8 1.2 Plaintiff Environmental Research Center. Inc. ("ERC") is a California non-profit
9 corporation acting as a private enforcer of Proposition 65 that is dedicated to, among other
10 causes, helping safeguard the public from health hazards by reducing the use and misuse of
11 hazardous and toxic chemicals, facilitating a safe environment for consumers and employees.
12 and encouraging corporate responsibility. ERC brings this Action in the public interest pursuant
13 to California Health and Safety Code Section 25249.7.

- 1.3 Defendant WORLD HEALTH PRODUCTS is a Connecticut Limited Liability
 Company that does business as GAT (collectively referred to herein as "World Health"). For
 purposes of this Consent Judgment, at all relevant times, World Health employed ten or more
 persons, and is a "person in the course of doing business" within the meaning of Proposition 65.
 World Health manufactures, distributes, and sells the Covered Products.
- 19 1.4 ERC and World Health are hereinafter sometimes referred to individually as a
 20 "Party" or collectively as the "Parties."

1.5 On October 21, 2011, pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section
 25249.7(d)(1), ERC served a Notice of Violations of Proposition 65 ("Notice of Violations") on
 the California Attorney General, other public enforcers, and World Health. A true and correct
 copy of the Notice of Violations is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

1.6 After more than sixty (60) days passed since service of the Notice of Violations,
and no designated governmental agency filed a complaint against World Health with regard to
the Covered Products or the alleged violations, ERC filed the Complaint in this Action (the
"Complaint") for injunctive relief and civil penalties. The Complaint is based on the allegations

1

in the Notice of Violations.

The Complaint and the Notice of Violations each allege that World Health 2 1.7 manufactured, distributed, and/or sold in California the Covered Products, which contain lead, a 3 chemical listed under Proposition 65 as a carcinogen and reproductive toxin, and expose 4 consumers at a level requiring a Proposition 65 warning. Further, the Complaint and Notice of 5 Violations allege that use of the Covered Products exposes persons in California to lead without 6 first providing clear and reasonable warnings, in violation of California Health and Safety Code 7 Section 25249.6. World Health denies all material allegations of the Notices of Violation and 8 the Complaint, asserts numerous affirmative defenses, and specifically denies that the Covered 0 Products require a Proposition 65 warning or otherwise cause harm to any person. 10

The Parties enter into this Consent Judgment in order to settle, compromise, and 1 1.8 resolve disputed claims and avoid prolonged and costly litigation. Nothing in this Consent 12 Judgment, nor compliance with its terms, shall constitute or be construed as an admission by any 13 14 of the Parties, or by any of their respective officers, directors, shareholders, employees, agents, parent companies, subsidiaries, divisions, affiliates, suppliers, franchisees, licensees, distributors, 15 wholesalers, or retailers, of any fact, conclusion of law, issue of law, violation of law, fault. 16 wrongdoing, or liability, including without limitation, any admission concerning any alleged 17 violation of Proposition 65. Except as expressly set forth herein, nothing in this Consent 18 Judgment shall prejudice, waive, or impair any right, remedy, argument, or defense the Parties 19 20may have in any other or future legal proceeding unrelated to these proceedings. However, nothing in this Section shall affect the enforceability of this Consent Judgment. 21

1.9 The "Effective Date" of this Consent Judgment shall be the date this Consent
Judgment is entered by the Court.

24 2. JURISDICTION AND VENUE

For purposes of this Consent Judgment only, the Parties stipulate that this Court has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this Action and personal jurisdiction over the Parties, that venue is proper in this Court, and that this Court has jurisdiction to enter this Consent Judgment pursuant to the terms set forth herein.

3. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF, REFORMULATION, TESTING, AND WARNINGS

Beginning on the Effective Date, World Health shall be permanently enjoined 2 3.1 from manufacturing for sale in California, directly selling to a consumer in California, or 3 "Distributing into California" any of the Covered Products for which the maximum daily dose 4 recommended on the label contains more than 0.5 micrograms of lead, unless such Covered 5 Product complies with the warning requirements in Section 3.3 or qualifies as a "Reformulated 6 Covered Product" pursuant to Section 3.4. "Distributing into California" means to directly ship 7 any of the Covered Products into California for sale or to sell any of the Covered Products to a 8 distributor that World Health knows or has reason to know will sell the Covered Product in 4 10 California.

