1 **1. INTRODUCTION**

2 **1.1 Parties**

3 This consent judgment (“**Consent Judgment**”) is entered into by and between plaintiff
4 Shefa LMV, Inc. (“**Shefa**” or “**Plaintiff**”) and Amazon.com, Inc. (“**Defendant**,” with Shefa and
5 **Defendant** individually referred to as a “**Party**” and collectively as the “**Parties.**”)

6 **1.2 Plaintiff**

7 Shefa is a public benefit, non-profit corporation that seeks to promote awareness of
8 exposures to toxic chemicals and to improve human health by reducing or eliminating hazardous
9 substances contained in consumer products.

10 **1.3 Settling Defendant**

11 Defendant employs ten (10) or more persons and is a person in the course of doing business
12 for purposes of the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, Health and Safety
13 Code §25249.6 *et seq.* (“**Proposition 65**”).

14 **1.4 Products Covered**

15 The products covered by this Consent Judgment are plastic crossbody and messenger bag
16 products that allegedly contain Diisononyl Phthalate (“**DINP**”) and were sold in California on the
17 website www.amazon.com, including, but not limited to, Clear Cross Body Messenger Bag, UPC
18 X0015UTBWX and ASIN B011P46CLK (collectively, the “**Covered Products**”).

19 **1.5 General Allegations**

20 Shefa alleges that Defendant, at times relevant to the complaint, manufactures, imports,
21 sells, or distributes, for sale in the state of California, the Covered Products without first providing a
22 clear and reasonable warning required by Proposition 65. DINP (CAS # 67701-26-2) is a chemical
23 listed under Proposition 65 as a chemical known to the state to cause cancer.

24 On December 12, 2019, Shefa served Defendant and the requisite public enforcement
25 agencies with a Sixty Day Notice of Violation (the “**First Notice**”) alleging that Defendant violated
26 Proposition 65 when it failed to warn its customers and consumers in California that the Covered
27 Products expose users to DINP.

1 On March 7, 2020, Plaintiff purchased the Covered Products on amazon.com. On April 6,
2 2020, Shefa served Defendant and the requisite public enforcement agencies with a Sixty Day
3 Notice of Violation (together with the First Notice, the “**Notices**”) alleging that as a retailer,
4 Defendant violated Proposition 65 when it failed to warn its customers and consumers in California
5 that the Covered Products expose users to DINP. To the best of the Parties’ knowledge, no public
6 enforcer has commenced and is diligently prosecuting the allegations set forth in the Notices.

7 **1.6 Complaint**

8 On October 23, 2020, Shefa filed the instant complaint in the Superior Court in and for the
9 County of Los Angeles against Defendant alleging violations of California Health & Safety Code
10 § 25249.6, based on exposures to DINP contained in the Covered Products sold in the State of
11 California (the “**Complaint**”).

12 **1.7 No Admission**

13 Defendant denies the material, factual, and legal allegations contained in the Notices and
14 Complaint and maintains that all the products it has manufactured, sold, or distributed for sale in
15 California, including the Covered Products, have been, and are, in compliance with all laws.
16 Nothing in this Consent Judgment shall be construed as an admission by Defendant of any fact,
17 finding, conclusion of law, issue of law, or violation of law; nor shall compliance with this Consent
18 Judgment constitute or be construed as an admission by Defendant of any fact, finding, conclusion
19 of law, issue of law, or violation of law, the same being specifically denied by Defendant. This
20 section shall not, however, diminish or otherwise affect Defendant’s obligations, responsibilities,
21 and duties under this Consent Judgment.

22 **1.8 Consent to Jurisdiction**

23 For purposes of this Consent Judgment only, the Parties stipulate that this Court has
24 jurisdiction over Defendant as to the allegations in the Complaint, that venue is proper in the
25 County of Los Angeles, the Defendant agrees that it employs or has employed ten or more persons
26 during time periods relevant to the Complaint and that this Court has jurisdiction over the Parties to
27 enter and enforce the provisions of this Consent Judgment pursuant to Proposition 65.

1 **1.9 Effective Date**

2 For purposes of this Consent Judgment, the term “**Effective Date**” shall mean the date the
3 Consent Judgment is approved and entered by the Court.

