prejudice, waive, or impair any right, remedy, argument, or defense the Parties may have in any
13 current or future legal proceeding unrelated to these proceedings.

14 **1.9** The Effective Date of this Consent Judgment is the date on which it is entered as
15 a Judgment by this Court.

16 **2. JURISDICTION AND VENUE**

17 For purposes of this Consent Judgment and any further court action that may become
18 necessary to enforce this Consent Judgment, the Parties stipulate that this Court has subject matter
19 jurisdiction over the allegations of violations contained in the Complaint, personal jurisdiction
20 over Beautiful Nutrition as to the acts alleged in the Complaint, that venue is proper in Alameda
21 County, and that this Court has jurisdiction to enter this Consent Judgment as a full and final
22 resolution of all claims up through and including the Effective Date which were or could have
23 been asserted in this action based on the facts alleged in the Notice and Complaint.

24 **3. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF, REFORMULATION, TESTING AND WARNINGS**

25 **3.1** Beginning on the Effective Date, Beautiful Nutrition shall be permanently
26 enjoined from manufacturing for sale in the State of California, "Distributing into the State of
27 California", or directly selling in the State of California, any Covered Product which exposes a
28 person to a "Daily Lead Exposure Level" of more than 0.5 micrograms of lead per day when

1 used in accordance with the manufacturer's directions on the label of the Covered Product
2 unless it meets the warning requirements under Section 3.2.

3 **3.1.1** As used in this Consent Judgment, the term "Distributing into the State
4 of California" shall mean to directly ship a Covered Product into California for sale in
5 California or to sell a Covered Product to a distributor that Beautiful Nutrition knows will sell
6 the Covered Product in California.

7 **3.1.2** For purposes of this Consent Judgment, the "Daily Lead Exposure
8 Level" shall be measured in micrograms, and shall be calculated using the following formula:
9 micrograms of lead per gram of product, multiplied by grams of product per serving of the
10 product (using the largest serving size appearing on the product label), multiplied by servings
11 of the product per day (using the largest number of servings in a recommended dosage
12 appearing on the product label), which equals micrograms of lead exposure per day.

13 **3.2 Clear and Reasonable Warnings**

14 If Beautiful Nutrition is required to provide a warning pursuant to Section 3.1, the
15 following warning must be utilized ("Warning"):

16 **WARNING:** Consuming this product can expose you to chemicals including lead which
17 is known to the State of California to cause cancer and birth defects or other reproductive
18 harm. For more information go to www.P65Warnings.ca.gov/food.

19 Beautiful Nutrition shall use the phrase "cancer and" in the Warning only if the "Daily Lead
20 Exposure Level" is greater than 15 micrograms of lead as determined pursuant to the quality
21 control methodology set forth in Section 3.4.

22 The Warning shall be securely affixed to or printed upon the container or label of each
23 Covered Product. In addition, for any Covered Product sold over the internet by Beautiful
24 Nutrition, the Warning shall appear such that the consumer views the warning prior to
25 completing the checkout process when a California delivery address is indicated for any
26 purchase of any Covered Product. If a warning is displayed on the checkout page, it must be
27 clear which product(s) are subject to the warning.

28 The Warning shall be at least the same size as the largest of any other health or safety
warnings also appearing on its website or on the label or container of Beautiful Nutrition's product

1 packaging and the word "WARNING" shall be in all capital letters and in bold print. No
2 statements intended to or likely to have the effect of diminishing the impact of, or reducing the
3 clarity of, the Warning on the average lay person shall accompany the Warning. Further, no
4 statements may accompany the Warning that state or imply that the source of the listed chemical
5 has an impact on or results in a less harmful effect of the listed chemical.

6 Beautiful Nutrition must display the above Warning with such conspicuousness, as
7 compared with other words, statements, design of the label, container, or on its website, as
8 applicable, to render the Warning likely to be read and understood by an ordinary individual under
9 customary conditions of purchase or use of the product.

10 3.3 Reformulated Covered Products

11 A Reformulated Covered Product is one for which the "Daily Lead Exposure Level" is no
12 greater than 0.5 micrograms of lead per day when used in accordance with the manufacturer's
13 directions. Any allegation that a Covered Product is not in compliance with this section shall be
14 verified through testing by an independent testing agency.

