27 (Health & Safety Code § 25249.6 *et seq.* and  
28 Code of Civil Procedure § 664.6)

1 **1. INTRODUCTION**

2 **1.1 Parties**

3 This Consent Judgment is entered into by and between plaintiff Anthony E. Held, Ph.D.,  
4 P.E. (“Held”) and defendant SmartHealth, Inc. (“SmartHealth”), with Held and SmartHealth each  
5 referred to individually as a “Party” and collectively as the “Parties.”

6 **1.2 Plaintiff**

7 Held is a resident of the State of California who seeks to promote awareness of exposures to  
8 toxic chemicals, and to improve human health by reducing or eliminating harmful substances  
9 contained in consumer and commercial products.

10 **1.3 Defendant**

11 SmartHealth employs ten or more individuals and is a “person in the course of doing  
12 business” for purposes of the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, California  
13 Health and Safety Code section 25249.6 *et seq.* (“Proposition 65”).

14 **1.4 General Allegations**

15 Held alleges that SmartHealth manufactures, imports, sells, and/or distributes for sale in  
16 California, vinyl/PVC gloves containing Diisononyl phthalate (“DINP”) without first providing the  
17 exposure warning required by Proposition 65.

18 **1.5 Product Description**

19 The products covered by this Consent Judgment are vinyl/PVC gloves containing DINP,  
20 including, but not limited to, the *Dr.Recommended.com Allerderm PF Vinyl Gloves, AL1013C*  
21 (collectively, “Products”).

22 **1.6 Notice of Violation**

23 On December 1, 2015, Held served SmartHealth and the requisite public enforcement  
24 agencies with a 60-Day Notice of Violation (“Notice”), alleging that SmartHealth violated  
25 Proposition 65 when it failed to warn its customers and consumers in California that the Products  
26 expose users to DINP. To the best of the Parties’ knowledge, no public enforcer has commenced  
27 and is diligently prosecuting an action to enforce the allegations set forth in the Notice.  
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**1.7 Complaint**

On February 16, 2016, Held commenced the instant action, naming SmartHealth, among others, as a defendant for the alleged violations of Proposition 65 that are the subject of the Notice.

**1.8 No Admission**

SmartHealth denies the material, factual, and legal allegations contained in the Notice and Complaint, and maintains that all of the products that it has sold, manufactured, imported and/or distributed for sale in California, including the Products, have been, and are, in compliance with all laws. Nothing in this Consent Judgment shall be construed as an admission of any fact, finding, conclusion of law, issue of law, or violation of law, nor shall compliance with this Consent Judgment constitute or be construed as an admission of any fact, finding, conclusion of law, issue of law, or violation of law. This Section shall not, however, diminish or otherwise affect SmartHealth’s obligations, responsibilities, and duties under this Consent Judgment.

**1.9 Consent to Jurisdiction**

For purposes of this Consent Judgment only, the Parties stipulate that this Court has jurisdiction over SmartHealth as to the allegations in the Complaint, that venue is proper in the County of Alameda, and that the Court has jurisdiction to enter and enforce the provisions of this Consent Judgment pursuant to Proposition 65 and Code of Civil Procedure section 664.6.

**1.10 Effective Date**

For purposes of this Consent Judgment, the term “Effective Date” shall mean within ten (10) days after Moore’s counsel serves written notice on SmarthHealth’s counsel that this Consent Judgment has been approved by and entered by the Court as provided by Section 5.

**2. INJUNCTIVE SETTLEMENT TERMS**

**2.1 Commitment to Provide Reformulated Products or Warnings**

Commencing on the Effective Date, and continuing thereafter, SmartHealth shall only sell, offer for sale, or distribute for sale in California Products that are either (a) Reformulated Products as defined by Section 2.2, below; or (b) Products that are offered by SmartHealth with a clear and reasonable warning pursuant to Section 2.3.





1 **3. MONETARY SETTLEMENT TERMS**

2 **3.1 Payments Pursuant to Health and Safety Code § 25249.7(b)(2)**

3 Pursuant to Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(b), in settlement of all the claims referred to  
4 in this Consent Judgment, SmartHealth shall pay \$3,000 in civil penalties. The civil penalty  
5 payment will be allocated in accordance with California Health and Safety Code section  
6 25249.12(c)(1) & (d), with 75% of the penalty amount remitted to the California Office of  
7 Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (“OEHHA”) and the remaining 25% of the penalty  
8 amount paid to Plaintiff. On or before the Effective Date, SmarthHealth shall make a civil penalty  
9 payment of \$3,000, in two checks for the following amounts made payable to (a) “OEHHA” in the  
10 amount of \$2,250; and (b) “Anthony E. Held, Client Trust Account” in the amount of \$750.”

11 **3.2 Reimbursement of Attorneys’ Fees and Costs**

12 The Parties acknowledge that Held and his counsel offered to resolve this dispute without  
13 reaching terms on the amount of fees and costs to be reimbursed to them, thereby leaving the issue  
14 to be resolved after the material terms of this Consent Judgment had been settled. Shortly after the  
15 other settlement terms had been finalized, the Parties negotiated SmartHealth’s reimbursement of  
16 the compensation due to Held and his counsel under general contract principles and the private  
17 attorney general doctrine codified at California Code of Civil Procedure § 1021.5 For all work  
18 performed through the mutual execution of this agreement and the Court’s approval of the same,  
19 but exclusive of fees and costs on appeal, if any, SmartHealth shall reimburse Held and his counsel  
20 \$19,000. On or before the Effective Date, SmartHealth shall deliver payment to the address in  
21 Section 3.4 in the form of a check payable to “The Chanler Group.” The reimbursement shall  
22 cover all fees and costs incurred by Held investigating, bringing this matter to SmartHealth’s  
23 attention, litigating, and negotiating a settlement of the matter in the public interest.

