1. DEFINITIONS

- 1.1 “Accessible Component” means a component of a Covered Product that could be touched by a person during normal or reasonably foreseeable use.
- 1.2 “Covered Products” means wallets, handbags, purses, clutches and belts that are Manufactured, distributed, sold or offered for sale by Settling Defendant.
- 1.3 “Effective Date” means the date on which this Consent Judgment is entered by the Court.

1 1.4 “Lead Limits” means the maximum concentrations of lead and lead
2 compounds (“Lead”) by weight specified in Section 3.2.

3 1.5 “Manufactured” and “Manufactures” have the meaning defined in Section
4 3(a)(10) of the Consumer Product Safety Act (“CPSA”) [15 U.S.C. § 2052(a)(10)],¹ as amended
5 from time to time.

6 1.6 “Paint or other Surface Coatings” has the meaning defined in 16 C.F.R.
7 § 1303.2(b)², as amended from time to time.

8 1.7 “Vendor” means a person or entity that Manufactures, imports, distributes, or
9 supplies a Covered Product to Settling Defendant.

10 **2. INTRODUCTION**

11 2.1 The parties to this Consent Judgment (“Parties”) are the Center for
12 Environmental Health (“CEH”) and defendant Robert Talbott, Inc. (“Settling Defendant”).

13 2.2 On or about October 14, 2009 and January 25, 2012, CEH served 60-Day
14 Notices of Violation under Proposition 65 (The Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act
15 of 1986, California Health & Safety Code §§ 25249.5, *et seq.*), alleging that Settling Defendant
16 violated Proposition 65 by exposing persons to Lead contained in wallets, handbags, purses,
17 clutches and belts without first providing a clear and reasonable Proposition 65 warning.

18 2.3 Settling Defendant manufactures, distributes or sells Covered Products that are
19 offered for retail sale in the State of California or has done so in the past.

20 2.4 On June 24, 2009, CEH filed the action entitled *CEH v. LuLu NYC LLC, et al.*,
21 Case No. RG 09-459448, in the Superior Court of California for Alameda County, alleging
22 Proposition 65 violations as to wallets, handbags, purses and clutches. Since then, CEH has filed

25 produce, or assemble.

26 ² As of May 1, 2011, “Paint or other Surface Coatings” means a fluid, semi-fluid, or other
27 material, with or without a suspension of finely divided coloring matter, which changes to a solid
28 film when a thin layer is applied to a metal, wood, stone, paper, leather, cloth, plastic, or other
surface. This term does not include printing inks or those materials which actually become a part
of the substrate, such as the pigment in a plastic article, or those materials which are actually
bonded to the substrate, such as by electroplating or ceramic glazing.

1 several actions alleging Proposition 65 violations as to Lead in similar products that have been
2 consolidated for pre-trial purposes under Lead Case No. RG 09-459448.

3 2.5 For purposes of this Consent Judgment only, the Parties stipulate that this
4 Court has jurisdiction over the allegations of violations contained in the operative Complaint
5 applicable to Settling Defendant (the “Complaint”) and personal jurisdiction over Settling
6 Defendant as to the acts alleged in the Complaint, that venue is proper in the County of Alameda,
7 and that this Court has jurisdiction to enter this Consent Judgment.

8 2.6 Nothing in this Consent Judgment is or shall be construed as an admission by
9 the Parties of any fact, conclusion of law, issue of law or violation of law, nor shall compliance
10 with the Consent Judgment constitute or be construed as an admission by the Parties of any fact,
11 conclusion of law, issue of law, or violation of law. Nothing in this Consent Judgment shall
12 prejudice, waive or impair any right, remedy, argument or defense the Parties may have in any
13 other legal proceeding. This Consent Judgment is the product of negotiation and compromise and
14 is accepted by the Parties for purposes of settling, compromising and resolving issues disputed in
15 this action.

16 **3. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF**

17 3.1 **Specification Compliance Date.** To the extent it has not already done so, no
18 more than 30 days after the Effective Date, Settling Defendant shall provide the Lead Limits to its
19 Vendors of Covered Products and shall instruct each Vendor to use reasonable efforts to provide
20 Covered Products that comply with the Lead Limits on a nationwide basis.