15 4. SETTLEMENT PAYMENT

16 4.1 In full satisfaction of all potential civil penalties, additional settlement payments,
17 attorney's fees, and costs, Beautiful Nutrition shall make a total payment of \$16,000.00 ("Total
18 Settlement Amount") to ERC within 5 days of the Effective Date ("Due Date"). Beautiful
19 Nutrition shall make this payment by wire transfer to ERC's escrow account, for which ERC
20 will give Beautiful Nutrition the necessary account information. The Total Settlement Amount
21 shall be apportioned as follows:

22 4.2 \$1,000.00 shall be considered a civil penalty pursuant to California Health and
23 Safety Code section 25249.7(b)(1). ERC shall remit 75% (\$750.00) of the civil penalty to the
24 Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment ("OEHHA") for deposit in the Safe
25 Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Fund in accordance with California Health and Safety
26 Code section 25249.12(c). ERC will retain the remaining 25% (\$250.00) of the civil penalty.

27 4.3 \$2,324.12 shall be distributed to ERC as reimbursement to ERC for reasonable
28 costs incurred in bringing this action.

1 4.4 \$1,650.00 shall be distributed to Michael Freund as reimbursement of ERC's
2 attorney's fees, \$3,750.00 shall be distributed to Ryan Hoffman as reimbursement of ERC's
3 attorney's fees, while \$7,275.88 shall be distributed to ERC for its in-house legal fees. Except
4 as explicitly provided herein, each Party shall bear its own fees and costs.

5 4.6 In the event that Beautiful Nutrition fails to remit the Total Settlement Amount
6 owed under Section 4 of this Consent Judgment on or before the Due Date, Beautiful Nutrition
7 shall be deemed to be in material breach of its obligations under this Consent Judgment. ERC
8 shall provide written notice of the delinquency to Beautiful Nutrition via electronic mail. If
9 Beautiful Nutrition fails to deliver the Total Settlement Amount within five (5) days from the
10 written notice, the Total Settlement Amount shall accrue interest at the statutory judgment
11 interest rate provided in the California Code of Civil Procedure section 685.010. Additionally,
12 Beautiful Nutrition agrees to pay ERC's reasonable attorney's fees and costs for any efforts to
13 collect the payment due under this Consent Judgment.

14 **5. MODIFICATION OF CONSENT JUDGMENT**

15 5.1 This Consent Judgment may be modified only as to injunctive terms (i) by
16 written stipulation of the Parties or pursuant to Section 5.3 and (ii) upon entry by the Court of a
17 modified consent judgment.

18 5.2 If Beautiful Nutrition seeks to modify this Consent Judgment under Section 5.1,
19 then Beautiful Nutrition must provide written notice to ERC of its intent ("Notice of Intent"). If
20 ERC seeks to meet and confer regarding the proposed modification in the Notice of Intent, then
21 ERC must provide written notice to Beautiful Nutrition within thirty (30) days of receiving the
22 Notice of Intent. If ERC notifies Beautiful Nutrition in a timely manner of ERC's intent to meet
23 and confer, then the Parties shall meet and confer in good faith as required in this Section. The
24 Parties shall meet in person or via telephone within thirty (30) days of ERC's notification of its
25 intent to meet and confer. Within thirty (30) days of such meeting, if ERC disputes the
26 proposed modification, ERC shall provide to Beautiful Nutrition a written basis for its position.
27 The Parties shall continue to meet and confer for an additional thirty (30) days in an effort to
28

1 resolve any remaining disputes. Should it become necessary, the Parties may agree in writing
2 to different deadlines for the meet-and-confer period.

3 **5.3** Where the meet-and-confer process does not lead to a joint motion or
4 application in support of a modification of the Consent Judgment, then either Party may seek
5 judicial relief on its own.

6 **6. RETENTION OF JURISDICTION, ENFORCEMENT OF CONSENT**
7 **JUDGMENT**

8 **6.1** This Court shall retain jurisdiction of this matter to enforce, modify, or terminate
9 this Consent Judgment.

