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	CONSENT JUDGMENT		

1. INTRODUCTION

This Consent Judgment is entered into by and between plaintiff Keep America Safe and Beautiful ("KASB") and defendant FKA Distributing Company, LLC dba HoMedics USA, LLC ("HoMedics"), with KASB and HoMedics each individually referred to as a "Party" and collectively, as the "Parties," to resolve the allegations in the July 9, 2021 60-Day Notice of Violation in compliance with the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, Health & Safety Code § 25249.6 et seq. ("Proposition 65").

1.1 The Parties

KASB is a California-based non-profit organization proceeding in the public interest pursuant to California Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(d) to ensure that chemicals known to the State of California to cause cancer, birth defects, or other reproductive harm are disclosed or eliminated from consumer products sold in California. HoMedics is a person in the course of doing business for purposes of California Health & Safety Code § 25249.11(b).

1.2 Consumer Product Description

KASB alleges that HoMedics manufactures, imports, sells, or distributes for sale in California massagers containing di(2ethylhexyl) phthalate ("**DEHP**"), including but not limited to, the *HoMedics Deep Kneading Back Massager with Heat, UPC: 031262060389*, without providing the health hazard warning KASB alleges is required by California Health & Safety Code § 25249.5 *et seq.* ("**Proposition 65**".) All such massagers are referred to hereinafter as the "**Products**." DEHP is listed pursuant to Proposition 65 as a chemical known to the State of California to cause cancer, birth defects and other reproductive harm.

1.3 Notice of Violation

On July 9, 2021, KASB served HoMedics, the California Attorney General, and the requisite public enforcement agencies with a 60-Day Notice of Violation ("Notice"), alleging HoMedics violated Proposition 65 by failing to warn its customers and consumers in California that the Products can expose users to DEHP. No public enforcer has commenced and is diligently prosecuting an action to enforce the allegations set forth in the Notice.

1.4 Complaint

On April 12, 2022, KASB commenced the instant action ("Complaint"), naming HoMedics as a defendant for the alleged violations of Proposition 65 that are the subject of the Notice.

1.5 No Admission

HoMedics denies the material, factual and legal allegations contained in the Notice and Complaint and maintains that all products it sold or distributed for sale in California, including the Products, have been, and are, in compliance with all laws. Nothing in this Consent Judgment shall be construed as, nor shall compliance with this Consent Judgment constitute or be construed as, an admission by HoMedics of any fact, finding, conclusion of law, issue of law, or violation of law. This section shall not, however, diminish or otherwise affect HoMedics' obligations, responsibilities, and duties under this Consent Judgment. HoMedics maintains that it has not knowingly manufactured or caused to be manufactured the Products for sale in California in violation of Proposition 65.

1.6 Jurisdiction

For purposes of this Consent Judgment only, the Parties stipulate: this Court has jurisdiction over HoMedics as to the allegations contained in the Complaint; venue is proper in San Francisco County; and the Court has jurisdiction to enter and enforce the provisions of this Consent Judgment, pursuant to Proposition 65 and Code of Civil Procedure § 664.6.

1.7 Effective Date

The term "Effective Date" means the date on which the Court approves this Consent Judgment and enters Judgment pursuant to its terms, and KASB provides notice, including by an electronic message, to HoMedics the judgment has been entered in the Court's records as a consent judgment.

2. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF: REFORMULATION

2.1 Reformulation Commitment

Commencing on the Effective Date and continuing thereafter, all Products HoMedics manufactures, imports, sells, ships, or distributes for sale, in or into California, directly or through one or more third party retailers or e-commerce marketplaces, shall meet the Reformulation Standard for Reformulated Products, as defined by Section 2.2, subject to the releases set forth below.

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2.2 Reformulation Standard Defined

For purposes of this Consent Judgment, "Reformulated Products" are defined as Products which, if they contain di(2-ethylhexyl) phthalate ("DEHP"), di-n-butyl phthalate ("DBP"), diisononyl phthalate ("DINP"), butyl benzyl phthalate ("BBP"), di-isodecyl phthalate ("DIDP") and di-n-hexyl phthalate ("DnHP"), contain any or all such chemicals each in a maximum concentration of less than 0.1 percent (1,000 parts per million) when analyzed by a laboratory accredited by the State of California, a federal agency, or a nationally recognized accrediting organization. For purposes of compliance with this reformulation standard, testing samples shall be prepared and extracted using Consumer Product Safety Commission ("CPSC") methodology CPSC CH-C1001.09.3 and analyzed using U.S. Environmental Protection Agency methodology 8270D, or other methodologies utilized by federal or state government agencies to determine phthalate content in a solid substance. ("Reformulation Standard".)