21 3.2 **Lead Limits.**

22 As of the Effective Date, Settling Defendant shall not purchase, import,
23 Manufacture, supply to an unaffiliated third party, sell or offer for sale any Covered Product that
24 will be sold or offered for sale to California consumers that exceeds the following Lead Limits:

25 3.2.1 Paint or other Surface Coatings on Accessible Components: 90 parts per
26 million (“ppm”).

27 3.2.2 Polyvinyl chloride (“PVC”) Accessible Components: 200 ppm.

28 3.2.3 All other Accessible Components (including but not limited to leather and

1 non-PVC imitation leather) other than cubic zirconia (sometimes called cubic zirconium, CZ),
2 crystal, glass or rhinestones: 300 ppm.

3 **3.3 Final Retail Compliance Date.** When one of Settling Defendant’s direct
4 customers sells or offers for sale to a California consumer a Covered Product after December 1,
5 2012 that does not meet the Lead Limits, Settling Defendant is deemed to “sell or offer for sale in
6 California” that Covered Product in violation of this Consent Judgment.

7 **3.4 Action Regarding Specific Products.**

8 3.4.1 On or before the Effective Date, Settling Defendant shall cease selling the
9 following specific products in California: (i) Audrey Talbott Handbag, SKU No.
10 883640204843 and (ii) Robert Talbott Braided Belt in Yellow, SKU No. 883640050341,
11 Style No. V962 (collectively, the “Recall Products”). On or before the Effective Date,
12 Settling Defendant shall also: (i) cease shipping the Recall Products to any of its
13 customers that resell the Recall Products in California, and (ii) send instructions to its
14 customers that resell the Recall Products in California instructing them to cease offering
15 such Recall Products for sale in California.

16 3.4.2 If Settling Defendant has not complied with Section 3.4.1 prior to
17 executing this Consent Judgment, it shall instruct its California stores and/or customers
18 that resell the Recall Products either to (i) return the Recall Products to the Settling
19 Defendant for destruction; or (ii) directly destroy the Recall Products.

20 3.4.3 Any destruction of Recall Products shall be in compliance with all
21 applicable laws.

22 3.4.4 Within sixty days of the Effective Date, Settling Defendant shall provide
23 CEH with written certification from Settling Defendant confirming compliance with the
24 requirements of this Section 3.4.

25 **4. ENFORCEMENT**

26 4.1 Any Party may, after meeting and conferring, by motion or application for an
27 order to show cause before this Court, enforce the terms and conditions contained in this Consent
28

1 Judgment. Enforcement of the terms and conditions of Sections 3.2 and 3.3 of this Consent
2 Judgment shall be brought exclusively pursuant to Sections 4.3 through 4.4.

3 4.2 Within 30 days after the Effective Date, Settling Defendant shall notify CEH
4 of a means sufficient to allow CEH to identify Covered Products supplied or offered by Settling
5 Defendant on or after that date, for example, a unique brand name or characteristic system of
6 product numbering or labeling. Upon written request by CEH, but no more than once in any
7 calendar year, Settling Defendants shall, within 30 days of receiving a request from CEH, update
8 the information provided to CEH pursuant to this Section 4.2 by notifying CEH of a means
9 sufficient to allow CEH to identify Covered Products currently supplied or offered by that
10 Settling Defendant. If CEH is unable to determine whether a particular product is a Covered
11 Product as to a Settling Defendant based on the information provided to CEH pursuant to this
12 Section 4.2, Settling Defendants shall cooperate in good faith with CEH in determining whether
13 the product at issue is a Covered Product and, if so, the identity of the Settling Defendant
14 responsible for selling the product. Information provided to CEH pursuant to this Section 4.2,
15 including but not limited to the identities of parties to contracts between Settling Defendant and
16 third parties, may be designated by Settling Defendant as competitively sensitive confidential
17 business information, and if so designated shall not be disclosed to any person without the written
18 permission of Settling Defendant. Any motions or pleadings or any other court filings that may
19 reveal information designated as competitively sensitive confidential business information
20 pursuant to this Section shall be submitted in accordance with California Rules of Court 8.46 and
21 2.550, *et seq.*

22 4.3 **Notice of Violation.** CEH may seek to enforce the requirements of Sections
23 3.2 or 3.3 by issuing a Notice of Violation pursuant to this Section 4.3.