4 **2. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF: COMPLIANT PRODUCTS AND WARNINGS**

5 **2.1 Reformulation Standards**

6 Within 90 days of the Effective Date, Defendant shall not manufacture for sale in California
7 any Covered Products unless such Covered Products contain DINP in concentrations less than or
8 equal to 1000 parts per million (“ppm”) when analyzed pursuant to U.S. Environmental Protection
9 Agency testing methodologies 3580A and 8270C or any other scientifically reliable methodology
10 for determining the concentration of DINP in the Covered Products, unless the Covered Product has
11 a warning consistent with Section 2.2, below.

12 **2.2 Warning Standards**

13 Defendant agrees, promises, and represents that, within 90 days of the Effective Date, to the
14 extent it ships or sells Covered Products that do not meet the formulation standards set forth above
15 in Section 2.1, Defendant will provide warnings on such Covered Products that comply with
16 Proposition 65. The warnings shall be provided in a conspicuous and prominent manner such that
17 they will be likely to be read or seen by the consumer prior to or at the time of the sale or purchase.
18 The Parties agree that the warning set forth below or any substantially similar language shall
19 constitute compliance with Proposition 65 with respect to any Covered Products that are not
20 reformulated:

- 21 (a) the text, “**WARNING This product can expose you to chemicals, including Di(2-**
- 22 **ethylhexyl) phthalate (DINP), which is known to the State of California to cause**
- 23 **cancer. For more information go to www.P65Warnings.ca.gov.**” accompanied by and
- 24 placed to the right of a symbol consisting of a black exclamation point in a yellow
- 25 equilateral triangle with a bold black outline sized to be no smaller than the word,
- 26 “**WARNING**” as provided by regulations adopted on or about August 30, 2016; or
- 27 (b) the text, “**WARNING Cancer - www.P65Warnings.ca.gov.**” accompanied by and
- 28

1 placed to the right of a symbol consisting of a black exclamation point in a yellow
2 equilateral triangle with a bold black outline sized to be no smaller than the word,
3 “WARNING” as provided by regulations adopted on or about August 30, 2016.

4 The triangular warning symbol specified in Section 2.2(a) and 2.2(b) shall be in yellow with a black
5 exclamation mark; *provided however*, the symbol may be printed in black and white if the Covered
6 Product label is not printed using the color yellow.
7

8 **2.3 Covered Products in the Stream of Commerce.**

9 Any Covered Products that have been manufactured, distributed, shipped, or sold prior to
10 ninety (90) days after the Effective Date, shall not be subject to the requirements of Sections 2.1 or
11 2.2.

12 **3. MONETARY SETTLEMENT TERMS**

13 **3.1 Payment from Defendant.** Within thirty (30) days of the Effective Date, and
14 Defendant’s receipt of a current W-9 form from the Greenbaum Law Firm, whichever is later,
15 Defendant shall make the Total Settlement Payment of **\$16,500.00**.

16 **3.2 Allocation of Payments.** The Total Settlement Payment shall be paid in three (3)
17 separate checks made payable and allocated as follows, or made in a single electronic transfer made
18 payable to the “Greenbaum Law Firm” using banking information provided by Plaintiff’s counsel,
19 in which case Plaintiff’s counsel shall send the allocated portions of the civil penalty to OEHHA
20 and Shefa as follows:

21 **3.2.1 Civil Penalty.** Defendant shall pay \$2,000.00 as a civil penalty
22 pursuant to Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(b). The civil penalty shall be apportioned in
23 accordance with Health & Safety Code § 25249.12 (25% to Shefa and 75% to the State of
24 California’s Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (“OEHHA”). Accordingly, the
25 OEHHA portion of the civil penalty payment in the amount of \$1,500.00 shall be made payable to
26 OEHHA and associated with taxpayer identification number 68-0284486. If sent by mail, this
27

1 payment shall be delivered to the Greenbaum Law Firm, 7120 Hayvenhurst Ave, Suite 320, Van
2 Nuys, CA 91406.

3 The Shefa portion of the civil penalty payment in the amount of \$500.00 shall be made
4 payable to Shefa LMV, Inc. and associated with taxpayer identification number 81-0907002. If
5 sent by mail, this payment shall be delivered to the Greenbaum Law Firm, 7120 Hayvenhurst
6 Ave, Suite 320, Van Nuys, CA 91406.