10 **6.2** If ERC alleges that any Covered Product fails to qualify as a Reformulated
11 Covered Product (for which ERC alleges that no Warning has been provided), then ERC shall
12 inform Beautiful Nutrition in a reasonably prompt manner of its test results, including
13 information sufficient to permit Beautiful Nutrition to identify the Covered Product at issue.
14 Beautiful Nutrition shall, within thirty (30) days following such notice, provide ERC with
15 testing information, from an independent third-party laboratory meeting the requirements of
16 Sections 3.4.3 and 3.4.4, demonstrating Beautiful Nutrition's compliance with the Consent
17 Judgment, if warranted. The Parties shall first attempt to resolve the matter prior to ERC taking
18 any further legal action.

19 **7. APPLICATION OF CONSENT JUDGMENT**

20 This Consent Judgment may apply to and be binding upon the Parties, and benefit the
21 Parties and their respective officers, directors, shareholders, employees, agents, parent companies,
22 subsidiaries, divisions, franchisees, licensees, customers (excluding private labelers), distributors,
23 wholesalers, retailers, predecessors, successors, and assigns. This Consent Judgment shall have no
24 application to any Covered Product that is distributed or sold exclusively outside the State of
25 California and which is not used by California consumers.

26 **8. BINDING EFFECT, CLAIMS COVERED AND RELEASED**

27 **8.1** This Consent Judgment is a full, final, and binding release of claims between
28 ERC and Beautiful Nutrition and its respective officers, directors, shareholders, employees,

1 agents, parent companies, subsidiaries, divisions, suppliers, franchisees, licensees, customers
2 (not including private label customers of Beautiful Nutrition), distributors, wholesalers,
3 retailers, and all other upstream and downstream entities in the distribution chain of any
4 Covered Product, and the predecessors, successors, and assigns of any of them (collectively,
5 "Released Parties"). ERC, on behalf of itself and acting in the public interest of the State of
6 California, hereby fully releases and discharges the Released Parties from any and all claims,
7 actions, causes of action, suits, demands, liabilities, damages, penalties, fees, costs, and
8 expenses asserted, or that could have been asserted from the handling, use, or consumption of
9 the Covered Product, as to any alleged violation of Proposition 65 or its implementing
10 regulations arising from the failure to provide Proposition 65 warnings on the Covered Product
11 regarding lead up to and including the Effective Date.

12 **8.2** ERC on its own behalf only, and Beautiful Nutrition on its own behalf only,
13 further waive and release any and all claims they may have against each other for all actions or
14 statements made or undertaken in the course of seeking or opposing enforcement of Proposition
15 65 in connection with the Notice and Complaint up through and including the Effective Date,
16 provided, however, that nothing in Section 8 shall affect or limit any Party's right to seek to
17 enforce the terms of this Consent Judgment.

18 **8.3** It is possible that other claims not known to the Parties, arising out of the facts
19 alleged in the Notice and Complaint, and relating to the Covered Product, will develop or be
20 discovered. ERC on behalf of itself only, and Beautiful Nutrition on behalf of itself only,
21 acknowledge that this Consent Judgment is expressly intended to cover and include all such
22 claims up through and including the Effective Date, including all rights of action therefore.
23 ERC and Beautiful Nutrition acknowledge that the claims released in Sections 8.1 and 8.2
24 above may include unknown claims, and nevertheless waive California Civil Code section
25 1542 as to any such unknown claims. California Civil Code section 1542 reads as follows:

26 A GENERAL RELEASE DOES NOT EXTEND TO CLAIMS WHICH THE
27 CREDITOR DOES NOT KNOW OR SUSPECT TO EXIST IN HIS OR HER
28 FAVOR AT THE TIME OF EXECUTING THE RELEASE, WHICH IF
 KNOWN BY HIM OR HER MUST HAVE MATERIALLY AFFECTED HIS
 OR HER SETTLEMENT WITH THE DEBTOR.

1 ERC on behalf of itself only, and Beautiful Nutrition on behalf of itself only, acknowledge and
2 understand the significance and consequences of this specific waiver of California Civil Code
3 section 1542.

4 **8.4** Compliance with the terms of this Consent Judgment shall be deemed to
5 constitute compliance with Proposition 65 by any releasee regarding alleged exposures to lead
6 in the Covered Product as set forth in the Notice and Complaint.

7 **8.5** Nothing in this Consent Judgment is intended to apply, nor shall it apply, to any
8 of Beautiful Nutrition's products other than the Covered Product.

