

SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Parties

This Settlement Agreement is entered into by and between Audrey Donaldson (“Donaldson”) and Jahie Pty Ltd (“Jahie”), with Donaldson and Jahie each individually referred to as a “Party” and collectively as the “Parties.” Donaldson is an individual residing in the State of California who seeks to promote awareness of exposures to toxic chemicals and to improve human health by reducing or eliminating hazardous substances used in consumer products. Donaldson alleges that Jahie employs ten or more persons and is a person in the course of doing business for purposes of the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, California Health and Safety Code section 25249.6 *et seq.* (“Proposition 65”).

1.2 General Allegations

Donaldson alleges that Jahie manufactures, sells, and distributes for sale in California, ceramic mugs, bowls and containers with exterior decorations containing lead. Lead is listed pursuant to Proposition 65 as a chemical known to cause birth defects and other reproductive harm. Donaldson alleges that Jahie failed to provide the health hazard warning required by Proposition 65 for exposures to lead. Jahie denies these allegations, contending that its products do not violate Proposition 65.

1.3 Product Description

The products covered by this Settlement Agreement are the following products that are manufactured, sold, or distributed for sale in California by Jahie: (i) *The Pantry Ciroa Ceramic Coffee Container With Wooden Lid, style 12463- COFFEE JAR* ; and (ii) *Must Haves by Ciroa Set of 2 Bowl & Mug, style 16297-MME*; (hereinafter collectively referred to as the “Products”).

1.4 Notice of Violation

On March 27, 2020 Donaldson served Brand Trade Services Pty. Ltd., Liddy Design Pty. Ltd., The TJX Companies, Inc., and the requisite public enforcement agencies with 60-Day Notices of Violation, alleging that they violated Proposition 65 by failing to warn their customers and consumers in California of the health hazards associated with exposures to lead from its Products. No public enforcer has commenced and is diligently prosecuting the allegations set forth in the Notice.

1.5 No Admission

Jahie denies the material, factual, and legal allegations contained in the Notice and maintains that all of the products that it has sold and distributed in California, including the Products, have been, and are, in compliance with all laws. Nothing in this Settlement Agreement shall be construed as an admission by Jahie of any fact, finding, conclusion, issue of law, or violation of law, nor shall compliance with this Settlement Agreement constitute or be construed as an admission by Jahie of any fact, finding, conclusion, issue of law, or violation of law, such being specifically denied by Jahie. This Section shall not, however, diminish or otherwise affect Jahie's obligations, responsibilities, and duties under this Settlement Agreement.

1.6 Effective Date

For purposes of this Settlement Agreement, the term "Effective Date" shall mean October 30, 2020.

2. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF: REFORMULATION/WARNING

2.1 Reformulation / Warning Commitment

As of the Effective Date, Jahie shall not manufacture, import, distribute, sell or offer the Products for sale in the State of California unless they are Reformulated Products pursuant to Section 2.2 or contain appropriate health hazard warnings pursuant to Section 2.3.

2.2 Reformulation Standards

“Reformulated Products” are defined as those Products that: (a) contain no more than 90 parts per million (“ppm”) lead in any decoration, colored artwork, designs and/or marking on the surface of the Products when analyzed pursuant to U.S. Environmental Protection Agency testing methodologies 3050B or equivalent methodologies utilized by federal or state agencies for the purpose of determining lead content in a solid substance; (b) yield a result of non-detect (defined as no more than 25 ppm (0.0025%) by weight of lead) for any decorations located in the upper 20 millimeters of a Product, i.e., the “Lip-and-Rim” area, when analyzed pursuant to EPA testing methodologies 3050B and 6010B, or equivalent methodologies used by state and federal agencies to determine lead content in a solid substance; *and* (c) yield no more than 1.0 microgram of lead on any surface sampled and analyzed pursuant to the NIOSH 9100 testing protocol.

If the decoration is tested after it is affixed to the Product, the percentage of the lead by weight must related only to the decorating materials and must not include any quantity attributable to non-decorating material (e.g., ceramic substrate).

2.3 Clear and Reasonable Warnings

As of the Effective Date, all Products Jahie sells and/or distributes for sale in California that do not qualify as Reformulated Products, per Section 2.2, shall bear a clear and reasonable warning pursuant to this Section. The warning shall be prominently placed with such conspicuousness when compared with other words, statements, designs or devices as to render it likely to be read and understood by an ordinary individual under customary conditions of use. For purposes of this Settlement Agreement, a clear and reasonable warning for the Products shall consist of a warning affixed directly to the product or product packaging, label, or tag, for Products sold in California, and contain one of the following statements:



WARNING: Reproductive Harm- www.P65Warnings.ca.gov

OR



WARNING: This product can expose you to chemicals including lead, which are known to the State of California to cause birth defects and other reproductive harm. For more information go to www.P65Warnings.ca.gov.

3. MONETARY SETTLEMENT TERMS

3.1 Civil Penalty Payment

Pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 25249.7(b)(2), and in settlement of all claims alleged in the Notice or referred to in this Settlement Agreement, Jahie agrees to pay \$2,500 in civil penalties no later than October 30, 2020. The penalty payment will be allocated in accordance with California Health and Safety Code section 25249.12(c)(1) & (d), with 75% of the penalty amount remitted to the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (“OEHHA”) and the remaining 25% of the penalty amount collectively paid to Donaldson, and delivered to the address in Section 3.3 herein. Jahie will provide its payment in two checks as follows: (1) “OEHHA” in the amount of \$1,875; and (2) “Audrey Donaldson” in the amount of \$625.