11

3.2 Calculation of Lead Levels

As used in this Consent Judgment, lead levels are calculated pursuant to the testing
protocol described in Section 3.5. For purposes of measuring the lead, the highest lead detection
result of the five (5) randomly selected samples of the Covered Products will be controlling.

3.3 Clear and Reasonable Warnings.

For those Covered Products that are subject to the warning requirement of Section 3.1,
World Health shall provide the following warning:

the largest number of servings in the recommended dosage appearing on the product label) which
equals micrograms of lead exposure per day.

16 4. SETTLEMENT PAYMENT

4.1 World Health shall make a total payment of \$72,500.00 within 10 business days
of the Effective Date, which shall be in full and final satisfaction of all potential civil penalties,
payment in lieu of civil penalties, and attorneys' fees and costs. The payment will be in the form
of checks sent to counsel for ERC, William F. Wraith, Wraith Law, 16485 Laguna Canyon Road.
Suite 250, Irvine, California, 92618. The payment shall be payable to and apportioned as
follows:

4.2 \$11,572.00 as civil penalties pursuant to California Health and Safety Code
Section 25249.7(b)(1). Of this amount, \$8,679.00 (75%) shall be payable to the Office of
Environmental Health Hazard Assessment ("OEHHA"), and \$2,893.00 (25%) shall be payable to
ERC. (Cal. Health & Safety Code § 25249.12(c)(1) & (d)). ERC's counsel will forward the civil
penalty to OEHHA.

4.3 \$15,350.00 payable to ERC as reimbursement to ERC for reasonable costs

associated with the enforcement of Proposition 65 and other costs incurred as a result of work in
 bringing this Action.

5. MODIFICATION OF CONSENT JUDGMENT

This Consent Judgment may be modified only by: (i) Written agreement and stipulation of the Parties or (ii) Upon entry of a modified Consent Judgment by the Court. ERC is entitled to reimbursement all reasonable attorneys' fees and costs regarding any modification requested or initiated by World Health.

6. RETENTION OF JURISDICTION, ENFORCEMENT OF CONSENT JUDGMENT

6.1 This Court shall retain jurisdiction of this matter to enforce, modify or terminate
this Consent Judgment.

6.2 Any Party may, by motion or application for an order to show cause filed with
this Court, enforce the terms and conditions contained in this Consent Judgment. The prevailing
party in any such motion or application may request that the Court award its reasonable

25 attorneys' fees and costs associated with such motion or application.

26 || 7. APPLICATION OF CONSENT JUDGMENT

27This Consent Judgment shall apply to, be binding upon, and benefit the Parties and their28respective officers, directors, shareholders, employees, agents, parent companies, subsidiaries,

ERC, on behalf of itself and in the public interest, hereby discharges 10 World Health and its respective officers, directors, shareholders, employees, agents, parent 11 companies, subsidiaries, divisions, affiliates, suppliers, franchisees, licensees, customers (not 12 including private label customers of World Health), distributors, wholesalers, retailers, and all 13 other upstream and downstream entities in the distribution chain of any Covered Product, and the 14 predecessors, successors and assigns of any of them (collectively, "Released Parties"). from all 15 claims for violations of Proposition 65 up through the Effective Date based on exposure to lead 16 from the Covered Products as set forth in the Notice of Violations and the Complaint. 17 ERC, on behalf of itself only, hereby releases and discharges the Released Parties 8.2 18

8.4 Unknown Claims

It is possible that other claims not known to the Parties arising out of the facts alleged in the Notice of Violations or the Complaint and relating to lead in the Covered Products that were manufactured before the Effective Date will develop or be discovered. ERC, on behalf of itself

only, acknowledges that this Consent Judgment acknowledges the claims released herein may

In any subsequent interpretation or 19 construction of this Consent Judgment, the terms and conditions shall not be construed against 20 any Party.

9.2 In the event that any of the provisions of this Consent Judgment are held by a
court to be unenforceable, the validity of the remaining enforceable provisions shall not be
adversely affected.

9.3 The terms and conditions of this Consent Judgment shall be governed by and
construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.