24 4.3.1 **Service of Notice.** CEH shall serve the Notice of Violation on Settling
25 Defendant within 45 days of the date the alleged violation(s) was or were observed,
26 provided, however, that CEH may have up to an additional 45 days to provide Settling
27 Defendant with the test data required by Section 4.3.2(d) below if it has not yet obtained it
28 from its laboratory.

1 4.3.2 **Supporting Documentation.** The Notice of Violation shall, at a minimum,
2 set forth for each Covered Product: (a) the date(s) the alleged violation(s) was observed,
3 (b) the location at which the Covered Product was offered for sale, (c) a description of the
4 Covered Product giving rise to the alleged violation, and of each Accessible Component
5 that is alleged not to comply with the Lead Limits and/or each Accessible Component that
6 is alleged to contain Lead in excess of 300 ppm, including a picture of the Covered
7 Product and all identifying information on tags and labels, and (d) all test data obtained by
8 CEH regarding the Covered Product and related supporting documentation, including all
9 laboratory reports, quality assurance reports and quality control reports associated with
10 testing of the Covered Products. Such Notice of Violation shall be based at least in part
11 upon total acid digest testing performed by an independent accredited laboratory. Wipe,
12 swipe, x-ray fluorescence, and swab testing are not by themselves sufficient to support a
13 Notice of Violation, although any such testing may be used as additional support for a
14 Notice. The Parties agree that the sample Notice of Violation attached hereto as Exhibit A
15 is sufficient in form to satisfy the requirements of subsections (c) and (d) of this Section
16 4.3.2.

17 4.3.3 **Additional Documentation.** CEH shall promptly make available for
18 inspection and/or copying upon request by and at the expense of Settling Defendant, all
19 supporting documentation related to the testing of the Covered Products and associated
20 quality control samples, including chain of custody records, all laboratory logbook entries
21 for laboratory receiving, sample preparation, and instrumental analysis, and all printouts
22 from all analytical instruments relating to the testing of Covered Product samples and any
23 and all calibration, quality assurance, and quality control tests performed or relied upon in
24 conjunction with the testing of the Covered Products, obtained by or available to CEH that
25 pertains to the Covered Product's alleged noncompliance with Section 3 and, if available,
26 any exemplars of Covered Products tested.

27 4.3.4 **Multiple Notices.** If Settling Defendant has received more than four
28 Notices of Violation in any 12-month period, at CEH's option, CEH may seek whatever

1 fines, costs, penalties, or remedies are provided by law for failure to comply with the
2 Consent Judgment. For purposes of determining the number of Notices of Violation
3 pursuant to this Section 4.3.4, the following shall be excluded:

4 (a) Multiple notices identifying Covered Products Manufactured for or
5 sold to Settling Defendant from the same Vendor; and

6 (b) A Notice of Violation that meets one or more of the conditions of
7 Section 4.4.3(b).

8 4.4 **Notice of Election.** Within 30 days of receiving a Notice of Violation
9 pursuant to Section 4.3, including the test data required pursuant to 4.3.2(d), Settling Defendant
10 shall provide written notice to CEH stating whether it elects to contest the allegations contained in
11 the Notice of Violation (“Notice of Election”). Failure to provide a Notice of Election shall be
12 deemed an election to contest the Notice of Violation.

13 4.4.1 **Contested Notices.** If the Notice of Violation is contested, the Notice of
14 Election shall include all then-available documentary evidence regarding the alleged
15 violation, including any test data. Within 30 days the parties shall meet and confer to
16 attempt to resolve their dispute. Should such attempts at meeting and conferring fail,
17 CEH may file an enforcement motion or application pursuant to Section 4.1. If Settling
18 Defendant withdraws its Notice of Election to contest the Notice of Violation before any
19 motion concerning the violations alleged in the Notice of Violation is filed pursuant to
20 Section 4.1, Settling Defendant shall make a contribution to the Proposition 65 Fashion
21 Accessory Testing Fund in the amount of \$12,500 and shall comply with all of the non-
22 monetary provisions of Section 4.4.2. If, at any time prior to reaching an agreement or
23 obtaining a decision from the Court, CEH or Settling Defendant acquires additional test or
24 other data regarding the alleged violation, it shall promptly provide all such data or
25 information to the other Party.