Certification of Compliance with Reformulation Standard 2.3

HoMedics shall provide its most recent test result performed after the date of the Notice, demonstrating the Products were tested and analyzed according to the parameters previously set forth in Section 2.2 and comply with the definition of Reformulated Products. HoMedics shall provide its test result, along with other relief sought by this Consent Judgment under Section 3, to the address provided in Section 3.3 within ten (10) business days of the Effective Date. Failure to comply with this Section shall render this agreement null and void.

MONETARY SETTLEMENT TERMS 3.

3.1 **Civil Penalty**

Pursuant to Health and Safety Code § 25249.7(b), HoMedics agrees to pay a civil penalty of \$9,000 within ten (10) business days of the Effective Date. HoMedics' civil penalty payment will be allocated according to Health and Safety Code § 25249.12(c)(1) and (d), with seventy-five percent (75%) of the penalty paid to the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment ("OEHHA"), and the remaining twenty-five percent (25%) retained by KASB. HoMedics shall issue its payment in two checks made payable to: (a) "OEHHA" in the amount of \$6,750; and (b) "Keep America Safe and Beautiful" in the amount of \$2,250. KASB's counsel shall deliver to OEHHA and

4. <u>CLAIMS COVERED AND RELEASED</u>

4.1 KASB's Release of Proposition 65 Claims

This Consent Judgment is a full, final, and binding resolution of the claims that were or could have been asserted by KASB arising out of the allegations in the Notice and in the Complaint. KASB, acting on its own behalf, in the public interest, and on behalf of its past and current officers, agents, shareholders, employees, predecessors, representatives, attorneys, successors and assignees ("Releasors") releases HoMedics, and its respective officers, directors, shareholders, employees,

KASB their respective portions of the penalty payment. HoMedics shall deliver its civil penalty payments to the address listed in Section 3.3, below.

3.2 Reimbursement of Attorneys' Fees and Costs

KASB and its counsel offered to resolve the allegations in the Notice and Complaint without reaching terms on the amount of reimbursement of attorneys' fees and costs. Shortly after the Parties finalized the other material settlement terms, they negotiated and reached an accord on the amount of reimbursement to be paid to KASB's counsel, under general contract principles and the private attorney general doctrine, codified at California Code of Civil Procedure § 1021.5, for all work performed through the mutual execution and reporting of this Consent Judgment to the Office of the California Attorney General and entry of Judgment pursuant its terms, but exclusive of fees and costs on appeal, if any. Within ten (10) business days of the Effective Date, HoMedics shall issue a check in the amount of \$31,000 and made payable to "Seven Hills LLP" for all fees and other costs incurred investigating, bringing this matter to HoMedics' attention, litigating, negotiating a settlement in the public interest, obtaining the Court's approval of its terms pursuant to Section 5, and reporting to the California Attorney General. HoMedics shall deliver its payment to the address listed in Section 3.3.

3.3 Payments

All payments payable and due under this Consent Judgment shall be delivered to KASB's counsel at the following address:

agents, parent companies, subsidiaries, divisions, suppliers, franchisees, licensees, customers (not including private label customers of HoMedics), distributors, wholesalers, retailers, and all other downstream entities in the distribution chain of any of the Products, and the predecessors, successors, and assigns of any of them (collectively, "Released Parties") based on any purported failure to provide a clear and reasonable warning about alleged exposures to DEHP contained in the Products that were manufactured, processed, distributed, sold and/or offered for sale in California before the Effective Date, as set forth in the Notice and Complaint. The Parties further agree that compliance with Section 2 of this Consent Judgment shall be deemed compliance with Proposition 65 with respect to alleged exposures to DEHP in the Products.

