SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Parties

This Settlement Agreement is entered into by and between Kim Embry ("Embry"), on the one hand, and Do it Best Corp. ("Do it Best"), on the other hand, with Embry and Do it Best each individually referred to as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties." Embry is an individual residing in the State of California who seeks to promote awareness of exposures to toxic chemicals and to improve human health by reducing or eliminating hazardous substances used in consumer products. Do it Best employs ten or more individuals and is a person in the course of doing business for purposes of the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, California Health and Safety Code § 25249.6 *et seq.* ("Proposition 65").

1.2 General Allegations

Embry alleges that Do it Best manufactures, sells, and distributes for sale in California, greenhouse covers that contain di(2-ethylhexyl)phthalate ("DEHP") and that it does so without first providing the health hazard warning required by Proposition 65. DEHP is listed pursuant to Proposition 65 as a chemical known to cause cancer and birth defects or other reproductive harm.

1.3 Product Description

The products covered by this Settlement Agreement are defined as, and expressly limited to, *Best Garden* brand greenhouse covers that contain DEHP and that are manufactured, sold or distributed for sale in California by Do it Best, including the *Best Garden Replacement Cover for Greenhouse*, UPC #009326722146 (the "Products").

1.4 Notice of Violation

On May 2, 2017, Embry served Do it Best, Do it Best Commerce Company, LLC, the California Attorney General and other requisite public enforcers with a 60-Day Notice of Violation ("Notice"), alleging that Do it Best violated Proposition 65 when it failed to warn its customers and consumers in California of the health risks associated with exposures to DEHP from the Products. To the best of the Parties' knowledge, no public enforcer has commenced and is diligently prosecuting an action to enforce the violations alleged in the Notice.

1.5 No Admission

Do it Best denies the material, factual, and legal allegations in the Notice and maintains that all of the products it sold and/or distributed for sale in California, including the Products, have been, and are, in compliance with all laws. Nothing in this Settlement Agreement shall be construed as an admission by Do it Best of any fact, finding, conclusion, issue of law or violation of law, nor shall compliance with this Settlement Agreement constitute or be construed as an admission by Do it Best of any fact, finding, conclusion, issue of law or violation of law, such being specifically denied by Do it Best. This Section shall not, however, diminish or otherwise affect Do it Best's obligations, responsibilities and duties under this Settlement Agreement.

1.6 Effective Date

For purposes of this Settlement Agreement, the term "Effective Date" shall mean ninety (90) days following the execution of this Settlement Agreement by the Parties.

2. <u>INJUNCTIVE RELIEF</u>

2.1 Clear and Reasonable Warnings

Commencing on the Effective Date, and continuing thereafter, Do it Best agrees to only manufacture for sale, purchase for sale, import for sale, or distribute for sale in or into California Products that are sold with a health hazard warning as provided for in Section 2.2.

2.2 General Warning Requirements

Do it Best agrees that each warning shall be prominently placed with such conspicuousness, as compared with other words, statements, designs, or devices as to render it likely to be read and understood by an ordinary individual under customary conditions before purchase or use. Each warning shall be provided in a manner such that the consumer or user understands to which *specific* Product the warning applies, so as to minimize the risk of consumer confusion.

For purposes of this Settlement Agreement, a clear and reasonable warning for the Products shall consist of a warning affixed to the packaging, label, tag, or directly to each Product sold in California by Do it Best that contains one of the following statements:

(a) **WARNING:** This product contains chemicals known to the State of California to cause cancer and birth defects or other

reproductive harm.

Or

(b) WARNING: This product can expose you to chemicals including DEHP, which is known to the State of California to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. For more information go to www.P65Warnings.ca.gov.

Or

(c) **WARNING**: Cancer and Reproductive Harm – www.P65Warnings.ca.gov.

If Do it Best elects to use the warning statements identified in 2.2(b) or (c), it shall also include a symbol consisting of a black exclamation point in a yellow equilateral triangle with a bold black outline. Where the packaging or label for the product is not printed using the color yellow, the symbol may be printed in black and white. The symbol shall be placed to the left of the text of the warning, in a size no smaller than the height of the word "WARNING".

2.3 Grace Period for Existing Inventory of Products

The injunctive requirements of Section 2 shall not apply to Products that are already in the stream of commerce as of the Effective Date, which Products are expressly subject to the releases provided in Section 4.1.

3. MONETARY SETTLEMENT TERMS

3.1 Civil Penalty Payment

Pursuant to Health and Safety Code § 25249.7(b)(2), and in settlement of all claims alleged in the Notice or referred to in this Settlement Agreement, Do it Best agrees to pay \$1,000 in civil penalties. The penalty payment will be allocated in accordance with California Health and Safety Code §§ 25249.12(c)(1) & (d), with 75% of the penalty amount paid to the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment ("OEHHA") and the remaining 25% of the penalty amount retained by Embry. Within ten (10) days of the date this Settlement Agreement is executed by the Parties, Do it Best shall issue two separate checks for the initial civil penalty payment to (a) "OEHHA" in the amount of \$750.00 and (b) "Kim Embry" in the amount of \$250.00.