9 **9. SEVERABILITY OF UNENFORCEABLE PROVISIONS**

10 In the event that any of the provisions of this Consent Judgment are held by a court to be
11 unenforceable, the validity of the remaining enforceable provisions shall not be adversely affected.

12 **10. GOVERNING LAW**

13 The terms and conditions of this Consent Judgment shall be governed by and construed in
14 accordance with the laws of the State of California. In the event that Proposition 65 is repealed, or
15 is rendered inapplicable to the Covered Product by a Court decision, then Beautiful Nutrition may
16 provide written notice to ERC of any asserted change in the law, and shall have no further
17 injunctive obligations pursuant to this Consent Judgment with respect to, and to the extent that, the
18 Covered Product is so affected.

19 **11. PROVISION OF NOTICE**

20 All notices required to be given to either Party to this Consent Judgment by the other shall
21 be in writing and sent to the following agents listed below via first-class mail. Courtesy copies via
22 email may also be sent.

14 **12. COURT APPROVAL**

15 **12.1** Upon execution of this Consent Judgment by the Parties, ERC shall notice a
16 Motion for Court Approval. The Parties shall use their best efforts to support entry of this
17 Consent Judgment.

18 **12.2** If the California Attorney General objects to any term in this Consent Judgment,
19 the Parties shall use their best efforts to resolve the concern in a timely manner, and if possible
20 prior to the hearing on the motion.

21 **12.3** If this Stipulated Consent Judgment is not approved by the Court, it shall be
22 void and have no force or effect.

23 **13. EXECUTION AND COUNTERPARTS**

24 This Consent Judgment may be executed in counterparts, which taken together shall be
25 deemed to constitute one document. A facsimile or .pdf signature shall be construed to be as valid
26 as the original signature.

1 **14. DRAFTING**

2 The terms of this Consent Judgment have been reviewed by the respective counsel for each
3 Party prior to its signing, and each Party has had an opportunity to fully discuss the terms and
4 conditions with legal counsel. The Parties agree that, in any subsequent interpretation and
5 construction of this Consent Judgment, no inference, assumption, or presumption shall be drawn,
6 and no provision of this Consent Judgment shall be construed against any Party, based on the fact
7 that one of the Parties and/or one of the Parties' legal counsel prepared and/or drafted all or any
8 portion of the Consent Judgment. It is conclusively presumed that all of the Parties participated
9 equally in the preparation and drafting of this Consent Judgment.

10 **15. GOOD FAITH ATTEMPT TO RESOLVE DISPUTES**

11 If a dispute arises with respect to either Party's compliance with the terms of this Consent
12 Judgment entered by the Court, the Parties shall meet and confer in person, by telephone, and/or in
13 writing and endeavor to resolve the dispute in an amicable manner. No action or motion may be
14 filed in the absence of such a good faith attempt to resolve the dispute beforehand.

15 **16. ENFORCEMENT**

16 ERC may, by motion or order to show cause before the Superior Court of Alameda
17 County, enforce the terms and conditions contained in this Consent Judgment. In any action
18 brought by ERC to enforce this Consent Judgment, ERC may seek whatever fines, costs,
19 penalties, or remedies as are provided by law for failure to comply with the Consent Judgment.
20 To the extent the failure to comply with the Consent Judgment constitutes a violation of
21 Proposition 65 or other laws, ERC shall not be limited to enforcement of this Consent Judgment,
22 but may seek in another action whatever fines, costs, penalties, or remedies as are provided by
23 law for failure to comply with Proposition 65 or other laws.

24 **17. ENTIRE AGREEMENT, AUTHORIZATION**

25 **17.1** This Consent Judgment contains the sole and entire agreement and
26 understanding of the Parties with respect to the entire subject matter herein, and any and all
27 prior discussions, negotiations, commitments, and understandings related hereto. No
28 representations, oral or otherwise, express or implied, other than those contained herein have

1 been made by any Party. No other agreements, oral or otherwise, unless specifically referred to
2 herein, shall be deemed to exist or to bind any Party.

3 17.2 Each signatory to this Consent Judgment certifies that he or she is fully
4 authorized by the Party he or she represents to stipulate to this Consent Judgment.