24 **3.3 Payment Timing**

25 In the event that any payment required by this Consent Judgment is untimely, the Parties  
26 agree and acknowledge that (a) SmartHealth shall be liable to Held for 10% simple interest on any  
27 unpaid amount(s); (b) Held may seek to enforce SmarthHealth’s payment obligations under  
28 general contract principles and Code of Civil Procedure section 664.6; and (c) Held shall be

1 entitled to reasonable fees incurred recovering such settlement payments pursuant to general  
2 contract principles and Code of Civil Procedure section 1021.5.

11 **4. CLAIMS COVERED AND RELEASED**

12 **4.1 Held's Public Release of Proposition 65 Claims**

13 Held, acting on his own behalf and in the public interest, releases SmartHealth and its  
14 parents, subsidiaries, , affiliated entities under common ownership, directors, officers, employees,  
15 and attorneys ("Releasees") and each entity to whom it directly or indirectly distribute or sell the  
16 Products including, but not limited to, their downstream distributors, wholesalers, customers,  
17 retailers, franchisers, cooperative members, licensors and licensees ("Downstream Releasees") for  
18 any violations arising under Proposition 65 for unwarned exposures to DINP from the Products  
19 manufactured, imported, distributed or sold by SmartHealth prior to the Effective Date, as set forth  
20 in the Notice. Compliance with the terms of this Consent Judgment constitutes compliance with  
21 Proposition 65 by SmartHealth with respect to the alleged or actual failure to warn about exposures  
22 to DINP from Products manufactured, sold or distributed for sale by SmartHealth after the  
23 Effective Date.

24 **4.2 Held's Individual Release of Claims**

25 Held, in his individual capacity only and *not* in his representative capacity, also provides a  
26 release to Defendants, Releasees, and Downstream Releasees which shall be effective as a full and  
27 final accord and satisfaction, as a bar to all actions, causes of action, obligations, costs, expenses,  
28 attorneys' fees, damages, losses, claims, liabilities and demands of Held of any nature, character or  
kind, whether known or unknown, suspected or unsuspected, arising out of alleged or actual

1 exposures to DINP in Products manufactured, imported, distributed and/or sold by SmartHealth  
2 before the Effective Date.

3 **4.3 SmartHealth’s Release of Held**

4 SmartHealth, on its own behalf and on behalf of its past and current agents, representatives,  
5 attorneys, successors and/or assignees, hereby waives any and all claims against Held and his  
6 attorneys and other representatives, for any and all actions taken or statements made by Held and  
7 his attorneys and other representatives in the course of investigating claims, seeking to enforce  
8 Proposition 65 against it in this matter, or with respect to the Products.

9 **5. COURT APPROVAL**

10 This Consent Judgment is not effective until it is approved and entered by the Court and  
11 shall be null and void if, for any reason, it is not approved and entered by the Court within one year  
12 after it has been fully executed by the Parties. Held and SmartHealth agree to support the entry of  
13 this agreement as a judgment, and to obtain the Court’s approval of their settlement in a timely  
14 manner. The Parties acknowledge that, pursuant to California Health and Safety Code section  
15 25249.7(f), a noticed motion is required for judicial approval of this Consent Judgment, which  
16 motion Held shall draft and file and SmartHealth shall support, including by appearing at the  
17 hearing if so requested. If any third-party objection to the motion is filed, Held and SmartHealth  
18 agree to work together to file a reply and appear at any hearing. This provision is a material  
19 component of the Consent Judgment and shall be treated as such in the event of a breach.

20 **6. SEVERABILITY**

21 If, subsequent to the Court’s approval and entry of this Consent Judgment as a judgment,  
22 any provision of this Consent Judgment is held by a court to be unenforceable, the validity of the  
23 remaining provisions shall not be adversely affected.

24 **7. GOVERNING LAW**

25 The terms of this Consent Judgment shall be governed by the laws of the State of California  
26 and apply within the State of California. In the event that Proposition 65 is repealed, preempted, or  
27 is otherwise rendered inapplicable by reason of law generally, or as to the Products, then  
28 SmartHealth may provide Held with written notice of any asserted change in the law, and shall have



1 no further obligations pursuant to this Consent Judgment, with respect to, and to the extent that, the  
2 Products are so affected. Nothing in this Consent Judgment shall be interpreted to relieve  
3 SmartHealth from its obligation to comply with any pertinent state or federal law or regulation.

4 **8. NOTICE**

5 Unless specified herein, all correspondence and notice required by this Consent Judgment  
6 shall be in writing and sent by: (i) personal delivery, (ii) first-class registered or certified mail,  
7 return receipt requested; or (iii) a recognized overnight courier to any Party by the other at the  
8 following addresses:

7 California Health and Safety Code section 25249.7(f).


8 **11. MODIFICATION**