7 **3.2.2 Attorney's Fees and Costs.** A reimbursement of Shefa's attorney's
8 fees and costs in the amount of \$14,500.00 payable to the "Greenbaum Law Firm," and associated
9 with taxpayer identification number 46-4580172. If sent by mail, this payment shall be delivered to
10 the Greenbaum Law Firm, 7120 Hayvenhurst Ave, Suite 320, Van Nuys, CA 91406.

11 **4. CLAIMS COVERED AND RELEASED**

12 **4.1 Public Release**

13 This Consent Judgment is a full, final, and binding resolution between Shefa acting on
14 behalf of itself and each of its past, current, and future agents, representatives, attorneys, successors,
15 and/or assignees, and in a representative capacity in the public interest under Health & Safety Code
16 § 25249.7, and Defendant and its past, current, and future and any and all direct and indirect
17 parents, subsidiaries, affiliated entities, manufacturers, suppliers, directors, officers, managers,
18 shareholders, members, employees, agents, attorneys, and the predecessors, successors, or assigns
19 of each of them, and each entity to whom Defendant directly or indirectly distributes or sells, or in
20 the past directly or indirectly distributed or sold, the Covered Products, including, without
21 limitation, any and all distributors, wholesalers, customers, retailers, franchisees, cooperative
22 members, and licensees (collectively "**Releasees**"), arising out of or resulting from, or related
23 directly or indirectly to, in whole or in part, any and all alleged or actual violations of Proposition
24 65 based on a failure to warn of alleged exposures to DINP from Covered Products manufactured,
25 supplied, sold, or distributed for sale prior to the Effective Date. The release in this Section 4.1
26 applies to all Covered Products that were manufactured, supplied, sold, or distributed for sale prior
27 to the Effective Date.
28

1 Compliance with the terms of this Consent Judgment shall constitute compliance with
2 Proposition 65 by Defendant and the Releasees with respect to DINP in Covered Products
3 manufactured, sold, or distributed on and after the Effective Date.

4 **4.2 Shefa's Individual Release of Claims**

5 In further consideration of the promises and agreements herein contained, Shefa, on its own
6 behalf and on behalf of its past and current agents, representatives, attorneys, successors, and/or
7 assignees, hereby waives all rights to institute or participate in, directly or indirectly, any form of
8 legal action, and releases all claims that it may have against Defendant and Releasees, including,
9 without limitation, all actions and causes of action, suits, liabilities, demands, obligations, damages,
10 costs, fines, penalties, losses, or expenses, including, without limitation, investigation fees, expert
11 fees, and attorneys' fees with respect to any alleged violations of Proposition 65 for unwarned
12 exposures to DINP from Covered Products manufactured, sold, or distributed for sale prior to the
13 Effective Date. The releases in Section 4.2 are provided in Shefa's individual capacity and are not
14 releases on behalf of the public.

15 **4.3 Release of Unknown Claims**

16 It is possible that other claims not known to the Parties arising out of the facts contained in
17 the Notices, or alleged in the Complaint, relating to the Covered Products, will hereafter be
18 discovered or developed. Shefa, on behalf of itself only, acknowledges that this Consent Judgment
19 is expressly intended to cover and include all such claims through and including the Effective Date,
20 including all rights of action therefor. Shefa acknowledges that the claims released in Sections 4.1
21 and 4.2 may include unknown claims, and nevertheless Shefa intends to release such claims, and in
22 doing so waives California Civil Code § 1542, which reads as follows:

23 **A GENERAL RELEASE DOES NOT EXTEND TO CLAIMS THAT THE**
24 **CREDITOR OR RELEASING PARTY DOES NOT KNOW OR SUSPECT TO**
25 **EXIST IN HIS OR HER FAVOR AT THE TIME OF EXECUTING THE RELEASE**
26 **AND THAT, IF KNOWN BY HIM OR HER, WOULD HAVE MATERIALLY**
27 **AFFECTED HIS OR HER SETTLEMENT WITH THE DEBTOR OR RELEASED**
28 **PARTY.**

Shefa understands and acknowledges that the significance and consequence of this waiver of

1 California Civil Code § 1542 is that, even if Shefa suffers future damages arising out of or resulting
2 from, or related directly or indirectly to, in whole or in part, the Covered Products, including but not
3 limited to any exposure to, or failure to warn with respect to exposure to, the Covered Products,
4 Shefa will not be able to make any claim for those damages against Defendant or any of the
5 Releasees.