The Parties understand and agree that this Section 4.1 release shall not extend upstream to any entities that sold, supplied or manufactured the Products or any component parts thereof, or any distributors or suppliers who sold the Products or any component parts thereof to HoMedics.

4.2 KASB's Individual Release of Claims

KASB, in its individual capacity only and not in its representative capacity, also hereby provides a release to HoMedics and the Releasees which shall be effective as a full and final accord and satisfaction, as a bar to all actions, causes of actions, obligations, costs, expenses, attorneys' fees, damages, losses, claims, liabilities and demands of KASB of any nature, character, or kind arising out of alleged or actual exposures to DEHP in Products manufactured, imported, sold or distributed for sale, in or into the State of California, by HoMedics prior to the Execution Date, as alleged in the Notice and Complaint. The Parties understand and agree that this Section 4.2 release shall not extend upstream to any entities that sold, supplied or manufactured the Products or any component parts thereof to HoMedics. Nothing in this section shall affect KASB's right to commence or prosecute an action under Proposition 65 against a Releasee that does not involve HoMedics' Products.

4.3 HoMedics' Release of KASB

HoMedics, on behalf of itself, its past and current officers, agents, shareholders, employees, predecessors, representatives, attorneys, successors, and assignees, hereby waives any and all claims against KASB and its attorneys and other representatives for any and all actions taken or statements

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made (or those that could have been taken or made) by KASB, its attorneys and other representatives, whether in the course of investigating claims or otherwise seeking to enforce Proposition 65 against it in this matter with respect to the Products.

5. <u>COURT APPROVAL</u>

Pursuant to California Health and Safety Code § 25249.7(f)(4), KASB shall file a noticed motion for judicial approval of this Consent Judgment. The Parties agree to mutually employ their best efforts, and those of their counsel, to support the entry of a judgment pursuant to the terms of this Consent Judgment and to judicial approval of their settlement in a timely manner. For purposes of this section, "best efforts" shall include, at a minimum, supporting the motion for approval, responding to any third-party objection, and appearing at the hearing before the Court, if so requested.

6. SEVERABILITY

If, subsequent to the Court's approval and entry of this Consent Judgment as a judgment, any provision of this Consent Judgment is deemed by a court to be unenforceable, the validity of the remaining provisions shall not be adversely affected.

7. GOVERNING LAW

The terms of this Consent Judgment shall be governed by the laws of the State of California and apply within California. In the event Proposition 65 is repealed, preempted, or is otherwise rendered inapplicable, by reason of law, generally, as to the Products or as to DEHP, then HoMedics may provide KASB with written notice of any asserted change in the law and shall have no further injunctive obligations pursuant to this Consent Judgment, with respect to, and to the extent that, the Products are so affected. Nothing in this Consent Judgment shall be interpreted to relieve HoMedics from its obligation to comply with any pertinent state or federal law or regulation.

8. NOTICE

Unless specified herein, all correspondence and notice required by this Consent Judgment shall be in writing and sent by: (i) first-class registered or certified mail, return receipt requested; or (ii) a recognized overnight courier to any Party by the other at the following addresses:

9. <u>COUNTERPARTS AND PDF SIGNATURES</u>

This Consent Judgment may be executed in counterparts and by portable document format (pdf) signature, each of which shall be deemed an original and, all of which, when taken together, shall constitute one and the same document.

10. COMPLIANCE WITH REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

KASB and its counsel agree to comply with the reporting form requirements referenced in California Health and Safety Code § 25249.7(f).

11. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Consent Judgment contains the sole and entire agreement and understanding of the Parties with respect to the entire subject matter hereof, and any and all prior discussions, negotiations, commitments, or understandings related thereto, if any, are hereby merged herein and therein. There are no warranties, representations, or other agreements between the Parties except as expressly set forth herein. No representations, oral or otherwise, express or implied, other than those specifically referred to in this Consent Judgment have been made by any Party hereto. No other agreements not specifically contained or referenced herein, oral or otherwise, shall be deemed to exist or to bind any of the Parties hereto.

12. MODIFICATION

This Consent Judgment may be modified only by: (i) a written agreement of the Parties and the entry of a modified Consent Judgment by the Court thereon; or (ii) upon a successful motion of any party and the entry of a modified Consent Judgment by the Court thereon.
