SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

1. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

1.1 Parties

This Settlement Agreement is entered into by and between Kim Embry ("Embry"), on the one hand, and Eagle Claw Fishing Tackle Co. ("Eagle Claw"), on the other hand, with Embry and Eagle Claw each individually referred to as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties." Embry is an individual residing in the State of California who seeks to promote awareness of exposures to toxic chemicals and to improve human health by reducing or eliminating hazardous substances used in consumer products. Eagle Claw employs ten or more individuals and is a person in the course of doing business for purposes of the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, California Health and Safety Code § 25249.6 et seq. ("Proposition 65").

1.2 General Allegations

Embry alleges that Eagle Claw manufactures, sells, and distributes for sale in California, fishing products that contain Lead and that it does so without first providing a health hazard warning required by Proposition 65. Lead is listed pursuant to Proposition 65 as a chemical known to cause cancer and birth defects or other reproductive harm.

1.3 Product Description

The products covered by this Settlement Agreement are defined as, and expressly limited to, Eagle Claw Lazer Lead Cylandier Drop Shot Weights, 1/8 oz., 1/4oz, 3/16 oz., and 3/8 oz. that contain Lead and are manufactured, sold or distributed for sale in California by Eagle Claw (the "Products").

1.4 Notice of Violation

On July 15, 2019, Embry served Eagle Claw and the California Attorney General and other requisite public enforcers with a 60-Day Notice of Violation ("Notice"), alleging that Eagle Claw violated Proposition 65 when it failed to warn its customers and consumers in California of the health risks associated with exposures to Lead from the Products. To the best of the Parties' knowledge, no public enforcer has commenced and is diligently prosecuting an action to enforce the violations alleged in the Notice.

1.5 No Admission

Eagle Claw denies the material, factual, and legal allegations in the Notice and maintains that all of the products it sold and/or distributed for sale in California, including the Products, have been, and are, in compliance with all laws. Nothing in this Settlement Agreement shall be construed as an admission by Eagle Claw of any fact, finding, conclusion, issue of law or violation of law, nor shall compliance with this Settlement Agreement constitute or be construed as an admission by Eagle Claw of any fact, finding, conclusion, issue of law or violation of law, such being specifically denied by Eagle Claw. This Section shall not, however, diminish or otherwise affect Eagle Claw's obligations, responsibilities and duties under this Settlement Agreement.

1.6 Effective Date

For purposes of this Settlement Agreement, the term "Effective Date" shall mean the date the last Party executes this Settlement Agreement.

2. <u>INJUNCTIVE RELIEF</u>

2.1 Clear and Reasonable Warnings

Commencing on the Effective Date, and continuing thereafter, Eagle Claw agrees to only manufacture for sale, purchase for sale, import for sale, or distribute for sale in or into California the Products that are sold with a health hazard warning as provided for in Section 2.2.

2.2 General Warning Requirements

Eagle Claw agrees that each warning shall be prominently placed with such conspicuousness, as compared with other words, statements, designs, or devices as to render it likely to be read and understood by an ordinary individual under customary conditions before purchase or use. Each warning shall be provided in a manner such that the consumer or user understands to which *specific* Product the warning applies, so as to minimize the risk of consumer confusion.

For purposes of this Settlement Agreement, a clear and reasonable warning for the Product shall consist of a warning affixed to the packaging, label, tag, or directly to each Product sold in California by Eagle Claw that contains the following statements:

WARNING: This product can expose you to chemicals including Lead which is known to the State of California to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. For more information go to www.P65Warnings.ca.gov.

The warning shall also include a symbol consisting of a black exclamation point in a yellow equilateral triangle with a bold black outline. The symbol shall be placed to the left of the text of the warning, in a size no smaller than the height of the word "WARNING". For internet purchases, the same warning shall appear on the display page for the Products.

2.3 Grace Period for Existing Inventory of Products

The injunctive requirements of Section 2 shall not apply to Products that are already in the stream of commerce as of the Effective Date, which Products are expressly subject to the releases provided in Section 4.1.

3. MONETARY SETTLEMENT TERMS

3.1 Civil Penalty Payment

Pursuant to Health and Safety Code § 25249.7(b)(2), and in settlement of all claims alleged in the Notice or referred to in this Settlement Agreement, Eagle Claw agrees to pay \$1000 in civil penalties. The penalty payment will be allocated in accordance with California Health and Safety Code §§ 25249.12(c)(1) & (d), with 75% of the penalty amount paid to the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment ("OEHHA") and the remaining 25% of the penalty amount retained by Embry. Within ten (10) days of the date this Settlement Agreement is executed by the Parties, Eagle Claw shall issue two separate checks for the initial civil penalty payment to (a) "OEHHA" in the amount of \$750 and (b) Kim Embry, payable to the Glick Law Group Client Trust Account, in the amount of \$250.

3.2 Attorney Fees and Costs

The Parties reached an accord on the compensation due to Embry and her counsel under the private attorney general doctrine and principles of contract law. Under these legal principles, within ten (10) days of the date that the last Party executes this Settlement Agreement Eagle Claw agrees to pay \$14,000 to Embry and her counsel for all fees and costs incurred in investigating, bringing this matter to the attention of Eagle Claw's management and negotiating a settlement. Eagle Claw's payment shall be delivered in the form of two checks: (1) one check for \$7,000 payable to "Glick Law Group"; and (2) one check for \$7,000 payable to "Nicholas & Tomasevic LLP."