26 4.4.2 **Non-Contested Notices.** If the Notice of Violation is not contested,
27 Settling Defendant shall include in its Notice of Election a detailed description of
28 corrective action that it has undertaken or proposes to undertake to address the alleged

1 violation. Any such correction shall, at a minimum, provide reasonable assurance that the
2 Covered Product will no longer be offered by Settling Defendant or its customers for sale
3 in California. If there is a dispute over the sufficiency of the proposed corrective action or
4 its implementation, CEH shall promptly notify Settling Defendant and the Parties shall
5 meet and confer before seeking the intervention of the Court to resolve the dispute. In
6 addition to the corrective action, Settling Defendant shall make a contribution to the
7 Fashion Accessory Testing Fund in the amount of \$10,000, unless one of the provisions of
8 Section 4.4.3 applies.

9 **4.4.3 Limitations in Non-Contested Matters.**

10 (a) If it elects not to contest a Notice of Violation before any motion
11 concerning the violation(s) at issue has been filed, the monetary liability of Settling
12 Defendant shall be limited to the contributions required by this Section 4.4.3, if any.

13 (b) The contribution to the Fashion Accessory Testing Fund shall be:

14 (i) One thousand seven hundred fifty dollars (\$1750) if Settling
15 Defendant, prior to receiving and accepting for distribution or sale the
16 Covered Product identified in the Notice of Violation, obtained test results
17 demonstrating that all of the Accessible Components in the Covered
18 Product identified in the Notice of Violation complied with the applicable
19 Lead Limits, and further provided that such test results meet the same
20 quality criteria to support a Notice of Violation as set forth in Section 4.3.2
21 and that the testing was performed within two years prior to the date of the
22 sales transaction on which the Notice of Violation is based. Settling
23 Defendant shall provide copies of such test results and supporting
24 documentation to CEH with its Notice of Election; or

25 (ii) One thousand five hundred dollars (\$1500) if Settling
26 Defendant is in violation of Section 3.3, provided however, that no
27 contribution is required or payable if Settling Defendant has already been
28 required to pay a total of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) pursuant to this

1 subsection. This subsection shall apply only to Covered Products that
2 Settling Defendant demonstrates were shipped prior to the applicable
3 Shipping Compliance Date specified in Section 3.2; or

4 (iii) Not required or payable, if the Notice of Violation identifies
5 the same Covered Product or Covered Products, differing only in size or
6 color, that have been the subject of another Notice of Violation within the
7 preceding 12 months.

8 **5. PAYMENTS**

9 **5.1 Payments by Settling Defendant.** On or before March 19, 2012, Settling
10 Defendant shall pay the sum of \$17,500 by check payable to the attorney-client trust account of
11 counsel for Settling Defendant. The funds paid by Settling Defendant shall be held in trust
12 pending the Court's approval of this Consent Judgment. Within five (5) days of entry of this
13 Consent Judgment, counsel for Settling Defendant who is holding such settlement funds in trust
14 shall pay the sum of \$17,500 to CEH. Within thirty (30) days of entry of this Consent Judgment,
15 Settling Defendant shall pay the sum of \$17,500, for a total sum of \$35,000 as a settlement
16 payment. The \$17,500 payment due within 5 days of entry of this Consent Judgment shall be
17 paid in three separate checks as follows: (a) \$2,300 made payable to the Center for Environmental
18 Health; (b) \$3,450 made payable to the Center for Environmental Health; and (c) \$11,750 made
19 payable to the Lexington Law Group. The \$17,500 payment due within 30 days of entry of this
20 Consent Judgment shall be paid in three separate checks as follows: (a) \$2,300 made payable to
21 the Center for Environmental Health; (b) \$3,450 made payable to the Center for Environmental
22 Health; and (c) \$11,750 made payable to the Lexington Law Group. Any failure by Settling
23 Defendant to comply with the payment terms herein shall be subject to a stipulated late fee in the
24 amount of \$100 for each day after the delivery date the payment is received. The late fees
25 required under this Section shall be recoverable, together with reasonable attorneys' fees, in an
26 enforcement proceeding brought pursuant to Section 4.1 of this Consent Judgment. All of the
27 settlement payments shall be delivered to the offices of the Lexington Law Group (Attn: Eric
28 Somers), 503 Divisadero Street, San Francisco, California 94117-2212, and allocated as set forth

1 below between the following categories:

2 5.1.1 Settling Defendant shall pay the sum of \$4,600 as a civil penalty pursuant
3 to Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(b), such money to be apportioned by CEH in accordance with
4 Health & Safety Code § 25249.12 (25% to CEH and 75% to the State of California’s Office of
5 Environmental Health Hazard Assessment).

