NOTICE OF VIOLATION

California Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act

Lead and Arsenic Exposures Resulting From Operations at 720 South Seventh Avenue, City of Industry, California 91746

This Notice of Violation is provided to you pursuant to and in compliance with California Health and Safety Code Section 25249.7(d).

- This Notice of Violation is provided by the Center for Environmental Health ("CEH"), 2201 Broadway, Suite 302, Oakland, CA 94612, (510) 655-3900 and Clean Air Coalition of North Whittier & Avocado Heights ("Clean Air Coalition"), 13022 Via Del Sol Avenue, Whittier CA 90601-1434, (562) 665-5669. CEH is a nonprofit corporation dedicated to protecting the environment, improving human health and supporting environmentally sound practices. Charlie Pizarro is the Associate Director of and a responsible individual within CEH. Clean Air Coalition is a community organization committed to defending the environment and quality of life in the North Whittier and Avocado Heights community. Rebecca Overmyer-Velázquez is the Coordinator of the Clean Air Coalition and a responsible individual within the organization.

Description of Violation:

• <u>Time Period of Exposure</u>: The violations have been occurring since at least November 20, 2015 and are continuing up through the present. There is a substantial threat of ongoing and future violations unless and until the alleged

violators abate the threat of additional lead and arsenic exposures from past, ongoing and future operations.

- <u>Provision of Proposition 65</u>: This Notice of Violation covers the "warning provision" of Proposition 65, which is found at California Health and Safety Code Section 25249.6.
- <u>Chemicals Involved</u>: The names of the listed chemicals involved in these violations are lead and lead compounds (collectively, "Lead") and arsenic (inorganic oxides and inorganic arsenic compounds) (collectively, "Arsenic"). Lead and Arsenic are chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects and other reproductive harm.
- <u>Location of the Exposures</u>: The specific location of the source of the exposures is the alleged violators' lead-acid battery recycling operation at 720 South Seventh Avenue, City of Industry, California 91746 (the "Facility"). The exposures to Lead and Arsenic caused by the Facility's operations occur at residential properties within a 0.25 mile radius of the Facility.
- Description of Exposure: This Notice addresses environmental exposures to Lead and Arsenic. These exposures are caused by the Facility's lead-acid batteries recycling operations. The Facility's operations emit significant quantities of Lead and Arsenic into the air, which has contaminated the soil of residential properties in the neighborhood surrounding the Facility. Individuals living in the neighborhood surrounding the Facility are exposed to Lead and Arsenic in the soil at their residences. The primary routes of exposure for the violations are direct ingestion when individuals (including children) ingest the soil contaminated with Lead and Arsenic; ingestion via hand to mouth contact after individuals touch or handle the soil contaminated with Lead and Arsenic; and inhalation when individuals breathe the Lead and Arsenic emitted from the Facility. No clear and reasonable warning is provided to residents in the neighborhood surrounding the Facility regarding the health hazards associated with Lead and Arsenic.

Resolution of Noticed Claims:

Based on the allegations set forth in this Notice, CEH and the Clean Air Coalition intend to bring a citizen enforcement lawsuit against the alleged violators unless such violators agree in a binding written instrument to: (1) provide clear and reasonable warnings; (2) immediately abate the threat of additional Lead and Arsenic exposures; and (3) pay an appropriate civil penalty based on the factors enumerated in California Health and Safety Code Section 25249.7(b). If the alleged violators are interested in resolving this dispute without resort to expensive and time-consuming litigation, please feel free to contact CEH and the Clean Air Coalition through its counsel identified below. It should be noted that CEH and the Clean Air Coalition cannot: (1) finalize any settlement until after the 60-day notice period has expired; nor (2) speak for the Attorney General or any District or City Attorney who received the 60-day Notice. Therefore, while reaching an agreement with CEH and the Clean Air Coalition will resolve their claims, such agreement may not satisfy the public prosecutors.

Preservation of Relevant Evidence:

This Notice also serves as a demand that the alleged violators preserve and maintain all relevant evidence, including all electronic documents and data, pending resolution of this matter. Such relevant evidence includes but is not limited to all documents relating to Lead and Arsenic releases from the alleged violators' operations, actual or potential exposures to Lead and Arsenic from the alleged violators' operations, efforts to comply with Proposition 65, and communications with any person relating to actual or potential exposures to Lead and Arsenic from the alleged violators' operations since November 20, 2015 through the date of any trial of the claims alleged in this Notice.

CERTIFICATE OF MERIT Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(d)

- I, Mark N. Todzo, hereby declare:
- 1. This Certificate of Merit accompanies the attached sixty-day notice in which it is alleged that the parties identified in the notice has violated Health & Safety Code § 25249.6 by failing to provide clear and reasonable warnings.
- 2. I am an attorney with the Lexington Law Group, and I represent the noticing parties, the Center for Environmental Health and the Clean Air Coalition of North Whittier & Avocado Heights.
- 3. Members of my firm and I have consulted with one or more persons with relevant and appropriate experience or expertise who has reviewed facts, studies or other data regarding the exposures to the listed chemical that is the subject of the action.
- 4. Based on the information obtained through those consultations, and on other information in my possession, I believe there is a reasonable and meritorious case for the private action. I understand that "reasonable and meritorious case for the private action" means that the information provides a credible basis that all elements of the plaintiff's case can be established and the information did not prove that the alleged violators will be able to establish any of the affirmative defenses set forth in the statute.
- 5. The copy of the Certificate of Merit served on the Attorney General attaches to it factual information sufficient to establish the basis for this certificate, including the information identified in Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(h)(2), i.e. (1) the identity of the persons consulted with and relied on by the certifier, and (2) the facts, studies or other data reviewed by those persons.