6 **5. COURT APPROVAL**

7 This Consent Judgment is not effective unless and until it is approved and entered by the
8 Court.

9 **6. GOVERNING LAW**

10 The terms of this Consent Judgment shall be governed by the laws of the State of California
11 and apply within the State of California. In the event that Proposition 65 is repealed or is otherwise
12 rendered inapplicable by reason of law generally, or as to the Covered Products, then Defendant
13 may provide written notice to Shefa of any asserted change in the law, and with the exception of
14 Sections 3.1 and 3.2 above, have no further obligations pursuant to this Consent Judgment, with
15 respect to, and to the extent that, the Covered Products are so affected. None of the terms of this
16 Consent Judgment shall have any application to Covered Products sold outside of the State of
17 California.

18 **7. NOTICE**

19 Unless specified herein, all correspondence and notices required to be provided pursuant to
20 this Consent Judgment shall be in writing and sent by: (i) personal delivery; (ii) first-class,
21 registered or certified mail, return receipt requested; or (iii) a recognized overnight courier on any
22 Party by the other at the following addresses:

1 Any Party may, from time to time, specify in writing to the other Party a change of address
2 to which all notices and other communications shall be sent.

3 **8. COUNTERPARTS; FACSIMILE AND PDF SIGNATURES**

4 This Consent Judgment may be executed in counterparts, and by facsimile or portable
5 document format (PDF) signature, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which,
6 when taken together, shall constitute one and the same document.

7 **9. COMPLIANCE WITH HEALTH & SAFETY CODE § 25249.7(f)**

8 Plaintiff agrees to comply with the reporting form requirements referenced in California
9 Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(f).

10 **10. POST EXECUTION ACTIVITIES**

11 The Parties acknowledge that, pursuant to California Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(f),
12 Shefa is obligated to file a noticed motion to obtain judicial approval of this Consent Judgment.
13 Upon the Parties' execution of this Consent Judgment, Shefa promptly shall proceed to submit this
14 Consent Judgment to the Court with a motion seeking Court approval.

15 **11. MODIFICATION**

16 This Consent Judgment may only be modified by a written instrument executed by the
17 Parties to be bound thereby, and after approval by the Court upon a noticed motion. Any motion to
18 modify shall be served on all Parties and the Office of the Attorney General.



19 **12. DISPUTE RESOLUTION**

20 If Shefa determines at a future date that an alleged violation of this Consent Judgment has
21 occurred, Shefa shall provide notice to Defendant. Prior to bringing any action to enforce any
22 requirement of this Consent Judgment, the party alleging a violation of this Consent Judgment shall
23 provide the other party with written notice of the grounds for such allegation together with all
24 supporting information as well as a complete demand for the relief sought. The Parties shall then
25 meet and confer regarding the basis for the allegation to resolve the matter informally, including
26 providing the party alleged to be in violation with a reasonable opportunity of at least thirty (30)
27 days to cure any alleged violation. Should such attempt at informal resolution fail, the party
28

1 alleging a violation may file its lawsuit seeking the proposed relief.

2 **13. AUTHORIZATION**

3 The undersigned are authorized to execute this Consent Judgment on behalf of their
4 respective Parties and have read, understood, and agree to all of the terms and conditions of this
5 Consent Judgment.

[PROPOSED] JUDGMENT

Please note that on August 1, 2023 at 8:30am, Plaintiff Shefa LMV Inc.’s (“Plaintiff”) Motion for Court Approval of Settlement Agreement and Entry of Consent Judgment as to Defendant Amazon.com, Inc. came for hearing before this Court in Department 39, the Honorable Stephen I. Goorvitch presiding. Counsel for Plaintiff did [not] appear; counsel for Defendant did [not] appear.

After full consideration of the points and authorities and related pleadings submitted, the Court GRANTED Plaintiff’s Motion pursuant to and in accordance with Health & Safety Code §25249.7(f)(4). The Court reviewed the above Settlement Agreement and makes the following findings pursuant to Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(f)(4):

- a. The injunctive relief required by the Settlement Agreement complies with Health & Safety Code § 25249.7;
- b. The reimbursement of fees and costs to be paid pursuant to the Settlement Agreement is reasonable under California law; and
- c. The civil penalty amount to be paid pursuant to Settlement Agreement is reasonable.

IT IS SO ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED.