6 5.1.2 Settling Defendant shall also pay the sum of \$6,900 as a payment in lieu of
7 civil penalty to CEH pursuant to Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(b), and California Code of
8 Regulations, Title 11, § 3203(b). CEH will use such funds to continue its work educating and
9 protecting people from exposures to toxic chemicals, including heavy metals. In addition, as part
10 of its Community Environmental Action and Justice Fund, CEH will use four percent of such
11 funds to award grants to grassroots environmental justice groups working to educate and protect
12 people from exposures to toxic chemicals. The method of selection of such groups can be found
13 at the CEH web site at www.ceh.org/justicefund.

14 5.1.3 Settling Defendant shall also separately pay to the Lexington Law Group
15 the sum of \$23,500 as reimbursement of a portion of CEH’s reasonable attorneys’ fees and costs.

16 **6. MODIFICATION**

17 6.1 **Written Consent.** This Consent Judgment may be modified from time to
18 time by express written agreement of the Parties with the approval of the Court, or by an order of
19 this Court upon motion and in accordance with law.

20 6.2 **Meet and Confer.** Any Party seeking to modify this Consent Judgment shall
21 attempt in good faith to meet and confer with all affected Parties prior to filing a motion to
22 modify the Consent Judgment.

23 **7. CLAIMS COVERED AND RELEASED**

24 7.1 This Consent Judgment is a full, final and binding resolution between CEH on
25 behalf of itself and the public interest and Settling Defendant, and its parents, subsidiaries,
26 affiliated entities that are under common ownership or common control, directors, officers,
27 employees, and attorneys (“Defendant Releasees”), and each entity to whom they directly or
28 indirectly distribute or sell Covered Products, including but not limited to distributors,

1 wholesalers, customers, retailers, franchisees, cooperative members, licensors, and licensees
2 (“Downstream Defendant Releasees”) of any violation of Proposition 65 that was or could have
3 been asserted in the Complaint against Settling Defendant, Defendant Releasees, and
4 Downstream Defendant Releasees, based on failure to warn about alleged exposure to Lead
5 contained in Covered Products that were sold by Settling Defendant prior to the Effective Date.

6 7.2 Compliance with the terms of this Consent Judgment by Settling Defendant
7 constitutes compliance with Proposition 65 with respect to Lead in Settling Defendant’s Covered
8 Products.

9 7.3 Nothing in this Section 7 affects CEH’s right to commence or prosecute an
10 action under Proposition 65 against any person other than a Settling Defendant, Defendant
11 Releasee, or Downstream Defendant Releasee.

12 7.4 Nothing in Section 7 affects CEH’s right to commence or prosecute an action
13 under Proposition 65 against a Downstream Defendant Releasee that: (a) is not a direct customer
14 of Settling Defendant under Section 3.3; and (b) sells or offers for sale a Covered Product to
15 California consumers that does not comply with the Lead Limits after the applicable Final Retail
16 Compliance Date set forth in Section 3.3.

17 **8. NOTICE**

18 8.1 When CEH is entitled to receive any notice under this Consent Judgment, the
19 notice shall be sent by first class and electronic mail to:

25 8.2 When Settling Defendant is entitled to receive any notice under this Consent
26 Judgment, the notice shall be sent by first class and electronic mail to:

1 8.3 Any Party may modify the person and address to whom the notice is to be sent
2 by sending each other Party notice by first class and electronic mail.

3 **9. COURT APPROVAL**

4 9.1 This Consent Judgment shall become effective upon entry by the Court. CEH
5 shall prepare and file a Motion for Approval of this Consent Judgment and Settling Defendant
6 shall support entry of this Consent Judgment.

7 9.2 If this Consent Judgment is not entered by the Court, it shall be of no force or
8 effect and shall never be introduced into evidence or otherwise used in any proceeding for any
9 purpose other than to allow the Court to determine if there was a material breach of Section 9.1.