3.2 Attorneys’ Fees and Costs

The Parties acknowledge that Donaldson and her counsel offered to resolve this dispute without reaching terms on the amount of fees and costs to be reimbursed to them, thereby leaving the issue to be resolved after the material terms of the agreement had been settled. Shortly after the other settlement terms had been reached, Jahie expressed a desire to resolve Donaldson’s fees and costs. The Parties reached an accord on the compensation due to Donaldson’s counsel under general contract principles and the private attorney general doctrine codified at Code of Civil Procedure section 1021.5 for all work performed in this matter. Under these legal principles, on or before October 30, 2020, Jahie agrees to pay \$18,500, in the form of a check made payable to “Voorhees & Bailey, LLP,” for all fees and costs incurred investigating, bringing this matter to the attention of Jahie’s management, and negotiating a settlement.

4. CLAIMS COVERED AND RELEASED

4.1 Donaldson's Release of Proposition 65 Claims

Donaldson, acting on her own behalf, and *not* on behalf of the public, releases Jahie, its parents, subsidiaries, affiliated entities under common ownership, directors, officers, agents employees, attorneys, including, but not limited to, Brand Trade Services Pty. Ltd. and Liddy Design Pty. Ltd., and each entity to whom Jahie, Brand Trade Services Pty. Ltd., and Liddy Design Pty. Ltd. directly or indirectly distributes or sells the Products, including, but not limited, to downstream distributors, wholesalers, customers, retailers (including, but not limited to The TJX Companies, Inc.), franchisees, cooperative members, importers, and licensees (collectively, "Releasees"), from all claims for violations of Proposition 65 arising from the sale of Products by Jahie at any time through the Effective Date based on unwarned exposures to lead in the Products. This release includes any sale of Products in inventory of any entity that it acquired from Jahie, Brand Trade Services Pty. Ltd., or Liddy Design Pty. Ltd. up to and including the Effective Date. The Parties understand and agree that this Section 4.1 release shall not extend upstream to any entities that manufactured the Products or any component parts thereof, or any distributors or suppliers who sold the Products or any component parts thereof to Jahie, Brand Trade Services Pty. Ltd., or Liddy Design Pty. Ltd.

4.2 Donaldson's Individual Release of Claims

Donaldson, in her individual capacity only and *not* in her representative capacity, provides a release herein which shall be effective as full and final accords and satisfactions, as a bar to all actions, causes of action, obligations, costs, expenses,

attorneys' fees, damages, losses, claims, liabilities, and demands of Donaldson of any nature, character, or kind, whether known or unknown, suspected or unsuspected, including but not limited to all failure to warn claims, arising out of alleged or actual exposures to lead in the Products manufactured, imported, distributed, or sold by Jahie, Brand Trade Services Pty. Ltd., Liddy Design Pty. Ltd. prior to the Effective Date. The Parties understand and agree that this Section 4.2 release shall not extend upstream to any entities that manufactured the Products, or any component parts thereof, 5or any distributors or suppliers who sold the Products, or any component parts thereof to Jahie, Brand Trade Services Pty. Ltd., and Liddy Design Pty. Ltd. Nothing in this Section affects Donaldson's right to commence or prosecute an action under Proposition 65 against a Releasee that does not involve Jahie's Products.

4.3 Jahie's Release of Donaldson

Jahie, on its own behalf, and on behalf of its past and current agents, representatives, attorneys, successors, and/or assignees, hereby waives any and all claims against Donaldson and her attorneys and other representatives, for any and all actions taken or statements made by Donaldson and her attorneys and other representatives, whether in the course of investigating claims, seeking to enforce Proposition 65 against it in this matter, or with respect to the Products.

5. SEVERABILITY

If, subsequent to the execution of this Settlement Agreement, any provision of this Settlement Agreement is deemed by a court to be unenforceable, the validity of the remaining provisions shall not be adversely affected, unless contrary to the intent of the Parties in entering this agreement.

6. GOVERNING LAW

The terms of this Settlement Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California and apply within the State of California. In the event that Proposition 65 is repealed or is otherwise rendered inapplicable by reason of law generally, or as to the

Products, then Jahie may provide written notice to Donaldson of any asserted change in the law and shall have no further injunctive obligations pursuant to this Settlement Agreement with respect to, and to the extent that, the Products are so affected.

7. NOTICE

Unless specified herein, all correspondence and notice required to be provided pursuant to this Settlement Agreement shall be in writing and sent by: (a) personal delivery; (b) first-class, registered or certified mail, return receipt requested; or (c) a recognized overnight courier on any Party by the other at the following addresses:

This Settlement Agreement may be executed in counterparts and by facsimile or portable document format (PDF) signature, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which, when taken together, shall constitute one and the same document.

9. COMPLIANCE WITH HEALTH & SAFETY CODE § 25249.7(f)

Donaldson and her attorneys agree to comply with the reporting form requirements referenced in California Health and Safety Code section 25249.7(f).

10. MODIFICATION

This Settlement Agreement may be modified only by written agreement of the Parties.

11. AUTHORIZATION

The undersigned are authorized to execute this Settlement Agreement on behalf of their respective Parties and have read, understand, and agreed to all of the terms and conditions of this Settlement Agreement.