4. <u>CLAIMS COVERED AND RELEASED</u>

4.1 Embry's Release of Eagle Claw Fishing Tackle Co.

This Settlement Agreement is a full, final, and binding resolution between Embry, on her own behalf and not on behalf of the public, and Eagle Claw of any violation of Proposition 65 that was or could have been asserted by Embry, on her own behalf, on behalf of her past and current agents, representatives, attorneys, successors and assignees, against Eagle Claw and each of its respective parents, subsidiaries, affiliated entities under common ownership, directors, officers, members, employees, attorneys, each upstream entity from whom Eagle Claw purchased the Products, and each entity to whom Eagle Claw directly or indirectly distributes or sells the Products, including, but not limited to, its downstream distributors, wholesalers, customers, retailers, franchisees, cooperative members and licensees ("Releasees"), based on the failure to warn about exposures to Lead in the Products manufactured, sold or distributed for sale in California by Eagle Claw before the Effective Date, as alleged in the Notice.

In further consideration of the promises and agreements herein contained, Embry on her own behalf and not on behalf of the public, on behalf of her past and current agents, representatives, attorneys, successors and assignees hereby waives any and all rights she may have to institute or participate in, directly or indirectly, any form of legal action and releases all claims against Eagle Claw and Releasees including, without limitation, all actions and causes of action, suits, liabilities, demands, obligations, damages, costs, fines, penalties, losses or expenses including, but not exclusively, investigation fees, expert fees and attorney fees arising under Proposition 65 with respect to the alleged or actual failure to warn about exposures to Lead in the Products manufactured, distributed, sold or offered for sale by Eagle Claw, before the Effective Date.

4.2 Eagle Claw Fishing Tackle Co.'s Release of Embry

Eagle Claw, on its own behalf and on behalf of its past and current agents, representatives, attorneys, successors, and assignees, hereby waives any and all claims against Embry and her attorneys and other representatives, for any and all actions taken or statements made by Embry and

her attorneys and other representatives, whether in the course of investigating claims, otherwise seeking to enforce Proposition 65 against it in this matter, or with respect to the Products.

4.3 California Civil Code Section 1542

It is possible that other claims not known to the Parties arising out of the facts alleged in the Notice and relating to the Product will develop or be discovered. Embry on behalf of herself only, on one hand, and Eagle Claw on behalf of itself only, on the other hand, acknowledge that this Settlement Agreement is expressly intended to cover and include all such claims up through the Effective Date. The Parties acknowledge that the claims released in Sections 4.1 and 4.2 may include unknown claims, and nevertheless waive California Civil Code section 1542 as to any such unknown claims. California Civil Code section 1542 reads as follows:

A GENERAL RELEASE DOES NOT EXTEND TO CLAIMS WHICH THE CREDITOR DOES NOT KNOW OR SUSPECT TO EXIST IN HIS OR HER FAVOR AT THE TIME OF EXECUTING THE RELEASE, WHICH IF KNOWN BY HIM OR HER MUST HAVE MATERIALLY AFFECTED HIS OR HER SETTLEMENT WITH THE DEBTOR.

5. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>

If, subsequent to the execution of this Settlement Agreement, any provision of this Settlement Agreement is held by a court to be unenforceable, the validity of the remaining provisions shall not be adversely affected.

6. GOVERNING LAW

The terms of this Settlement Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California and apply within the State of California. In the event that Proposition 65 is repealed or is otherwise rendered inapplicable by reason of law generally, or as to the Products, then Eagle Claw may provide written notice to Embry of any asserted change in the law, and with the exception of Sections 3.1 and 3.2 above, have no further obligations pursuant to this Settlement Agreement, with respect to, and to the extent that, the Products are so affected. None of the terms of this Settlement Agreement shall have any application to Products sold outside of the State of California.

7. NOTICE

Unless specified herein, all correspondence and notice required to be provided pursuant to this Settlement Agreement shall be in writing and sent by: (a) personal delivery; (b) first-class, registered or certified mail, return receipt requested; or (c) a recognized overnight courier on any Party by the other at the following addresses:

Any Party may, from time to time, specify in writing to the other a change of address to which all notices and other communications shall be sent.

8. <u>COUNTERPARTS; FACSIMILE SIGNATURES</u>

This Settlement Agreement may be executed in counterparts and by facsimile or portable document format (PDF) signature, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which, when taken together, shall constitute one and the same document.

9. COMPLIANCE WITH HEALTH & SAFETY CODE § 25249.7(f)

Embry and her attorneys agree to comply with the reporting form requirements referenced in California Health and Safety Code § 25249.7(f).

10. MODIFICATION

This Settlement Agreement may be modified only by written agreement of the Parties.

11. <u>DISPUTE RESOLUTION</u>

If Embry or Eagle Claw determine at a future date that a violation of this Settlement Agreement has occurred, that Party shall provide notice to the other Party. Before bringing any

action to enforce any requirement of this Settlement Agreement, the Party alleging a violation of this Settlement Agreement shall provide the other Party with written notice of the grounds for such allegation together with supporting information as well as a complete demand for the relief sought. The Parties shall then meet and confer regarding the basis for the alleged violation to resolve the matter informally, including providing the Party alleged to be in violation with a reasonable opportunity of at least thirty (30) days to cure any alleged violation. Should such attempt at informal resolution fail, the Party alleging a violation may file its lawsuit seeking the proposed relief.

12. <u>AUTHORIZATION</u>

The undersigned are authorized to execute this Settlement Agreement on behalf of their respective Parties and have read, understood, and agree to all of the terms and conditions of this Settlement Agreement.