10 **10. ATTORNEYS' FEES**

11 10.1 Should CEH prevail on any motion, application for an order to show cause or
12 other proceeding to enforce a violation of this Consent Judgment, CEH shall be entitled to its
13 reasonable attorneys' fees and costs incurred as a result of such motion or application. Should
14 Settling Defendant prevail on any motion application for an order to show cause or other
15 proceeding, Settling Defendant may be awarded its reasonable attorneys' fees and costs as a result
16 of such motion or application upon a finding by the Court that CEH's prosecution of the motion
17 or application lacked substantial justification. For purposes of this Consent Judgment, the term
18 substantial justification shall carry the same meaning as used in the Civil Discovery Act of 1986,
19 Code of Civil Procedure §§ 2016, *et seq.*

20 10.2 Except as otherwise provided in this Consent Judgment, each Party shall bear
21 its own attorneys' fees and costs.

22 10.3 Nothing in this Section 10 shall preclude a Party from seeking an award of
23 sanctions pursuant to law.

24 **11. TERMINATION**

25 11.1 This Consent Judgment shall be terminable by CEH or by Settling Defendant
26 at any time after September 1, 2017, upon the provision of 30 days advanced written notice; such
27 termination shall be effective upon the subsequent filing of a notice of termination with Superior
28 Court of Alameda County.

1 11.2 Should this Consent Judgment be terminated pursuant to this Section, it shall
2 be of no further force or effect as to the terminated parties; provided, however that if CEH is the
3 terminating Party, the provisions of Sections 5, 7, and 12.1 shall survive any termination and
4 provided further that if Settling Defendant is the terminating Party, the provisions of Sections 5,
5 7.1 and 12.1 shall survive any termination.

6 **12. OTHER TERMS**

7 12.1 The terms of this Consent Judgment shall be governed by the laws of the State
8 of California.

9 12.2 This Consent Judgment shall apply to and be binding upon CEH and Settling
10 Defendant, and its respective divisions, subdivisions, and subsidiaries, and the successors or
11 assigns of any of them.

12 12.3 This Consent Judgment contains the sole and entire agreement and
13 understanding of the Parties with respect to the entire subject matter hereof, and any and all prior
14 discussions, negotiations, commitments, or understandings related thereto, if any, are hereby
15 merged herein and therein. There are no warranties, representations, or other agreements between
16 the Parties except as expressly set forth herein. No representations, oral or otherwise, express or
17 implied, other than those specifically referred to in this Consent Judgment have been made by any
18 Party hereto. No other agreements not specifically contained or referenced herein, oral or
19 otherwise, shall be deemed to exist or to bind any of the Parties hereto. No supplementation,
20 modification, waiver, or termination of this Consent Judgment shall be binding unless executed in
21 writing by the Party to be bound thereby. No waiver of any of the provisions of this Consent
22 Judgment shall be deemed or shall constitute a waiver of any of the other provisions hereof
23 whether or not similar, nor shall such waiver constitute a continuing waiver.

24 12.4 Nothing in this Consent Judgment shall release, or in any way affect any rights
25 that any Settling Defendant might have against any other party, whether or not that party is a
26 Settling Defendant.

27 12.5 This Court shall retain jurisdiction of this matter to implement or modify the
28 Consent Judgment.

1 12.6 The stipulations to this Consent Judgment may be executed in counterparts
2 and by means of facsimile or portable document format (pdf), which taken together shall be
3 deemed to constitute one document.

4 12.7 Each signatory to this Consent Judgment certifies that he or she is fully
5 authorized by the Party he or she represents to stipulate to this Consent Judgment and to enter into
6 and execute the Consent Judgment on behalf of the Party represented and legally to bind that
7 Party.

8 12.8 The Parties, including their counsel, have participated in the preparation of
9 this Consent Judgment and this Consent Judgment is the result of the joint efforts of the Parties.
10 This Consent Judgment was subject to revision and modification by the Parties and has been
11 accepted and approved as to its final form by all Parties and their counsel. Accordingly, any
12 uncertainty or ambiguity existing in this Consent Judgment shall not be interpreted against any
13 Party as a result of the manner of the preparation of this Consent Judgment. Each Party to this
14 Consent Judgment agrees that any statute or rule of construction providing that ambiguities are to
15 be resolved against the drafting Party should not be employed in the interpretation of this Consent
16 Judgment and, in this regard, the Parties hereby waive California Civil Code § 1654.