5 **18. REQUEST FOR FINDINGS, APPROVAL OF SETTLEMENT AND ENTRY OF**
6 **CONSENT JUDGMENT**

7 This Consent Judgment has come before the Court upon the request of the Parties. The
8 Parties request the Court to fully review this Consent Judgment and, being fully informed
9 regarding the matters which are the subject of this action, to:


10 (1) Find that the terms and provisions of this Consent Judgment represent a fair and



**NOTICE OF VIOLATION OF
CALIFORNIA HEALTH & SAFETY CODE SECTION 25249.5 ET SEQ.
(PROPOSITION 65)**

Dear Alleged Violator and the Appropriate Public Enforcement Agencies:

I represent Environmental Research Center, Inc. ("ERC"), 3111 Camino Del Rio North, Suite 400, San Diego, CA 92108; Tel. (619) 500-3090. ERC's Executive Director is Chris Heptinstall. ERC is a California non-profit corporation dedicated to, among other causes, helping safeguard the public from health hazards by bringing about a reduction in the use and misuse of hazardous and toxic chemicals, facilitating a safe environment for consumers and employees, and encouraging corporate responsibility.

ERC has identified violations of California's Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 ("Proposition 65"), which is codified at California Health & Safety Code §25249.5 *et seq.*, with respect to the product identified below. These violations have occurred and continue to occur because the alleged Violator identified below failed to provide required clear and reasonable warnings with this product. This letter serves as a notice of these violations to the alleged Violator and the appropriate public enforcement agencies. Pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 25249.7(d), ERC intends to file a private enforcement action in the public interest 60 days after effective service of this notice unless the public enforcement agencies have commenced and are diligently prosecuting an action to rectify these violations.

General Information about Proposition 65. A copy of a summary of Proposition 65, prepared by the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment, is enclosed with this letter served to the alleged Violator identified below.

Alleged Violator. The name of the company covered by this notice that violated Proposition 65 (hereinafter the "Violator") is:

Spartan Brands, Inc., individually and doing business as Beautiful Nutrition

Consumer Product and Listed Chemical. The product that is the subject of this notice and the chemical in that product identified as exceeding allowable levels are:

**Beautiful Nutrition LLC Beautritious Skin Firming Collagen Cocktail Line Reducing Drink Mix
- Lead**

On February 27, 1987, the State of California officially listed lead as a chemical known to cause developmental toxicity, and male and female reproductive toxicity. On October 1, 1992, the State of California officially listed lead and lead compounds as chemicals known to cause cancer.

It should be noted that ERC may continue to investigate other products that may reveal further violations and result in subsequent notices of violations.

Route of Exposure. The consumer exposures that are the subject of this notice result from the recommended use of this product. Consequently, the route of exposure to this chemical has been and continues to be through ingestion.


Exhibit A

Approximate Time Period of Violations. Ongoing violations have occurred every day since at least December 16, 2013, as well as every day since the product was introduced into the California marketplace, and will continue every day until clear and reasonable warnings are provided to product purchasers and users or until this known toxic chemical is either removed from or reduced to allowable levels in the product. Proposition 65 requires that a clear and reasonable warning be provided prior to exposure to the identified chemical. The method of warning should be a warning that appears on the product label. The Violator violated Proposition 65 because it failed to provide persons handling and/or using this product with appropriate warnings that they are being exposed to this chemical.

Consistent with the public interest goals of Proposition 65 and a desire to have these ongoing violations of California law quickly rectified, ERC is interested in seeking a constructive resolution of this matter that includes an enforceable written agreement by the Violator to: (1) reformulate the identified product so as to eliminate further exposures to the identified chemical, or provide appropriate warnings on the labels of this product; (2) pay an appropriate civil penalty; and (3) provide clear and reasonable warnings compliant with Proposition 65 to all persons located in California who purchased the above product in the last three years. Such a resolution will prevent further unwarned consumer exposures to the identified chemical, as well as an expensive and time consuming litigation.



(PROPOSITION 65): A SUMMARY

The following summary has been prepared by the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA), the lead agency for the implementation of the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 (commonly known as "Proposition 65"). A copy of this summary must be included as an attachment to any notice of violation served upon an alleged violator of the Act. The summary provides basic information about the provisions of the law, and is intended to serve only as a convenient source of general information. It is not intended to provide authoritative guidance on the meaning or application of the law. Please refer to the statute and OEHHA's implementing regulations (see citations below) for further information.