3.2 Attorney Fees and Costs

The Parties reached an accord on the compensation due to Embry and her counsel under the private attorney general doctrine and principles of contract law. Under these legal principles, within ten (10) days of the date this Settlement Agreement is executed by the Parties, Do it Best agrees to pay \$19,000 to Embry and her counsel for all fees and costs incurred in investigating, bringing this matter to the attention of Do it Best's management and negotiating a settlement. Do it Best's payment shall be delivered in the form of two checks: (1) one check for \$9,500 payable to "Glick Law Group"; and (2) one check for \$9,500 payable to "Nicholas & Tomasevic LLP."

4. CLAIMS COVERED AND RELEASED

4.1 Embry's Release of Do it Best

This Settlement Agreement is a full, final, and binding resolution between Embry, on her own behalf and not on behalf of the public, and Do it Best of any violation of Proposition 65 that was or could have been asserted by Embry, on her own behalf, on behalf of her past and current agents, representatives, attorneys, successors and assignees, against Do it Best and Do it Best Commerce Company, LLC and each of their respective parents, subsidiaries, affiliated entities under common ownership, directors, officers, members, employees, attorneys, each upstream entity from whom the Products were purchased by Do it Best, and each entity to whom Do it Best directly or indirectly distributes or sells the Products, including, but not limited to, its downstream distributors, wholesalers, customers, retailers, franchisees, cooperative members and licensees ("Releasees"), based on the failure to warn about exposures to DEHP in Products manufactured, sold or distributed for sale in California by Do it Best before the Effective Date, as alleged in the Notice.

In further consideration of the promises and agreements herein contained, Embry on her own behalf and not on behalf of the public, on behalf of her past and current agents, representatives, attorneys, successors and assignees hereby waives any and all rights she may have to institute or participate in, directly or indirectly, any form of legal action and releases all claims against Do it Best and Releasees including, without limitation, all actions and causes of action, suits, liabilities, demands, obligations, damages, costs, fines, penalties, losses or expenses including, but not exclusively, investigation fees, expert fees and attorney fees arising under Proposition 65 with respect to the alleged or actual failure to warn about exposures to DEHP in Products manufactured,

distributed, sold or offered for sale by Do it Best, before the Effective Date.

4.2 Do it Best's Release of Embry

Do it Best, on its own behalf and on behalf of its past and current agents, representatives, attorneys, successors, and assignees, hereby waives any and all claims against Embry and her attorneys and other representatives, for any and all actions taken or statements made by Embry and her attorneys and other representatives, whether in the course of investigating claims, otherwise seeking to enforce Proposition 65 against it in this matter, or with respect to the Products.

4.3 California Civil Code Section 1542

It is possible that other claims not known to the Parties arising out of the facts alleged in the Notice and relating to the Products will develop or be discovered. Embry on behalf of herself only, on one hand, and Do it Best on behalf of itself only, on the other hand, acknowledge that this Settlement Agreement is expressly intended to cover and include all such claims up through the Effective Date. The Parties acknowledge that the claims released in Sections 4.1 and 4.2 may include unknown claims, and nevertheless waive California Civil Code section 1542 as to any such unknown claims. California Civil Code section 1542 reads as follows:

A GENERAL RELEASE DOES NOT EXTEND TO CLAIMS WHICH THE CREDITOR DOES NOT KNOW OR SUSPECT TO EXIST IN HIS OR HER FAVOR AT THE TIME OF EXECUTING THE RELEASE, WHICH IF KNOWN BY HIM OR HER MUST HAVE MATERIALLY AFFECTED HIS OR HER SETTLEMENT WITH THE DEBTOR.

5. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>

If, subsequent to the execution of this Settlement Agreement, any provision of this Settlement Agreement is held by a court to be unenforceable, the validity of the remaining provisions shall not be adversely affected.

6. GOVERNING LAW

The terms of this Settlement Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California and apply within the State of California.

7. <u>NOTICE</u>

Unless specified herein, all correspondence and notice required to be provided pursuant to

this Settlement Agreement shall be in writing and sent by: (a) personal delivery; (b) first-class,

registered or certified mail, return receipt requested; or (c) a recognized overnight courier on any

This Settlement Agreement may be executed in counterparts and by facsimile or portable

document format (PDF) signature, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which,

when taken together, shall constitute one and the same document.

9. COMPLIANCE WITH HEALTH & SAFETY CODE § 25249.7(f)

Embry and her attorneys agree to comply with the reporting form requirements referenced in

California Health and Safety Code § 25249.7(f).

10. MODIFICATION

This Settlement Agreement may be modified only by written agreement of the Parties.

11. <u>AUTHORIZATION</u>

The undersigned are authorized to execute this Settlement Agreement on behalf of their respective Parties and have read, understood, and agree to all of the terms and conditions of this Settlement Agreement.