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

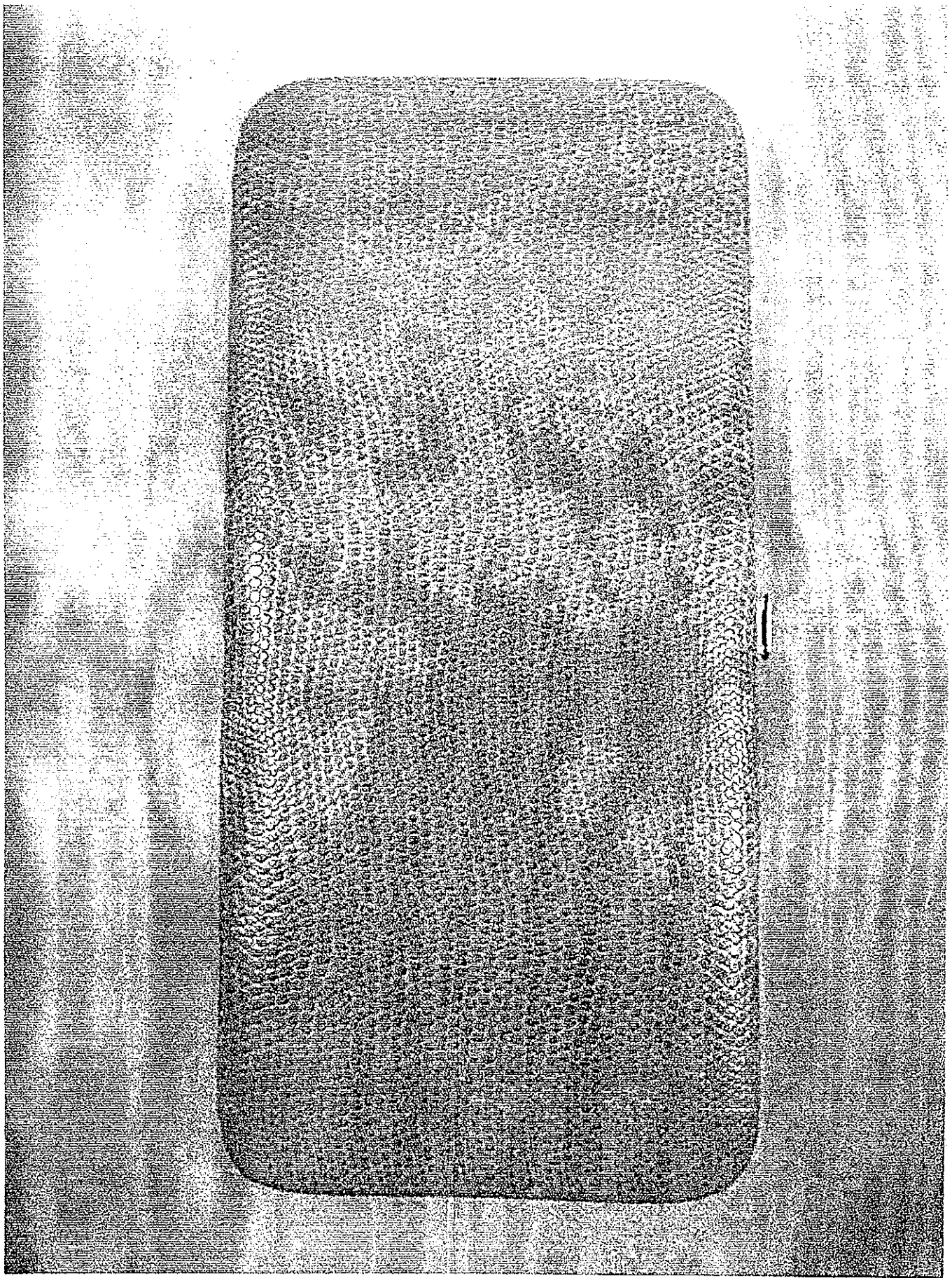