FOR INFORMATION CONCERNING THE BASIS FOR THE ALLEGATIONS IN THE NOTICE RELATED TO YOUR BUSINESS, CONTACT THE PERSON IDENTIFIED ON THE NOTICE.

The text of Proposition 65 (Health and Safety Code Sections 25249.5 through 25249.13) is available online at: <http://oehha.ca.gov/prop65/law/P65law72003.html>. Regulations that provide more specific guidance on compliance, and that specify procedures to be followed by the State in carrying out certain aspects of the law, are found in Title 27 of the California Code of Regulations, sections 25102 through 27001.¹ These implementing regulations are available online at: <http://oehha.ca.gov/prop65/law/P65Regs.html>.

WHAT DOES PROPOSITION 65 REQUIRE?

The "Proposition 65 List." Under Proposition 65, the lead agency (OEHHA) publishes a list of chemicals that are known to the State of California to cause cancer and/or reproductive toxicity. Chemicals are placed on the Proposition 65 list if they are known to cause cancer and/or birth defects or other reproductive harm, such as damage to female or male reproductive systems or to the developing fetus. This list must be updated at least once a year. The current Proposition 65 list of chemicals is available on the OEHHA website at: http://www.oehha.ca.gov/prop65/prop65_list/Newlist.html.

Only those chemicals that are on the list are regulated under Proposition 65. Businesses that produce, use, release or otherwise engage in activities involving listed chemicals must comply with the following:

Clear and reasonable warnings. A business is required to warn a person before "knowingly and intentionally" exposing that person to a listed chemical unless an exemption applies. The warning given must be "clear and

reasonable.” This means that the warning must: (1) clearly say that the chemical involved is known to cause cancer, or birth defects or other reproductive harm; and (2) be given in such a way that it will effectively reach the person before he or she is exposed to that chemical. Some exposures are exempt from the warning requirement under certain circumstances discussed below.

Prohibition from discharges into drinking water. A business must not knowingly discharge or release a listed chemical into water or onto land where it passes or probably will pass into a source of drinking water. Some discharges are exempt from this requirement under certain circumstances discussed below.

DOES PROPOSITION 65 PROVIDE ANY EXEMPTIONS?

Yes. You should consult the current version of the statute and regulations

(<http://www.oehha.ca.gov/prop65/law/index.html>) to determine all applicable exemptions, the most common of which are the following:

Grace Periods. Proposition 65 warning requirements do not apply until 12 months after the chemical has been listed. The Proposition 65 discharge prohibition does not apply to a discharge or release of a chemical that takes place less than 20 months after the listing of the chemical.

Governmental agencies and public water utilities. All agencies of the federal, state or local government, as well as entities operating public water systems, are exempt.

Businesses with nine or fewer employees. Neither the warning requirement nor the discharge prohibition applies to a business that employs a total of nine or fewer employees. This includes all employees, not just those present in California.

Exposures that pose no significant risk of cancer. For chemicals that are listed under Proposition 65 as known to the State to cause cancer, a warning is not required if the business causing the exposure can demonstrate that the exposure occurs at a level that poses “no significant risk.” This means that the exposure is calculated to result in not more than one excess case of cancer in 100,000 individuals exposed over a 70-year lifetime. The Proposition 65 regulations identify specific “No Significant Risk Levels” (NSRLs) for many listed carcinogens. Exposures below these levels are exempt from the warning requirement. See OEHHA's website at:

<http://www.oehha.ca.gov/prop65/getNSRLs.html> for a list of NSRLs, and Section 25701 *et seq.* of the regulations for information concerning how these levels are calculated.

Exposures that will produce no observable reproductive effect at 1,000 times the level in question. For chemicals known to the State to cause reproductive toxicity, a warning is not required if the business causing the exposure can demonstrate that the exposure will produce no observable effect, even at 1,000 times the level in question. In other words, the level of exposure must be below the “no observable effect level” divided by 1,000. This number is known as the Maximum Allowable Dose Level (MADL). See OEHHA's website at:

<http://www.oehha.ca.gov/prop65/getNSRLs.html> for a list of MADLs, and Section 25801 *et seq.* of the regulations for information concerning how these levels are calculated.

Exposures to Naturally Occurring Chemicals in Food. Certain exposures to chemicals that naturally occur in foods (i.e., that do not result from any known human activity, including activity by someone other than the person causing the exposure) are exempt from the warning requirements of the law. If the chemical is a contaminant² it must be reduced to the lowest level feasible. Regulations explaining this exemption can be found in Section 25501.

Discharges that do not result in a "significant amount" of the listed chemical entering any source of drinking water. The prohibition from discharges into drinking water does not apply if the discharger is able to demonstrate that a "significant amount" of the listed chemical has not, does not, or will not pass into or probably pass into a source of drinking water, and that the discharge complies with all other applicable laws, regulations, permits, requirements, or orders. A "significant amount" means any detectable amount, except an amount that would meet the "no significant risk" level for chemicals that cause cancer or that is 1,000 times below the "no observable effect" level for chemicals that cause reproductive toxicity, if an individual were exposed to that amount in drinking water.

HOW IS PROPOSITION 65 ENFORCED?

Enforcement is carried out through civil lawsuits. These lawsuits may be brought by the Attorney General, any district attorney, or certain city attorneys. Lawsuits may also be brought by private parties acting in the public interest, but only after providing notice of the alleged violation to the Attorney General, the appropriate district attorney and city attorney, and the business accused of the violation. The notice must provide adequate information to allow the recipient to assess the nature of the alleged violation. The notice must comply with the information and procedural requirements specified in Section 25903 of Title 27 and sections 3100-3103 of Title 11. A private party may not pursue an independent enforcement action under Proposition 65 if one of the governmental officials noted above initiates an enforcement action within sixty days of the notice.

A business found to be in violation of Proposition 65 is subject to civil penalties of up to \$2,500 per day for each violation. In addition, the business may be ordered by a court to stop committing the violation.

A private party may not file an enforcement action based on certain exposures if the alleged violator meets specific conditions. For the following types of exposures, the Act provides an opportunity for the business to correct the alleged violation:

- An exposure to alcoholic beverages that are consumed on the alleged violator's premises to the extent onsite consumption is permitted by law;
- An exposure to a Proposition 65 listed chemical in a food or beverage prepared and sold on the alleged violator's premises that is primarily intended for immediate consumption on- or off- premises. This only applies if the chemical was not intentionally added to the food, and was formed by cooking or similar preparation of food or beverage components necessary to render the food or beverage palatable or to avoid microbiological contamination;

- An exposure to environmental tobacco smoke caused by entry of persons (other than employees) on premises owned or operated by the alleged violator where smoking is permitted at any location on the premises;
- An exposure to listed chemicals in engine exhaust, to the extent the exposure occurs inside a facility owned or operated by the alleged violator and primarily intended for parking non-commercial vehicles.

If a private party alleges that a violation occurred based on one of the exposures described above, the private party must first provide the alleged violator a notice of special compliance procedure and proof of compliance form.

A private party may not file an action against the alleged violator for these exposures, or recover in a settlement any payment in lieu of penalties any reimbursement for costs and attorney's fees, if the notice was served on or after October 5, 2013, and the alleged violator has done *all* of the following within 14 days of being served notice:

- Corrected the alleged violation;
- Agreed to pay a civil penalty of \$5B500 (subject to change as noted below) to the private party within 30 days; and
- Notified the private party serving the notice in writing that the violation has been corrected.

The written notification to the private-party must include a notice of special compliance procedure and proof of compliance form completed by the alleged violator as directed in the notice. On April 1, 2019, and every five years thereafter, the dollar amount of the civil penalty will be adjusted by the Judicial Council based on the change in the annual California Consumer Price Index. The Judicial Council will publish the dollar amount of the adjusted civil penalty at each five-year interval, together with the date of the next scheduled adjustment.

An alleged violator may satisfy these conditions only one time for a violation arising from the same exposure in the same facility or on the same premises. The satisfaction of these conditions does not prevent the Attorney General, a district attorney, a city attorney of a city of greater than 750,000 population, or any full-time city prosecutor with the consent of the district attorney, from filing an enforcement action against an alleged violator. The amount of any civil penalty for a violation shall be reduced to reflect any payment made by the alleged violator for the same alleged violation to a private-party.

Chemicals known to the State to cause cancer or reproductive toxicity in engine exhaust, to the extent the exposure occurs inside a facility owned or operated by the alleged violator and primarily intended for parking noncommercial vehicles.
